

Bulldogs fall short in comeback bid against Raiders 23-20

The Bulldogs staged a furious comeback against the visiting South Sumter Raiders but ultimately fell just short

After almost three full quarters of combat the Bulldog-Raider showdown came down to the final 13 minutes. South Sumter had just recovered their own fumble and faced a 4th-and-7 at the Zephyrhills 22-yard line. Running power option plays from stout, 6-2, 202-pound quarterback Eian Finkley and speed-ster running back Jamare Dorsey, the Raiders pulled a rabbit out of their hat. The power read drifted right only for Finkley to pivot left and lob a jump pass over the Zephyrhills defense, finding Colby Rinberger for just his second touch of the game. Rinberger snared the pass and bested two defenders en route to a 13-

Voter turnout posted on website

Supervisor of Elections Brian E. Corley announced that voter turnout for the Nov. 8 General Election will be posted daily on the elections' office website, PascoVotes.gov. The voter turnout numbers will represent those who have returned their vote-by-mail ballot. Beginning Oct. 26, the posted turnout will include those who have voted early.

"Posting voter turnout is part of our commitment to transparency with elections in Pasco County," said Corley. Voter turnout will be updated every 10 minutes during

Voter turnout will be updated every 10 minutes during Early Voting and on General Election Day. After the polls close at 7 p.m. on Nov. 8, the election results will be posted as soon as they become available.







Ryman, born in Indiana in 1939, was a fixture in the community since moving to Zephyrhills in 1970. He raised his family here and worked in the mobile home business for 50 years until retiring in 2000.

For many years he ran the scoreboard at Bulldog Stadium for Zephyrhills High foot-ball games, took an active role in the Daybreak Rotary Club and was part of a small circle of breakfast club locals at the former Barb's Restaurant. Ryman was one of the club's charter members and in 2019 was named Rotarian of the Year.

Bill Cassel, who often was part of what he called an eclectic group at those breakfast gatherings and enjoyed sitting beside Ryman at the Rotary club's meetings, spoke fondly of his friend.

"Everyone was Nelson's best friend," he said at the celebration of life ceremony. "He had limitless love.

Ryman also spread his good cheer internationally by taking part in mission work in Haiti, where he survived a 2010 hurricane.



MOMENTS IN TIME The History Channel

• On Oct. 13, 1953, the 45-foot Artmobile, the world's first art museum on wheels, arrives in Virginia carrying 16 paintings by 15th- and 16th-century masters. It attracted 5,000 visitors in the first few weeks. Art objects were loaned for exhibit by famous museums across the country until the Artmobile was canceled in 1994 due to budget cuts.

• On Oct. 14, 1857, engineer and inventor Elwood Haynes is born in Portland, Indiana. Haynes designed one of the very first American automobiles using a gas engine he saw in use at the 1893 Chicago World's Fair. The finished product weighed 820 pounds and moved on 28-inch bicycle wheels.

• On Oct. 15, 1965, in one of several identical events across the country, Catholic priest David Miller burns his draft card in New York. For violating the recent law banning the burnings, Miller was arrested and sentenced to two years in jail.

• On Oct. 16, 1793, Marie Antoinette, the last queen of France, is taken to the guillotine and beheaded nine months after her husband, the former King Louis XVI of France. Marie Antoinette and Louis, unpopular and accused of high treason due to France's financial woes, had been caught trying to flee to Austria.

• On Oct. 17, 1986, President Ronald Reagan signs into law an act that approves \$100 million in humanitarian and military aid for Nicaraguan Contras with a goal of overthrowing the Sand-inista government. Shortly afterward, however, the Iran-Contra scandal was revealed wherein the U.S. had sold missiles and arms in secret deals with Iran and \$30 million were diverted to the Contras.

• On Oct. 18, 1974, singer Al Green is attacked when an ex-girlfriend pours a pot of hot grits on his back while he was in the bathtub. Green was left with severe injuries but also a spiritual awakening. By 1976, Green had become an ordained Baptist minister and established a Memphis church.

• On Oct. 19, 1931, David Cornwell, known as spy novelist John le Carre, is born in Poole, England. He published his first spy novel, "Call for the Dead," in 1961. The novel, like his second, "A Murder of Quality" (1962), featured spy George Smiley.

7 ways to reduce breast cancer risk

Many women are concerned about the potential for developing breast cancer in their lifetimes. Breast cancer is the second-most common cancer among women in the United States and Canada. Despite that prevalence, there are ways for women to reduce their risk for breast cancer.

While it is impossible to change family history or genetic markers like gene mutations that increase breast cancer risk, the following are seven ways women can lower their risk.

1. Exercise regularly and maintain a healthy weight. Physical activity and monitoring calories can keep weight in check. The Mayo Clinic recommends at least 150 minutes per week of moderate aerobic activity or 75 minutes per week of vigorous aerobic activity. Strength training at least twice a week also is recommended. Being overweight or obese increases a woman's risk for breast cancer.

2. Consume a healthy diet. The link between diet and breast cancer risk is still being studied. However, research suggests that a diet high in vegetables and fruit, and calciumrich dairy products, but low in red and processed meats may lower breast cancer risk.

3. Avoid or limit alcohol consumptions. Alcohol increases risk of breast cancer, even in small amounts. For those who drink, no more than one alcoholic drink a day should be the limit. The more a woman drinks, the greater her risk of developing breast cancer, states the Mayo Clinic.

4. Undergo genetic counseling and testing. Women concerned about a genetic connection or family history of breast cancer can



speak to their doctor about testing and counseling that could help them reduce their risk. Preventive medicines and surgeries might help those at elevated risk for breast cancer.

5. Limit hormone therapy. Combination hormone replacement therapy for post-menopausal women may increase risk of breast cancer, indicates the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Similarly, taking oral contraceptives during reproductive years may increase risk. Women can speak with their physicians to weigh the pros and cons of taking such hormones.

6. Breastfeed children, if possible. Breastfeeding has been linked to reducing a woman's risk of developing breast cancer.

7. Learn to detect breast cancer. Women should get to know their bodies so they


can determine if something is awry as early as possible. Early detection of breast cancer increases the chances that treatment will prove successful.





Raider defense offsides to convert the fourth down. Colella completed six of seven passes on the 77-yard drive, culminating with a seven-yard touchdown pass to Fred Adams. It drew the Bulldogs to within 23-20 and 4:44 left on the clock. All they had to do next, was get a stop.

They got it. On a most difficult 3rd-and-1, the Bulldogs bagged Finkley for a four-yard loss and forced a punt with 2:43 left to play. On the Bulldogs next offensive drive, a 20-yard completion to Sands electrified the home crowd but the Bulldogs missed on what looked to be a certain completion to DJ Pickett on third down. The play on 4th-and-13 resulted in a South Sumter sack and fumble recovery, throwing ice on the fanning comeback flames. Down to just one timeout, the Bulldogs were powerless to stop the inexorable march off of the final seconds, the final 23-20 score burned red into the scoreboard. "This was a battle," Bulldog head coach Nick Car-roll said. "It's been like that all year. There are no easy games.' It looked as if the Bulldogs were in over their heads early, trying to stop a very efficiently-run power option game by the Raiders. Finkley proved very difficult to bring down and made great decisions on when to take and when to give to running backs Dors-ey, Young, Malakhi Boone and Kaden Payne. The Bulldog defense managed to stop them their first drive. A tackle-forloss by Zephyrhills's Christian Velasquez, extinguished the second Raider drive. Finally, the Raiders got close enough to draw first blood with a field goal. The Bulldogs managed to keep it close until tragedy struck in the waning moments of the first half. South Sumter's Cody Zilcosky blocked a Zephyrhills punt and recovered it himself, setting up a short field for the Raider offense. Two plays later, Dorsey was in the end zone. A missed extra point made it 9-0 Raiders with 1:05 to play in the half. The Bulldogs answered. A huge, 46-yard completion to DJ Pickett got the home crowd on its feet and got the Bulldogs in striking distance. A 12-yard and then a 20-yard completion to Sands scored the first Bulldog touchdown of the night and made it just a 9-7 deficit heading into halftime. The speedy Dorsey broke a big run on the Raiders's second possession of the third quarter. It went for 49 yards, up the left sideline for a touchdown and 16-7 lead. The Bulldogs put together a formidable drive, Colella again, made some great throws, completing five of five passes. Rodney Smith capped the drive with a fourvard touchdown run. The twopoint conversion failed and it was 16-13 with 3:53 left in the third before the final flurry

took over. The Bulldogs, while stinging from the loss, have to be proud of the way they hung in and traded blows with the undefeated Raiders. The Raiders amassed 269 rushing yards on 39 attempts, Dorsey gaining 144 of those yards on 19 carries with a pair of touchdowns. The Bulldogs, who like to rely on their run game behind Smith, ended up throwing the ball much more than usual.

"That's what they (South Sumter) were giving us," Carroll said. "We would have thrown all night."

Colella would throw 35 times, completing 23 of those attempts for 221 yards and two scores. The Bulldogs will not dwell on it long. They have another undefeated team this

HOLLYWOOD -- Something wicked this way comes! The film about the Broadway blockbuster "Wicked," which has grossed \$1 billion after their \$14 million investment, is in pre-production at Elstree Studios in England. Ariana Grande is Glinda (created by Kristin Chenoweth), and Cynthia Erivo is Elphaba (the role that won a Tony Award for Idina Menzel), while Jonathan Bailey -- currently Anthony, Viscount Bridgerton in Netflix's "Bridgerton" series -- is playing Fiyero. Rehearsals began in August, and the film starts shooting in November. Unlike the 2003 Broadway musical, which runs 2 hours and 45 minutes, the film will be in two parts, the first coming Christmas Day 2024 and the second Christmas Day 2025. The Broadway musical won three Tony Awards and is currently the fifth longest running show in Broadway history.

When Robert Mark Kamen wrote the screenplay for "The Karate Kid," (1984), he had no idea he'd become the goose who laid the golden egg. The original film cost \$8 million and grossed \$131 million. "Part II," released in 1986, cost \$13 million and grossed \$130 million. "Part III," which cost \$12.5 million, only earned \$38.9 million. When Will Smith and Jada Pinkett Smith produced "The Ka rate Kid" starring their son Jaden Smith, the \$40 million film grossed a whopping \$359 million. Meanwhile, "The Karate Kid" saga was reinvented for television as "Cobra Kai," with original stars Ralph Macchio, William Zabka and Martin Kove. The series has amassed more than 50 episodes and is currently available on Netflix.



Two years ago, during the height of the pandemic, Tucker noted that the American Cancer Society still organized a "Walk Your Way" to keep people involved. "We still did fundraising," she said of that

Pink was the color du jour Saturday morning at The Shops at Wiregrass. A parade of people — from toddlers in strollers to teens, adults to senior citizens, along with several dogs walked through the streets of the outdoor shopping complex. Most dressed in pink for the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer Walk.

Some sprinted, a few danced and plenty cheered in unison as they crossed the finish line following a 2.5-mile walk along Paseo Drive and through the streets of the outdoor mall in Wesley Chapel. They relished supporting a benefit for cancer research and associated programs.

A few, like New Port Richey's Brian Donnelley, stayed near the finish line to dance and sing to songs played by a disc jockey. Like many his life has been touched by cancer. He lost his mother Sharon and his mother's friend Carol Macy to the world's second-leading cause of death.

"They're not here anymore so it's just my way of showing my love for them because they're up in heaven," he said.

Meredith Tucker, manager of the annual event, estimated a crowd of more than 2,500 who helped raise about \$60,000 for the cause. Those numbers marked an increase from last year's turnout with the event returning after being cancelled in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic.

"It's more than they had last year," she said. "It's just more people coming out, building it back up again.

Tucker and organizers expressed concern about Hurricane Ian and its aftermath adversely affecting the cancer walk. Such was not the case, however, with Tucker saying, "We ended up having a great turnout." "We still did fundraising," she said of that 2020 event. "We encouraged people to get small groups and walk in their neighborhood."

T.J. Tolentino, who showed up with a dozen members of the Infante family from New Port Richey, is among many glad that the event was revived.

"I think it helps support everyone," he said.

So too do friends Debbie Cardona, who brought along her French Bulldog Zoe, and Elayne Bassinger. Both are breast cancer survivors.

"It's absolutely fantastic," said Cardona, a two-time survivor of ovarian cancer.

For Cardona and Bassinger, longtime president of the Land O' Lakes Lutz Women's Club, it marked their fourth breast cancer walk at The Shops at Wiregrass.

The day after the breast cancer walk at the Wesley Chapel area mall, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers honored a cancer survivor before their game against the Atlanta Falcons, a National Football League rival, at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa. Kelly Broadbelt, a Hillsborough County school teacher who was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2001, was named the Bucs' Goal Getter of the Game.

Since 1993, the American Cancer Society's annual campaign has united communities, companies, and individuals with a collective goal to end breast cancer. Over the past two decades, the non-competitive walks have collectively grown into the nation's largest and most impactful breast cancer movement.

This year was even more special since Making Strides Against Breast Cancer is celebrating its 30th anniversary and took place in more than 150 communities nationwide.
