Pioneer Florida Museum hosted first major outdoor event since last February

What the Scarecrow Festival lacked in attendance, it made up for in enthusiasm. Kids and families, young and old alike, ventured to the Pioneer Florida Museum and Village last Saturday for what has become one of the

most popular events there.

The festival marked the first event hosted by the village since the Farm Festival and Quilt Show last February. Numerous events and activities were subsequently cancelled due to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic.

"I think people were just ready to get out and be outside to have some fun," said Stephanie Black, executive director for the museum and village.

Brenda Minton, the facility's events coordinator, estimated Saturday's attendance to be in the 2,500 range, which represents a drastic reduction in what she said typically is about 6,000. Still, that number exceeded her expectations.

It's 105 and counting for Anne Napoli

Betmar Acres resident gets a drive-by birthday celebration from family, friends and other locals

During a recent coffee hour at one of the clubhouses in Betmar Acres, Phil Hawkins struck up a conversation with a spry elderly woman. That brief meeting made a lasting impression on him.

"I thought she was in her 70s or 80s and she said, 'I'm 104,'" he recalled. "I said what? You've got to be kidding me!"

Anne Napoli does that to people.

Sitting in the passenger seat of a Toyota Camry last Thursday, along with her two daughters in the car, Napoli enthusiastically waved back at well-wishers driving slowly past her daughter Barbara Winslow's home on Arrowhead Drive. The celebration of her 105th birthday will be remembered as the most unusual one ever.

In all, 85 people and eight dogs drove by to wish Napoli a happy birthday. Hopefully, she said, her next birthday won't have similar restrictions like current precautions taken due to the coronavirus pandemic.

"It's simple, but that's the way we have to do it," said Winslow. "We couldn't offer cake or anything, but people were so friendly."

Five years ago, Napoli made the pages of *The Zephyrhills News* when she celebrated her 100th birthday at one of the 55-and-older community's clubhouses. At the time, she attributed becoming a centenarian to staying active. She has added on to that simple philosophy.

"Gin and chocolate," she said with a smile, not disclosing how much of each.

Even back on her 100th birthday she was



well aware of people spreading germs. So during that celebration she shunned hugs and instead distributed little Hershey's Kisses.

Napoli lives at Betmar Acres with Winslow, who at 73 is the self-described "baby" in the family. Her other daughter, Jo-Ann McDermott, 78, also lives in Betmar and comes over often. Being close to her daughters is an ideal situation for Napoli, who said she wouldn't have it any other way.

"It means security and they take good care of me," she said.

The admiration and respect is mutual Winslow mentioned having trouble with sewing on a button recently and her mother taking over and completing the task on her own.

"We're so proud of our mother," Winslow said.

Napoli grew up in the Boston suburb of Somerville, married Joseph and the couple retired on

Cape Cod. They were married for 54 years until Joseph passed away at the age of 81. She moved to Betmar 17 years ago.

Last Thursday, people from the community and beyond passed Napoli's home in cars, minivans and SUVs. Mostly, however, folks pulled up in golf carts to wish her a happy birthday. In one of those golf carts was Hawkins, a professional musician who stopped to play happy birthday on his tuba.

Some of the passers-by stopped for happy birthday wishes while others gave Napoli some good-natured ribbing. Cary Jones, who arrived in a golf cart with his little dog Hero, dished out a little of both.

"I just salute this woman. She's amazing and she has her wits about her," he said, adding with a chuckle, "She cheats at cards."

Hearing that, Napoli had a quick retort.

"No, of course not," she said of Jones' remark about cards. "And if I did you wouldn't know."

Another well-wisher in a golf cart with a dog was Jenn Cronin, who told Napoli, "Don't eat too much cake now."

Barbara Flickinger drove by and complimented Napoli, saying, "She looks great."

Added Eileen Fields, another local resident who had a large happy birthday sign on her minivan, "I wish you many more. You're looking so great I can't believe it. Hopefully when this thing (COVID-19) is over then I can give you a big hug."



"I thought a lot more people came out than I expected," she said. "We probably had about a third of the people we've had in the past. Organizers pointed out that events on the six-acre property, such as making scarecrows and other games, were a bit more spread out than in the past. Also, there were no bounce houses this time. There were, however, two new acts as far as entertainment — soccer collies and Blaise Bubble Magic as seen on America's Got Talent — that attracted plenty of children and parents. Marleen Rios, who recently moved from New York City to Dade City with her 8-year-old son Maximus, said he brought a flyer home from Pasco Elementary School. "I said this morning, we're going to go to the Scarecrow Festival," Marleen said. "We're thrilled." For his part, Maximus said he enjoyed "popping the bubbles." Additional activities included a pumpkin patch, pumpkin painting, rock painting and rock climbing, pony rides, a petting zoo and carnival games. There also were numerous arts and crafts and other vendors. Amy Perez said she and her husband Jose brought her children, 4-year-old Jessica and Peter, 8, "just to be outside and have activities to do." Among the piles of hay in which children, parents and others built their own personalized scarecrows were the Culbreath brothers, 9-year-old Xander and 5-year-old Marshall. Mostly, they seemed more interested in jumping and diving into the hay pile rather than building a scarecrow. "This is our second time here, because they enjoyed the last time," said their grandmother Sonja Culbreath, who also was joined by the boys' aunt, Jessica Culbreath. Among the other activities, Marshall said he liked riding ponies, provided by A. Thomas Pony Rides and Petting Zoo in Land O' Lakes, and Xander relished the soccer collie show put on by Mark Lukas of Floral City. Brenda Montalvo, who came from Mulberry and brought her sons Liam, 6, and 8-year-old

Ayden Davis, also took them to the scarecrow-making activity and pony rides. "I loved the scarecrow," she said. "The kids had a blast with that." Almost everywhere visitors looked, it seemed, there were boys and girls in costumes. Like Amanda Wray's daughter Madelyn dressed as Snow White and Jessica Towner's daughter Eve as Rapunzel. "It's a fun little thing to do in Dade City," Amanda Wray said. "There's a lot of people here," Jessica Towner added. As always, there were lots of children and their parents in the petting zoo area, which featured baby chicks, bunnies, a donkey, small horse, water buffalo and small calves. "I'm really excited to bring our animals out and make people happy," said Peyton McKenzie, of Building Legacies 4-H Club. "A lot of things were closed or cancelled. It's nice to bring (the animals) out so they can socialize too." Now that the Scarecrow Festival took place, other events are coming back to the popular and historical destination in Dade City. Next up is this Sunday's Classic Rock Pioneers Show, 4-6 p.m. "We're trying to go ahead and have our outdoor events and make the best of things," Black said.

FOR I BELIEVE GOD—DO YOU?

The apostle Paul journeyed to Italy as a prisoner in his appeal to Caesar, which stemmed from false accusations of the Jews, and his ship was caught up in a tempestuous wind-storm named Euroclydon, **Acts 27:20** "And when neither sun nor stars in many days appeared, and no small tempest lay on us, **all hope that we should be saved was then taken away."**

BUT PAUL SAYS TO THOSE ABOARD: "21 But after long abstinence Paul stood forth in the midst of them, and said, Sirs, ye should have hearkened unto me, and not have loosed from Crete, and to have gained this harm and loss. **22 And now I exhort you to be of good cheer:** for there shall be no loss of any man's life among you, but of the ship. 23 For there stood by me this night the angel of God, whose I am, and whom I serve, 24 Saying, **Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee."**

CONTINUING ON PAUL SAYS in Verse 25: "Wherefore, sirs, be of good cheer: FOR I BELIEVE GOD, that it shall be even as it was told me.

BUT TO BE SAVED, ALL ABROAD HAD TO STAY ON THE SHIP:

"29 Then fearing lest we should have fallen upon rocks, they (the shipmen) cast four anchors out of the stern, and wished for the day. 30 And as the shipmen were about to flee out of the ship, when they had let down the boat into the sea, under colour as though they would have cast anchors out of the foreship, **31 Paul said to the centurion and to the soldiers, EXCEPT THESE ABIDE IN THE SHIP, YE CANNOT BE SAVED."** Please read the whole story.

Item 2.3 approved the purchase of a front load commercial refuse truck. The 2021 Peterbilt 520 Dual Drive 66K GVWR Amrep FEL Body W/ Curotto-Can will be purchased from Rush Truck Centers in Tampa at a cost of \$320,825.50. The budget line item in the 20-21 FY Budget includes \$340,000 for sanitation capital purchases.

Item 2.4 approved the purchase of a sewer vac truck in the amount of \$344,214.00. The purchase was recommended by the utilities director and city manager and is included in the 20-21 FY Budget under machinery and equipment.

Item 2.5 approved easements along Simons Road for Duke Energy to conduct improvements to the transmission system servicing the City of Zephyrhills. Duke Energy agreed to pay the city \$13,000 for the easements.

Item 2.6 approved a “piggyback” bid with Lee County for a number of road resurfacing projects in Zephyrhills. The city is not contiguous with Lee County but the “piggyback” bid with contractor Asphalt Paving Systems, Inc. combines projects with the aim of obtaining a better price. The resurfacing covers a number of areas that include: 1st Street–US 301 to Old 5th Avenue; 9th Street – 12th Avenue to North Avenue; 8th Avenue West – 1st Street to Western boundary of Oakside Cemetery; Heights Avenue – Beltram Drive to Tangerine Drive; 8th Avenue West – 1st Street to Western boundary of Oakside Cemetery; Old 5th Avenue – 1st Street to 5th Avenue / SR 54; Waverly Avenue – Court Street to End; 21st Street – 6th Avenue to Our Savior Lutheran Church match line; 14th Street – North Avenue to 16th Street; 18th Street – North Avenue to South Avenue; 9th Avenue – 12th Street to 20th Street; 11th Street – 11th Avenue to North Avenue; 11th Street – 9th Avenue to R.B.S.M.S. match line; and Piedmont Avenue – Wire Road to N. 16th Street.

On to Business Item 3.1, an interlocal agreement with Pasco County for road and intersection improvements along CR 54 between Gall Boulevard and 23rd Street, covering 1.31 miles of roadway. The project will be divided into three phases. The original plan was for a 50-50 cost share with the county but as Phase 3, which includes the intersection at 23rd Street, falls entirely within Pasco County boundaries, the county agreed to pay for all of Phase 3 and then the remainder of their apportioned project funds would go toward Phases 1 and 2.

Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe said that the dollar amount would be, “just about the same” with splitting the project costs in that manner as opposed to a straight 50-50 split across the whole project. The estimated cost of the project is \$6,855,255.44 of which the city is to pay \$3,427,627.72 in installments. Poe said that the contract should be awarded by February and that construction should start by March of 2021.

Councilman Lance Smith noted that the area was one of the more congested areas of the city. The item passed 5-0.

Item 4.1 in the City Attorney’s Report set

out a first reading of Ordinance No. 1407-20 regarding the city’s Purchasing Ordinance to update purchasing thresholds. Poe’s reasoning was that the low thresholds tended to bog down smaller projects. He referenced a knocked down guard rail and how long it took to replace it, having to attain three competitive bids and then come back to council with them. Proposed thresholds increase in the item from \$2,500 to \$5,000 for quotes and from \$20,000 to \$50,000 for bids.

Item 4.2 renewed the city’s contract with Zephyrhills City Attorney Matthew Maggard. The terms are identical to the previous contract, which expires on Oct. 31. Council members universally praised Maggard’s work and renewed the three-year contract by unanimous vote.

In the comments section, Zephyrhills Senior Planner Todd Vande Berg pumped up the grand opening of the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center on Oct. 17. He also spoke about the development of the Sarah Vande Berg Foundation and how two after school programs are already underway. Eight students are also on scholarships provided by the foundation at the tennis center.

Poe announced that the Pretty Pond/301 project is officially underway.

Councilwoman Jodi Wilkeson commended IT Director Mike Panak for the improvements in the teleconferencing of council meetings.

Council members echoed their anticipation of the tennis center’s grand opening on Saturday.
