Legacy of the late Zephyrhills High standout who perished in a 2015 car crash will carry on at new facility

The unveiling of a statue paying homage to a late Zephyrhills High standout was the culmination of last Saturday's grand opening of the new Sarah Vande Berg Tennis and Wellness Center off Simons Road. The legacy

of Sarah, who played tennis at the University of South Carolina Upstate and perished in a 2015 car crash, will

"Forever going forward, we will see Sarah all over this place," said Gary Baldus, who coaches girls tennis at Zephyrhills High and is a minister at New Walk Church. "We will always remember her. The legacy of her life will continue."

Numerous photos of those involved in the project of a \$5 million facility three years in the making took place around the statue near the end of the event. Perhaps none felt more honored than the Vande Berg family — Todd, the city's planner who was instrumental in

Two shootings in Zephyrhills

Man fatally shot Saturday at Sam Pasco Recreation Complex, which followed the previous weekend's gun shots in a Wawa parking lot

Two recent shootings — one in Zephyrhills and another just beyond city limits have detectives from the Zephyrhills Police Department and Pasco Sheriff's Office working separate cases that remain open.

In the most recent case, a man whose identity was not initially known by the sheriff's office was fatally shot at the Samuel W. Pasco Recreation Complex off Chancey Road. The Wiregrass Lions, a youth football and cheerleading organization in the Pasco Police Athletic League, play at that park where last Saturday's reported shooting took place around 1

According to a sheriff's report, 32-yearold Carl Branch of Fort Myers area was shot and killed in the parking lot area while a youth football game took place nearby. On Sunday, the victim's family waived Marsy's I

tections and voluntary identified him. Preliminary information indicated that the victim was targeted for unknown reasons and that the incident was not a random act. Suspects are believed to be traveling in a white four-door Nissan sedan. They are described as an unknown number of black males wearing dark clothing, who also may be from the Fort Myers area.

During the previous weekend, gun shots were reported in the parking lot of a Wawa along State Road 54 in Zephyrhills. Less is known about an alleged shooting that took place there. Capt. Reggie Roberts, who also serves as the Zephyrhills Police Department's public information officer, said the detective unit is working the case and hoping for a break

The local police department has yet to release any information on victims, suspects, or the number of people involved, for that matter. There is, however, some information on a vehicle allegedly involved in the shooting.

"We are still trying to determine" the amount of people involved, Roberts said. "The car had dark tinted windows and we can't determine how many people were in there."

Unlike the case at Sam Pasco Park, Roberts said, "We've had no complaints of injury." He did say that shots came "outside in the parking lot and at a vehicle.

As for the youth organization, the Lions released a statement not long after the shooting: "We the Wiregrass Lions nor any team a part of the Pasco Athletic League were involved in that event, but we send our prayers to any and all families that were involved in that tragic

The police department and sheriff's office welcome any information on those cases and encourages people who can assist or provide anything to come forward.

Any witnesses to the incident, please call the Zephyrhills Police Department," Roberts said of the shooting at the Wawa parking lot.

"We encourage anyone with information on this crime to report it to Crime Stoppers of Tampa Bay," said Amanda Hunter, public information officer for the sheriff's office. "The Pasco Sheriff's Office is committed to bringing closure to this case for the victim and the victim's family."

pushing the effort along; his wife Charla, a language arts teacher at Stewart Middle School; and Emily, a former high school tennis teammate of her late sister.

"Nothing compares with what we've built," said Todd, who has been a longtime avid tennis player as well. "I truly believe that this is going to be a game-changer for Zephyrhills. It's going to provide an impact on Zephyrhills

and Pasco County." That sentiment was shared by many others at the new center, which features outdoor courts for tennis, pickleball and padel (a racquet sport played in a closed court; along with a 30,000-square-foot indoor facility for the United Global Academy; and rooms for fitness, yoga, massage, a salt room and cryotherapy; and a restaurant and pro shop.

"I wanted to create something different and unique," said Pascal Collard, the new center's chief executive officer who formerly was the tennis director at the Saddlebrook Resort in Wesley Chapel. "Guys on my team, we did it!"

Among the local dignitaries and prominent figures who showed up to laud the efforts

of the project were state senator Wilton Simpson and Danny Burgess, a former state representative who once again is running for office. There also were city councilmen and chamber of commerce presidents Melonie Monson and Hope Kennedy of Zephyrhills and New Tampa, respectively.

'This is just an amazing facility," Simpson said. "They went all out and they did it right. It gets people outside and will bring people from all over.

Added Burgess, "This is absolutely magnificent. It's one of a kind."

Nick Bollettieri, a mentor to Collard, showed up in support. The American tennis coach pioneered the concept of a tennis boarding school with the IMG Academy in Bradenton, and helped develop professionals like Andre Agassi, Jim Courier and Monica Seles.

This isn't to build champions," Bollettieri said of the new center. "It's built to give children an opportunity to pursue their dreams."

Collard and Todd Vande Berg gave special thanks to construction, architectural and design firms, along with David Waronker, a local developer who donated about 10 acres for the project. The city planner also spoke of the partnership that includes people from the private sector, along with city, county and state levels.

"It's a very unique partnership we have here," he said. "Today, this raises the bar for the city of Zephyrhills."

Two city managers for Zephyrhills also showed up. Billy Poe, the current one who formerly held that role in Dade City, and Steve Spina, who had that title when the tennis center effort began in 2018.

Two scholarships were awarded near the end of Saturday's ceremony. Zephyrhills High students Brooke Baldus, who is on the golf and tennis teams, and Jaiden Ryker, a tennis player and cheerleaders, were the recipients.



Deadline to request Vote-by-Mail Ballots

Brian E. Corley, Supervisor of Elections, Pasco County, announces the last day for the elections' office to mail vote-by-mail ballots is Oct. 24. Per Florida law, ballot requests received in the supervisor's office by 5 p.m. that day will be honored. Request a ballot on-line at www.PascoVotes.gov or call (800)

Ballots will still be available for pick-up over the counter at the three supervisor's offices until 5 p.m. Nov. 2. Voters wishing to pick up ballots on behalf of someone will need a written request from the voter designating them as the person authorized to carry out the ballot. The designee will be asked to provide a photo ID and to complete an affidavit before releasing the ballot to them.

Florida Statutes do not allow for voteby-mail ballots to be picked up in the supervisor's office on the day of the election unless an emergency precludes the voter from

going to their assigned polling place. An affidavit affirming the facts of the emergency will be required. The only exception is voters residing in an assisted living facility.

All voted ballots must be physically in the elections' office by 7 p.m. Election Day, Nov. 3, including ballots being delivered by United States Postal Service. Attended ballot drop-off boxes will be available at all 14 Early Voting Sites during the early voting period, Oct. 19-31. Voted ballots may also be hand delivered to any of the three Supervisor of Elections' Offices in Pasco County by the 7 p.m. Election Day deadline. Voted ballots may not be turned in at the polls on Election Day.

The apostle Paul journeyed to Italy as a prisoner in his appeal to Caesar, which stemmed from false accusations of the Jews, and his ship was caught up in a tempestuous wind-storm named Euroclydon, Acts 27:20 "And when neither sun nor stars in many days appeared, and no small tempest lay on us, all hope that we should be saved was then taken away."

BUT PAUL SAYS TO THOSE ABOARD: "21 But after long abstinence Paul stood forth in the midst of them, and said, Sirs, ye should have hearkened unto me, and not have loosed from Crete, and to have gained this harm and loss. 22 And now I exhort you to be of good cheer: for there shall be no loss of any man's life among you, but of the ship. 23 For there stood by me this night the angel of God, whose I am, and whom I serve, 24 Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee."

CONTINUING ON PAUL SAYS in Verse 25: "Wherefore, sirs, be of good cheer: FOR I BELIEVE GOD, that it shall be even as it was told me.

BUT TO BE SAVED, ALL ABROAD HAD TO STAY ON THE SHIP:

"29 Then fearing lest we should have fallen upon rocks, they (the shipmen) cast four anchors out of the stern, and wished for the day. 30 And as the shipmen were about to flee out of the ship, when they had let down the boat into the sea, under colour as though they would have cast anchors out of the foreship, 31 Paul said to the centurion and to the soldiers, EXCEPT THESE ABIDE IN THE SHIP, YE CANNOT BE SAVED." 



"We're about those things that help Zephyrhills

For years Zephyrhills has been known primarily for two things to the outside world. It is the city of water and Skydive City is on the international map as being a preeminent stop for skydiving. Now, however, a few things can be added.

Last weekend's grand opening for the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis Center also is likely to bring national and international attention. As for growth and development, officials are declaring this part of the county as the next major location to attract businesses and housing to go along with road improvements and an expansion of the Zephyrhills International Airport.

Wilton Simpson, a state senator since 2012 who serves the 10th District that includes parts of Pasco as well as Hernando and Citrus counties, deemed it fitting to have the economic meeting in Zephyrhills.

"When you think about how you bring better jobs it's going to be through infrastructure," said Simpson, an egg farmer from Trilby who is the Senate-Designate. "Things are getting better. Economic activity is picking up."

The initial speakers at the summit were Randy Deshazo of the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council who talked about the aviation industry and how it impacts the area. He was followed by city planner Todd Vande Berg, who is front and center on current and future plans for growth and expansion.

Vande Berg mentioned how the COVID-19 crisis has had an adverse effect on the economy with downturns in goods and services, along with consumer spending. Locally, however, he said, "We're looking at how we can help our community to be more resilient."

Vande Berg noted the city leaders are working on comprehensive plans "to broaden the economic horizon as the city and outlying region continues to grow."

Among the road developments he mentioned are the recent expansion of State Road 56, a four-lane roadway that connected Meadow Pointe to U.S. 301, the current expansion of SR 54 from two to four lanes and improvements to the intersection of SR 54 where it meets Morris Bridge Road and Eiland Boulevard, and a reconfiguration of Pretty Pond Road at U.S. 301.

"We might be the next corridor for industrial manufacturing to come to," Vande Berg said, citing the area's proximity to accompanying growth in northern Hillsborough and western Polk counties.

To handle that growth, which also includes a handful of housing developments already under way and manufacturing possibly coming to the SR 54-Chancey Road area, more transportation alternatives could be in store for the region. Increased public transportation and rail lines expanding were among the topics mentioned.

Aside from Simpson two other politicians with local roots lent their voices to the summit meeting — Randy Maggard, State Representative for District 38, and Pasco County Commissioner Ron Oakley, who are prominent businessmen from Dade City.

'It's great to be able to work for east Pasco," said Maggard, citing a need to pave dirt roads in the city. "At the end of the day I'm going to fight for Zephyrhills."

Added Oakley, "Where do all those (aforementioned) roads lead to? They're coming this way. People are coming from the north and other areas into this area. You've got everything that's going to make this county boom."
