City council recognizes Special Olympians, annexes new parcels

Monday's city council meeting recognized a special group of athletes

The evening started off on a festive note as Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield read aloud a proclamation acknowledging Special Olympians. The East Pasco Stars Softball Team, led by their head coach Judy Brunner and assistant coaches Belinda Brown and Stacy Moms brought home the gold medal and a National Championship on Sept. 18. The Florida East Pasco Stars Team finished with five wins and two losses, defeating Team Canada 11-1 to bring home the gold medal.

Team players John Algood, Michael Dunn, Richard Proctor, Joshua Asua, Blake Bird, Justen Buchanan, Kenny Carriveau, George Morris, Bubby Morris, Phillip Olson, Roger Olson, Ernie Shultz, Andres Torres, Curt Walters and Scott Walter led the Stars to victory.

All of that concluded, it was on to the nineitem Consent Agenda. All nine items were bundled and passed together 5-0. Item 2.1 was a change order for contractor CW Roberts for mitigation ponds on the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport Runway Extension Project. Additional work is required to create and maintain a wetland mitigation site south of Runway 1. Contract time is extended to four years beyond the installation of the new planting, solely to allow for the maintenance and reporting items associated with it. No revision to the overall contract time is made for all other contracted work; the original completion date of Feb. 12, 2023 remains applicable. The additional cost of

Paulie Palooza Music Festival is key downtown event

Major fundraiser for Gulfside Hospice has become a fixture in its fourth year being held on 5th Avenue

Initially held in the drop zone area at the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport and labeled a Ride For Hospice, the Paulie Palooza Music Festival has changed locations three times. Now in its fourth year, the charitable event has become a fixture in downtown Zephyrhills.

The festival, a major fundraiser for Gulfside Hospice with locations in Zephyrhills and west Pasco, took place on Saturday from noon to 9 p.m. and drew hundreds to the street party on 5th avenue. Now it its 11th year the annual event also has taken place at the Venue, adjacent to the airport.

Organizers, especially Paul Correia who founded the festival, are glad it relocated to the downtown area and envision it being held there for the foresee-



\$94,409.35 is still covered by the Florida Department of Transportation grant.

Item 2.2 was a Joint Participation Agreement (JPA) with FDOT for the participation in the rehabilitation design of Runway 01-19. The northern end of Runway 1-19 is below state standards, the pavement condition index (PCI) and in need of rehabilitation. The Contract #G2D46 in the amount of \$350,000 will be divided into state share of \$280,000 and a local match \$70,000 budgeted in the FY City Budget.

Item 2.3 was a Joint Participation Agreement (JPA) with the FDOT to provide for participation in the purchase of Airport Security Vehicles. The split of the \$40,000 contract is set for: State \$32,000, local match \$8,000 with the local match budgeted in the FY 2022-2023 City Budget.

Item 2.4 asked council to approve purchase of Kubota tractor and bush hog mower for the airport. The new tractor is needed to keep up with demand and replace the Massey Ferguson tractor/mower that is no longer in operation. The airport is currently borrowing from the utilities department to meet the required demands. The total purchase amount, \$92,159.17 is \$17,840.83 under budget.

Item 2.5 asked council's approval of the purchase of public works department vehicles. The three vehicles in question were: front load sanitation truck using the Florida Sheriff's Contract Bid at a total cost of \$383,161.00 with \$400,000 budgeted. A three-quarter-ton pickup truck for the parks division using the Sourcewell Contract with a total cost of \$56,549.00 under a \$65,000 budget line item. A three-quarterton pickup truck for the Fleet Division using the Sourcewell Contract at a total cost of \$58,432.00 with \$65,000 budgeted.

Item 2.6 asked council to approve an annual street resurfacing Piggyback Agreement with Polk County and Asphalt Paving Systems, Inc.. The streets slated for resurfacing are: 20th Street – South Avenue to CR54, A Avenue– US 301 to 6th Street, A Avenue – 4th Street to 6th Street, 4th Street - A Avenue to South Avenue, B Avenue – 6th Street to US 301, B Avenue – 5th Street to 6th Street, 10th Avenue – 1st Street to US 301 and 4th Avenue – 4th Street to US 301. The not to exceed price is set at \$599,688.65.

Item 2.7 asked council to renew a WaterSmart Agreement. Utility customers have used WaterSmart since July 2018. This user-friendly online portal allows customers to view bills and water consumption, pay bills, initiate text and email notifications, and set up autopay. In addition, WaterSmart analyzes water consumption, detects leaks, and pushes email and text notifications to customers. The three-year agreement has pricing at \$42,954.34 FY 2023; \$44,215.18 FY 2024; and \$45,486.06 FY 2025.

Item 2.8 asked council to approve an outdoor tennis court agreement with GPWG Constructors. GPWC was selected among Request for Quote respondents. The project has a proposed six-week design phase, a 60-day construction phase and budget line item of

Item 2.9 was a Request for Qualifications for professional services, city-wide for the CRA, planning, and public works departments. On Sept. 7, the city distributed a Request for Qualifications and it was distributed through the Tampa Bay Times and BidNet Direct online. BidNet had 43 firms download the solicitation. On Oct. 7, the city received seven solicitation responses. The evaluation committee recommended approval of Alfred Benesch, BGE, Inc., CPH, GAI, HCP, and Kerns Family Construction, for continuing services in planning, engineering, marketing, and construction services.

In Business Items, Items 3.1 and 3.2 were the second readings of a territory annexation, land use and zoning changes for the ACME Development on Wire Road North of County Road 54. The ordinance was actually three part: annexation, a Future Land Use Map Amendment (FLUMA), and zoning assignment. The annexation would remedy a county enclave within the city. The petition was presented to the city by Commercial Site Solutions, Inc. (CSS) on behalf of the property owner (ACME Development Inc.) for a 4.95-acre parcel on Wire Road north of County Road 54. A 55- unit townhome community is anticipated to be developed if this petition is approved. At the April 11 meeting, council directed the applicant and staff to explore the possibility of constructing a left-hand turn lane on Wire Road. After analysis by the applicant's traffic consultant and meeting(s) with the county's acquisition and use permit team, it was determined that the project would not meet the criteria for a designated turn-lane. Therefore, a turn-lane is not part of this propos-

al. Both items passed 5-0. Items 3.3 and 3.4 both dealt with Zephyr Storage LLC on US-301 South of Daughtery Road. Item 3.3 was the annexation of the parcel where an indoor storage facility is proposed. Item 3.4 made changes to the future land use and zoning. Both items passed 5-0.

Item 3.5 was an annexation, Future Land Use Map Amendment (FLUMA) and rezoning application concerning approximately 29.38 acres generally located on the north side of Eiland Boulevard, east of Fort King Road. Item 3.5 also asked for changes to the Future Land Use

Map Amendment and zoning designation. Councilman Ken Burgess noted that the project has a maximum allowed unit-per-acre plan and that council should make sure and get what it needs from the developer as far as

roads, water and sewer. The item passed 5-0. It was even more annexation in the Planning Director's Report. Item 4.1 was another three-fold item asking for annexation, FLUMA and rezoning. The subject property is located along CR 54 approximately 1,500 feet from Wire Road in a mostly built-out area bordered to the west by 16th Street. To the east and south is the Florida Trailer Estates mobile home park, and to the north is the Sleepy Hollow mobile home park across from CR 54. The subject property consists of approximately 4.62 acres. The anticipated use of the property will be a 65-unit townhome community limited to 14 dwelling units per acre. It amounts to 14 units per acre and according to Senior Planner Rodney Corriveau it eliminates a Pasco County enclave and, "cleans up some of the swiss cheese-looking city limits.

Item 4.2 asked for council's approval of the Market at Zephyrhills Final Plat. The subject property consists of approximately 8.6 acres and is proposed to be developed with five platted lots for commercial development. It passed

In Citizen Comments, assistant superintendent for support services Elizabeth Kuhn made a Penny for Pasco presentation. The program, approved by voters in 2004, collected over \$320 million between 2005 and 2014. Renewed in 2012 by a 70 percent majority, the surtax is projected to collect \$700 million until it expires in 2024. The distribution of Penny for Pasco funds is 45 percent to the Pasco County government, 45 percent to Pasco County schools and 15 per-

cent to Pasco County cities. Kuhn cited a litany of projects that Penny for Pasco helped fund, including Zephyrhills City Hall, renovations to the high school and future projects in the city that are slated if the measure passes. Renewal of the program will be on this November's ballot.

MOMENTS IN TIME

The History Channel

- On Oct. 27, 1904, the New York City subway opens. The line traveled 9.1 miles through 28 stations. More than 100,000 people paid a nickel each to take their first ride. Today there are 26 lines, the longest running 32 miles.
- On Oct. 28, 1998, the Digital Millennium Copyright Act is signed into law. The act strengthened copyright protections and allowed copyright holders to issue "takedown" notices to individuals or companies who engaged in infringing use of a copyrighted work.
- On Oct. 29, 1969, Bobby Seale, a member of the "Chicago Eight," is gagged during his murder trial on orders of the judge to stop Seale's outbursts. The "Chicago Eight" were charged with crossing state lines to cause anti-war demonstrations in Chicago. Seale was eventually sentenced to 48 months in prison for the outbursts alone, but the murder portion of his trial ended with a hung jury and the contempt charges were dropped.
- On Oct. 30, 1864, the town of Helena, Montana, is founded by four gold miners at a location they called Last Chance Gulch. Miners flooded to the area by the thousands, finding \$19 million in gold in four years. By 1894, Helena was the capital of Montana.
- On October 31, 1955, out of loyalty to the crown, England's Princess Margaret announced she would not marry Group Captain Peter Townsend. His divorced status would have forced her to give up her royal title, Civil List allowance, and place in the line of succession to the
- On November 1, 1941, Ansel Adams shot a picture of a moonrise over Hernandez, New Mexico, that would become one of photography's most famous images. Adams made more than 1,300 prints of it during his career including one that sold at a Sotheby's auction for \$609,600 in 2006.
- On November 2, 1862, Mary Todd Lincoln wrote to her husband about the public sentiment against General George B. McClellan's cautious command, saying people "would almost worship you if you would put a fighting general in the place of McClellan." The president followed her advice.



Breast CANCER awareness MONTH

Potential warning signs for breast cancer

Breast cancer is the most commonly occurring cancer in women across the globe. According to the World Cancer Research Fund International, there more than 2.26 million new cases of breast cancer in women in 2020. Such figures are sobering, but it's important to recognize that breast cancer survival rates have improved dramatically in recent decades, providing hope to the millions of women who may be diagnosed with the disease in the years to come.

Various factors have helped to improve breast cancer survival rates, and education about the disease is certainly among them. Women are their own greatest allies against breast cancer, and learning to spot its signs and symptoms is a great first step in the fight against this potentially deadly, yet treatable

Knowing your body

The American Cancer Society urges women to take note of how their breasts normally look and feel. That knowledge is vital because it helps women recognize when something does not look or feel good to the touch with their breasts. Screening alone may not be sufficient, as the ACS notes that mammograms do not find every breast cancer.

Signs and symptoms

When women are well acquainted with how their breasts look and feel, they're in better position to recognize any abnormalities, which may or may not be indicative of breast cancer. The ACS reports that the following are some potential warning signs of breast cancer.

• A new lump or mass: The ACS indicates that this is the most common symptom of breast cancer. A lump or mass that is cancerous is often painless, but hard and has

irregular edges. However, lumps caused by breast cancer also can be soft, round and tender. Some even cause pain.

- Swelling: Some experience women swelling of all or part of a breast even if they don't detect a lump.
- Dimpling: skin on the breast may dimple. When this occurs, the skin on the breast sometimes mimics the look of an orange
- Pain: Pain on the breast or nipple could indicate breast cancer.
- Retraction: Some women with breast cancer experience retraction, which occurs when the nipple turns inward.

• Ŝkin abnormalities: Breast cancer may cause the skin on the breast to redden, dry out, flake, or thicken.





How to plan for post-retirement medical expenses



People need to be aware of the potential costs of medical care in retirement and plan ahead so they can meet those obligations if and when the need

When individuals retire, they not only walk away from work, but also relinquish thier steady paychecks. For many, retirement can be a potentially risky financial endeavor. Saving for retirement is a great way to mitigate such risk, but unforeseen expenses, such as medical bills, can quickly derail a retirement plan.

As of 2022, people can contribute up to \$3,650 for an individual or \$7,300 for a family per year into a health savings account. After age 55, an additional \$1,000 per year is allowed. Money in an HSA grows tax-free and it can be spent tax-free on qualified medical expenses. Once a person has Medicare, he or she no longer is eligible to contribute to the HSA, but can use money already in the account to pay for qualified medical expenses that are not covered by Medicare.

Long-term care insurance is another option, and many people invest in such an account during their 50s or 60s. The earlier an individual enrolls in a program, the lower the premium. According to Personal Capital, most poli-cies will not start until a patient has needed assistance for 90 days and other qualifying guidelines are met. Generally speaking, long-term care insurance also is use-or-lose. If there's never a need to use the insurance, it will not be refunded. This is a risk that certain people are willing to take.






