Pirates steal 39-18 comeback win over Coyotes



The undefeated Pirates run out onto the field before Monday night's home game against Cypress Creek.

In a battle of unbeatens, Pasco rallied from an early deficit with 25 unanswered points to improve to 5-0

Halfway through his first season and they're already chanting the name of new Pasco coach Alphonso Freeney.

"Freeney! Freeney! Freeney!"

That chant came from football players and cheerleaders in the Pirates' end zone after Monday's 29-18

comeback win over Cypress Creek at W.F. Edwards Stadium in Dade City. The home team came out on top in a battle of unbeatens in a game postponed by three days due to Hurricane Ian.

Pasco improved to 5-0 while Cypress Creek fell to 4-1. Before this week's game the Florida High School Athletic Association ranked Pasco second and Cypress Creek third in Suburban Class 3A, Region 2.

Not since the days of former coach Tom McHugh, now an assistant at Zephyrhills, has Pasco gotten off to such a strong start. The Pirates had an eight-year playoff run with two region finals and one state semifinal appearances during that span.

Now, however, it's time for a new winning regime to take over.

Bulldogs rout Wildcats 42-0

Scoring on offense, defense and special teams, the Bulldogs thrashed the Wildcats on Monday's make-up game

Wesley Chapel head coach Tony Egan had a plan. He knew his young squad would not be able to keep up with visiting Zephyrhills. He scripted a game of ball control, of keep-away from the Bulldog offense. It worked great at the start. The Wildcats received the opening kick off and led off with a steady dose of junior running back Wesley Young. He only gained seven yards on three tries

He only gained seven yards on three tries but an offsides penalty on the Bulldogs gave the Wildcats a 4th-and-short from their own 20yard line. A direct snap to Dylan McGinnis got the first down. The Wildcats were then backed up by a false start penalty and a tackle-for-loss by Bulldog Maddox Rivera, setting up a 3rdand-12.

Egan's plan was working. The Wildcat offense had already gobbled up almost nine minutes of the first quarter when disaster struck. The Wesley Chapel quarterback heaved an errant pass on that third down and Zephyrhills's DJ Pickett intercepted it and took it to the house for a 45-yard return. Just like that and without an offensive snap, the Bulldogs led 7-0.

"Our defense did well stopping them on third and fourth down but they were able to make some plays to extend drives," Bulldog head coach Nick Carroll said.

The Wildcats went right back to their ball

East Pasco escapes the devastation felt in other areas with just a few power outages and tree damage left *in the aftermath*

Early projections by the national weather service and various emergency management organizations had Hurricane Ian staying out into the Gulf of Mexico and moving parallel northward along the west coast of Florida. As is the case for nearly all storms and hurricanes, however, that trajectory ultimately changed.

Even though the major hurricane veered inward and made landfall in Fort Myers, Zephyrhills and the surrounding areas of east and central Pasco were spared for the most part. The county got off relatively easy compared to other parts of the Sunshine State that suffered devastating flooding, power outages and tree damage due to heavy rains and high winds.

Ian came in as a category 4 hurricane with closures and evacuations taking place in numerous counties and municipali-ties in west central Florida along with the middle part of that state. The city issued a state of emergency and some power outages and flooding were reported.

"We prepared for the worse and prayed for the best," said Shane LeBlanc, the city's public works director. "We definitely

dodged a bullet."

City manager Billy Poe shared that sentiment: "Fortunately enough, we didn't take the brunt of it. Pasco County got so lucky.

A debris cleanup began on Monday. City staff swept through neighborhoods picking up debris from the bands of wind that ripped through the area.

After last Wednesday, LeBlanc said city staff dealt with some power outages that included residences and traffic signals, as well as flooding, the latter of which was a chief concern.

All that paled into comparison of people in south Florida that lost their homes and places like Pine Island and Sanibel Causeway, the latter of which is no longer accessible to the mainland after parts of the road washed away.

"That was the first thing I thought of besides the heartbreak of losing their homes," LeBlanc said of floods.

Poe praised city staff for its preparations and immediate re-

sponse to the area's comparably minimal damage. "Staff did a great job preparing the city for the storm," he said, adding that the city's police department stepped up when some traffic signals were out temporarily. "We took all the precautions. We were prepared and staged; ready to go.'

As for the county, most government offices were closed late last week. That included libraries, senior centers, building and construction services and extension offices, animal services, parks and boat ramps. Additionally, there was temporary suspension of residential and commercial trash and recycling collection services

Additionally, the county opened emergency shelters, al-though none were in Zephyrhills. The closest shelter was at Cen-tennial Middle School, just north of the city. Other local shelters included the Cypress Creek High/Middle School complex,



Wesley Chapel High, Wiregrass Ranch High, Weightman Middle and Pasco Middle.

Sand bags also were available at Pasco County Fire Rescue Station 29 on Dairy Road.

On a brighter note, Hurricane Ian was not the only historical event that took place last Wednesday when a healthy baby girl actually was born in the parking lot of AdventHealth Zephyrhills.

Hospital officials reported that parents from Sumter County pulled into the parking lot when the mother began experiencing contractions. Clinical care teams rushed outside to deliver baby Kieralynn.

By early this week, AdventHealth hospitals in Pasco County (including locations in Zephyrhills, Dade City and Wesley Chapel) resumed normal hospital operations, including regular visitation and outpatient services. That included elective procedures, which were temporarily put on hold as the hurricane made its path across the state.

Breast CANCER awareness MONTH

The link between diet and breast cancer

Cancer is an insidious disease that affects just about every part of the body, including the breasts. The World Cancer Research Fund International indicates there were more than 2.26 million new cases of breast cancer in women in 2020.

Women understandably want to learn what they can do to reduce their risk of developing breast cancer. One of the first considerations may be analyzing diet and determining if it is affecting breast cancer risk.

A variety of factors affect a woman's risk for developing breast cancer, and certain lifestyle choices, including diet, can play a role. However, according to Healthline, the risk factors with the biggest impact include sex, age and genetics. Lifestyle can influence breast cancer risk but not at the same levels as genetic markers, family history, gender, or age. However, women interested in doing all they can to stay healthy may want to take a closer look at the foods and beverages that can adversely affect breast cancer risk.

Healthy diet

Healthy food choices are linked to lower incidences of cancer and other conditions. Susan G. Komen states that eating plenty of fruits and vegetables may be linked to a lower risk of developing breast cancer. A pooled analysis of data from 20 studies found women who ate the most vegetables had a lower risk of estrogen receptor-negative breast cancer (but not estrogen receptor-positive breast cancer) compared to women who ate the least vegetables, according to a 2013 report published in the

Journal of the National Cancer Institute. And it doesn't really matter if produce is organic or not. According to the American Cancer Society, the benefits of eating fresh fruits and vegetables outweigh any health risks linked to pesticide residue.

The complex relationship between fat, sugar and cancer

Though a single food will not lead to higher breast cancer risk, overeating and putting on excess weight can increase risk. That is why it is essential to get plenty of exercise each week and monitor calorie consumption. While women who are in their reproductive years may not see as much breast cancer risk from being overweight or obese, after menopause, that risk increases, says Susan G. Komen. The risk is not directly related to fatty foods, however. The American Cancer Society says an examination of the amount of fat eaten by women in the United States found no link between fat and breast cancer risk.

In addition, while consuming too much

sugar may not be healthy in the long run, it's a myth that "sugar feeds cancer." Eating sugar may lead to weight gain, which may increase the risk of breast cancer, says the ACS.

Alcohol consumption

One component of diet that has been studied extensively is the effects of alcoholic beverages on breast cancer risk. Susan G. Komen reports that a pooled analysis of data from 53 studies found women who had two to three alcoholic drinks per day had a 20 percent higher risk of breast cancer compared to those who didn't drink alcohol. Alcohol should be limited to one drink per day for the average woman, or none at all, if possible.

Diet is only one factor in the risk for developing breast cancer. While important, there are other components that increase risk by a more significant margin.

control strategy. Four plays later, the first quarter had expired. The Wildcats faked the punt on fourth down but failed to convert after a seven-play drive. It was now 10:33 left in the half when the Bulldog offense took over at their own 45-yard line. Four plays later, the Bulldogs were in the end zone again. A great run on a jet sweep by Theodore Sands, setup a 15-yard touchdown from Brendyn Colella to Pickett.

Now 14-0 Bulldogs, the Wildcats kept up the game plan. A personal foul on Zephyrhills extended the Wesley Chapel drive but ultimately the Wildcats turned the ball over on downs, albeit with just 2:47 left in the half.

Again, the Bulldogs wasted no time. On their third play of the drive, the jet sweep turned in another big play. This time it was Rivera slicing right through the Wildcat defense for a 45-yard score. The 21-0 score held until halftime.

Then the wheels came off for the Wildcats. Roe Miller would take the third quarter kickoff and return it 78 yards for a touchdown and the rout was on. The Wildcats assembled another long drive with eight plays and a first down run by Jaylahn Lewis driving the pile for five extra yards but they fumbled three plays later, Zephyrhills recovering. In a three-year span under former coach Jason Stokes the Pirates did not make the playoffs. That seems to be a stretch that will change this season with Pasco now the frontrunner as a potential district champion.

For his part, Cypress Creek coach Mike Johnson praised his team for taking a lead in the third period and battling despite losing a handful of players to injuries during the game. "They're a good ball club," he said of the

"They're a good ball club," he said of the Pirates, adding that his players "were pretty upset. I can't say enough about my guys. They just work so hard. I think toward the end we ran out of gas a little bit."

The teams traded a pair of touchdowns early. Zyon Davis halted Pasco's opening drive by returning an interception from the end zone 100 yards down the right sideline for a touchdown and Malachi Askin ran in a two-point conversion. Askin added a 4-yard touchdown run in between scoring runs of 9 and 21 yards by Tayshaun Balmir.

A 35-yard field goal by Cameron Canard, his longest of the season, gave the Coyotes an Gulf's Adrian Golden in 2008.

With 1,200 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns so far, Balmir is putting up numbers in the range of Janarion Grant and Troy Hambrick, arguably the best running backs in school history. Grant played for Rutgers and is now with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football league, while Hambrick starred at South Carolina before playing in the National Football League for the Dallas Cowboys and Arizona Cardinals.

Added Johnson, "He's the real deal. He is one heck of a football player. He runs angry."

The final score of the game came midway through the fourth quarter when Willie Reed returned an interception 72 yards for a touchdown.

Leading the way for Cypress Creek were Askin and quarterback Jack Niemann. Askin gained 68 yards and now has 594 rushing yards with nine touchdowns this season. Niemann passed for 112 yards to increase his season total to 874.

Wiregrass Ranch aims for turnaround after season-opening 5-5 tie with perennial powerhouse East Lake

Wiregrass Ranch High's club ice hockey team is about a half dozen years removed from being a solid playoff contender in the Lightning High School Hockey League, but that dismal trend could be changing soon. The Bulls are coming off a 9-13 season for a fifth-place finish in the Andreychuk Division of the Western Conference.

After six straight losing seasons, the resurgent Bulls appear to be on the cusp of a major turnaround. If this year's fast start provides any indication of things to come a possible post-season berth becomes a feasible option for the 2022-23 season.

Wiregrass Ranch opened this season with a solid 5-5 tie against perennial powerhouse East Lake, which has a few state titles and a longstanding playoff run to its credit. The Eagles were league finalists last year and do not appear to have lost much to graduation.

Even more impressive with that tie is the fact that the Bulls built up a solid 5-3 lead before hanging on as the Eagles rallied on a late pair of goals in the third period.

"East Lake is just a fantastic hockey team," said Wiregrass Ranch assistant Kevin Corbett, adding that his players picked it up and turned around a 2-1 deficit into a 5-3 lead before the Eagles got their two late goals. "My comment in the first period was you're playing a team that doesn't give you time and space."

Through the first three games of the season, Wiregrass Ranch had yet to lose. The Bulls went 2-0-1 in the early going.

> So far, they have five of a possible six points, just one behind longtime state contender Tampa Jesuit. They sandwiched 9-4 and 12-1 wins over Freedom and Tampa Catholic, respectively, around that tie with East Lake.

> Corbett and head coach John Scoby replaced J. Powers, who now is an assistant at River Ridge, in the offseason. Corbett credits Scoby's optimistic outlook and enthusiasm, in part, for the turnaround.

> "The buy-in is that the kids are really playing for each other," Corbett said. "Coach Scoby has got them fired up. He gets the chemistry of the team working real well."

> Speed has been a factor in the Bulls' fast start. The sophomore-laden team is focused on keeping their skates moving at all times.

> "Our team is a bunch of young kids that really go hard," said Corbett, who at 63 still plays on an adult hockey team at AdventHealth Center Ice in Wesley Chapel.

One of those young skaters is newcomer Terence Lavasseur. As he has done all season, Levasseur led the team in scoring against East Lake with two goals and an assist. His second goal in the third period gave the Bulls a 5-3 lead before the Eagles rallied to tie it.

"Anytime I see a kid reaching for the puck his feet are still and you don't see that with Terence," Corbett said.

A transfer from Montreal, Levasseur had a hat trick and six points against Freedom. His skating ability is second to none and he does not hesitate to shoot the puck when he gets open and use a defenseman for a screen shot. Plus, Lavasseur has enough hockey sense to pass off the puck to a teammate when he gets double-teamed.

Through three games Lavasseur led the team with 10 points, three more than Aiden Bishop and Sean Campbell.

Wiregrass Ranch had a strong turnout this season, which warranted a junior varsity team. The Bulls did not have a JV team last season.
