Governor pays another impromptu visit to Zephyrhills

Ron DeSantis stops at Bahr's Aluminum to discuss an upcoming special session

Governor Ron DeSantis paid his second impromptu visit to Zephyrhills this year and third overall on Monday morning. He stopped at Bahr's Aluminum for a press conference to discuss details of an upcoming

"I could run for the county commission in Pasco, I've been here so many times," he jokingly said at the beginning of his address. "We have got to stand up for people and protect their jobs; protect their livelihoods." Amid a contingent of supporters that included

State Senate President Wilton Simpson and State Senator Danny Burgess, the governor said that the special session would focus on several key issues.

Mainly, give teeth to the parent's bill of rights with parents being able to make health choices for their own children; continue the opposition to vaccine mandates being imposed by the federal government, which threaten people's jobs; and supporting police, fire and health workers, along with other essential employees.

We want people to be able to work," DeSantis said. "We don't want to discriminate against them because of their health choices."

State Senator is running to become Florida's Agriculture Commissioner

Kickoff for Wilton Simpson's campaign starts with a barbecue at family's ranch in Trilby

An announcement that State Senator Wilton Simpson (R-Trilby) was running for agriculture commissioner came in September. Sharing it with longtime family friends, those who he has worked with and ardent supporters took place at his ranch last Thursday night.

The kickoff party, which he envisioned might draw about 100 people, was more in the 500 range.

"It's such an honor to have you come out tonight. You could've done other things, Simpson addressed the crowd before musical entertainment and the barbecue was served up by Alan John and his crew.

Simpson briefly mentioned several issues, such as comparing tax rates of New York and Florida and how the Sunshine State is utilizing more for less. Perhaps most importantly, he said, "We're trying to get ahead of the 1,000 people a day who are moving here."

Heading up the state's agricultural department is something Simpson believes is right up his alley. Things like ensuring funds are available to restore the everglades, making sure people still were able to work during the heyday of the coronavirus pandemic are some of the matters Simpson has addressed during his 12-year tenure in the Florida Senate.

'This is actually something I've done all my life," said Simpson, president of the Florida Senate since 2020. "It's been an honor to produce food for people all my life, so it would be an honor to be in that position.'

Simpson heard endorsements from many like State Senator Danny Burgess, a longtime family friend who has worked alongside Simpson in Tallahassee. Burgess had a prior engage-

ment, but wrote a strong endorsement. "I typically would never ask you to join me in supporting a particular candidate for





Doling out \$5,000 signing bonuses for law enforcement employees who opt to leave a state that is currently mandating vaccines to come to Florida is one way in which the governor plans to deal with the matter. To bolster that stance, a small gathering heard from several people.

Lisa Williams, a single mother from Tampa and longtime flight attendant for a major airline, had an adverse reaction after receiving a shot. She bemoaned the fact that she cannot get help for her medical issues from her employer.

'We are not anti-vaccine, we are anti-mandate," she said be-

fore praising the governor's stance. A local business owner addressed questions he had over how his employees and contractors would be affected by the mandates and was unsure of who the new rules applied to. Doc Hyder, president of Rowland Transportation in Dade City, said

he could not afford to let people go if they did not get a shot and that it would be devastating to his business.

"It makes no sense to us," he said. "The vaccine mandate will mean more chaos in the supply chain."

People at the gathering also heard from a Hillsborough County Sheriff's deputy and a Red Cross worker, both of whom are opposed to the vaccine mandate.

DeSantis reiterated that vaccine mandates are unconstitutional and violate freedom of choice.

"They're threatening to potentially deprive individuals and people that we need," he said. "They're threatening to throw out people from work in the state of Florida. We have a responsibility to protect Floridians, regardless of these mandates."

Well aware of the governor's actions in facing vaccine mandates, mask mandates at business and in schools, Simpson noted the importance of keeping people at work and the state's economy going during the coronavirus pandemic.

Florida is the shining state on the hill that we always talk about," said Simpson, who is running for agriculture commis-

sioner. "We're going to stand up for all our workers in this state." Keeping the state open for business and keeping a Florida free agenda is a must, noted Chris Sprowls, Speaker of the Florida House of Representatives.

'This is vital to the strength of Florida, the strength of Florida families," he said.

Looking forward to the special session, DeSantis said, "I'm proud we're going to do something that matters. We're going to be saving a lot of jobs in Florida. We're going to be fighting for freedom.

and exercise with the other kids."

Following a one-year hiatus due to the coronavirus pandemic, the torch run was revived at a new location. The annual fundraiser traditionally began on the track at Pasco High School's W.F. Edwards Stadium, meandered throughout the downtown Dade City area and wound up at the Old Historic Courthouse. There were water stations along the way and plenty of supporters along the route.

This year's event took place at the Wiregrass Ranch Sports Campus of Pasco County, a sprawling sports facility that opened in 2000. The torch run is likely to continue at its current location.

Amanda Hunter, the sheriff's public information manager, noted that shifting the torch run to the sports campus solves the issue of changing traffic patterns in an urban area. Before, traffic had to be re-routed and there were concerns about the safety of the participants.

"It's a little easier to have it at a facility like this," she said. "It's a lot safer for the athletes."

Richard Blalock, chief executive officer of RADDSports at the sports campus, said he welcomes opportunities to work with law enforcement, fire departments and other service agencies. When approached by sheriff's office officials he said he was happy to be able to help

"These are the types of things we want to do," he said. "It's a win-win for everybody."

Unlike the previous torch runs in which Nocco led a contingent of law enforcement runners/walkers, Special Olympians from Pasco



and Hernando counties, and numerous family members and supporters through downtown Dade City, a walk around the soccer field proved sufficient.

Some participants took more than one lap with three being the equivalent of one mile. Either way, the walk, which included a lighted torch passed from Nocco to deputy Ray Meunier, aboard Samson with the Pasco Sheriff's Posse, proved beneficial for the cause.

"Go out and have a fun day," the sheriff urged participants. "This is one of the great

days that makes me happy."

Cypress Creek, led by coaches Will Fulmer and Angel Ramos, brought 23 Special Olympians to the walk. They were among other special athletes who also got to play kick ball and throw footballs at targets drawn out on a net.

"It's a blessing," said Fulmer, who also is an assistant coach for Cypress Creek's varsity football team. "These kids try 100 per-

cent every second they're out there."

Added deputy Larry Roberts, a former Pasco High football and track standout, "It's a big deal to give to those who are not as fortunate as others; who are challenged in life. It makes us happy to put a smile on

their faces." Nocco thanked everyone for coming and tossed the football around with some of the special athletes. Other representatives of the sheriff's office played kickball with them.

Another popular attraction were three horses from the sheriff's posse. They were ridden by Meunier, Diane Shefts and Marnie Bennett with Taylor Nutt along to assist.



Bulldogs dominate Pirates in this year's 9-Mile War game

Playoff-bound Zephyrhills wins 56-0 while Pasco finishes a dismal season without a victory

The dire warning from coach Nick Carroll not to overlook winless Pasco in last Friday night's 9-Mile War at Bulldog Stadium really was not necessary. Host Zephyrhills crushed its

longtime nemesis 56-0.

For playoff-bound Zephyrhills it marked one of the most lopsided outcomes in the storied rivalry, which began in 1941 and at 63 matchups is the oldest and fiercest in Pasco County history. The Bulldogs, who have won six of the past seven games in the 9-Mile War, narrowed Pasco's all-time lead in the series to

"I'm happy for the kids and the coaches," Carroll said. "It's always good to beat Pasco, because you never know. It's always nice to get a

win against our rival."

Zephyrhills heads into the playoffs against St. Petersburg Gibbs this Friday at home with a 9-1 record while Pasco's season ends at 0-10. Carroll feels the rivalry will be more competitive someday, reasoning that "eventually they are going to be back. There's too much rich tradition and history at Pasco."

While the game was unlike many of the previous close battles between the rivals, the sparse attendance also was not indicative of previous Zephyrhills-Pasco matchups. Due in part to Pasco's dismal record along with rain that soaked the area throughout the day, Bulldog Stadium was literally half-empty. By halftime many of those people had left.

It was nothing like many of the past match-ups, some of which Carroll labeled "electrify-

Zephyrhills wasted little time getting on the scoreboard against Pasco. The defense

forced the Pirates to punt after the game's first three plays and the Bulldogs needed just one play to score with Maguire Neal on the receiv-ing end of Jaxson Rivera's 17-yard touchdown

Jaylin Thomas then scored the first of his two touchdowns in the first half. The senior running back, who has rushed for at least 100 yards in eight games this year, plunged into the end zone from a yard out on a drive set up by his 46-yard burst down the right sideline.

Rivera then hit Jakobe Campbell on a slant-in from the left side for an 18-yard touchdown pass, his second of the game, before Thomas added a 30-yard scoring run.

Willie Queen added an 18-yard touch-

down run and Campbell scooped up a fumble and scored from 36 yards out to help stake the Bulldogs to a 43-0 halftime lead.

Defensively, Theotis Smith caused two Pasco fumbles and recovered another, and Lawrence Graham had an interception. All of those turnovers came in the first half.

A notable play, which made history, also took place in the first half when backup defensive tackle Annaleese Thomas run the football into the end zone off left tackle for a two-point conversion. The 5-foot-3 senior, who lined up in the offensive backfield alongside Smith for that play, is the only female football player for Zephyrhills to ever score in a game.

That's a play we put in for her," Carroll said. "She is a great kid and a great addition to our team. We all accept her as another player and we're happy for her."

Thomas, who often plays on the defensive line late in lopsided games, held the ball aloft on the sidelines afterward as teammates cheered for her.

The second half went by fast, thanks to a running clock that is implemented when a team is ahead by 35 points or more after the break.

Queen added his second touchdown, this time on a 76-yard kickoff return and backup quarterback R.J. Allen completed a 25-yard scoring pass to Xavier Garroway.



HOLLYWOOD -- James Bond looks pretty good for a 58 year old. Bond first appeared on May 8, 1963 in the guise of Sean Connery in "To Russia With Love." Daniel Craig, 53, the sixth actor to embody Bond, has gotten people back into movie theaters and broken box-office records worldwide with his latest and last film, "No Time to Die." But Craig's fifth and final Bond film leaves him two short of the record holder, Roger Moore, who played 007 seven times between 1973 and 1985. He was preceded by Sean Connery, who gave him life five times from 1963-1983.

As much fun as Bond movies are, the 26 films (not counting the one-off 1967 comedy "Casino Royale," with four male and four female stars playing Bond) won only five Oscars, for visual effects, sound editing and the song "Skyfall," and none for acting. Collectively, the franchise has earned almost \$7 billion globally. The single top-grosser was "Skyfall" (2012), which netted \$1.1 billion. The search for the new Bond has begun.

Scarlett Johansson has settled her lawsuit with Disney. Disney had agreed to a 90day theater run of her film "Black Widow," but started streaming it on Disney+ after 45 days for \$30 a pop. Johansson sued for the 45-day percentage she lost from the streaming move. Disney had assumed her \$20 million payday covered it, but rather than face a lengthy court trial with the entire movie industry waiting for a big payday precedent, they settled out of court and signed a non-disclosure settlement.

Also wanting her day in court is Lisa Renna (wife of Harry Hamlin), former star of "Days of Our Lives," "Melrose Place" and currently "The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills." A photo agency is suing Renna for \$1.2 million for posting eight photos of herself with her two adult daughters on her own Instagram page. The agency is suing because, "Once a photograph is posted, People Magazine or US Weekly are less likely to buy it." Copyright laws generally protect writers or images produced through creative effort. It seems absurd that celebrities can't use photographs of themselves taken by others, especially those taken in public without their consent (Renna says, "My kids grew up with them jumping out of the bushes in Malibu"). Still want to be a celebrity?

DC Comics are taking Superman where he's never gone before. Jon Kent, the 17-yearold son of Clark Kent (Superman) and Lois Lane, is coming out as bisexual in the Nov. 9 release in "Superman: Son of Kal-El No. 5, in which he shares a romantic kiss with reporter Jay Nakamura. Proving once again ... "A kiss is NOT just a kiss!"


