Owners and organizers Randy and Teresa Yoho have been in a quandary the last few months. The couple owns franchises Mud Endeavor and Bug Jam and usually runs motocross events on the dirt track at

the Pasco County Fairgrounds. The global COVID-19 pandemic changed all that. All three enterprises were shut down in late February. The very nature of the events was just not conducive to social distance. As the peak of the outbreak wound up over the summer, a whole season of events were cancelled.

Finally, as infection rates began to fall in October, the couple put on their Castle Canyon obstacle course race in Brooksville. They adapted the event, letting smaller groups in a staggered start, go off on the course.

By the weekend of Nov. 7-8, the 2020 Bug Jam went on. Masks were required for indoor activity and food service vendors also wore them but the event was


### **Constitution** essay contest winners announced

Pasco fifth-graders draw inspiration from culture, history

At once dazzled and intrigued by the hit musical Hamilton, Bexley Elementary fifthgrader Lucy Butler penned an inspired fan letter to the United States' founding document that earned her top honors in the Eighth Annual Pasco County Clerk & Comptroller Constitution Essay Contest.

## Stormwater plan and Zephyr **Commons headline council meeting**

Monday's City Council meeting advanced a number of projects and proposals


If you think Zephyrhills isn't a town on the move, you've not attended any recent city council meetings. Municipal construction projects, housing developments, rezonings and updates on existing projects have all the earmarks of a rapidly-growing city, trying to develop in an effi-

cient manner. Three Consent Agenda items started off the meeting. Item 1.1 was merely an acceptance of the Oct. 26 meeting minutes. Item 1.2 authorized the purchase of a tractor/finish mower for the parks division. The price tag was \$54,090 but included the John Deere Small Agricultural 2-wheel drive tractor and a number of other accessories and upgrades. Item 1.3 authorized purchase of a tree chipper for the streets division. The trailer-mounted brush chipper together with upgrades totaled \$76,499. Both the chipper and tractor were under the budget line item in the city's budget and all three items were bundled and passed 4-0.

Business Item 2.1 asked council to approve hiring Kimberly-Horn and Associates, Inc. to conduct a Stormwater Master Plan for the city. It was noted by Zephyrhills Public Works Director Shane LeBlanc that such a study had not been done since 1999 and that typically the designs are done every five years. Early discussion revolved around the project's price tag, coming in just under \$250,000, \$75,000 of which will be covered by

Penny for Pasco, the rest by the city. Some of the benefits of the study that were discussed included - laying out a master plan with identified "hot spots" and recommendations for remediation, also that the master plan would be an important tool when it comes to applying for federal or state appropriations for proj-

## Local students earn scholarships at Baldwin Wallace University

What she discovered gave her confidence about the future of her country, even during "an election year and with COVID-19 happening as well.

"The U.S Constitution protects the rights of American citizens. In our country, the government does not hold us back from being free. We can say or write what we want (unless it's plagiarism), we can choose our religion, and we can protest things that aren't fair. The Constitution also gives us the right to vote (but you have to be 18 or older and registered).

Making certain she did not throw away her shot, Butler backed up her research with a shout-out to Hamilton and Federalist Papers co-authors James Madison and John Jay, making arguments for the Constitution that resonate with her today.

Wrote one of the judges, an instructor of English and professional writing at Saint Leo University, "The introduction paragraph is so interesting and conversational that I was immediately pulled into the essay and wanted to read more. Great idea to connect Alexander Hamilton to the modern musical and use it to engage the reader."

Essays by Oakstead Elementary 10-yearolds Derek Knoedler and Britany Fissehaye claimed second and third place, respectively.

Knoedler extolled the virtues of the Constitution's "building blocks of our governing system," creating "checks and balances to ensure that no one has too much power." He also gave a nod to the framers who realized though their document "was good it wasn't without its flaws. So, amendments were added to the Constitution to make it better.'

For Fissehaye, the Constitution is personal. She notes the 19th Amendment granted women the right to vote, and the 13th Amendment abolished slavery. "No more African Americans like me must live in such a terrible way," she wrote. She also exhibited a keen grasp of the Unit-

ed States as a republic.

When the Constitution says, 'WE THE PEOPLE,' it's trying to express that the people have power. Like in the case of voting. First, we have all the power, then we loan a small part of that to the governors, senators and representatives that will be us in the government. So, technically, if they do their job right, we still have the power through voting!"

Essays earning honorable mention were submitted by Saksham Batra, Henry Perez, Heidi Keck, Alyssa Kasubinski (Oakstead), Dequrez Gulley Jr. (Athenian Academy of Technology and the Arts), Kayla Golden and Ashley Parenton (Longleaf).

"Many of [the essays] moved me deeply (even some that are not in the top 10)," wrote the Saint Leo instructor, "because of their honesty and fervor."

"These students should all be commended for being brave enough to enter a contest; that takes guts. I often tell students that it takes courage simply to write. Just think – before their act of bravery, all that existed was a blank page. Because they dared to write, words now exist that never before existed and may never exist again.

That is saying something."

Competition sponsor Pasco County Clerk & Comptroller Nikki Alvarez-Sowles, Esq., could not agree more.

'Congratulations to all who entered in this extremely difficult year," she said. "The courage of so many young people choosing to write and compete when so much seems at loose ends gives me confidence that the rock of our republic – our Constitution – will make sure we







otherwise completely outside. Many attendees elected to wear masks outside, just to take one further precautionary step but the sentiment that it was great to have the event was universal.

'We had monthly shows in Orlando that have been cancelled since February," diecast enthusiast Robb Ortolano said. "I most definitely appreciate the opportunity to be here. It's a relief to get back to some sense of

Ortolano, masked up, was setup indoors with his collection of over 150,000 die-cast cars. Collecting since 1996, Ortolano had Hot Wheels, Matchbox and other brand die-cast cars ranging from 50 cents to \$250.

Ortolano was not the only vendor happy to have an event. Don Ammann of McNabb Group Parts & Accessories was on hand, selling rare parts for pre-1979 air-cooled Volkswagen

Ammann shared some of the history of VW Bugs. By the late 1950s, Bugs were being imported to the United States from Germany. They were air-cooled vehicles, as in, no radiator - just air cooling the engine. 1979 was the last year the cars were imported. Manufacturing of the VW Bugs transferred to Mexico after 1979, the VW Buses being made in Brazil. Ammann specializes in the hard-to-find parts for these vehicles and even journeyed to the back lot where used parts were lying out in heaps.

"You have to know what you're looking for and you can find gold over there," Ammann

The 2020 Bug Jam was in doubt until sometime in September when Ammann got a call from Randy Yoho.

"He (Yoho) wanted to see if we would commit to being at the event," Ammann said. "Once he got approval to do it, we were all-in."

The event, one of the largest in the state

and region, annually attracts about 600 Bugs on Saturday and as many as 5,000 on Sunday. Ammann said that Yoho expected just 40 cars less than the 2019 event.

Dan and Windra Curley of Jacksonville brought their 1965 sunroof VW Bug to the show. They were camped out in an RV, making a whole weekend out of the festivities.

There's bands, food, beer - it's more than just a car show," Dan Curley said. "All the other events we were going to got cancelled. We didn't have our hopes up for this one but we decided to roll with it and see what happened."

Jeremy Gibboney and Rose Rodriguez of Clermont had been rolling with it for quite some time. Gibboney lived out of his 1975 VW Pop Top Westfalia Bus for a year-and-a-half as he drove from Pennsylvania to northern California, where he spent even more time in the Redwood Forests with his two dogs. Gibboney enjoys the simplicity of working on

"They (VWs) have problems from timeto-time but if you have some spare parts and some basic tools, you can fix most things on the road," Gibboney said. "They're easy to work

As the Saturday event gave way to the bigger Sunday event, parades, live music, fair food, DJs, live music and an unmentionable night time host of activities took over the fairgrounds over the weekend, marking what is at the very least a temporary return to normalcy.

Councilman Lance Smith arrived by this vote and the item passed 5-0.

In the Planning Director's Report, annexation and rezoning items were discussed and passed 5-0. The annexation dealt with a 37.61acre parcel north of Sam Pasco Park, where Skybird Properties intends to build a 180-unit subdivision. The action Monday on the item was just a transmittal meeting, meaning that a formal public hearing will now be held regarding the project. Outside of the annexation, the proposal asked for a zoning change to R3.

It was noted by senior planner Todd Vande Berg and independent planners and engineers that much of the infrastructure was already intact on the property. Much discussion emerged regarding the right-of-way buffering the proposed development with Meadowood Estates.

Item 3.2 discussed the rezoning and proposal for a 12-acre parcel at Zephyr Commons. The zoning change sought to move from C2 to R4 (multi-family residential). The parcel was annexed by the city in 2004, and it was thought that it would be a primarily commercial enterprise but proposals for a more residential project emerged on Monday. There was much discussion pertaining to access points, both to the commercial centers and to US Highway 301. Future improvements to Dairy and Wire roads were brought up. The parcel, as proposed, could hold up to 240 units. The notion of morning and evening ingress/egress was a primary concern, the potential overlap with the traffic signal improvement project on 301 between Pretty Pond and Kossick was discussed.

Later in the meeting, Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. noted that the aforementioned traffic signal project had begun.

The Zephyr Commons project first emerg-ed in 2008, before the economic recession. It came

back before council on Monday in a slightly different iteration and was advanced 5-0.

In the Finance Director's Report, director Ted Beason recommended that the city renew their contract with Munibilling, the utility billing provider hired after the Fathom collapse, almost a year to the date. Beason touted the transition and growing familiarity with the new system and that \$270,000 could be saved going forward into the second year of the contract. Beason also noted the integration of certain applications of the billing process and the ability of Munibilling to reach out to customers during times of abnormal usage. The item only required a council vote to change away from

Munibilling. The city will stick with the entity for at least another year.

In the City Manager's Report, item 5.1, approved 5-0, entered the city and Country Oaks RV Park into a 10-year agreement where the park will connect eight units to the municipal sewer system immediately and bring the remaining units online over the course of the next

In the Citizen Comments Section, Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center CEO Pascal Collard and Foundation program director Nick Walton gave updates to both the tennis center and the outreach program by the foundation. Collard touted a USTA tournament set for the third week in January and Walton discussed the programs being delivered at West Elementary, as well as the foundation's scholarship programs. Alex Atteberry spoke briefly, offering his service to the city as an airport operational management company.

In the Council Comments, Poe mentioned that the "clock had started" on the Pretty Pond/301 project.

Councilwoman Jodi Wilkeson asked Poe if there were some metrics that the city was following that would allow further re-opening of businesses and events.

The discussion led to recent cancellations of large holiday events both in Zephyrhills and Dade City. It was discussed how Dade City recently cancelled or changed the format for some of their events.

Poe expressed concern that if Zephyrhills went on with their Christmas parade, that residents from adjacent communities would likely flood the event. The Shops at Wiregrass having cancelled their Symphony in Lights event was noted and Poe brought up the inability to control access points to such an event. Further discussion ensued about how to pare down the format of the event.

The next meeting is set for Dec. 14.
