### City council swears in new ZPD officer, sets charter review questions

Monday's council meeting annexed property, changed zoning and brought on a new ZPD office

The Zephyrhills Police Department grew just a bit on Monday adding officer Paul Fellows. Fellows is a Pasco County native, having graduated from Ridgewood High School. He was part of the ROTC program and transitioned into the United States Marine Corps. Chief Derek Brewer swore Fellows in and the department filled its final vacancy.

Two items came up in unfinished business. Both were regarding developments along Eiland Boulevard and Fort King Highway. Two parcels were already in Zephyrhills city limits, the other two required annexation from Pasco County. The parcels being annexed from Pasco County needed zoning changes updated to city zoning codes. The total area is about 29 acres and has a maximum of 347 dwelling units, averaging to 11.98 units per acre.

Councilman Lance Smith inquired as to a traffic study being conducted in the area and Historic Preservation Specialist Audrey Mc-Guire confirmed that the study was indeed being conducted but was not yet completed.

Additional questions were floated with regard to improvements to Eiland Boulevard, particularly at the intersection of Eiland Boulevard and Fort King Highway and included the addition of turn lanes. The applicant was requesting that all parcels be converted to PUD or Planned Unit Development. Both measures, one confirming the Future Land Use Map Amendment (FLUMA) and one confirming the Planned Unit Development (PUD) rezoning were approved

### **Bulldogs chomp on Bucs in a region quarterfinal**

Brendyn Colella passes for a countyrecord eight touchdowns in district champion Zephyrhills' 56-27 rout of Gulf

District champion Zephyrhills is in the playoffs for the eighth time in nine seasons and it did not take long for the home team to send a message to future opponents. The Bulldogs are capable of scoring at a record pace, readily apparent in a first-round 56-27 rout of Gulf.

That region quarterfinal victory was fueled by a record-setting passing attack. Quarterback Brendyn Colella threw for a single-game Pasco County record eight touchdowns, spread among four wide receiv-

D.J. Pickett had six catches for 164 yards and four touchdowns. Fred Adams had a pair of scoring receptions with Jakobe Campbell and Ted Sands each adding a touchdown catch.

Afterward, Colella and Pickett spoke about their on-field connection. Colella is a junior transfer from Wiregrass Ranch while Pickett, a sophomore, is a former Zephyrhills Athletic League player who spent one season at Carrollwood Day School before return-

"I trust (Pickett) with the ball," said Colella, who completed 12 of 17 passes for 327 yards with an interception. "I just throw it up and he's going to go get

Pickett echoed his quarterback's assessment, saying, "I tell him all he has to do is throw it up and I'm going to go get it."

Colella's eight touchdowns in one game surpassed the previous mark of six shared by a halfdozen quarterbacks. That list includes Zephyrhills' Charles Harrison and Wiregrass Ranch's Rocco Becht, who is now playing at Iowa State. Colella was being groomed as Becht's replacement for the Bulls.

"I'm glad for him. I told him we were going to air it out tonight," Zephyrhills coach Nick Carroll said.

Next up for Zephyrhills (8-3) is a region semifinal at home against Lecanto (8-3). The Bulldogs won the 9-Mile War for a third straight year and hoped for a rematch against Pasco. Lecanto's 45-14 win over the Pirates (9-2) changed that.

Just one week before the playoff game against Gulf, Zephyrhills relied on its running game in the final game of the regular season. The Bulldogs got six rushing touchdowns — led by Rodney Smith's three, two from Ben Raines and Adams' one — in a 42-21 win over Dunnellon.

Running or passing, Carroll noted that his offensive attack is versatile enough to keep defenders guessing. He also noted that a slow start in which Zephyrhills split the first six games proved

to be a learning lesson for his players. "It's a testament to the (earlier) games that we played, that helped get us to where we are now," Carroll said.

As for the game against Gulf, the teams were tied at 7 early. The Bulldogs recovered Gulf's onsides kick attempt and needed just three plays to get on the

In the Consent Agenda, Item 3.1 requested that city council approve a CSX Encroachment Agreement to cross the CSX railroad on Old Lakeland Highway. The city's Northside Lift Station and Force Main project will need to cross the CSX railroad right-of-way on Old Lakeland Hwy. The fiscal impact is \$20,000 and includes permit processing, a CSX flag person and CSX inspections. The item passed 5-0.

Item 3.2 asked for council's approval of the purchase of a chipper truck for the public works department. The total cost of the truck is \$178,607 with \$250,000 budgeted in the FY2022-

Item 3.3 asked for approval to purchase nine vehicles for ZPD and to up-fit an additional police intercept vehicle. The total cost is \$552,508.85 and is under the FY2022-23 budget

Item 3.4 asked for council's approval of a \$412,985 budgeted item to rehabilitate three lift stations in the utilities department.

Item 3.5 asked to award a bid to BGE, Inc. for continuing engineering services. BGE, Inc. had the highest score of the seven firms that submitted Requests for Qualifications and was recommended by the Evaluation Committee.

Item 3.6 asked to award a bid to Alfred Benesch & Company for continuing professional services for the planning and public works departments. Alfred Benesch & Company emerged as the Evaluation Committee's top pick among seven participating firms.

Item 3.7 asked to award a bid to CPH, LLC for continuing professional services for the CRA, planning and public Works Departments.

Item 3.8 asked to award a bid to HCP Associates for continuing professional services for the same aforementioned departments.

Item 3.9 asked to award a bid to G-A-I Consultants for continuing professional services for the same departments.

Item 3.10 asked for approval of the Nov. 9 city council meeting minutes. All Consent Agenda items were bundled and passed 5-0.

In Business Items, Item 4.1 was an annexation of the acreage totaling approximately 30 acres of property located on the north side of Eiland Boulevard and east of Fort King Road, the same parcel that got the rezoning changes in the unfinished business section. The item passed

Item 4.2 was another annexation, this one at 38736 C.R. 54, 1,500 feet from Wire Road. The anticipated development is a 65-unit townhome community with a projected 14 units per acre site plan. Some provisions, such as installing a left turn lane on C.R. 54, a sidewalk on C.R. 54, that the developer connect C.R. 54 to Calumet Avenue, improve Calumet Avenue, and to limit 14 dwelling units per acre, were part of the terms. The annexation eliminates an existing Pasco County enclave and falls inside of the City's Water Use Permit. The item passed

Item 4.3 was a Future Land Use Map Amendment for the same property at 38736 C.R. 54. This item passed 5-0.

Item 4.4 pertained to the proposed Zephyr Storage facility off Gall Boulevard. It asked to approve a conditional use to exceed height limitations of an indoor facility. The applicant requested for a height limit of 29 feet 6 inches (two stories) for the front portion of the development and a limit of 38 feet 8 inches to 40 feet 9 inches (three stories) for the rear portion.

Zephyrhills Planning Director Todd Vande Berg spoke about the enhanced landscaping, how many of the original trees on the property

were preserved. The item passed 5-0.

In the Planning Director's Report, Item 5.1 asked for a rezoning of the former Agape Baptist Church off Chancey Road, near the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport in what senior planner Rodney Corriveau called the city's "Industrial Corridor." The subject property is roughly 10 acres. The area does contain a number of residential properties, so council wants to be careful not to place any heavy industrial business in the area. Just what type of business would be taking up on the parcel was unclear but Corriveau stated that it would likely be a warehouse type of building with retail or office space in the front of it. Only one access road off of Chancey Road currently exists. Another private road could provide a second access point pending approval by the private owner of the road but that seemed unlikely based on the discussion at the dais. The item passed 5-0.

Item 5.2 asked council to approve waiving a match requirement for an Historic Facade Grant as proposed by the American Legion. The Legion wants to refurbish/reconstruct the front porch of their historic building. The historic building is where, in November of 1914, residents voted to incorporate the City of Zephyrhills. The Legion's quote for the work was just \$1,600. The grant provides \$2,500 and requires a \$2,500 match from the applicant. With the total budget for the project falling well under the \$2,500, the Legion asked for the match to be

waived. The item passed 5-0.

In the City Manager's Report, Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. detailed eight questions that will be placed on the April 23, 2023 ballot to change the city's charter. The questions were passed 5-0 and will be put to the pasters in April to other with the electric of the control of t voters in April together with the election of two

city council seats.

The questions were: to designate the City of Zephyrhills being established on Nov. 17, 1914, increasing the term of city council members from three years to four years, allow the finance director to report deposits quarterly instead of at every regular meeting, increase the term of office for mayor from three years to four years, allow newly-elected council members to take their new seat at the next regular meeting, to remove time constraints for prospective council candidates to obtain required signatures, to accept election results at the next regular meeting and to require a charter review every 10 years as opposed to five. This item passed 5-0.

In the City Attorney's Report, city attorney Matthew Maggard read a resolution denoting the 50th anniversary of the Florida Association of City Clerks (FACC). Council members spoke glowingly of city clerk Lori Hillman, with council president Jodi Wilkeson calling Hillman and other clerks, "the glue that holds the council to-

gether." It passed 5-0.

In Citizen Comments, Cliff McDuffie spoke on behalf of the Masonic Lodge at 12th Street and North Avenue. He stated that three non-profits shared the building and that the corner of 12th Street and North Avenue has become a dangerous one. McDuffie spoke of vehicles traveling at high speeds and how their sign was damaged by a motorist. He asked for some sort of barrier to be erected to protect the prop-

Wilkeson directed him to engage with the city manager to find a solution.

Greater Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce President/CEO Vicki Wiggins then asked for council's permission to sell alcohol at the 13th Annual Pigz in Zhills event, Jan. 13-14. council approved 5-0.

# Pasco turnaround ends with first-round playoff loss

Resurgent Pirates made the playoffs for the first time since 2013, but lost 45-14 to Lecanto in a region quarterfinal

Alphonso Freeney came to Pasco to turn things around. The Pirates, who had not made the playoffs since 2013 and were coming off a rare winless season, are now headed in the right direction thanks, in part, to their second-year coach.

That turnaround, however, came to an abrupt halt for Pasco, which broke an eight-year playoff drought with a 9-1 regular season. The Pirates lost 45-14 to Lecanto in last week's region quarterfinal at W.F. Edwards Stadium in Dade City.

A time change due to Tropical Storm Nicole blowing through Florida resulted in a 6 p.m. Saturday kickoff rather than the standard Friday night start at 7:30. Pasco's momentum was snapped in that Saturday game.

Following a 28-16 loss to arch-rival Zeph-yrhills in the 9-Mile War, which dashed any hopes of an unbeaten season, the Pirates entered their first-round playoff game on the strength of three shutouts over Crystal River, Wesley Chapel and Brooksville Central in succession.

"These kids fly around. They love to hit," said first-year Pasco coach Alphonso Freeney, entrusted with the turnaround after replacing Jason Stokes in the offseason.

Pasco, formerly a county powerhouse with an eight-year playoff run that included two region finals and a state semifinal appearance, has struggled in recent years. A winning regular season is one thing, but Freeney mentioned that his players have their sights set on loftier goals.

"They want more," he said. "The mindset is these kids want to win a championship."

Afterward in a post-game meeting in the end zone, Freeney addressed his players, some of whom had tears in their eyes following the disheartening defeat.

"The hardest part of this is saying goodbye to the seniors," he said. "I've already won. I won by taking this head coaching job at Pasco. I've won because I've taken all of you. We're a family. We're brothers forever."

Ámong those seniors who will be sorely missed are running back Tayshaun Balmir and quarterback Enrique Matos. Balmir rushed for 1,835 yards with 22 touchdowns this season while Matos had a combined total of 830 yards with 11 touchdowns.

Both struggled against Lecanto, however, with Balmir gaining 55 yards and leaving the game at halftime with an injury. Matos threw

for just 22 yards and scrambled for 11.

With the offense sputtering, Freeney inserted backup quarterback Sidney Allen into the lineup for the second half. The junior came through with scoring passes of 10 and 11 yards to wide receiver J.J. Johnson, another junior. Allen wound up with 134 passing yards and Johnson had a team-leading four receptions for 73 yards.

"Sidney Allen is going to be a great player," Freeney said. "He has all the tools to be an amazing player."

On Allen's first touchdown pass to Johnson he scrambled to his left, pulling up at the line of scrimmage when a defender was bearing down on him and lofted a pass into the end zone to a wide-open Johnson.

"I thought he was going to scramble," Johnson said. "I didn't think he was going to throw it. I waved my hand to help him out to let him know I was there and to throw it to me."

As bad as the players felt after the game, Freeney told them they have something to build on and that the program is headed in the right direction.

"For my underclassmen, you guys know now what it takes," he said. "It's no more days off. I want to win a state championship."

Surrounded by election day, yet another tropical storm with Nicole threatening the sunshine state and just one day after a special memorial tribute to veterans in Zephyr Park, a Veteran's Day Parade took place Saturday in downtown Zephyrhills with little fanfare.

While it turned out to be not the best attended parade of its kind, the meaning of the event, organized for a second straight year by the Fraternal Order of Eagles Aerie 3752, was not lost on the people who attended and were involved in it.

Rod Rehrig, past commandant of the local chapter of the Marine Corps League Detachment 1124, was the grand marshal for a second straight year. He also took part in the Veteran's Day tribute at Zephyr Park a day earli-

"I consider it a great honor," said Rehrig, who rode alongside his friend, Jeanette Mae Himmelright, in a silver convertible Corvette driven by Zephyrhills Eagles member John

Announcing the parade of marches, vehicles and floats during the parade was emcee Charla Vande Berg. Alongside her was fellow Eagles member Norma Ginges.

"We're missing that hometown feel and we're trying to bring it back," Vande Berg said of why the Eagles decided to take over the pa-

rade. "We've lost that sense of community."

Added Ginges, "We have joined to make downtown more alive."

"Red, white and blue and a small-town parade," he said, the emotion coming out in his shaky voice. "This is how it should be."

Cliff Moffett, president of the Zephyrhills Museum of Military History, was among several people who drove or rode in jeeps and various military vehicles as part of the parade. Like the others, he was glad to be a part of the event to honor U.S. veterans.

"Just to see the smiles on the faces of the veterans that rode in the parade, that's what gets me," Moffett said. "Just seeing the veter-

ans and how much they were appreciated." Rehrig, who contacted a friend from his hometown in Pennsylvania that day, said his friend expressed disappointment that his town had no such parade and was dismayed

that more was not done to recognize veterans. "I think that it's a great show or respect for the veterans," Rehrig said of the local parade, which has taken place downtown for the past two falls after being cancelled in 2020 due

to the coronavirus pandemic. On the other end of the spectrum, Moffett was clearly disappointed that the Battle for Veterans was cancelled. It was scheduled as a reenactment with military displays on the outskirts of the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport

and adjacent to the museum. "It was a tough decision," he said of a meeting with the museum's board and the choice to cancel that event. "It was a shame we had to cancel the event. It was a really tough thing to do, but we didn't know if that field was going to be turned into a mud bog.

HOLLYWOOD --Newman speaks from the beyond. He died on Sept. 26, 2008, at 83, but has his new autobiography to serve as an oral history of his life. Entitled "The Extraordinary Life of an Ordinary Man," the memoir was released Oct. 18 with David Rosenthal, who began working on it with Paul 20 years ago. Rosenthal interspersed Paul's memories with those of friends and family, including his first wife, Jackie Witte (whom he left in 1958 to date, and eventually marry, Joanne Woodward).

Paul wanted to "leave some kind of record that sets things straight. Pokes holes in the mythology that's sprung up around me." In the book, he reveals his parents were cold-hearted people. His mother viewed him as "a decoration for her house." Paul stated, "The damage for me has come when I've realized what people were clamoring for was not me. It was characters invented by writers." Is that insecurity rearing its ugly head?

He was amused he came in first place in a 1950s poll of women asked to choose which well-known personality they had sexual fantasies about. He added, "Joanne gave birth to a sexual creature. She taught me, she encouraged me, she delighted in the experimental." He also confessed, "And then, there's the celebrity aspect; being a movie star means you start out with three strikes against you ... the adulation, the recognition in restaurants -these are completely unnatural."

He continued, "I never enjoyed acting; never enjoyed going out there and doing it. It's probably the reason I drank as much as I did. But, acting gave me a sanctuary where I was able to create emotions without being penalized for having them.'

I was assigned by magazines to get pictures of him, and he was rarely, if ever, amenable. I finally gained his respect by writing a nasty poem for him and Joanne about their conduct that they, unbelievably, loved and liked me for. Paul knew Joanne had Alzheimer's two years before he died. It's been reported she doesn't even remember who Paul Newman was, but at 92, she's still hanging on. This autobiography is a mustread, if only to try to understand what made stars like Paul Newman tick.

scoreboard. Colella completed three passes, the last one being a 17-yard scoring throw to Pickett.

Gulf answered two series later, capitalizing on a Wyatt Stacy interception that set up a 5-yard scoring run by quarterback Ethan Holewski, who wound up with 163 passing yards and a late touchdown throw to Noa Paselio.

Zephyrhills went on a scoring spree with 28 points in the second quarter to take a 35-7 halftime lead. In the span of two minutes and 15 seconds, Colella completed scoring passes to Adams, Sands and Campbell. Then, on a fourth-and-one play from Gulf's 14-yard line, Colella and Pickett hooked up on a 14-yard scoring pass.

Gulf got two second-half scores from Antonio Muniz, the game's rushing leader with 115 yards. Those scores, along with Holewski's late touchdown pass were offset by three Colella scoring passes.
