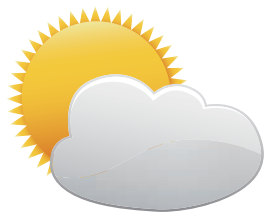

American House hosts telethon

Corsos For Heroes, which utilizes dogs to help veterans and first responders, brings charitable event to Zephyrhills

What better place to have a telethon for a patriotic cause than the American House. That's exactly the mindset organizers had when they scheduled the Corsos for Heroes Charity Telethon at the assisted living center off Pretty Pond Road in Zephyrhills.

The inaugural telethon raised about \$3,000 for a national organization that donates Cane Corsos — big-boned guardian dogs from Italy and touted as affectionate and protective — to help United States veterans and first responders in need. It likely will not be the last one at that facility.

"We're going to try to make this a yearly thing; try to make it bigger and better," said Doreen Rivera, the organization's vice president of marketing. "What better place to have it than the American House?"

The location was chosen, in part, because Rivera's stepfather and mother, John and Joan Roche, reside there. John is retired from the U.S. Navy. Rivera also noted that the site has 50,000 followers and events like the telethon help with publicity.

Keaton Hobbs, community relations director for American House, said the facility gladly welcomed Corsos for Heroes. Especially considering that more than 30 veterans or spouses reside there.

"When (Rivera) was putting the event together, what better place than the American House," she said. "For our residents it's so important. They love seeing us do events like this

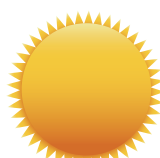

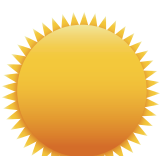

Bulldogs ousted in first round of playoffs

Zephyrhills loses a close game in the Class 5A region quarterfinal, 12-10 to St. Petersburg Gibbs at home

The Zephyrhills football team has made it a habit of playing in the postseason with seven appearances over the past eight years. So that was pretty much expected when the Bulldogs went 9-1 in the regular season, won a district title and earned a home playoff game.

What was not anticipated is the way the team went out, losing 12-10 to St. Petersburg Gibbs in the first round at Bulldog Stadium last Friday night. Especially considering that the Bulldogs were seeded second in Class 5A while the Gladiators were ranked seventh. Gibbs pulled off the upset while Zephyrhills fell short of matching last year's berth in the region semifinals.

"We knocked off the No. 2 team, No. 2," Gibbs coach Louis Murphy exclaimed to his players during a euphoric celebration after the game.

Zephyrhills coach Nick Carroll, his assistants and the players were not in any mood to celebrate in the opposite end zone.

"It's always hard," Carroll said of a playoff loss. "We're going to sit down as a staff and see what we have to do to get better."

Early on it appeared that the game might be a high-scoring shootout. Gibbs scored on the opening possession of the game, marching 80 yards downfield and capping a 12-play drive with A.J. Miller's 18-yard touchdown pass to Tra'quan Johnson in the left corner of the end zone.

Zephyrhills countered with a seven-play, 88-yard drive. Jaylin Thomas burst up the middle for a 4-yard scoring run. That play was set up by a 39-yard slant-in pass from Jaxon

Rivera to T.J. Jackson. Since the Gladiators missed their extra-point attempt, Rivera's point-after kick gave the Bulldogs a slim 7-6 lead.

Gibbs went ahead again just before half-time. Miller, who completed 8-of-10 for 91 yards, capped a nine-play, 97-yard drive with his second touchdown pass of the game. On fourth-and-8 from the Zephyrhills 15-yard line and with just 19 seconds remaining before the break, he found Alan Stokes on a crossing pattern just inside the end zone for a 12-7 lead.

Each team lost a fumble and got sacks at crucial times. With Zephyrhills trailing 12-10 after Rivera's 27-yard field goal in the fourth quarter, Theotis Smith sacked Miller on fourth-and-2 at the Zephyrhills 7-yard line.

Not to be outdone, after the Bulldogs crossed midfield in the waning seconds, Kev-aun Jones sacked Rivera for his second of the game on the final play.

While disappointed in the outcome, Carroll described the game as a combination of things with both offensive and defensive units coming up short. It did not help that the Bulldogs lost linebacker Nick Sheldon to a broken wrist in the first half.

"We didn't play very good," the coach said. "We just didn't get pressure up front when we needed to. You could see they had some more explosive athletes than we did."

Thomas, Zephyrhills' senior running back, rushed for a game-high 164 yards while Gibbs' Johnson gained 119. For Thomas, who accounted for the bulk of his team's offense, it gave him eight games with at least 100 rushing yards this season.

While Thomas had some nice runs, a couple of which put the Bulldogs in scoring position they simply were unable to get into the end zone after their first touchdown.

"Every time we got in the red zone we either had a penalty or a bad snap and we couldn't score," Carroll said. "We just didn't take advantage of the situations. There were some inconsistencies there. We didn't make the plays."

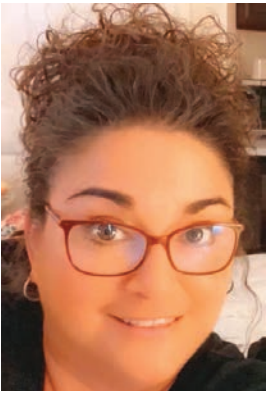

THANKFULNESS TO GOD is SELF-RIGHTEOUS THANKSGIVING

Men and women often-times give their testimonies of faith and prayers to God which sound more like self-praise rather than prayer and thanksgiving unto our Lord God.

In Luke chapter 18, the Lord tells a parable unto his disciples and unto certain unrighteous ones who trusted in themselves for their righteousness. The Lord made the comparison of the Pharisee, who went to the temple to pray, and the publican who went into the temple to pray. The Pharisee prayed thus "with himself," he thanked God that he wasn't like other people and that he fasted and paid tithes. He was happy and thankful for who he was and what he was doing for God. **But how did he leave the temple after praying to God?**

He left... unjustified and unrighteous before God and still a sinner.

But the publican on the other hand, realizing that he was a sinner and un-right before God, stood afar off. He would not lift up his eyes to heaven, and he smote upon his breast, and prayed, "God be merciful to me a sinner." **God heard his prayer. The publican went home justified before God**, rather than the other man, the Pharisee, of whom was not justified.

As our apostle Paul tells us in all of his writings to the Church, the body of Christ, that by the blood of Christ's cross, and by his humility for us on Calvary's cross, that we, who are not under the law for righteousness, can be justified as well. The handwriting of the law was taken out of the way, blotted out, and nailed to Christ's cross (**Colossians 2:14**): "Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us, which was contrary to us, and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross;" In this dispensation of God's grace, the Lord is dispensing grace, mercy, and peace to all who by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, will believe His Words to them, in that he died on the cross to pay for their sins, he was buried, and he arose from the dead on the third day for their justification, they shall be saved (**Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-4**).

Ephesians 2:8 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: 9 Not of works, lest any man should boast. **Romans 3:21** But now the righteousness of God without the law is manifested, being witnessed by the law and the prophets; 22 Even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe: for there is no difference: 23 For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God; 24 Being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus:

and they're very supportive."

Harry Toro, breeder for the dogs, said he founded Corsos for Heroes, in part, "to find out what was going on with our veterans." The non-profit organization helps veterans and first responders by finding the perfect match of a canine companion for them. Each dog is trained for their specific needs.

Many veterans, Toro noted, have difficulties in transitioning from the military into civilian life.

"A lot of soldiers are coming home and when they come home they're not taught how to go back into communities," he said. "I want to let them know that there's hope."

Toro, who did not serve but is a member of a military family, grew up in New Jersey and became a professional boxer after winning the Golden Gloves and making the U.S. Olympic Boxing team. Later, he dabbled in acting and modeling in California before returning to New Jersey and starting a successful trucking company.

After being diagnosed with traumatic brain injury, stemming in part from boxing and a car accident, Toro began breeding and training Cane Corsos. One day he gave a pup to a veteran suffering Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and the man said the dog changed his life. That inspired Toro to found Corsos for Heroes.

Now, the company is based in Lutz and so far they have bred more than a dozen dogs to be donated. Toro has two of those dogs — Corleone, 5, and 8-year-old Latima.

Nolen Davis, a motivational speaker based in Houston who helps with innovative events and building businesses in network marketing, exceed the telethon. He also is the host for Step-up Radio.

"I flew in just for this," Davis said. "Sometimes the biggest thing to tackle a problem is hope."

who has had two sons — Will and Stephen — serve in the U.S. Marines.

Added Lamb's wife Sharon, "We're proud of our veterans and we're thankful."

Two other patriotic Zephyrhills residents shared their thoughts along the parade route. "I thought it was cool," said Dave Conklin, who served as a U.S. Marine and came to the parade with his wife Susan. "There's not a lot of people who give a parade to the veterans."

Conklin spoke proudly of his two sons, David and Daniel, who are veterans.

Apparently, the parade was not just about older veterans or supporters. The youth also was represented with the Zephyrhills High Marching Band and Color Guard, along with JROTC and Civil Air Patrol members marching.

In the back of one military truck, a half-dozen young boys chanted, "USA! USA! USA!" as it drove past a crowd of people gathered at the Eiland Bandstand.

Charla Vande Berg, vice president of the local Eagles' Ladies Auxiliary, was the emcee for the parade. While she did not serve in the military, her late father John Sherrod and an uncle, Allan Gezelman, did.

"For me, it's a beautiful day to celebrate the veterans," she said. "It's a way to say thank you. The veterans have given us a wonderful country of freedom."

John Duff, president of the local Eagles Aerie, declared, "This is the largest Veterans Day Parade they've ever had."

Over near the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport, there were actually two World War II reenactments — Saturday and Sunday at 1 p.m. with armored vehicles representing Americans and Germans, along with participating soldiers acting their parts and encampments around the perimeter of a roped-off battlefield.

The mock battles were similar to war reenactments and military vehicle displays that previously took place at the nearby Zephyrhills Museum of Military History, only last weekend's events were on a grander scale.

"This is the first (area) reenactment to this scale," said Frank Cashman, a reenactor who dressed as an American officer. "We hope to come back here next year and this time and make this an annual event. I think the city was pleased."

Added Dave Thomas, president of the preservation association's Florida chapter, "We liked the layout. Our motto is: history in motion. We like to let people see (the reenactors, vehicles and encampments). This is history."

Before the weekend activities there were a few local ceremonies on the official Veterans Day, which was last Thursday. A traditional recognition took place at the Veterans Memorial at Zephyr Park and Elks Lodge 2731 held a mandatory event. Among the keynote speakers was Ken Fabiani, the Elks' veterans chairperson.

"Veterans Day to me means that we are able to honor those who gave their time and lives so our country can be free," said Fabiani, a Vietnam veteran.

Bulldog basketball opening season with experience and altitude

The 2021-22 boys basketball team will open the winter season with a rare combination of veteran experience and height, both inside and outside

If 2020-21 was a transitional season, 2021-22 should be a culmination season. The Bulldogs return a bevy of veterans and have height up and down the roster like they haven't had in a very long time. This year's team will have 10 seniors and six-footers, even at the guard positions.

"We've got a lot of bigs this season, we're going to be competitive inside," Bulldog head coach Mike Novak said. "That's going to be our strength this season but the real trick is going to be figuring out our inside-outside game."

The Bulldogs will have a couple of All-Conference returners to lead the way. The 6-4 senior Jimmy McAuley transitions from a post player to point guard this season. McAuley has been a varsity player since his sophomore year and brings leadership and military grit to the team. McAuley helps run the Zephyrhills JROTC Raiders, an obstacle course-fitness team that competes against other JROTC programs. McAuley worked with the team during summer workouts.

"They (rest of the team) thought they were just doing summer workouts, they didn't know they were joining the Army," Novak said.

McAuley was second-team All-Conference last season and will factor in as one of the Bulldogs' key players. Senior Kevin Pagan returns too, this after a first-team All-Conference season in 2020-21. The Bulldogs have traditionally played with a two-guard, three-forward set but with Pagan's height and low post play, they'll throw him in at the center position. Fellow seniors Noah Amous and Joseph Barnes, who are both 6-3, could also rotate into the center position.

There'll be some adjustment for the aforementioned trio, including McAuley, as they will be asked to play different positions but this could also keep the Bulldogs unpredictable in the frontcourt and backcourt.

In the backcourt, the Bulldogs bring back even more senior starters. Guard Preston Linville is a four-year varsity player and dependable perimeter shooter. Right now he's projected to start at guard along with McAuley. Marc Dortch and Tory Taylor will factor into the guard positions, as will junior Ken McCullough.

There is even more senior talent waiting for their chance to shine. Jatorrian Reinhold, Kayvion Roberts and Damien Lopez are all three vying for playing time, Novak says the two are doing a good job and are "in the mix" for potential playing time.

According to Novak, many starting positions are still being settled. The Bulldogs played a pre-season tournament this week and then get a week off before they take on east Pasco County rivals, Cypress Creek and Wesley Chapel the week after Thanksgiving.

The 6-11 record from last year should improve in 2021-22. The team lost a lot of playing time and even games to Covid-19-related issues, something they hope they don't see much of this season. They were fourth in Class 5A District 6 a year ago and they are likely to climb that ladder this year.

The team with the target are the Fivay Falcons, who went 10-0 in the district, en route to a 23-3 overall record, which took them two rounds deep into the regional playoffs. The Falcons come into the 2021-22 season without their leading scorer (Eric Howard) and leading rebounder (Erik Scott), so it's reasonable to think the Bulldogs will be able to match up better with the Falcons this upcoming season. The Bulldogs were 0-3 against the Falcons a year ago but the first two games were losses by a combined seven points.

This should be a bull year for the Bulldogs. There's no reason to think they won't be able to compete for a playoff spot and potential district title.

"Last year was challenging but we're cautiously optimistic," Novak said. "The kids are anxious to play."

City council meeting fine tunes Tina & Joe's contract, gets YMCA update

Monday's meeting entered into a lengthy but conclusive debate over the terms of the new restaurateur taking over the Jeffries House

The first order of business was an update on projects at the East Pasco YMCA. District Executive Director Paul Conley gave a presentation about the existing and emerging programs at YMCAs in the area, specifically the East Pasco YMCA in Zephyrhills. He spoke of the challenges Covid-19 and the lockdown presented, the YMCA losing 40 percent of its membership. He then discussed the comeback as they re-opened in May of this year. According to Conley, the East Pasco YMCA has had 63,000 visits so far in 2021 and he expects between 75,000 and 80,000. He touted the \$95,000 in subsidized memberships and the expansion of Learn to Swim programs, while touting the \$125,000 improvement to the public pool at the East Pasco YMCA.

In the Consent Agenda, all 10 items were bundled and passed together 5-0. The regular meeting minutes from the Oct. 11 and the Oct. 25 meeting were accepted. They approved an agreement to purchase products and services to support drinking water productions and sewer collection needs with contractor Data Flow Systems, Inc. (DFS); and asked for approval of an agreement to purchase products and services to support the Neptune Meter R900 Automated Meter Reading System with Ferguson Waterworks.

They asked to approve a piggyback agreement with Pasco County for the purchase of "as-needed" pumps, overhaul and related equipment repair for the city's water and wastewater treatment plants with contractor PSI Technologies and approve a task assignment for the north side master lift station and force main project with Jones Edmunds. The scope of the project would install approximately 16,000 linear feet (LF) of 12-inch PVC force main piping, within the right-of-way, following Otis Allen Road, crossing under Old Lakeland Highway (CR535),

along the east right-of-way (ROW) of CR 535 south, and ending at the southwest corner of CR 54 and CR 535. It would also install a master lift station on property obtained by the city near the intersection of 23rd and Otis Allen. Funding provided in the FY22 budget under the Wastewater Division - Infrastructure line item. Design cost \$187,515.00.

Next item was an amendment to Resolution 783-21 changing the payment structure for Mayoral-Council compensation from semi-annually to monthly. Item 8 asked for approval of a facility encroachment agreement for the conveyance of potable water and raw/treated sewage at the Gagne Development with CSX Transportation.

Item 9 would approve purchase of police vehicles, specifically seven more to replace an aging fleet. ZPD would like to continue to phase out Dodge Charger sedans and move more to SUVs. The five SUVs will cost \$44,805.86 per vehicle for a total of \$224,029.30. The purchase of the two pickup trucks will be used by our Special Response Team (SRT) and will cost \$41,985.84 per vehicle for a total of \$83,971.68. The total of the seven vehicles, plus \$529.19 in miscellaneous radio equipment, is \$308,530.11. The department budgeted \$355,000 for the seven vehicles, putting the purchase \$46,469.89 under budget. Missing from the price is the purchase of the in-car camera, which could be added at a later date.

The last item asked to approve a piggyback agreement with the City of Milton for the purchase of cured in-place pipe from Advanced Plumbing Technologies. The estimated financial impact is \$400,000.00. Budgeted for FY22 Wastewater Infrastructure line item.

Next up was the review of the management agreement between the city and Tina & Joe's Cafe, the new restaurateur that is setting up in the Jeffries House. The key details of the agreement that were discussed were the three years of rent-free occupation and then the percentage of gross revenue Tina & Joe's would pay the city. Proposed was a seven-year term, where there was no charge in the first three years and then a three-percent charge of gross revenue for the duration of the contract. Those numbers were debated by council members and just as it looked like the plans were

going back to the drawing board, councilman Lance Smith laid out a plan for a five-year lease with no charge to Tina and Joe's the first year and then one percent of gross the second year, two percent the third and then three percent for the fourth and fifth years of the lease. This met with universal approval from the dais and was approved 5-0.

In the Citizen Comments section, Silverado resident Ashley Pollard addressed council citing issues with the CDD in the development. Pollard bemoaned the lack of residents on the CDD and how the CDD continues to raise assessment fees with residents powerless to stop it. In the terms of the CDD, board members are appointed by the developer and residents cannot run for election on the CDD until they have lived in the development for at least six years. Pollard stated that residents will not be able to take over the majority vote in the CDD until 2026. Pollard complained of the, "damage done in eight years and we do not have a vote."

City Attorney Matthew Maggard stated that there was an oversight process that the city could engage in and that he would personally look into the matter. Wrapping up the meeting, city manager Poe was proud to announce his son William qualifying for the state cross country meet.

HOLLYWOOD -- "The Theory of Everything" Oscar-winner Eddie Redmayne has completed "Fantastic Beasts: The Secrets of Dumbledore," with Mads Mikkelsen and Jude Law, due April 15. He's currently shooting Netflix's "The Good Nurse," with Jessica Chastain, about a caregiver tied to the deaths of hundreds of patients. Redmayne next will hit London's theater district as "The Emcee" in "Cabaret." His casting set off a storm of protests because a heterosexual man will be playing a traditionally gay role.

The original master of ceremonies on Broadway and in the 1972 film was Joel Grey (married to Jo Wilder from 1958 to 1982, they had two children, including "Dirty Dancing" star Jennifer Grey). But at the time of Broadway's "Cabaret," he wasn't officially "out" as a gay man. The character of The Emcee, while flamboyant, only appears in musical numbers, including "Two Ladies (And I'm The Only Man)," with no back story about being gay. So why the fuss about Redmayne as The Emcee?

Among straight actors who've won Oscars for "playing gay" are Tom Hanks ("Philadelphia"), Hilary Swank ("Boys Don't Cry"), Charlize Theron ("Monster"), Philip Seymour Hoffman ("Capote") and Sean Penn ("Milk"). Many of these films would never have been made or been successful without the special talents of these artists. Eddie Redmayne playing The Emcee in "Cabaret" will bring in a huge audience who'll flock to see his interpretation of the role. There will be many people who otherwise would never have been exposed to the horrors that existed in Nazi Germany at the core and message of "Cabaret."

Michael Caine announced he'd retire after his last film, "Best Sellers" (released Sept. 17). For decades, British actors have announced their retirements when there weren't any work offers, then when offers came, they conveniently came out of retirement. After two Oscars and 136 films, Michael Caine is NOT retiring. He got what he wanted ... offers of work.

In 1984, I was hired by disaster film producer Irwin Allen ("Poseidon Adventure," "The Towering Inferno") to photograph (for him) a Dean Martin-style roast with some of the greatest comics: Milton Berle, Bob Newhart, Red Buttons, George Burns, Danny Thomas, Rowan & Martin, Steve Allen and Sid Caesar. They all roasted Caine, giving him tips on how to be funny prior to filming "Blame It on Rio." It turned out to be a disaster movie, and not by Irwin Allen. The critics called the film "anything but funny" and it bombed.

I remember a highlight of the night was Oscar-winner Red Buttons side-splitting classic routine about "famous people who never got a dinner": "Nero fiddled while Rome burned, and HE never got a dinner." They all toasted Caine by saying, "Now YOU know what it's all about, Alfie!" But obviously, he didn't!

As for the awards, there were seven primary categories and another special award that is not doled out annually. The Alice Hall Award, given for exemplary lifetime contributions toward the betterment of the Zephyrhills community went to Tim Pierson, the recently retired chief executive officer of CenterState Bank.

The Small Business of the Year went to Zephyrhills Cinema 10, which lists less than 25 employees and Sunrise Eatery earned Large Business of the Year.
