Oakside Cemetery announces it will become an official location for the 2022 National Wreaths Across America Day

The cemetery will join the more than 3,100 participating locations across the country to Remember, Honor and Teach on Dec. 19

The National nonprofit Wreaths Across America (WAA) announced today that Oakside Cemetery in Zephyrhills, will be joining in the mission to Remember, Honor, Teach, as an official location for 2022. This is the first year that the cemetery will participate in this national program.

Wreaths Across America started as a simple gesture of thanks that has grown into a national movement of dedicated volunteers and communities coming together to not only remember the nation's fallen and honor their service, but to teach the next generation about the sacrifices made for us to live freely. This year, there will be more than 3,100 participating locations placing veterans' wreaths on National Wreaths Across America Day -Dec. 17 - with more than two million volunteers coming together.

The goal for Oakside Cemetery is to raise enough funds to place 320 sponsored veterans' wreaths on the headstones of all the local heroes laid to rest there, to ensure that the individuals

Bulldogs beat Panthers 21-0

Zephyrhills advances to its first region final berth in school history

For the first time in school history, Zephyrhills is on the verge of cracking the state final four. Zephyrhills is just one win away from that elusive goal after defeating Lecanto 21-0 in last Friday's Class 3 Suburban Region Semifinal at Bulldog Stadium.

Coach Nick Carroll, a former Zephyrhills standout who has played and coached in regional playoff games, noted the historical relevance of the team advancing to its first-ever region final.

"That was our goal in the summertime," he said. "I'm from Zephyrhills, so witnessing this and being a part of this is special."

The path to a potential state championship is not easy for the Bulldogs, who travel to Lake Wales to take on the unbeaten Highlanders (12-0) a day

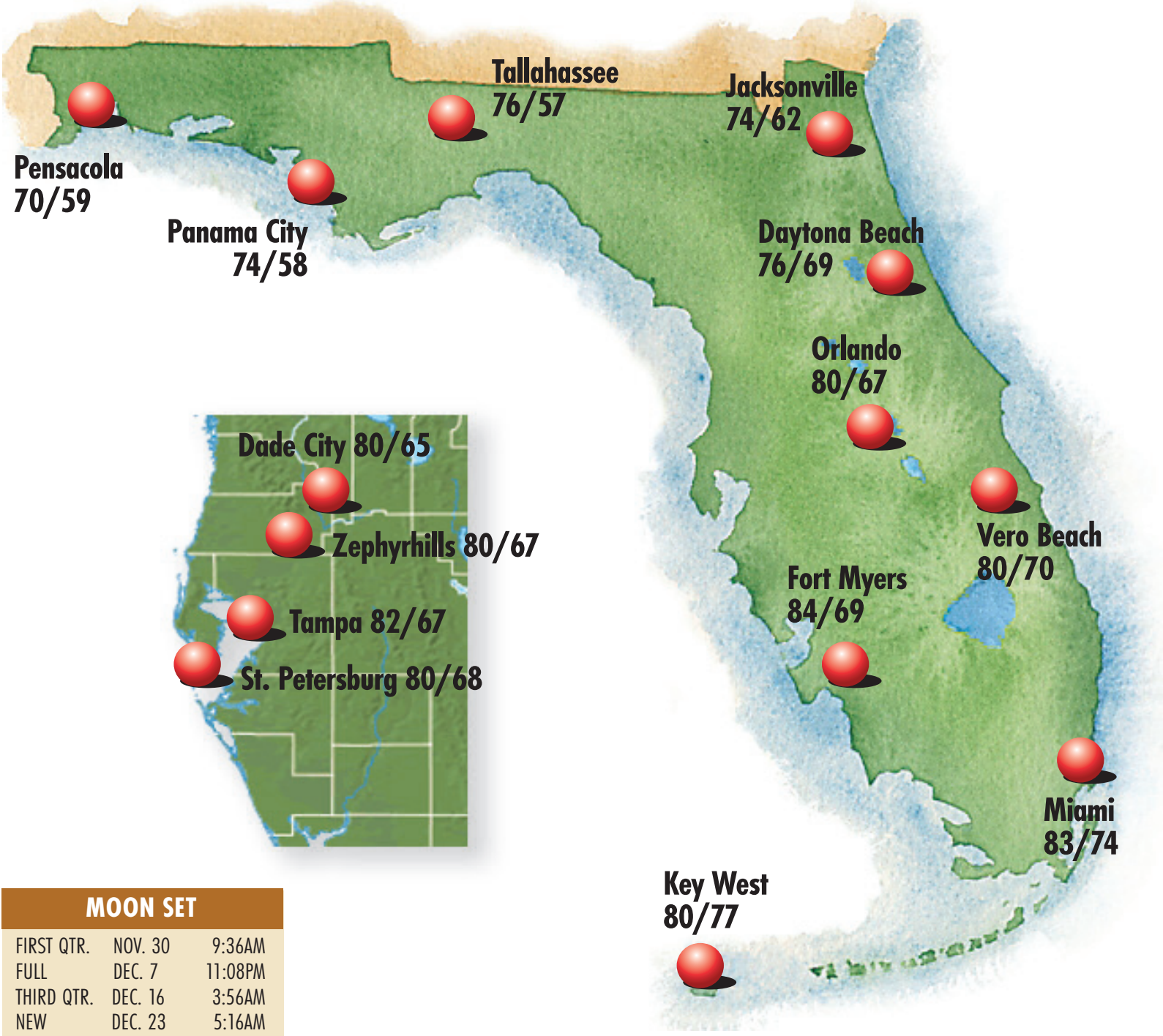

For the second year, Saint Leo University is collecting stuffed animals for use by the Tampa Police Department. As a holiday season project of Saint Leo’s Tampa Education Center, Teddy Bears for TPD will provide cuddly critters for officers to carry in their vehicles in order to provide comfort to children in stressful situations.

In addition to the Tampa Education Center, the university community is helping with this effort and the student government union, the Office of Greek Life and Community Service, and the East Pasco Education Center at the residential campus in Pasco County are assisting.

Donations of new and gently used teddy bears and other stuffed animals will be collected in donation boxes now through Dec. 13. Saint Leo in partnering with the TPD to put together a “comfort squad” of stuffed animals. Officers will provide these furry friends to children at crime scenes, in times of crisis, trauma, and other scary situations.

Last year, nearly 250 stuffed animals were donated by Saint Leo students, faculty, staff, and the public.

This year, teddy bears and plush animals may be dropped off in donation boxes (look for the Teddy Bears for TPD signs) at the following: Tampa Education Center, 1403 N. Howard Ave., Tampa, donations will be accepted 8

a.m.-5 p.m., Monday through Friday; dining hall lobby in the student community center at university campus, 33701 S.R. 52; student activities building at university campus; Saint Edward Hall lobby (East Pasco Education Center) at university campus; and Benedictine Hall lobby at university campus.

“We want interactions with the police to be positive for children, even if it’s a scary situation,” said Rod Kirkwood, director of Saint Leo University’s Tampa Education Center. “These donations will allow the police officers to provide something soft for the children to hold during a hard or difficult time.”

Studies show that cuddling a stuffed animal can release “feel good” chemicals in the brain, and help soothe children (and adults). Last year’s donations went to TPD’s Behavioral Health Unit along with the major crimes, sex crimes, and domestic violence units. “Children may not be a victim of a crime,” said Tampa Police Assistant Chief Lee Bercaw, “but they may witness a parent having a mental health issue or other issues.” And the teddy bears and other stuffed animals are comforting to the children being assisted by these TPD units.

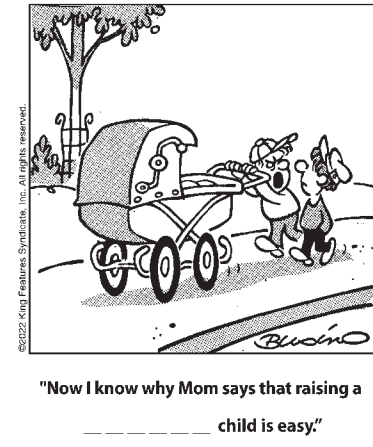

The History Channel

Tips to simplify Thanksgiving entertaining

Preparing Thanksgiving dinner for a houseful of close friends and relatives can be a tad overwhelming. Thanksgiving is a food- and tradition-centric holiday, and all eyes will be typically on the dinner table. Pulling off a feast of this magnitude — multiple courses, side dishes and desserts — takes considerable effort. These tips, tricks and timesavers can be a Thanksgiving host’s saving grace.

Pick the menu early

Don’t leave menu planning and shopping to the last minute. Decide what you’ll be cooking in addition to turkey several weeks before the big day. Select two or three side dishes, preferably items that can be prepared in advance and then reheated on Thanksgiving. These can include a baked macaroni-and-cheese casserole, mashed potatoes, roasted vegetables, and a cornbread stuffing.

Brine your bird

Turkey is the centerpiece of the feast, so give it every opportunity to shine. No one wants a dry turkey, but unfortunately this lean poultry can dry out easily. Meats typically lose about 30 percent of their weight during cooking. However, by soaking the turkey in a brine prior to cooking it,

you can reduce this moisture loss to as little as 15 percent, according to Dr. Estes Reynolds, a brining expert at the University of Georgia. Brining the fowl for a day or more can infuse flavor and moisture.

Food Network personality Alton Brown has a fan-favorite roast turkey recipe with an aromatic brine that has garnered five stars and was featured on his show “Good Eats” (www.foodnetwork.com/recipes/alton-brown/good-eats-roast-turkey-recipe-1950271). A simple salted water soak also can work.

Start prep work a few days before Thanksgiving

Take some stress out of Thanksgiving by cutting all vegetables and/or preparing some dishes a few days early. Label and organize prepared ingredients by recipe and store in the refrigerator. Make extra room in the fridge by removing nonessential items and placing them in a cooler with ice and cleaning out any old food or condiments. Plan your table settings and label which bowls and other serving dishes will be used for which items. This will make it much easier to set the table on Thanksgiving.

Serve batched cocktails

It can be challenging and expensive to have a full bar for guests. Mulled wine, hot cider and punches are ideal ways to service a crowd looking for delicious spirited drinks.

Create simple centerpieces

Use seasonal sights for your centerpieces or place settings. These can include small squashes, gourds, citrus fruits, nuts, or acorns. A hollowed-out pumpkin filled with fresh flowers also can be eye-catching.

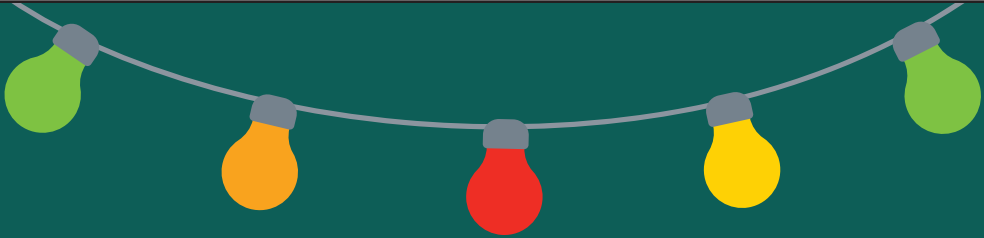

Pioneer Florida Museum brings home a piece of Pasco

The Pioneer Florida Museum & Village in Dade City recently acquired some artifacts that belonged to the county's namesake

Pasco County was carved out of sprawling Hernando and Citrus counties in 1887. Yet, little is known about the man, Samuel Pasco, whom Pasco County is named after. In fact, there's no evidence that Pasco ever visited the county that would eventually bear his name. However, Samuel Pasco became a prominent civil servant and even served as a U.S. senator from Florida. Florida was not his native state.

Samuel Pasco was born in London, England on June 28, 1834 to John and Amelia Nash Pasco. At just eight years old, Pasco and his family emigrated to what is today the Canadian province of Prince Edward Island. In 1842 it was still in the sphere of British colonial hegemony. The stay on the frigid island would not be long.



Later that same year, the family moved to Charlestown, Mass. It was at nearby Cambridge where Pasco was accepted to Harvard University. By 1858, Pasco had graduated with an AB or an Artium Baccalaureus degree. He accepted the head master position at the Waukeenah Academy near Tallahassee in January of 1859.

Pasco would not be very long at peace in his new position. On Jan. 9, 1861 a group of Federal artillerymen fired on Florida state troops or possibly a body of armed residents outside of Fort Barrancas in Pensacola. This touched off the American Civil War, at least in Florida. South Carolina state troops would cannonade Federal Fort Sumter after repeated demands for Major Robert Anderson to evacuate it, on April 12, 1861. Pasco would seem to have identified with his home state and in August of 1861, he enlisted as a private in Company H, 3rd Florida Infantry Regiment, along with 15 of his older students from the academy.

Four years of conflict, hardship, capture and imprisonment followed. Pasco kept a journal or diary of his experiences from September, 1862 until he learned of his being exchanged on Oct. 3, 1864 and sent his diary home. It was this diary or rather a book privately published by his descendants, that helped the museum connect the dots to the artifacts.

The museum's curator was researching Samuel Pasco for a living history event and came across some information on the University of South Florida's digital archives. At the bottom of the article was a notation to write a letter to an address in Monroe, Virg. to obtain a copy of Pasco's diary, entitled, 'Private Pasco - A Civil War Diary.' A few weeks later, two copies of the privately published book landed at the Pioneer Florida Museum.

The museum struck up a dialogue with who turned out to be the widow of one of Pasco's great-grandsons, William Gibbons. It was Gibbons and other family members that prepared and transcribed the diary. The diary itself was given to Pasco's son Samuel Jr. after Pasco's death in 1917. The diary remained in the Pensacola home Nell Mallory and Samuel Jr. Pasco's home until the summer of 1987. The diary was found in a dresser drawer belonging to Nell and Samuel Jr.'s daughter Katherine, who passed away that year. The collaboration began.



The Pioneer Florida Museum is now a repository for a few rare copies of Pasco's transcribed diary but it didn't stop there. Patricia Gibbons, the widow of William Gibbons inquired whether three pieces of furniture that belonged to Pasco were of interest to the museum.

"Yes, of course we were interested," Museum executive director Stephanie Black said. "The trick was how were we going to get them back to Florida."

The pieces of furniture include two wooden chairs and a wooden settee. A settee is kind of a couch without padded arms. It looks like two chairs fused together. The furniture was in Pasco's Monticello home, just north of Waukeenah. It was moved to Virginia sometime in the 1990s. The museum created a fundraiser and raised enough donations to fly the museum curator to Monroe, Virg., rent a van and transport the items back home to Florida, to Pasco County, specifically.

"This is really a big deal for us to be able to display some artifacts that belonged to Mr. Pasco," museum accessions chair Wayne Sweat said. "We just can't wait to get them down here."

It is unlikely the museum will procure the actual diary. That is a precious family heirloom. However, the furniture pieces and at least a copy of the diary were both welcome additions to a museum that has overhauled and improved its displays significantly in the last few years.

"We are really striving," Black said. "We've added history events, reconfigured the whole display area in the main building. If you came here a month or two ago, there's almost certainly something new on display already."

Pasco's post-war life was promising. He became a prominent state legislator, even serving as Speaker of the House in 1887. It was that same year that residents of Hernando and Citrus counties were petitioning to carve out a county they wanted to call, "Banner" County. Banner is not a name, it's actually a term meaning, foremost or leading. That adjective didn't sit well with state legislators, all from other counties. The delegation needed a new name. In Tallahassee for that session, the delegates undoubtedly saw or heard about Pasco's May 19 election to the U.S. Senate. U.S. senators were selected by state legislatures during this time and not popularly elected as they are today. The switch was in and the name stuck. On June 2, Florida Governor EA Perry signed the act into law, as it sailed through the House with just two dissenting votes and the Senate with just one. The bill also made Dade City the temporary county seat of the newly formed Pasco County.

On Thursday night, the items arrived via rental van at 15602 Pioneer Museum Rd. in Dade City, completing their long-awaited trip. The museum has a plan for the artifacts.

"We have an enclosed display area where we are going to put a whole Samuel Pasco display together, featuring these items," Black said.

after Thanksgiving. Lake Wales beat visiting Zephyrhills 33-0 in the season opener.

“We get a chance to play the day after Thanksgiving,” Carroll said. “We have to redeem ourselves against Lake Wales.”

Zephyrhills’ previous region semifinal appearance resulted in a 32-0 loss at Orlando Jones two years ago. This year, the Bulldogs (9-3) won their second straight district title, defeated arch-rival Pasco in the 9-Mile War and have won six games in a row.

Perhaps indicative of how the game would

play out came in the first quarter on each team’s first possession.

Lecanto took the opening kickoff, marching 15 plays downfield on a drive that began at its own 33-yard line. The Panthers lined up for what appeared to be a relatively easy 22-yard field goal attempt, but a bad snap resulted in the ball turning over on downs and Zephyrhills taking over at its 27.

After the

Panthers chewed up more than 10 minutes in that first quarter, the Bulldogs needed less than two minutes to find the end zone. On just six plays, they moved downfield and capped that drive with Maddox Rivera’s 22-yard burst up the middle for a touchdown. A Christian Clemens extra point kick and Zephyrhills had a 7-0 lead.

Once they found the end zone, the Bulldogs wanted more. After the home defense forced a Lecanto punt after just three offensive plays, Zephyrhills mounted a seven-play, 69-yard drive to score another touchdown. Quarterback Brendyn Colella capped that drive with a 5-yard scoring pass to Jakobe Campbell in the left corner of the end zone and the route was on.

The second half proved to be time for the defenses on both teams to shine. Lecanto put together a sustained drive and held the ball for most of the third quarter, moving from its own 19 to a fourth-down play at Zephyrhills’ 3-yard line.

That’s where the home defense once again proved to be impenetrable. Lecanto’s stand-out running back, Amir Wilson, was tackled by Fred Maixner for no gain and the ball was turned over on downs. That turned out to be as close to scoring as the Panthers would come.

“It was obvious,” Maixner said of the handoff from quarterback J.T. Tipton to Wilson. “I could tell what formation they were in. I could tell where (Wilson) was standing, so I just went right there.”

Wilson, who a week earlier rushed for more than 300 yards and scored three touchdowns in a playoff win over Pasco, was limited to just 80 yards by the Bulldogs.

Zephyrhills’ rushing game fared much better with Rodney Smith rushing for a game-high 110 yards and Rivera adding 80. As for the passing game, Colella threw for 75 yards, which included a 36-yard touchdown pass to Fred Adams in the fourth quarter.

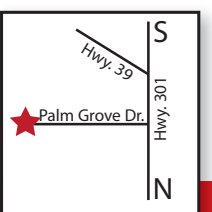

"We hope this one will be the same," Judy said.

"He's such a humble man," she said of a man she knows as Juan. "He keeps this place very clean. He's a one-man show."
