Pretending as though it's cold outside is big commercial venture in Florida and east Pasco County. The Shops at Wiregrass' holiday display that sprays foam to mimic snow, draws parking lot-busting crowds over

the winter months. The AdventHealth Center Ice rink in Wesley Chapel can at least make one feel like they are in a winter wonderland, watching ice skaters and hockey players skate about. A litany of winter/holiday events in the area help residents forget they live in the sub-tropics, even if just for a few hours. A Point Summit enterprise Snowcat Ridge Alpine Snow Park had its grand opening Nov. 20.

Point Summit pioneers in large outdoor entertainment venues. Based out of Indiana, the corporation has built renowned scare parks and a 125-acre paintball park. The business venture also has roots in Florida as both Dade City entertainment parks Treehoppers and

Zephyrhills, Dade City chambers considering merger

The chambers of commerce in the two east Pasco cities have formed a task force to consider merging

It's far from official but the groundwork is being laid for a potential merger between the Greater Zephyrhills and Dade City chambers of commerce. It's not something that happens with a snap of the fingers. It's a process.

The first step of that process is appointing a task force that can start exploring the pros and cons of a merger. That step has already been taken. Thirteen members have already been appointed to the task force. Greater Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce CEO Melonie Monson was mum on just who those task force members are just yet.

"They are prominent members of the community," Monson said. "It's people you will know and recognize and will respect their opinions. It also includes a provost of PHSC."

It's a move that would combine the two municipalities on the east side of the county, Zephyrhills being the most populous municipality in all of Pasco County. "It's not something we are taking lightly,"

"It's not something we are taking lightly," Monson said. "We're going to do our due diligence and if it's not better for both chambers, we won't do it."

The notion follows on the heels of several other chambers in the region merging in recent years. In 2017, the former Greater Wesley Chapel Chamber of Commerce merged with the Greater Pasco Chamber of Commerce to form the North Tampa Bay Chamber of Commerce that serves citizens and businesses in Wesley Chapel, Trinity, Odessa. Offering two perspectives on the unusual cir-



and TV Sales off U.S. 301 in Dade City since 1959, and who also represents District 38 in the Florida House of Representatives.

He said various items have been on sale since October and a variety of products will be on sale throughout the entire holiday season.

"That's our approach, Maggard said. "Really, the biggest problem is getting supply and inventory. The main reason (for an entire season of sales) is trying to get product. That's what we're all trying to do.'

As for the adverse way the pandemic has affected businesses and other parts of people's lives, Maggard is optimistic about better prospects in the future.

"It's getting a little better," he said.

Locally, the Greater Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce has come up with a plan to spread good cheer during the holiday shopping season. As part of a program to help businesses as well as local residents the chamber gets businesses to donate gift cards, which are made available to the public through random draw-

"We decided instead of doing a one-day shop small businesses campaign we are doing a one-month campaign," said Melonie Monson, the chamber's president. "We have a wide variety of gift cards that we've given away."

In the program's first few weeks people have been awarded gift cards from such local restaurants as Sonny's BBQ and Sunrise Eatery, along with businesses like Main Street Billiards, Lady Bedazzle's Boutique and Beauty by Ernestine. Anyone spending \$25 at a local business is eligible for the drawing that lasts for 30 days in November.

Among the business participants of that program is the San Antonio Citizens Federal Credit Union, which at the chamber's recent annual awards banquet was named the member of the year. Jill Evans, the credit union's vice

president of marketing, noted that the company

contributed four \$25 gift cards.
"I think it's wonderful," she said of the chamber's idea, adding, "and everybody loves to get gift cards.'

Monson, who said the chamber organized the gift card giveaway as part of the Jumpstart Z'hills Series promotional plan, concurred with

"It's a good event for (businesses) and for the community," Monson said. "We're just so happy with it. We thought it would be fun and it is. Who doesn't like something for free?"

Even the large malls have had to alter their traditional plans of hosting one big shopping day or a long holiday shopping weekend. The Grove in Wesley Chapel, The Shops at Wiregrass and Tampa Premium Outlets fall into that

Phuong Nguyen, a spokesperson for The Grove, noted that places like Old Navy and Highland Axe Throwing were among local businesses offering various specials spanning for several days this month. For example, Old Navy's Black Friday deal runs for five days instead of one. At Highland Axe Throwing, a Black Friday special extends to Nov. 29

"This year, we know Black Friday shopping will look different," said Mark Gold, The Grove's developer and landlord. "With the installation of the UV lights and the extension of sales promotions, we are able to provide a shopping experience unlike anywhere else.'



Scream-A-Geddon are Point Summit properties. Treehoppers Aerial Adventure Park is a year-round outdoor climbing facility nestled in the tree tops off of Saint Joe Road in Darby, where customers link up to ropes and harnesses and negotiate climbing challenges. Scream-A-Geddon is a seasonal, haunted house operation just adjacent to Treehoppers, where customers try to survive a quintet of haunted attractions. Snowcat Ridge is located nearby, 27839 Saint Joe Rd.

Snowcat Ridge will feature a number of attractions, the biggest and most obvious being a 60-foot high Snowy Slope covered with man-made snow and plunging 400 feet. Riders can go single, tandem or with their family on inflatable tubes down the slope. A Magic Carpet transports both riders and tubes back up the slope for another round.

Another attraction on the menu is an Arctic Igloo where customers can build snowmen out of man-made snow. The igloo is a 10,000 square foot attraction that even has a "bunny" slope for the little ones too small to take on the 400-footer. The Alpine Village will feature a nightly music and light show as well as its own Holiday Market, where customers can sip hot cocoa and relax next to a fire.

The park will be the first of its kind in the state and while it might seem to defy Florida's weather, it is certainly still its subject. The park opened this November and hopes that cooler temperatures hold until spring break. High temperatures could close the park, even during the winter and spring months, so it might be a good idea to check ahead, especially if your plan is to go on a warmer day. Bring your jackets. Even if the temperature is 80 degrees, with wet snow falling on you and an overall drop in temperature as a result; it's jacket weather for

Snowcat Ridge adds a scintillating chapter to the booming tourism industry in east Pasco County. The other Point Summit properties already mentioned, Center Ice, the RADD Sports Complex, the just opened Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center and now a seasonal snow park. Pasco County has become a major player in sports recreation in Florida.

General admission to Snowcat Park includes a two-hour snow tubing session on the slopes and all day access to the igloo and arctic village. There is even an unlimited snow tubing option. Opening night prices start at \$34.95 and taper off to \$24.95 deeper into November and December. The park opened at 3 p.m. for their Nov. 20 grand opening and stays open until 10 or 11 p.m. based on the day of the week. The park is open select days of the week, so it's best to check the calendar on the website at: www. snocatridge.com for hours and to purchase tickets. Tickets are available on site but cost \$5

Chamber of Commerce was absorbed in 2014. The Greater Pasco Chamber of Commerce formed in 2019 when the West Pasco and Central Pasco chambers merged.

The task force appointment follows a pattern of mergers. With Zephyrhills and Dade City downtowns less than 10 miles from each other, exploring the merger seemed like a natural progression. The Zephyrhills chamber has 500 members, the Dade City has 430.

"This is a huge population of east Pasco County," Monson said. "We're looking at the regional over the city aspect. It's about advocacy and the ability to make a difference in pro-business legislation."

Pasco County is exploring hiring lobbyists to vie for the county's interests. While that may or not be a long-term goal of a merged east Pasco chamber, the combining of business interests and community members will have more weight to it when it comes to advocacy.

The physical details likely won't emerge until after a merger is completed. There are offices and a staff at each chamber in the respective cities.

"We anticipate keeping the staff and both buildings open," Monsoon said.

The task force will also look to the residents and businesses themselves for input on the potential merger.
