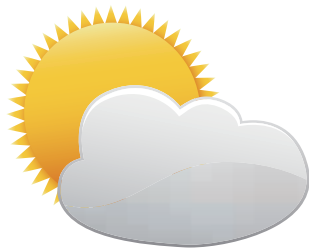

Hospital scuttled its annual festival in favor of a socially-distant, non-crowd gathering, to acknowledging the spirit of the season

It's certainly not ideal. 2020 has not been an ideal sort of a year. Large public gatherings, widely seen as health hazards, have been cancelled left and right. The Shops at Wiregrass cancelled their Festival of Lights,

Dade City called their Christmas parade off.

"For more than 35 years, AdventHealth Zephyrhills has celebrated its annual Christmas Tree Lighting with thousands of families within the community but this year, in an abundance of caution due to COVID-19, hospital leaders have changed the event to help families celebrate the holiday safely with a smaller event along the fitness trail," Communications Manager for AdventHealth West Florida Division Ashley Jeffrey said.

It makes sense that a hospital would make a decision out of an abundance of caution. The Christmas Tree Lighting event was one of the better ones in the city and while it boasted musical acts, the community coming together to decorate trees representing each state and

Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day offers a glimpse of history

Zephyrhills Museum of Military History hosts longstanding traditional event near city's airport

Wig Wigmore missed out on his 100th birthday celebration because, like so many events this year, it was cancelled due to safety precautions stemming from the coronavirus pandemic. The Pearl Harbor survivor, however, was not about to miss out on a longstanding tradition at the Zephyrhills Museum of Military History.

Wigmore, a Holiday resident who turned 100 last month, was driven by a friend across Pasco County for Saturday's Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day at the museum, which is adjacent to the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport. Pearl Harbor Day was recognized nationwide two days later on Dec. 7.

Cliff Moffett, the military museum's president, noted that in previous years two or three other survivors, such as Charles McClelland and Ed Soucha, showed up for the annual remembrance. Only Wigmore committed to coming this time with the pandemic keeping some others at home.

Nonetheless, Wigmore's presence was welcomed and applauded by dozens of people who came out for Saturday's event.

"Wig still lives on his own. He's going to live forever," Moffett said. "He said, 'I don't know if I'm going to make it this year.' That was about 15 years ago."

While Moffett made that last comment jokingly there was nothing funny about what happened on Dec. 7, 1941. The bombing of Pearl Harbor that morning 79 years ago was labeled by President Franklin D. Roosevelt as "a day that will live in infamy" and spawned what many call the greatest generation.

Moffett relayed Wig's story to a gathering on the grounds of the museum.

"He saw the (Japanese) planes flying overhead and he knew that his life would change

forever," Moffett said, as Wigmore nodded his head in agreement.

Visitors to the museum grounds on Saturday were also treated to viewing and actually climbing on various military vehicles, aircraft and other historical displays. This year's ceremony gained a bit of regional recognition when Fox 13 Charley Belcher, an Emmy award-winning feature reporter for Good Day Tampa Bay, visited the museum last Friday.

Three sisters from Lakeland — Brittani Pilla, Brandi Phillips and Ashley Connor — each brought their young children to the event.

"We live close and the boys always like the airplanes when we drive by," Phillips said.

Added Pilla, "It's neat. The kids have loved it. They ask questions about things that they wouldn't know."

"I think it's great for the kids to be able to see the history and talk to veterans," Connor said.

Some in the crowd said they would not miss the annual event. John Foran and his wife

Elaine always drive across the county from New Port Richey to attend.

"John served in Vietnam and he likes to talk to the veterans," Elaine said as they waited in a line to meet Wigmore. "He has good memories and bad ones, but he always likes to come here."

Others came to the event for the first time, like Brenda and Richard Heisler, a couple from Seffner.

"We do the Civil War reenacting and we didn't know it was even here," Richard said.

Among the gathering were several reenactors, including Tod Johnson of Dade City and Tampa's Mike Alvarez. Johnson donned the attire of a Navy Lt. Commander while Alvarez dressed as a technical sgt.

"It's been said before that if we forget our history we're doomed to repeat it," Johnson said. "We try to remind everybody."

"Guys like Wig and Charlie, that's why I put these things on. It's for these guys," said Chris Heesch, who dressed in the Navy uniform of his father Fred, who served in the military from 1950-56.

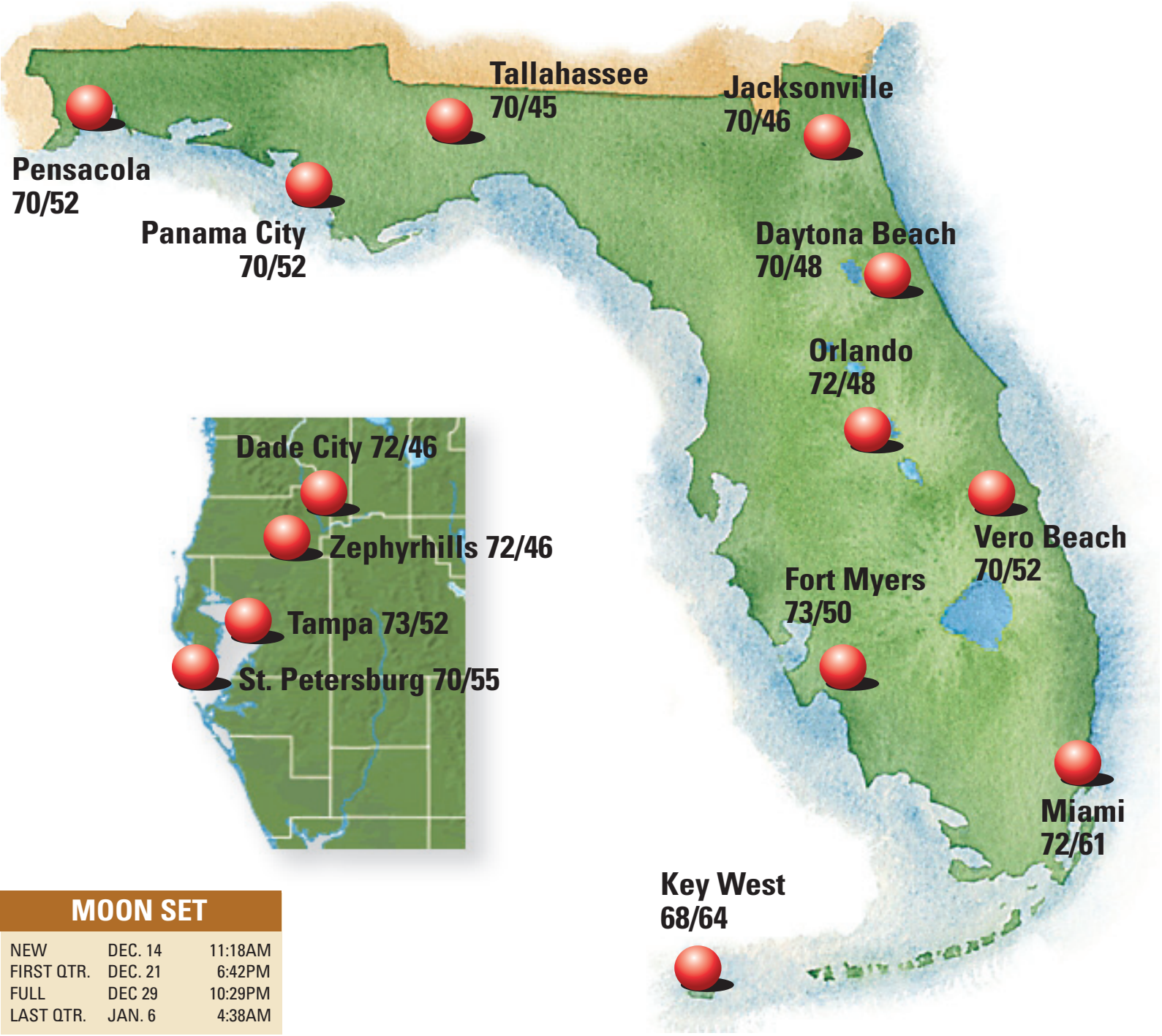

Mrs. Claus declined to attend the event a week prior, leaving the traditional red sleigh vacant for most of Saturday.

Liane Roderick, who brought her grandchildren Luke and Amanda Saunders, visited from Plant City. She had the siblings sit in Santa's sleigh for a photo.

"This is nice even though there's not a lot of people here," Roderick said. "They have a goat at home so they liked seeing the animals."

Animals brought in were in pens and petting them was encouraged.

Four friends — Marci Janecek of Dade City, Zephyrhills' Kat McClintock, Tampa's Cathy Van Fleet and Sherri Bolander, a Zephyrhills snowbird from Ohio — took turns holding dwarf goats.

"I'm just obsessed with animals," Janecek said while hugging a dwarf goat closer to her heart.

"This is an amazing place," McClintock said, adding that "you like to support local."

Van Fleet called it "girls day" saying that "we've been cooped up" for a while.

Dr. Jonathan Blake, owner of Blake Veterinary Hospital, visited with some family members on Saturday. As a third generation native of the Dade City area and whose late father Norman served as the museum's treasurer, he was thrilled that people came out for Saturday's event.

"To see a decent crowd and on such a beautiful day, it's heartwarming," he said.

Missy Lee, from the Dade City Chamber of Commerce and the museum, oversaw some of the crafts and games being played by children at the Mabel Jordan Barn. At a table behind her were three young girls covering pine cones with peanut butter and bird seed.

"They have really enjoyed doing this today" Lee said of the children, as well as volunteers from Zephyrhills and Pasco high schools. "It's a beautiful day for families to come out and walk the grounds."

Social distancing also was not a problem since the crowd was a bit sparse and there was plenty of space on the site of more than six acres.

Over in the gazebo, people gathered around with food and ate at picnic tables while being entertained by Gypsy Wind, a three-person musical group that played Kentucky bluegrass and other popular songs.

The museum's buildings were adorned with Christmas decorations, pioneer-style of course. Some families with young children stopped to chat with Anne Dammers, a reenactor stationed on the porch of the old schoolhouse.

"At these events I can share a bit of history with the kids," she said, adding that the small old desks with chalkboards are some of the things "they haven't thought about."

At one end of the property people gathered around for presentations by a blacksmith. There also was cane chair making and pine needle basket demonstrations. At the other end, some of the younger children gathered around the old train engine.

With temperatures in the low 70s and high 60s there were no complaints about hot weather. In fact, perhaps no one described it better than Lee.

"When I was with the chamber we called this chamber weather," she said. "Now, I call it pioneer weather."

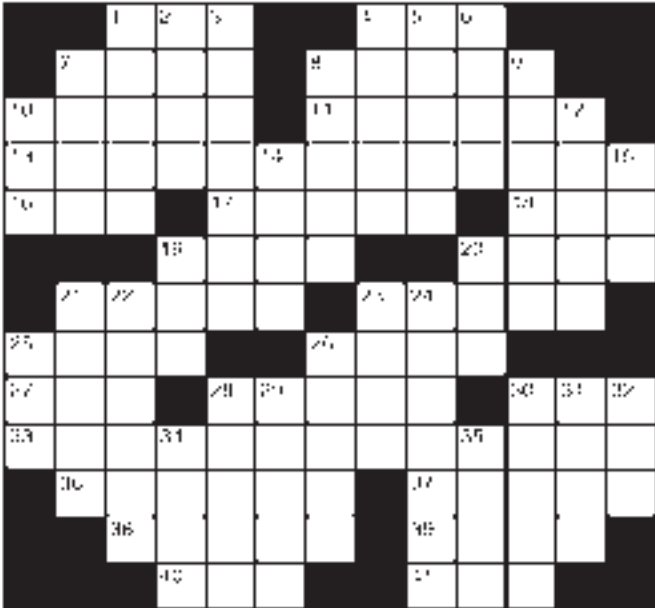

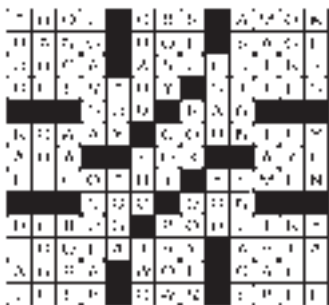

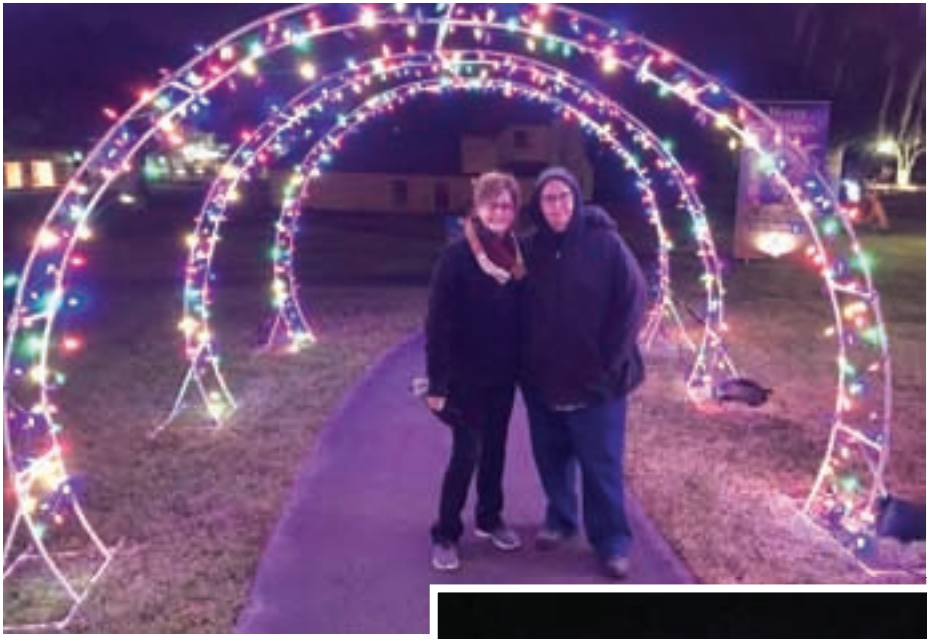

heartfelt public addresses by local officials - some alternative had to be devised.

"This year, AdventHealth Zephyrhills has created a fun-filled Christmas Stroll along the fitness trail which provides families the opportunity to practice safe, social distancing while still enjoying Christmas decorations, lights, music and life-size Christmas cards," Jeffrey said.

It was a far cry from the extravaganzas of years past but most attendees were glad to have something, some reason to get out of the house.

"We have a high-risk family member," Kristy Muir of Lakeland said. "This is an opportunity to be outside, see some lights in a safe, outdoor location."

The Muirs had not come to prior tree lightings. They walked the loop and grabbed photo ops at the series of stations along the trail.

"This is a wonderful use of the fitness path," David Muir said.

The hospital did what it could to string the tradition together. Lost was the state tree-lighting. That part of the event will have to wait for 2021.

"In an effort to prevent large gatherings on the hospital campus, the Christmas Stroll will not include the annual Circle of Trees. Traditionally, families and businesses would gather on the hospital lawn to decorate more than 50 Christmas trees, however, this year AdventHealth Zephyrhills has supported local businesses and the community by providing participants the opportunity to create life-size Christmas cards that are placed along the fitness trail," Jeffrey said.

While the AdventHealth Zephyrhills Christmas Stroll was a far cry from the annual tree lighting event, the hospital made the effort. The effort did not go unnoticed.

"We all need something to pick up our spirits," Deborah Kerr of Lakeland said. "This setup is very pretty and it's also a good way to get exercise."
