New ZPD officers sworn in during final city council meeting of 2021

New ZPD officers and recognition of city employees headlined the final Zephyrhills City Council meeting of 2021

Dark blue uniforms bedecked the Zephyrhills City Council chambers on Monday night as current ZPD officers were on hand to witness the swearing in of four new officers: Nickolas Cherubino, Celeste Tojyat, Jailene Colon and Kirk Jadotte. Police chief Derek Brewer gave a brief bio of each of the incoming officers before administering the oath. After the oaths were read, family members pinned the new badges on the freshly-minted ZPD officers and a standing ovation welcomed the quartet into the fold. It was later pointed out that with the new hires, ZPD is now fully-staffed. Next up was a recognition and presentation by Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield regarding the water division of the utilities department. The water division just recently returned from a conference in Orlando where they were awarded first place by the American Water Works Association for Outstanding Water Distribution System Division 3. Utilities director John Bostic and a handful of his staff were present to receive the award and commendation by the mayor. "These guys do excellent work 24/7, 12 months a year," Bostic said. "These gentlemen take pride in what they do." Zephyrhills Utility Service Worker 3 Dennis Farr didn't have far to go after the photo op because he was called right back up to the front to receive his Zephyrhills City Employee of the Year Award. Both Farr and finance supervisor/assistant city clerk Jessica Gardner were nominated by a committee and Farr was chosen at the recent city employee Christmas party. Farr managed to escape the spotlight by missing the party but he got his recognition at Monday's council meeting. Down the agenda, six Consent Agenda items were bundled and passed together with 5-0 unanimity. They were: a 60-month approval, \$54,000 contract with Axon for services related to ZPD body cameras. An approval for \$79,758 to refurbish a truck received from the

The Pioneer Florida Museum & Village teamed up with an army of volunteers to bring back the Dade City Christmas Parade

People will remember the year 2020 for decades to come. The year saw Americans and people all over the world encounter new challenges. Public events took a nosedive, almost into disappearance. As the country and the state began to emerge from under the rock, events started to get back on the calendar. Zephyrhills started to go ahead with limited and then full-on public events.

Dade City saw several events scuttled, including the 2020 Christmas parade. The planning phase for the 2021 parade came around and the Dade City Chamber of Commerce began to seek alternative entities to put the event on. Enter the Pioneer Florida Museum & Village. "We are so grateful that we were able to work with Dade City and our community to keep the Dade City Christmas Parade going," museum executive director Stephanie Black said. "We already have exciting ideas to make it better for next year."

Black and a team of volunteers set to work. Grand Marshall - Simpson Lakes and presenting sponsors Rocycle and Saint Leo University stepped up and provided some much-needed seed money. Then the local businesses, clubs and civic organizations began to line up. By the time the queue was setting up Friday evening, there were 55 floats ready to roll through downtown Dade City.

One of the parade's annual entries was Dade City Church. The 2021 parade was the eighth year for the church on 21st Street.

"Last year was a real Christmas damper - there was no stroll, no parade, no Church Street," Kimmie Frier said. "We're grateful to have it back, it brings Christmas spirit for the whole town."

Other civic organizations lined up to take part. Cub Scouts Pack 301 packed in their float with children, most of whom helped put together the float.

Walk Through Bethlehem is a live reenactment

Longstanding tradition is hosted by Family of God in Dade City and is a collaboration among four area churches

For a second straight year Family of God Baptist Church in Dade City hosted a Walk Through Bethlehem, a live reenactment with period characters that continues a longstanding tradition and that now involves four churches. It was revived last December following a two-year hiatus from when it switched over from Richland Baptist Church.

The mock biblical village was set up outdoors for three days last weekend at Family of God, located off Old Lakeland Highway just north of U.S. 98. It is a collaboration that includes three other churches — Pasadena Baptist, Faith Fellowship of Jesus Christ in Trilby and Richland Baptist, where the Walk Through Bethlehem was initiated 26 years ago.

"It brings us closer together than we realize," said Robert Perkins, a pastor at Faith Fellowship who was back at the Walk Through Bethlehem event for a second straight Christmas season. "It shows us how much we have in common."

Perhaps there is more in common than outsiders think.





utility department into a mobile command post for ZPD. A request for Skydive City to re-enter into a sublet agreement for certain premises with GSA (General Services Administration) for use by SOCOM (Special Operations Command/MacDill Air Force base) to train the Para-Commandos. This has been allowed as common practice for over a decade. The existing lease and extensions were set to expire on Dec. 28.

Requested assistance from Jones Edmunds to provide engineering services during the construction of the Fort King Water Line Extension Project. Recently, the city went out to bid and received the bids for the construction of a 12-inch water main along Fort King Road beginning at the Phelps Road/Fort King intersection, heading south to the Simons Road/Fort King area. Amendment No. 1 will cost no more than \$66,850.00 and is currently budgeted in the FY22 budget year under the water division - infrastructure line item. A 65-day extension to the completion date of a fuel farm at Zephyrhills Municipal Airport was approved. It pushes the completion date out to Feb. 22, 2022. Finally an approval to purchase a Grapple Truck through the Florida Sheriff's Association. The grapple truck purchase proposal of \$243,996.49 is to be covered by FY 21-22 Streets Department Capital Line Item \$125,000 and FY 21-22 Sanitation Department Capital Line Item \$125,000. In business items, Item 1 was tabled until the Jan. 10 meeting. Item 2 codified an ordinance related to the Abbott Square Community Development District. Item 3 approved a Land Development Code Amendment that dictates allowable uses in the LDC. Item 4 dealt with fencing allowed at the Hounds Town USA dog davcare center on Eiland Boulevard and Fort King Road. It was established that six-foot, opaque perimeter fencing would be used and that the designs complied with C2 zoning requirements. All of the aforementioned items passed 5-0, with item 1 taking just a 4-0 vote as councilman Lance Smith abstained from the vote. In citizen comments, Zephyrhills resident Eddy Knapp and later John Watson addressed council regarding low flying tow aircraft coming out of the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport. Knapp contested that the flight pattern and low altitude that tow planes were currently flying were in violation of FAA guidelines and that reports have been made to the FAA regarding. Knapp also produced some items that he claimed fell into his yard from the tow planes. Tow planes are used to take engineless gliders up into the air. Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. stated that the city has been in talks with the airport and the FAA and that the FAA is, "aware and investigating."

Host Bulldogs defeat arch-rival Pirates 58-25

winning streak to seven straight games while Pasco has lost three in a row

In recent years, Zephyrhills and Pasco have not had much of a rivalry in girls basketball. When Zephyrhills was good, Pasco was not and vice versa. That is not the case so far this season with the longtime rivals aligned in Class 5A, District 6 and the Sunshine Athletic Conference.

Both teams entered Monday night's clash at Zephyrhills with winning records. The host Bulldogs came in with seven wins in eight games and riding a six-game win streak while Pasco sported a winning record at 6-3 despite two straight losses.

"Sometimes winning records can be deceiving, but it's a tough game just for the fact that it's our biggest rival," Zephyrhills coach Chris Smith said before the game. "They definitely have improved and so have we."

The Bulldogs revealed just how much they have improved from last year's by extending their current streak to seven in a row with a 58-25 win. That also gave them an 8-1 overall record, 6-0 mark at home as well as a perfect 4-0 district slate.

Meanwhile, Pasco, which already owns a five-game winning streak and has matched their entire win total from last season, has now lost three consecutive games. The Pirates are 6-4 overall with a 2-3 record on the road.

"I told our players to just look down there and see the color of their uniforms and if that doesn't get you to play you may not be a Bulldog," said Smith, alluding to the school rivalry between cities separated by just nine miles.

between cities separated by just nine miles. In fairness, Pasco took on Zephyrhills with its top player sidelined. Coach Justin Dargahi noted that Evelyn Randall, a senior who averages a team-leading 16 points per game, was out sick. He added that Randall and Hayli Carter were instrumental in Pasco's strong start, in part because both are solid free-throw shooters.

Carter hit one of her six 3-point shots to give the Pirates an early lead, but the Bulldogs

tied it on a Mikayla Cintron free throw and never looked back. From that one-point deficit early in the game, Zephyrhills went on a 13-0 run to take a 15-3 lead. That stretch of consecutive points ended on a Carter free throw.

Zephyrhills extended its lead to 26-11 at halftime and increased that to 40-18 by the end of the third quarter. Smith credited his players with solid efforts, also noting that he made an adjustment right before the game to offset Pasco's plan to play a box-type defense.

⁴Right before the game we put in an offense to counter that and it worked to perfection," Smith said.

While Carter wound up with a game-high 20 points, mostly on her 3-point shots from long range, Pasco did not get much offensive production from anyone else. For Zephyrhills, it was just the opposite with nine players getting on the score sheet.

Leading the way for the Bulldogs in that department was Maya Llanes, who finished with 18 points while adding a handful of assists and steals.

"I would say her game's peaking right now," Smith said of Llanes, a senior who can play guard and forward.

Madison Driggers added 10 points while Allison McCullough and Jade King chipped in with six apiece. Cintron was next with five.

Smith also praised Kylie Walton, a sophomore who plays strong in the middle on both ends of the court. The coach said she has looked solid for the past three games.



Zephyrhills, Cypress Creek take second, third place at conference weightlifting

The Bulldogs and Coyotes have forged a tight rivalry in east Pasco County, one plainly evident during last week's eastern conference meet

The Bulldogs and Coyotes are evening out. The Bulldogs reached their zenith two years ago when they sent their first individual state titlist to the podium and nabbed their highest team finish in school history (third place). Several Bulldog lifters made the state meet in 2021, continuing the team's legacy under coach Joe Rinaldo.

The winter 2021-22 season has a new set of faces for the Bulldogs but the same tenacity from years past. The Bulldogs are perennially chasing county powerhouse Sunlake but now they have upstart program Cypress Creek un-der head coach Tico Hernandez nipping at their heels.

"This was a dog fight, not with Sunlake but with Cypress Creek," Rinaldo said. "They are up and coming and I told Tico (Hernandez) that we have to plan for him now."

As the dust settled, it was Sunlake cruising to the East Conference title with 78 points. Zephyrhills managed to out-last Cypress Creek 47 to 39 for second place.

"I'm excited to see what the girls do as we progress through the season," Hernandez said. "They all love it and we are closing the gap with Zephyrhills.

For the Bulldogs, it was relying on some veteran grit and upstart surprises. Rinaldo only has seven returners of his 27-member squad. Sophomore Bella Patrias, in the 199-Class, took first place, scoring a big seven points for her team. She hit all three of her bench press lifts, topping out at 145, a personal best. She also hit her third try at 130 pounds on clean-andjerk, for a composite score of 275, which edged out Pasco's Ashlee Cummings by 10 points.

composite score, best of the whole meet but just

five points better than Anastasia Marenda of Wiregrass Ranch. Padron hit all six of her lifts on Wednesday, setting a personal best of 175 on clean-and-jerk and matching her personal best on the bench with 175. She also won her weight class in the snatch.

The phenom at the meet was 101-Class Coyote lifter Andje Costa. Costa is not a rising star but rather a shooting star in girls high school weightlifting. She was third place at the 2021 state meet and with the top two finishers from that meet graduated, Costa looks poised to top the podium in 2022. Her stats are jaw dropping. She weighed in at 100.3 pounds and then won the snatch with a 105-pound lift more than her own body weight and a mark that would have placed her third in the Unlimited weight class. She followed that up going 2-for-3 on her bench lifts, topping out at 110 and then trying three times to get 140 on cleanand-jerk and finally getting it on her third attempt. It pushed her composite score way out to 250, 15 points ahead of the runner up in her weight class.

I was hoping to beat my own conference record of 145 (on clean-and-jerk), which is why I came in at 140," Costa said. "But then I wasn't even able to get up from my squat. (By the third attempt) I figured it was my senior year and I wanted to be conference champ and so I decided to just get it over with.'

Ćosta got some help from teammate Sienna Silvest, who racked up a 240 composite score to win the 110-Class.

"She (Silvest) is a determined girl," Hernandez said. "She is a perfectionist with weightlifting, the way she takes care of her teammates and the way she handles her schoolwork. She is the current valedictorian in her class.

The Bulldogs managed to keep just ahead of the Coyotes thanks to stout performances from Payton Leidy, Sharibel Vazquez, Autumn

Cypress Creek quarterback Owen Walls had a pair of apparent scoring passes to teammates Dontrell Clerkley and Dernere Jones


verted all three extra-point kicks after touchdowns by the pair of Zephyrhills running backs.



HOLLYWOOD -- Jared Leto won an Oscar for "Dallas Buyer's Club" (2013) and proved he'll go the distance for his characterizations. In "House of Gucci" (which opened Nov. 24), he's unrecognizable playing Paulo Gucci. On his first day (deep in character), he ran into Al Pacino (playing Aldo Gucci) and said "Dad." Pacino didn't recognize him, thought he was a weirdo and walked away. Later, Leto saw him again and said, "Father." Pacino was rushing away until another cast member whispered, "That's Jared." Pacino turned, arms stretched out, and said "son!"

Leto also has "Morbius" (in IMAX), due Jan. 28, with former "Doctor Who" and "The Crown's" Matt Smith. Morbius suffers from a rare disease and tries a dangerous cure that turns him into a vampire. What woman wouldn't want him nibbling on her neck? Sequels are already in the works. Leto next stars for director Aron Aronofsky in "Adrift," about a fishing boat crew discovering a ghost yacht in open sea (coming Aug. 19). Leto pursued the rights for 10 years and brought it to Aronofsky and Jason Blum; now all three are producing. Meanwhile, Lady Gaga is getting a Cher "Moonstruck" Oscar buzz for "House of Gucci." Critics are saying the film has a "Godfather' vibe" and that Gaga is "incredible," as is Jared Leto. Director Ridley Scott, a three-time Oscar director nominee for "Thelma & Louise" (1991), "Gladiator" (2000) and "Black Hawk Down" (2001) and as a producer of "The Martian" (2015), has never won, though he did win an Emmy and was knighted in 2003. Scott is currently prepping yet another remake of "The Boston Strangler" (which starred Tony Curtis in 1968 and David Faustino of "Married With Children" in 2008). Keira Knightly plays the reporter who pursues the case, with co-stars Chris Cooper and Alessandro Nivola. Ridley Scott's recent "The Last Duel," with Matt Damon, flopped. Once there were 13 soaps on three networks, but today there are just four left. A recent growth in their audience has kept "The Young and The Restless" at No. 1. "General Hospital" is No. 2, followed by "The Bold and The Beautiful" and "Days of Our Lives." "Days" has received a two- year pickup from NBC, and thanks to the recent success of "Days of Our Lives: Beyond Salem" on Peacock, toplined by super couples Thaao Penghlis and Leann Hunley, and Deidre Hall and Drake Hogestyn, Peacock greenlit "Days of Our Lives: A Very Salem Christmas" (due Dec. 16), toplined by Emmywinner Chandler Massey (in a recent Hallmark film) and Eileen Davidson. I met Thaao Penghlis on his first day at "Days of Our Lives," and now he's celebrating his 40th anniversary with the show. He's such a great actor, you'd never know he's from Australia ... "There's not a whole lot of difference," he said in comparing the current construction materials of wooden structures with cloth similar to what farmers use for their crops, as well as various props at tables. "The city's pretty much the same, the script's the same. The message is the story of Christmas."

That, people learn as they progress through the village, leads to baby Jesus. White's daughter Rachel was placed in swaddling clothing to portray the first baby Jesus and, like her father, has played numerous roles over the years. Last year, she served as a guide. This year, baby Jesus was Kali Patterson's

This year, baby Jesus was Kali Patterson's son Kaden, who is just six months old. Kali portrayed the virgin Mary while her friend, Cullen Bazzell, was Joseph.

In all, about 75 volunteers took part in the

reenactment with many having been involved for years. Like Jacob Hollaway, a 2019 Pasco High graduate who enjoys playing a shepherd that oversees live sheep in a gated wooden pen. Near the end

of the tour visitors were greeted by the three wise men, who were played by David Barnett, Walter Singletary and

Dennis Grimsley. The two next stops carry special meaning to the organizers with large stakes driven into the ground representing Jesus dying on the cross, along a tomb with a large slab rolled to the side to reveal the resurrection of the lord.

A long table in a large tent was the final stop. There, visitors were greeted by several pastors and church members. Among that group was the Bissell couple, Steve and Marcie, who are Christians and have been married for 47 years. They also have a so-called cowboy ministry they spread at rodeos. The Bissells say they help newcomers and

The Bissells say they help newcomers and return visitors alike fill out response cards and are there to answer questions about the tour or Jesus as well as provide other information.
