Young Bulldogs continue to struggle with inconsistent play in *a 55-52 loss to the Wildcats*

The season openers for Zephyrhills and Wesley Chapel were markedly different with the Bulldogs defeating River Ridge and the Wildcats losing to Freedom. Since then, however, the fortunes of both basketball teams have taken different paths.

Zephyrhills has three losses since then, coming up short against defending district champion Land O' Lakes, Fivay and Wesley Chapel. The Bulldogs were edge by one point in the Fivay game and made a late comeback bid against the Wildcats, only to lose 55-52.

Zephyrhills coach Mike Novak, who has repeatedly alluded to inconsistency from a young team lacking varsity experience, witnessed a bit more consistency on the court at Wesley Chapel.

"It's a young group, but they're learning," said Novak, who is in his fifth season as the Zephyrhills head coach. "It's a lot of young

kids. They're trying."
On the other hand, Wesley Chapel got a win against Sports Leadership & Management of Tampa before the game against Zephyrhills gave the Wildcats a modest two-game winning streak.

Our guys are getting better," said Marvin Gray, a former assistant at Fivay who in the offseason replaced longtime Wesley Chapel coach Doug Greseth. "They're coming along. They're trying to put the team ahead of themselves.'

Wesley Chapel took an early 21-10 lead against Zephyrhills. The Wildcats had an explosive first quarter and despite being outscored 17-12 in the second quarter they still were able to maintain a 33-27 lead at halftime. That pattern continued in the second half with Wesley Chapel outscoring Zephyrhills 13-9 in the third before the Bulldogs rallied for a 16-9 advantage in the fourth.

Leading the way for the Wildcats was Sam Lowe, a senior guard who scored a game-high 23 points. It did not take long for the Wesley Chapel captain to make his mark either. He got a steal and a layup for the first basket of the game and quickly followed up with back-to-back 3-point shots and although Wesley Chapel only 10-3 at that point the home team never trailed. "He plays ĥard," Gray said.

Like Lowe, the coach said this year's group, which includes 11

## **Bulls gore Bulldogs** in 8-0 shutout win

Undefeated Wiregrass Ranch and winless Zephyrhills are on opposite ends of the spectrum

One high school girls soccer team came into last week's game at Wiregrass Ranch without a loss while the other was seeking its first win of the season. Those early trends continued with the host Bulls dominating the Bulldogs in an 8-0 win.

By keeping its unbeaten record intact, Wiregrass Ranch improved to 6-0-1, which includes a scoreless tie with Tampa Catholic and five shutouts. The Bulls are coming off a 19-2-1 season that included a district

title and region semifinal appearance. Meanwhile, struggling Zephyrhills fell to 0-2, a dubious mark that includes an 8-0 road loss to River Ridge in the season opener. The Bulldogs were 3-15 last season and did not get their first win until the

seventh game. "The past four games we have come out really slow, but (against Zephyrhills) something clicked," said Wiregrass Ranch coach Avery Walker, who replaced longtime coach Edwin Costa in mid-season

last year. "I think they all started just to come togeth-In a rare occurrence, the eight-run mercy rule resulted in the game being called at halftime. The Bulls actually scored their eighth goal, a penalty kick by Kayla Ojeda, to clinch it in the 38th minute, two min-

utes before halftime, but the game must go to at least a half for it to count. Emily Erker, a sophomore forward, wasted little time getting the home team on the scoreboard. She drilled a low shot into the right corner for her seventh goal of the season in the second minute of the

game and a few minutes later got an assist when she set up Aiya Harrell's goal. Erker, who had just three goals last season, has become the Bulls' offensive leader with seven goals

and 17 points. "I'm a lot more confident," Erker said. "My touch got a lot better and I control the ball a lot better. I like scoring."

Zephyrhills coach Katie Jeffcott noted that her team was not able to overcome that early deficit.

# Zephyrhills lifter Aguilera breaks fourth school record

Senior Madison Aguilera capped off a solid performance by the girls weightlifting team at conference

The 2019-20 season was the zenith for the girls weightlifting program at Zephyrhills. Yet, if the mid-season conference meet hosted by the Bulldogs last Wednesday was any indication, they are chasing last season's high water mark and gaining. The Bulldogs won several individual conference titles but ultimately fell shy of defending state champion and perennial powerhouse Sunlake. Sunlake senior Madison Guincho, competing in the 129-pound weight class, bench pressed 185 pounds on Wednesday, breaking the conference record. The Bulldogs had some fireworks of their

"We set the goal for second today and we got it," Bulldog head coach Joe Rinaldo said. "We established ourselves today."

The fitting finale to the meet was senior Madison Aguilera stepping onto the platform to take her clean-and-jerk lifts. Aguilera is an elite clean-and-jerk lifter and is traditionally the last to take her lifts. She lined up and on her third attempt, hoisted 165 pounds up and over her head as her teammates cheered. The lift clinched not just the 139-pound conference title but it set the now fourth

Aguilera now holds the Zephyrhills school record in four different weight classes - the 129-class record of 140 pounds, the now 139-class record of 165, the 154-class record of 185 set her junior year and oh, she broke the 169-class record earlier this season.

"This was the first meet with fans back attending," Aguilera

## The benefits of organic agriculture


Modern consumers have more choices than ever before. Whether they're buying appliances, books, clothing, or any of the myriad necessities of daily life, consumers have a wealth of products to choose from.

• Organic produce reduces exposure to pesticides and antibiotics. UC Davis Health notes that organic produce has been proven to reduce consumers' exposure to pesticides and antibiotics. That's a significant benefit, as pesticide exposure has been shown to lead to neurodevelopmental issues and has been linked to higher cancer risk. Consumers shopping on budgets can pick and choose which organic foods they purchase, as UC Davis Health notes that certain foods have been shown to have higher pesticide residues than others. Apples, celery, grapes, spinach, strawberries, and tomatoes have high levels of pesticide residues,




so choosing organic versions of these foods may be a wise choice. Avocados, broccoli, cabbage, and cantaloupe are some of the foods that typically have low levels of pesticide residue.


• Organic agriculture reduces environmental degradation. The Organic Trade Association notes that synthetic pesticides and fertilizers used on some conventional farms can deplete the soil of valuable nutrients and increase environmental degradation. Organic farmers do not use such pesticides or fertilizers, instead utilizing such practices as composting, cover cropping and crop rotation, each of which can have positive, long-term effects on soil quality.

• Organic agriculture benefits local wildlife. A 2015 study from researchers in Argentina that was published in the journal Agriculture, Ecosystems & Environment found that small mammals were more abundant around organic farms than conventional farms. That's not just good for those mammals, but also the farmers, as small mammals can feed on insects that would otherwise adversely affect crops.

Many grocery stores are increasing the availability of organic fruits and vegetables. Such foods can benefit human health as well as the health of the planet.

### Make Marbleized Paper at Family Wrap Party

Whether we're children or adults, we all like to feel useful and part of the holiday festivities. Now's the time to enlist the kids in the fun and creative job of gift-wrapping. But before you go out and purchase rolls of wrap, save money by making a beautiful batch for this year's gifts.

Gather big paper bags from your recycling bin, plus marbles and bright poster paint, and you'll be ready for family fun.

### Here's the stuff you'll need:

- One large, sturdy cardboard gift box approximately 12 by 18 inches, or similar container with sides — several marbles (one for each paint
- color) — liquid poster paint in several colors — spoons (one for each color)
- plain brown paper grocery bags, construction paper or butcher paper — recycled deli or margarine tubs
- scissors
- newspaper

### Here's the fun:

1. Cover your work surface with newspaper. Cut open the paper bags and trim a sheet to fit the bottom of the box. (Or, if using construction paper or butcher paper, cut to size.) Place the paper inside. Pour a small amount of each color of paint into the containers.

2. Drop a marble in one of the paint containers. Shake the container gently until the marble is thoroughly coated with paint, or use a spoon to move the marble around in the paint. With a spoon, drop the marble in the box and shift the box back and forth so the marble rolls in all directions, leaving paint on the paper. Repeat the process, using a different marble for each color of paint desired.

2. When the colorful, abstract design is complete, remove your paper of modern art and let it dry.



TIP: For smaller packages, "shake and create" gift wrap using a clean, large cylindrical potato-chip can with a lid. Loosely roll a sheet of paper inside the can so that it lines the interior. Using one color at a time, roll a marble or two in paint (as described above) and drop in the can. Snap on the lid, shake a few times, remove the lid and put the marble or marbles onto newspaper. Repeat with a marble or two in another color. Remove the paper to reveal your art. You might want to paint jingle bells along with the marbles for a fun, festive sound while shaking.

### Rosemary Cashews for Holiday Giving

Before COVID, my holiday traditions this time of year began with a gathering of five neighborhood friends for an early-morning coffee klatch at one of our houses. We originally met when our sons were just 5 years old, and our friendship continued through Cub Scout activities, softball games, bike rides and picnics at the neighborhood park. Off they went to college, and we attend their weddings together.

Since we still lived within blocks of one another, we'd take turns hosting the annual get-together. For the one in charge, it offered an opportunity to use our fanciest or quirkiest tableware for serving fruit, pastries and coffee. We'd exchange little memorable, sometimes homemade, gifts, too. I liked to bring something from my kitchen, like this rosemary cashew appetizer/snack I prepared last year.

The tasty cashews were such a hit, I decided to make the recipe in multiples this year and fill wide pint-size canning jars I picked up at the store. Tied with holiday ribbon, gift tags and a shiny mini-size gold ornament for extra bling, it is a unique, personalized gift.

Make these in an afternoon with your school-age kids, who can assist in doing a step or two. For starters, let them take charge of pulling the fresh rosemary leaves off the stems before you chop the fragrant herb with a sharp knife. Then

put the kids in charge of decorating and writing the tie-around gift tags.



### **ROSEMARY CASHEWS**

- cups roasted, unsalted cashews
- heaping tablespoon minced fresh rosemary leaves
- tablespoon brown sugar tablespoon salt
- tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
- teaspoon cayenne pepper (optional)
- 1. Heat oven to 350 F.
- 2. Spread the cashews in one layer on a cookie sheet and bake for about 6 minutes, or until warm and lightly toasted.
- 3. Combine the rosemary, brown sugar, salt, melted butter and pepper (if you want an extra kick) in a large bowl. When the cashews are heated, immediately pour them in the bowl with the spice butter mixture. Toss thoroughly.
- 4. Cool and serve. Store in an airtight container up to two weeks.

NOTE: If you prefer, substitute 1 tablespoon pure maple syrup for 1 tablespoon brown sugar.

### **Christmas Tradition** Gets a Modern Twist

It seems like I was just planning and preparing our Thanksgiving dinner and now Christmas is upon us. If you want to change things up a little for

your Christmas dinner, try modernizing an old traditional recipe.

Recently, I've been reading about Christmas customs and holiday meals in Europe. I discovered a tradition called The Feast of the Seven Fishes, along with several delicious recipes for preparing fish. The fish is often used as a symbol of Christianity. Because of the persecution faced by

the early church, when a Christian met a stranger in the road, the Christian sometimes drew one arc of the simple fish outline in the dirt. If the stranger drew the other arc, both believers knew they were in good company.

Preparing and eating seafood on Christmas Eve in celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ is an old European tradition with Italian roots. Many families abstain from eating meat and serve only fish or other types of seafood on Christmas Eve. This traditional holiday meal is called The Feast of the Seven Fishes. A typical feast features cod, eel, octopus, calamari, mussels, clams, shrimp and lobster.

This year, you might want to create a holiday dinner menu based on a variation of the Feast of the Seven Fishes. These recipes are budget-friendly ways to incorporate an ancient holiday tradition into a simplified, modern Christmas Eve dinner using just one pot or pan. Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays, ya'll!

### CHRISTMAS EVE SEAFOOD PAELLA

- cup extra-virgin olive oil 1/3 ounces (16 to 20) shelled, deveined shrimp
- ounces squid (bodies), rinsed,

patted dry and sliced into rounds

- teaspoons salt
- teaspoon paprika medium onion, finely chopped

teaspoon turmeric

- can (14 ounces) fire-roasted
- diced tomatoes, drained teaspoon red chili flakes or
- cayenne pepper cloves garlic, chopped
- cups Arborio rice cups seafood, chicken or veg-
- etable broth bottle (8 ounces) clam juice
- littleneck clams, scrubbed Parsley and lemon wedges, for garnish



1. In a deep 12-inch cast iron skillet, heat oil on medium-high until hot but not smoking. Add shrimp, squid, 1/2 teaspoon of the salt, 1/2 teaspoon of the turmeric and 1/2 teaspoon of the paprika. Cook 2 minutes or until shrimp start to brown, stirring once. With slotted spoon, transfer the shrimp and squid to medium bowl.

2. Reduce heat to medium. Add the onion, tomatoes and the remaining salt, turmeric, paprika and the chili flakes or cayenne pepper. Cook 8 minutes, stirring often. Add garlic; cook 2 minutes. Add rice; cook 2 minutes, stirring.

3. To skillet, add broth and clam juice, stirring to distribute rice evenly in pan. Heat to boiling on medium-high. Boil, without stirring, 15 minutes.

4. Gently press the shrimp, squid and clams on top of the rice. Cover skillet with lid or foil; cook another 10 to 16 minutes or until the clams open and rice is just tender. Remove from heat. Let stand, covered, 10 minutes before serving. Garnish with parsley and lemons. Makes 6 servings.

### SPICY SEAFOOD STEW

pounds potatoes, peeled and diced (new potatoes, finger-

- ling potatoes, red bliss or *Yukon Gold)*
- pound carrots, sliced small yellow onion, chopped
- stalks celery, sliced teaspoons minced garlic
- Juice and zest of 1/2 lemon
- cups frozen corn kernels jar (24 ounces) pasta sauce
- teaspoons ground turmeric
- teaspoon cayenne pepper
- teaspoon salt
- teaspoon ground black pepper cups seafood stock or clam
- juice, or chicken or vegetable broth, or water pound sea scallops, drypacked or bay type, or 1 lb.
- thin white fish filets (sole or flounder), fresh or frozen and thawed pound uncooked shrimp (31-
- 40 per pound); thawed, peeled and deveined cup chopped parsley leaves
- large lemons cut into wedges

1. In a 5 quart slow cooker, combine the potatoes, carrots, onion, celery, garlic, lemon juice and zest, corn, pasta sauce, turmeric, cayenne pepper, salt and black pepper. Stir to combine. Cook, covered, on low until potatoes are tender, 4 1/2 to 5 hours.

2. Stir in stock, broth or water, and the scallops or fish, and shrimp. Cook, covered, until scallops are opaque, and shrimp turn pink, about 4-6 minutes longer.

3. Sprinkle with parsley and serve with lemon wedges and warm crusty bread. Make 9 servings (about 2 quarts).

TIP: If you're peeling and deveining your shrimp, use the shells to make shrimp stock. Place the rinsed shrimp shells, 1 chopped carrot and stalk of celery, the onion skin and parsley stems in a large saucepan. Cover with 2 cups of cold water. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer uncovered for 30 minutes while preparing the recipe. Use the shrimp stock according to directions above.

Gifts from the kitchen are easy and inexpensive to make and are always welcome during the holidays.

Sachets and potpourri make beautiful and aromatic Christmas gifts. They can be fashioned from a

variety of herbs and potpourri, and are simple to make. Bath sachets can be put directly into the tub or tied to the faucet so that the hot water passes through the herbal mixture as the bath is drawn.

Sachet bags also may be placed inside clothes drawers, tucked into the corners of couches or armchairs, or placed inside of closets to freshen up a closed space.

Any number of creative and inexpensive combinations may be used to make potpourri. Spices, flowers, essential oils, your favorite perfume, dried herbs and citrus peels all make a wonderful potpourri.

Using a fixative — such as a tincture of benzoin, styrax or orris root — will extend the life of the perfume and ingredients. Most fixatives can be purchased at craft stores or ordered online.

These easy-to-make recipes for bath sachets, potpourri and an herbal rubbing lotion will be fragrant reminders long after Christmas is over. Remember, gifts from the heart are part of the true meaning of Christmas. Have a happy holiday season!

### **BATH SACHETS**

cups dried herbs (lavender, sage, rosemary, pennyroyal, lemon verbena, chamomile,

thyme or mint — alone or in any combination)

(4-inch) squares of cheesecloth or cotton (8 small decorative handkerchiefs also work well)

(12-inch) lengths of ribbon or lace

1. Place the herbs in a plastic bag. Roll a rolling pin back and forth over the herbs until they are slightly crushed. Place 1/4 cup of the dried herbs in the center of the cloth square.

2. Gather the square in a pouf and knot a piece of ribbon or lace around the neck of the pouf to secure the herbs. Make ribbon or lace into a bow, leaving the ends long enough to tie the bath sachet to a faucet. Makes 8 bath sachets.



### ROSE PETAL POTPOURRI

- *3 cups dried rose petals* 2 cups dried lavender
- 1 cup dried lemon verbena
- 1 tablespoon dried lemon peel 1 tablespoon allspice
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon 1 tablespoon cloves
- 1. In a large jar, combine the rose petals and lavender. In a medium bowl, mix the lemon verbena, lemon peel, allspice, cinnamon and cloves. Pour the lemon mixture into the jar contain-

ing the rose petals and lavender. 2. Cover jar tightly and shake ingredients. Let potpourri stand for 2 to 3 weeks, shaking mixture frequently to combine the scents.

### To give as gifts:

### HERBAL RUBBING LOTION

This is refreshing herbal lotion is a wonderful pick-me-up for sore muscles and tired minds at the end of a long day. The herbs also give the rubbing alcohol a pleasant fragrance. The herbs may be obtained from grocery stores or online sources. You also can purchase decorative bottles online or

- from craft stores. cup fresh lavender leaves
- 1/4 cup lemon verbena
- 1/4 cup mint leaves 1/4 cup rosemary sprigs
- cups unscented rubbing alcohol 1. Place the herbs in a plastic bag. Roll a rolling pin back and forth over the herbs until they are slightly crushed

to release the oils and fragrance. 2. Place herbs in a glass jar that has been sterilized by boiling. Add the rubbing alcohol. Cover tightly and label the jar NOT TO BE USED INTERNALLY. Set aside in a cool, dry place for 5 to 7 days. Strain the alcohol through several layers of

cheesecloth into pretty jars or bottles. 3. Cap tightly and label bottles or jars, NOT TO BE USED INTERNALLY. Tie a pretty bow around the bottles or jars, if desired. Makes 2 cups rubbing lotion.

seniors, aims to improve on last year's record and make a deep playoff run. The Wildcats were district runners-up last season and lost in the region quarterfinals.





HOLLYWOOD -- 'Tis the season of giving, unless you are "America's Got Talent" or "American Idol" or "The Voice"! When Howie Mandel says repeatedly, "I don't know if this is a \$1,000,000 act," he's absolutely right. In fact, the winning prize is nothing near \$1 million!

You may have read the disclaimer that appears with every show that says the \$1 million prize will be paid to the winner over a 40, yes, 40-year period. That means autistic and blind season 14-winner Kodi Lee, 24 when he won, would not receive his last payment until he is 64. According to Forbes Magazine, "The million-dollar lump sum would certainly be less than half a million dollars ... before taxes are even deducted. If a winner wants 40 payments over four decades, they could receive \$25,000 yearly ... before taxes."

In "America's Got Talent's" defense, it makes all this completely clear to contestants prior to the competition. The winner and some of the top contenders do get to play a special engagement in Las Vegas at Planet Hollywood Resort and Casino. Ventriloquists Terry Fator and Grace VanderWaal have been the most successful winners.

"American Idol" is not innocent either. In 2019, winner Laine Hardy won a record deal with Hollywood Records, a \$125,000 prize for winning and another \$125,000 on completing an album within four months. The deal may include as many as six albums, and while recording they allegedly receive \$1,000 a week to cover living expenses and an additional \$1,000 for every master completed and turned in. The contestant also receives a \$300,000 advance for recording their album, which they are expected to pay back with album sales in addition to 50% of marketing costs, after the album's release. In some cases, the artists were allegedly unhappy about the way they were handled or that they were unable to exit their contract to accept much more lucrative offers. Carrie Underwood, Kelly Clarkson, Chris Daughtry and Clay Aiken have been by far the most successful "American Idol" winners.

The winner of "The Voice" is awarded \$100,000 and a record deal with Republic Records (a division of Universal Music Group) or the Nashville-based Big Machine Records. Of the 18 winners so far, only Cassadee Pope has achieved even a moderate amount of success.

A horse of a totally different color is the Nobel Peace Prize. The winner receives a medal, the title of Nobel Peace Prize Laureate and 10 million Swedish crowns, which equals about \$1.2 million in U.S. dollars. Obviously, winning a Nobel Prize is far better, but when you're a singer or talent looking for your big break, all of the above doesn't sound so un-Nobel. Merry Christmas!
