What could be more telling about this time of year than a community coming together to help parents who cannot afford to buy their children gifts for Christmas. That's exactly what played out in December with the Toys for Tots Drive culminating on Dec. 19 in Zephyr-

Three organizations — the Lions Club off Dean Dairy Road, where Sunday's distribution took place, Moose Lodge 2276, which was instrumental in fundraising through a Poker Run and a car show to name a few events, and the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve, which initiated the program in 1947 — joined forces to help

needy families.

"It's just so gratifying to see people in need get something from the community," said Rod Rehrig, past commandant of Marine Corps League Detachment

In all, more than 1,200 families were the recipients of the generosity of those groups mentioned. More than \$34,000 was raised, according to Brenda Neuhauser, a

To qualify, a parent had to show proof of being a Zephyrhills resident and gifts were for boys and girls less than a year old up to age 12.

"We don't bother to ask how much their income is," said Lions co-coordinator Debbie Phelps, noting that once appointments were given out some of the others were told to come back later that afternoon.

Ashley Montomery, who recently started working again, showed up to get gifts for her daughters, Aleyah, 11, and 4-year-old Anabell.

"I thought it would help me out," she said. "I got a good amount of stuff for both of them and things that they'll like."

# Renewed lease, renewed hope at Zephyrhills Municipal Golf Course

The passage of a city council resolution on Nov. 29, gave new life to the public golf course in Zephyrhills

There was a time, not too long ago, when the future of the Zephyrhills Municipal Golf Course was in jeopardy. The COVID-19 Pandemic cutoff golfers from the facility, the extension of the airport runway bit a large chunk of the facility off and the spectre of the Florida National Guard looking to buy the city-owned property hung like a Sword of Damocles.

'It was kind of a perfect storm," office manager Aya Burkhart said. "Minimum wage went up, Covid hit and the National Guard was looking, all at the same time."

Already a seasonally-heavy course, the municipal golf course got hit hard during the pandemic.

"The Canadians didn't come at all last year," kitchen manager Denise McKillip said.

Just as all these factors began to bear down on the little golf course next to the airport, their lease was coming up. April of 2022 began to look like the final chapter in the course's history. It came up in a fall city council meeting where both Burkhart and superintendent Jeff Sweet attended and spoke but the lease renewal was postponed to a later date. This must have sent chills down the spines of the course's staff and volunteers. What's more? It was happening before seasonal residents returned. The course's support base still wasn't back in town

"It was scary, a lot of places were folding left and right," pro shop manager Craig Sexton said. "Then we had less public support with the growhinds out of town. No one brown with the snowbirds out of town. No one knew which way it was going to go."

Finally, by late November, most of their support base had returned and they showed up at a Nov. 29 city council meeting to voice their support of the little golf course that could. The council chambers were packed with people ready to share their stories about what the facility meant to them. Much to their surprise, tucked into the bundled Consent Agenda, was the approval of a new lease - a new lease on life for the facility.

"This all started back in May, our only time without many members around but they wrote letters, contacted city council and even signed petitions," Burkhart said. "It was such

# Bulldogs come up short in 4-2 loss to Hernando

Host Zephyrhills drops a third straight game, which followed a modest two-game winning streak

While you don't get points on the scoreboard for effort, progress is definitely being made by the Zephyrhills High girls soccer team. The Bulldogs, who have seen their share of struggles of late and have not had a winning season in more than a decade, are not far removed from their first two-game winning streak in years.

To say they still have a way to go, though, was clearly apparent in last Friday night's game at Bulldog Stadium. The home team lost 4-2 against Hernando, which improved to 8-5 overall.

That left Zephyrhills at 2-10-1 and with a three-game losing skid heading into the winter break. The Bulldogs, who did not get their first victory until the ninth game of the season, do not play again until Jan. 3 when they host a struggling Brooksville Central squad that won just one of its first 12 games.

"I have no complaints how we played (against Hernando). The effort was there," said Zephyrhills coach Katie Jeffcott, who also has coached girls soccer at Stewart Middle as

'Stuffies' for Tampa Police Department Nearly 250 stuffed animals donated for officers to carry in vehicles to provide comfort

Some cuddly teddy bears and other stuffed animals will join the Tampa Police Department thanks to Saint Leo University. On Dec. 16, at the university's Tampa Education Center, Interim TPD Chief Ruben Delgado, Assistant Chief Lee Bercaw, and members of the department's new Behavioral Health Unit and others TPD members, received nearly 250 stuffed ani-

to children in stressful, crisis situations

Spearheaded by Saint Leo University-Tampa and supported by the university's Student Government Union and East Pasco Education Center, teddy bears for TPD collected the stuffed animals from Nov. 9 through Dec. 13 at the university's Tampa location and at its residential campus in Pasco County.

The new Behavioral Health Unit along with the major crimes, sex crimes, and domestic violence units will now have teddy bears and stuffed animals in their vehicles that they can give to provide comfort to

children in stressful situations, said Bercaw.

"Children may not be a victim of a crime," Bercaw said, "but they may witness a parent having a mental health issue or other issues.'

Saint Leo University provides teddy bears,

Law enforcement officers often encounter children on the scene of a crime, accident, or other situation. "When police arrive on scene, they're the first people to see children in a traumatic situation," said Delgado. "Giving them a teddy bear or a stuffed animal helps calm them. It really makes a difference.'

"Now, thanks to Saint Leo University, we'll be able to provide a teddy bear, and we'll get the child to smile," said Officer Angie Torres, a member of the Behavioral Health Unit. "If I get a teddy bear, I smile. We all love teddy bears.'

Saint Leo moved its Tampa location to the historic former Berriman-Morgan Cigar Factory building, 1403 N. Howard Ave., in late 2020. "We really wanted to support our local community and give back," said Rod Kirkwood, director of Saint Leo's Tampa Education Center. "Being able to partner with and support the Tampa Police Department is important, and we want interactions with the police to be positive for children, even if it's a scary situation."

The Tampa Education Center hopes to continue this partnership and collect more "comfort squads" of stuffed animals





a relief when the lease terms were approved."

The new lease guarantees five years with the option to renew every five years with the option of extending up to 20. Both parties must agree to the extensions. After the fifth year of the lease and upon the first renewal, the monthly fee period by the course to the city increases two percent every year up to 10 years. From there, both parties can renegotiate.

The 18-hole course was originally built in 1957. It is conducive to both retirees and beginner golfers. While most courses are 7,000 yards, Zephyrhills Municipal Golf Course is just 5,400 yards, making tee offs and drives a little easier.

"This is definitely a friendly golf course," 18-year member Bob McGown said. "Other courses are tougher but for someone that's learning the game, it's really good for them."

Annual memberships run \$1,300 for an individual and \$2,500 for a family. Monthly rates range from \$300 to \$500. The course keeps 28 volunteers on scholarship, where they work at the course in exchange for membership. It's built a family atmosphere over the years.

"After seven years here, I've gotten to know the majority of the people," McKillip said. "I see them on the 18th hole and there's a beer and popcorn on the table waiting for them when

The staff, volunteers and members very much embody the extended family atmosphere.

'It's a big family, you lose some, you gain some," Sexton said. "When we lose members, it's like losing a family member." Staff all have their own areas of expertise and no one steps on each other's toes. No one micromanages the different depart-

"That's part of why I love it here, everyone has their own territory and there's a lot of pride in their work," Burkhart said. The family atmosphere endures whether or not people are

"We want people to come here, even if it's just for coffee or to hang out," Burkhart said. "We don't want people to be by themselves. I lost my mom to depression and I do not want people to go through that."

The course stays open from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. and the pro shop stays open until 6 p.m. seven days a week. Membership is climbing back to normal. Sexton says that they are at 70 percent of membership from pre-Covid numbers and that half the Canadians have still not yet returned. The course offers 20 percent discounts to military veterans and Burkhart says that as much as half of her members are veterans. Young or old, veteran or civilian, the Zephyrhills Municipal Golf Course is back and is welcoming the community with open arms.

"We don't want you to stay at home, we want you to be here," Burkhart said. "We want to see people be happy here."



HOLLYWOOD -- Henry Cavill is on the short list to become James Bond! He's certainly qualified, after three Superman films (combined grosses of \$2 billion) and a season of Netflix's "The Witcher" (season 2 just premiered, and there's already a pickup for season 3). He's currently shooting "Enola Holmes 2" and preparing "Argylle" for Apple TV+, with Sam Rockwell, Bryce Dallas Howard, Bryan Cranston, Catherine O'Hara, John Cena and Samuel L. Jackson, the first of three in a franchise. In "Argylle," Cavill plays a larger-than-life action hero (with a wink). That will be followed by the "Highlander" reboot (for which he's getting \$5 million), the start of yet another franchise for him. His last 007type film, "The Man From Ú.N.C.L.E." (2015), grossed only \$107 million, which didn't cover its \$85 millionplus price tag.

Hollywood studios are famous for their creative bookkeeping. Big-name stars are warned to get their money up front because the back-end profits often suffer from studios "cooking the books"! Anthony Mc-Carten, writer of "Bohemian Rhapsody," recently sued 20th Century Fox because it claimed "Bohemian Rhapsody," which cost \$55 million, lost \$51 million. He was contracted to receive 5% of the profits, from the back end, but hasn't seen a cent of the \$900 million it grossed, so he filed a more than 50-page lawsuit in Los Angeles Superior Court.

In 1989, James Garner sued Universal Pictures for \$16.5 million for syndication royalties from his "Rockford Files" series. He was only paid only \$249,000 of the \$119 million royalties, but six years later he settled out of court for an undisclosed sum (rumored to be \$6 mil-

lion). In 2013, Don Johnson sued Rysher Entertainment for foreign-syndication monies owed for his "Nash Bridges" series (of which he was part owner). He sued for \$50 million, and a panel of judges ruled he be paid \$15 million. He persisted and was awarded an estimated \$19 million and 50% of the

copyright of the series. In July 2012, "Happy Days" cast members Anson Williams, MariOn Ross, Don Most, Erin Moran and Patricia Bosley, widow of Tom Bosley, sued CBS for the unpaid use of their likenesses and names in merchandising and got \$65,000 in their settlement. Stars Ron Howard and Henry Winkler had their own deals and were already amply paid.

It had to happen: "General Hospital" stars Steve Burton (Jason Morgan, on and off since 1991) and Ingo Rademacher (Jasper Jax since 1996) were "dropped" from the show when they refused to get vaccinated after a Nov. 1 vaccine mandate. The other three soaps, "The Bold and The Beautiful," "Days of Our LIves" and "The Young and The Restless," have relied on testing, social distancing and other CDC guidelines. Will they get the point? Stay tuned.
