# Christmas Parade is cause for a downtown celebration

Festival of Lights and accompanying parade represent most recent event hosted by Main Street Zephyrhills

Within the past year, Main Street Zephyrhills has helped with the downtown revival. The non-profit organization has organized Music & Motorcycles, Halloween Howl and partnered with the Fraternal Order of Eagles Aerie 3752 on last month's Veterans Parade.

The biggest and most notable event, however, occurred Saturday when Main Street Zephyrhills helped to bring back the Festival of Lights highlighted by the annual Christmas Parade down 5th Avenue. More people lined the downtown streets for the festival and pa-

rade than any of the other previous events. For Faith Wilson, Main Street's coordinator, it

marked her first festival and parade at Christmas-time. Last year's event was cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic and she was hired this summer.

"I didn't have any expectations, because I had never been," said Wilson, crediting the organizational skills of what primarily is a new board of directors as well as the volunteer efforts of her son, 11-year-old Bryce. "We all came together and it came out spectacular.'

The theme of this year's festival was a Candyland Christmas and it included the traditional tree lighting and visit from Santa Claus. In all, the parade listed 52 entrants and there were 66 vendors set up in the downtown corridor.

"I'm blown away by the talent of all the parade participants," Wilson said. "They were so creative."

Maryanne and Edward Royster, a retired couple from Michigan who spent their winters in Zephyrhills, said they usually come down to Florida after Thanksgiving. Attending the Christmas parade is among several events they enjoy coming to.

"We like seeing all the young people on the floats.

## **Bulldogs defeat** Wildcats 73-55 on **Alan Reed Court**

Zephyrhills gets the upper hand in an early season matchup between Class 5A, District 6 and Sunshine Athletic Conference rivals

It's never too early to get the upper hand in the Class 5A, District 6 and Sunshine Athletic Conference races. Host Zephyrhills did just that with a 73-55 victory over Wesley Chapel on Alan Reed Court last Friday night in the second game of the season for both high school boys basketball teams.

The Bulldogs improved to 2-0 overall with matching marks in the district and conference as well. They defeated Cypress Creek in the season opener. Zephyrhills has seven playoff appearances in the past nine seasons but did not make it out of the district tournament last

Meanwhile, the Wildcats dropped to 1-1. They defeated Cypress River Ridge in their season opener.

important, but there's a lot more basketball to be played," Zephyrhills coach Mike Novak said on the importance of starting off the season strong and taking the lead in those conference and district races.

Novak, now in his sixth season as the varsity coach since taking over for Reed, is well aware that it is indeed a long season and that there will be plenty of ups and downs. He witnessed that first-hand when the Bulldogs started off slow and trailed the Wildcats by 10 points (18-8) at the end of the first quarter.

"The guys were amped up a little bit," Novak said, noting that his team settled down

"once we got a few shots."

It did not take long for Zephyrhills to erase that 10-point deficit with the home team giving the crowd, which included cheerleaders in the stands near center court, plenty to cheer about. The Bulldogs outscored the Wildcats 23-12 in the second quarter, taking a 31-30 halftime lead on a Kevin Pagan layup in the wan-

Pagan, a senior power forward, was one of three Zephyrhills players to score in double figures. He finished with 18 points and, perhaps more importantly, eight rebounds. He also helped lead the Bulldogs to a 21-9 scoring advantage in the third quarter.

Also contributing to that run that allowed the Bulldogs to enter the final frame with an



# Zephyrhills wins two-day tourney hosted by the Bulls

Wiregrass Ranch plans on making an annual tradition of new Hillsborough-Pasco wrestling format

For many years, several of Pasco County's more competitive high school wrestling teams have taken part in an early-season tournament hosted by East Lake, which featured Pasco and Pinellas schools.

Last year's competition, however, was cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic and East Lake opted not to continue that series for this year. No problem for Wiregrass Ranch coach Jamey Ketler, who eagerly put together an inaugural dual meet for teams from Hillsborough and Pasco counties.

The move to form the Pasco-Hillsborough Duals stems from a realignment by the Florida High School Athletic Association that now has Pasco and Hillsborough teams squaring off more than in years past.

"It only makes sense that Pasco schools wrestle the Hillsborough schools," he said, adding, "I'm going to try to keep it here at Wiregrass Ranch. We're trying to build our program and this is another good opportunity to bring wrestling into the Wesley Chapel area."

"I love that (coach) Ketler put this on, because we never really see Hillsborough teams," said Jackson Hudson, a 160-pounder who wrestles for Cypress Creek.

Zephyrhills' Mike Martinez was among several local coaches who looked forward to the new format. Even more so afterward since Zephyrhills won. The Bulldogs went 6-0 to finish ahead of runner-up Hudson and up-and coming team.

"I couldn't be more proud of this group," Martinez said. "They're stubborn and love challenges, just like Bulldogs should be. "It's going to be a fun season. I think (the Hillsborough-Pasco format is) great. I always felt we've got some good wrestlers in this area. This will be another way to build it up."

Cypress Creek and host Wiregrass Ranch finished third and fourth, respectively, to give Pasco teams the top four spots. The highest finish for a Hillsborough squad was fifth-place Bell Creek, a private school in Tampa. King, Tampa Prep and Spoto rounded out the field by

finishing sixth-eighth.

Individually, five Bulldogs did not lose a match. Jaiden Martinez went 6-0 with five pins and a 7-1 decision in the 145-pound weight class. At 170, Idael Reyes had five pins and a win by forfeit. Theotis Smith, a 220-pounder

had four pins with two forfeit victories. Dalton Arrington and Gabriel Gulay each had three pins at 182 and 113, respectively.

Wiregrass Ranch had three undefeated wrestlers who went 6-0 in Devin Lanier, 120; Donovan Eury, 126; and Roman Sanchez, 138.

Last weekend's two-day tourney also included a girls division with Ketler citing an increased interest among that group. That proved to be true with more than 30 girls competing af-

ter the boys division was completed.

Two girls from Zephyrhills wrestled last weekend, but not at Wiregrass Ranch. Kohana Martinez, the coach's daughter, and Anesha Gonzalez opted to compete in the Clash of Titans all-girls division in Orlando. Kohana won the 100-pound weight class, but Gonzalez, a relative newcomer, did not place among the leaders.

A touching part of the tourney came during a break in the action when Wiregrass Ranch wrestler Steven Ochs, a senior who wrestles at 152 and is in his second season, made an announcement that he committed to enlisting in the U.S. Marine Corps.

"They just offered a great opportunity," said Ochs, who plans to pursue a culinary degree and be a chef.

"There's still an inherent level of patriotism in this generation," said staff Sgt. Connor Mitchell, a recruiter based in Wesley Chapel.

In a different dual meet, Zephyrhills Christian Academy won five of seven team matches. The Warriors posted victories over Wesley Chapel, Nature Coast, Citrus, Brooksville Central



The Pirates were able to take advantage of the right side of the Bulldog defense and it was not long before Christian Montes added a goal to make it 2-0.

The Pirates controlled the action through most of the first 12 minutes, putting near-constant pressure on the Stewart goal. Rangel came near to scoring again, blasting a shot dead center that sailed over the crossbar. Moments later, Juan Carols Sanchez would put one away from more than 20 yards out to make it 3-0.

The Pirates were right back on the attack, Montes driving into the 18-yard box and sending a high shot just under the crossbar for a 4-0 lead. Again, the Pirates were on the move, putting pressure on the Bulldog goal. Sanchez, then slipped a shot far post just minutes later to make it 5-0.

Then the Bulldogs got another unlucky break. They got whistled for a foul inside the 18-yard box and Benicio Leos buried the penalty kick to make it 6-0. Just moments later, Rangel battled through the Bulldog defense and finished off a flurry inside the 18-yard box and made it 7-0.

The Bulldogs looked to be teetering on the brink of a first-half mercy ruling. That's when they finally flipped the field with Kobe Ten Brink pushing deep into Pirate territory and getting a shot off. It won a free kick that was on target but saved by Pasco keeper Sergio Velasquez. This opened up into the first half water

The Bulldogs pushed back, late in the first

The Pirates now finish out the season against John Long and Centennial, their only loss this season coming at the hands of Weightman. They are technically still in the hunt for the Conference title.

"Weightman was our first game of the year, they were really good but we've been getting better," Herndon said.

The Bulldogs are in a different phase, just trying to hold together and build for the future.


"Our objective is to come out and have fun," Padilla said. "We've improved so much from where we started the season."

"You can come and watch from the terrace, drink and eat under the umbrella and watch your kids," Collard said. "A lot of parents will go and get a massage while their kids play."

## Sheriff's Newsletter

Gift cards are both highly requested and convenient for holiday shoppers. Some retailers offer gift cards digitally, removing the physical card. Unfortunately, with all the positives, gift cards create an ideal opportunity for scammers. The Pasco Sheriff's Office wants to help you spot and avoid potential gift card scams this holiday season.

Carefully inspect gift cards before you purchase a balance on them. A scam often starts before a card is activated. Gift cards stored near the register and under security camera coverage are less likely with which to be tampered. Carefully review cards and packaging for signs of tampering or exposure. Scammers can take a photo or write down card numbers and check the balance later, searching for cards with an activated amount. If the PIN is exposed on a gift card, notify a store representative and choose an untampered card on which to load funds. Be mindful of replacement stickers that may cover security codes, look for scratches to the card beyond the security strip.

Buy gift cards directly from the retailer and online purchases are best. Direct purchases

require fewer transfers of funds resulting in more stringent security. Online retailers mail the gift card directly to you, preventing any access to the purchase codes and PIN. In addition, your receipt from the retailer for the gift card has a direct verification to validate your purchase. As a bonus, stores sometimes offer incentives when you purchase a specific amount. Never buy gift cards from an auction or community website. Resale sites are often a traffic source for stolen, fraudulent or already used gift cards.

Save receipts after the purchase of a gift card. Consider taking a photo of your receipt. You can email that photo to yourself for record-keeping if you fear you may lose the receipt. If you fall victim to a scam, your receipt can validate the original ownership and value of the gift card. In addition, the company's direct purchase of a gift card offers enhanced transaction information such as purchase location, activation and any use of the gift card.

If you receive a gift card, treat it like you would a debit card. Using a gift card quickly helps eliminate potential threats. Change the security code as quickly as possible to something unique only you will know. Check the company's website to see if you can create an account. This feature can help protect your credit value as well as the risk of misplacement or theft. If available, register your gift card online with the company. Some large retailers realize the potential lost or stolen gift card and the opportunity to combine the balance of several cards onto one. At the same time, when you register your gift card, check for the availability to report a scam online through the retailer. Online fraud reporting will avoid a long wait on the phone to speak with the fraud department and easily save confirmation or claim

Taking a bit of extra caution with your gift cards this holiday season will help prevent gift card scams.







HOLLYWOOD -- If you're Leonardo DiCaprio, how do you top starring with Jennifer Lawrence in Netflix scifi drama "Don't Look Up" (due Dec. 24) and with Robert DeNiro in Martin Scorsese's \$200 million "Killer of the Flower Moon" (for Paramount+ and Apple TV)? Star, produce and play cult leader Jim Jones, who, in Jonestown, Guyana, on Nov. 18, 1978, fatally poisoned 900 followers and himself with cyanide-laced Flavor Aid. DiCaprio turned 47 on Nov. 11, the same age as Jim Jones when he died.

Next, Kidman reunites with her "Big Little Lies" husband, Alexander Skarsgard, in the historical thriller "The North Man," starring Bjork and Ethan Hawke, out April

Gal Gadot was thrilled when original 1970s TV "Wonder Woman" Lynda Carter, now 70, played Asteria, the greatest Amazon Warrior in Greek mythology. She confessed, "Lynda has mentored me from the first moment I was cast as Wonder Woman. She's a true champion of what I've been doing." Carter will be back for the third edition of "Wonder Woman." Gadot hit screens Nov. 5 in "Red Notice," with Ryan Reynolds and Dwayne Johnson, and is upcoming in "Death on the Nile," out Feb. 11.
