

East Pasco pair powers through pickleball tournament at SVB

The Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center held its inaugural pickleball tournament this past December. The event attracted 350 players competing in five different sports over the course of the second week of December. Locals Peggy Griffiths of Dade City and Lani Prillman of Zephyrhills won the Pickleball Women's Doubles of the umbrella event, the Senior Games State Championships. The event featured both mixed and womens' doubles in pickleball, as well as other paddle sports.

"We have the two fastest-growing sports at SVB now, pickleball and padel," Sarah Vande Berg CEO Pascal Collard said. "Everyone said they had a great time and loved our facility. Some even said we need more pickleball courts."

Pickleball is one of the fastest-growing sports, not just in the

country, but in the world. The sport is kind of a hybrid of tennis and table tennis but it casts a wide net, luring seniors, tennis players and athletes in general. Prillman and Griffiths are tennis partners.

"The best pickleball players come from the tennis courts," Prillman said. "The strokes are very similar."

They started their run at pickleball about five years ago as the opportunity to play popped up at the Zephyrhills YMCA. "After we started, several more players started coming - it was

a good core group," Prillman said. The YMCA offered both indoor and outdoor pickleball opportunities. Pickleball plays on a smaller court than tennis but utilizes the same net and thus can be played most anywhere - a tennis court,

an outdoor or even an indoor basketball court. A wooden paddle

with a wiffle ball-like ball (at least for outdoor games) are the pri-

mary differences from tennis. Prillman's and Griffiths' advantage in tennis translated over to pickleball. "I'm left-handed and Peggy is right-handed," Prillman said. "It keeps our forehands in the middle of the court."

Want to hit down the Prillman/Griffiths main street? Better think again. The pair added one more laurel to their exploits as a

Wiregrass Ranch ice hockey program is revived

Bulls shake off a few struggling seasons to reach .500 and become playoff contenders once again

A longtime playoff contender that has fallen on hard times in recent years, the Bulls are in the midst of a resurgence. Through 18 games in the Lightning High School Hockey League, Wiregrass Ranch head-ed into the winter break at 8-8-2. The Bulls have not reached the coveted .500 mark since the 2017-18 sea-

Of even greater importance is that the team of players from central and east Pasco were 4-2-2 in the Andreychuk Division, behind only front-running Tampa Jesuit, which was 10-3-2 overall and 6-2-1 in the division. The Bulls, who had just five wins last season, are on a three-game winning streak — 8-1 and 8-2 victories over Lakeland George Jenkins before a 6-2 win against Bloomingdale — with five wins in their past six games.

'We started out a bit rocky, but when they realized they can't play as individuals we started doing pretty good," said coach J. Powers, a former assistant who took on the head role midway through last season. "Everybody's doing a little bit to make an impact. The process is just literally to trust each other. They had to learn how to win rather than remember how they used to lose."

A 3-1 win over perennial playoff contender Jesuit in the season opener got Wiregrass Ranch headed in the right direction.

"That first win was huge," Powers said. "We really won it by playing a solid defensive system. Defense starts in the offensive end when you lose the

The Wiregrass Ranch Sports Complex was the place to be for the final week of 2020. Pasco County's newest gem on the sports scene hosted 36 high school girls basketball teams from throughout the state for the Tampa Bay Christmas Invitational.

Previously played at host Seffner Christian and SLAM Academy in Tampa, the fifth-year series appears to have found a new home. Aside from new site, this is the first year the tourney has not included out-of-state teams, primarily due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Joe Cooper, Seffner Christian's coach and tournament organizer, said he already has heard from more than 100 teams in 13 states that want to compete in next year's invitational. That makes the invitational a top draw for college coaches as well.

"It's been a phenomenal transition," he said. "I got with directors here and told



EASY SUPPER SHAKSHUKA

- tablespoons olive oil
- small onion, chopped
- teaspoon red chile flakes or 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper or 1/4 teaspoon hot sauce
- teaspoon salt
- teaspoon ground black pepper teaspoon paprika
- teaspoon ground cumin
 - teaspoon ground cloves or

- cinnamon
- cloves garlic, minced
- cups prepared marinara sauce cups fresh baby spinach

cup feta cheese Cilantro, basil or parsley *leaves, chopped (optional)*

1. In a large skillet over medium heat, add the olive oil, then add the chopped onion, the chile flakes or cayenne pepper or hot sauce, salt, pepper, paprika, cumin and cloves or cinnamon, and cook for 5 minutes, or until the onion becomes soft and translucent. Add the garlic and cook for another 1-2 minutes.

2. Stir in the marinara sauce and turn the heat to high to bring the sauce to a boil. Add the spinach, one handful at a time, and stir it in to wilt it.

3. Turn the heat to low. Using the back of a large spoon, make 4 indentions (wells) in the sauce to place the eggs. Gently crack the eggs in the skillet into the indentions in the tomato sauce and cover the skillet with a lid for 3 to 5 minutes, or until the whites of the eggs are cooked and set.

4. Sprinkle the feta cheese around the eggs and on top of the sauce. Garnish with the cilantro, basil or parsley, if desired, and serve warm with crusty bread or rolls to mop up the sauce. Serves 4.



puck. That's what they did in the first game and they believed in it."

Tyler Cook, a senior captain who has been with the team since he was a freshman, is a defensive stalwart. That, the coach noted, puts him in position of leadership to help the Bulls have a winning record in his final season.

"He brings pretty good tenacity," Powers said. "He keeps things positive. I know as a 12th-grader he did not want to have another losing season."

Wiregrass Ranch also gets leadership from alternate captains Daylan Campbell and Nick Simonelli, both of whom are senior forwards. Powers lauded Campbell for adapting to the team's defensive philosophy saying he "is now

focused on the team game." On the back end, contributing to a solid defense is the goaltending tandem of sophomores Ryan Costello and Oliver Andel. While some teams rely on a clear-cut starter with a backup that does not see much time between the pipes, Powers prefers more even playing time for his goalies. Andel is 5-3-1 with a .896 save percentage while Costello is 3-5-1 at .891.

"Our goaltenders are really top-notch," the coach said. "I try to keep them on a rotation."

Offensively, the Bulls are getting balanced production from several forwards, not just one of two primary scorers like on some teams. Campbell and Joshua Bain, a sophomore who has played forward and on defense, share the team lead in goals at 11. Campbell had a hat trick and four points in a win over Palm Harbor University while Bain's breakout game was a five-point night with four goals in the 8-1 rout of George Jenkins.

Not far behind that scoring pair is Daniel Petukhov, with nine goals and 15 points. Additionally, Campbell and Sebastian Powers, the coach's son, are tied with 16 points, one more than Petukhov.

Another factor in the team's resurgence is having a handful of players who also compete on travel hockey teams. Still, it all comes down to a renewed commitment to defense by all of the players, not just some of them.

The biggest difference is we're really starting to keep pucks out of our net," said Powers in a comparison to this year's team from last

them we could be one of the best girls high school basketball tournaments in the country."

Zephyrhills and Wesley Chapel were two local teams among the participants. Both teams got in three games, but neither fared well. The Wildcats won just once while the Bulldogs lost all three games. Regardless of the outcomes, coaches for both teams spoke about the importance of getting in some playing time during the break against teams they normally do not

"It kind of gives the kids the feeling they're doing something different," Zephyrhills coach Chris Smith said. "You get to see other teams. We came here to get out and play different talent. You definitely didn't want to go in and lose all three games that we played."

"The competition is really good at this event," Wesley Chapel coach Peter Livingston said, adding, "It was not the best days for Pasco County sports. It was kind of disappointing at the end of the tournament."



SVB offered a unique opportunity to host such a large tournament. The sparkling new facility has kicked off their grand opening with a number of marquee events.

'SVB is a beautiful facility," Prillman said. "There were hundreds of people at the tournament and we didn't feel like we were on top of each other because there's so much space.'

There's also a social element to pickleball that cannot be overlooked. There are very few restrictions to participating. Age and space to play are not significant obstacles. While tournaments pit fixed teams against each other, regular play or practice is far more social.

"It's one of the neat things (about pickleball), is that you rotate around and play with other people," Prillman said.

The social element, added to the accessibility of the game, mixed in with the sport's surging popularity, make it a prime activity for growing a social network. And it's not just for seniors, either.

"The sport is exploding within the senior community but it's even trickling down to the younger players, as well," Prillman said.

The state tournament win qualified Prillman and Griffiths for the Senior Games national tournament held only every two years. The last one in Albuquerque, N.M., in 2019, drew almost 14,000 participants across 20 different sports. The National Senior Games has been held every other year since 1987 and has 54 affiliated qualifying Member Games in North America.
