Susan Blackwell, assistant district manager for Bon Worth Women's Clothing in Zephyrhills, one of several places throughout east and central Pasco with giving collection trees, is overjoyed to have taken part in the program for the past three years.

"I don't like to think of people being alone on Christmas," she said. "This makes you feel like somebody who might be forgotten won't be."

Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day brings out veterans

Zephyrhills Museum of Military History hosts commemorative event

A visit to the southwest corner of the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport last Saturday harkened back to a time that changed world history and honored Americans that some refer to as the greatest generation.

The 10th Annual Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day, complete with reenactors and World War II veterans, came a month after the nation recognized another day in military





history. Armistice Day, signifying the end of World War I, was celebrated in early November.

"If it wasn't for these guys in World War II the world would've been totally different, not just the United States but the world," said Cliff Moffett, president of the Zephyrhills Museum of Military History.

Added John Bolender, a museum

volunteer, "I think that generation was pretty selfless; they had a big duty to country. I try to thank them for their service. When they come out to events like this I hope they have pleasant memories."

Among a handful of World War II veterans in attendance were two survivors of the Pearl

Harbor attack by the Japanese on the U.S. Pacific Fleet in Hawaii. Dec. 7, 1941 lives in infamy and Moffett ensured that survivors Charles McClelland and Cecil "Wig" Wigmore would be honored by sharing their stories. A third, Earl Ingram, was hurt and did not show up.

Moffett recollected how McClelland suffered a broken leg during the first wave of the aerial assault yet still managed to perform his duty by raising the American flag on a pole. The 95-year-old also survived the sinking of a ship.

Wigmore, 97, saw enemy planes flying overhead as he went to breakfast on that fateful morning and got to headquarters in the mountains to man the phones and assist with communications.

Saturday's commemoration also featured a display of military vehicles, a weapons demonstration and three military aircraft from days gone by. A C-47B aircraft, aptly named "Hit or Miss" for its elusive tactics during World War II, is being restored and prepared for an intercontinental mission. Other aircraft included a C45 and C53, the latter of which is stationary.

Ed Franco, owner of Zephyrhills Turin Aviation who is restoring the C-47B, said 20 U.S. based planes and 21 in Europe will take flight to follow the routes taken as part of the D-Day Invasion. It is part of the 75th anniversary of the 1944 battle in Normandy, France.

"They're wanting to get as many planes as possible and drop as many troops on the beaches as possible," Franco said.

The museum is built on grounds of what

once was an airfield for U.S. Army Training Corps in preparation for World War II. There once were many barracks on site, but now only the former infirmary remains.

A stone at the foot of a flagpole behind the barracks building reads: In memory and thanks for the service of the Tenth Fighter Squadron.

Jerry English, a reenactor who served in the U.S. Army (1962-68), showed up as a proud participant.

"It brings back a lot of memories," he said. "It just reminds me of how great the greatest generation was and is."

Chris Heesch, whose father Fred served in the U.S. Navy during the Korean War, assisted Moffett in raising the American flag early in the ceremony. He proudly dons a Navy uniform, reasoning, "It's not just my dad. My whole family was Navy (including a grandfather and uncle)."

Like the others, Heesch walked around during the ceremony hugging and chatting with the numerous veterans in attendance.

"I love them guys," he said. "When they recognize you and appreciate what you do and throw their arms around you, that's what it's all about. And the second-best thing is the children. They appreciate that legacy."

Manny Maldonado, a 91-year-old who was a paratrooper in World War II, was among those who appreciated the ceremony.

"It made me feel good," he said. "You get people who recognize you and not everyone does that."







such items as clothing, shoes, CD players and even a night stand to match one resident's special request.

"We basically know what to choose," Riddle said. "I go around and ask our residents, 'What would you like Santa to bring you?' Whatever they ask for they pretty much get."

Brightening up a seniors holiday season is a community effort of Home Instead Senior Care, which cited an AARP report that 28 percent of people 65-and-older live alone. Each year, many seniors have fewer family members and friends to provide company and care, which can result in social isolation and make the holidays especially difficult and lonely.

The annual initiative of Home Instead Senior Care, which began six years ago, works with communities to provide companionship and gifts to local seniors who may otherwise spend the holidays isolated. Last year, nearly 100 local seniors received 250 gifts thanks to the generosity of people.

"We love it and we love partnering with them," Riddle said of the partnership between Rosecastle and Home Instead Senior Care.
