

Brave foursome pulls man from trailer fire

Residents of Andy's Travel Trailer Resort save elderly man who relocated to assisted living facility

John Acrivlelis is alive, saved from a fire at Andy's Travel Trailer Resort thanks to the quick thinking and actions taken by four young men from Zephyrhills. The elderly man now resides in an assisted living facility in Hillsborough County.

"If it hadn't been for those boys that man would have died that night," said Debra Cannon, the resort's manager who called the foursome's effort nothing

short of heroic.

That heroic deed was not lost on Acrivlelis, who lauded the young men's collective lifesaving efforts.

"Basically, they saved my life," he said. "It turned out pretty good. I'm fortunate to be alive."

On Nov. 19 around 11 p.m. Acrivlelis' trailer, a fifth wheel that he owned and had been at the park, located at 37707 State Road 54 for the past six years, was on fire. He said he went to bed around 7-8 p.m. and had been asleep before being awoken and pulled from the burning structure by Anthony Pustella, Douglas D'Orsi, Matthew Murphy and Nicholas Mahoney.

Cannon provided the names of the young men, who could not be reached for comment.

"They heard an explosion and knew something was going on," Cannon recollected. "The guy was

AdventHealth seeking volunteers for 2019

Both the Zephyrhills and Dade City hospitals are looking to grow the ranks of their volunteer force

While the name has changed to AdventHealth for two hospitals in Dade City and Zephyrhills, one thing has remained the same - the need for volunteers.

Formerly known as Florida Hospital Zephyrhills and Florida Hospital Dade City, both facilities are constantly on the lookout for volunteers from the local communities. There are currently over 220 volunteers, with the majority supporting AdventHealth in Zephyrhills. There is always a need for more.

"It's a proven fact that people who volunteer live healthier, happier and longer lives," volunteer services manager Brenda Welcher said. "We can never have enough volunteers."

There are many different ways to volunteer at AdventHealth. Positions include information desk, escorting, ambassador, shuttle driver and patient services. Volunteers at the information desk help visitors and patients find the appropriate destination within the hospital. Escorts accompany patients around the hospital. Shuttle drivers help visitors and patients around the vast parking lot and must have a valid drivers license. They will undergo a driving background check through the DMV. Patients services volunteers visit patients in their rooms.

"They (patient service volunteers) are an extra set of eyes and hands, checking patients, attending to their needs," Welcher said.

The Ambassador program began in the fall of 2018 and is aimed at assisting visitors to the hospitals.

"We had some issues with visitors getting lost, with the ambassador program, we can assure that visitors get to their destination," Welcher said.

Ambassadors don't just point down a hallway, they walk the visitors to their destination. The hospital at Zephyrhills is sprawling and can be difficult

Name change becomes official for two local hospitals

AdventHealth signs now adorn faith-based hospitals in Zephyrhills and Dade City

The name change to AdventHealth was announced in 2018. Now, what once were Florida Hospital Zephyrhills and Florida Hospital Dade City have the signage to make the rebranding readily apparent to the general public.

While the two facilities have gone by previous names — the East Pasco Medical Center was changed to Florida Hospital Zephyrhills in 2006 and Florida Hospital Dade City had been Bayfront Health until 2018 — and undergone their share of expansions, as part of the Florida Hospital network they have been under the parent

company of AdventHealth.

All external signage should be in place on both campuses. The hospitals are currently working through interior signage for both, according to Susan Frimmel, marketing director for AdventHealth Zephyrhills and Dade City.

Amanda Maggard, president and CEO of AdventHealth Zephyrhills and Dade City, expressed her enthusiasm for the recent change.

"This is an exciting time for our local hospitals," she said. "We are now part of one national, unified brand focused on being more consumer-centric and connected. An essential element of our brand is providing exceptional care, which we've worked hard to do locally through achievements such as AdventHealth Dade City earning the area's only Atrial Fibrillation Accreditation and AdventHealth Zephyrhills being named One of Only 35 Top General Hospitals in the U.S. by The Leapfrog Group."

AdventHealth ranks as one of the nation's largest faith-based health systems with 47 hospital campuses in nine states. The 30



to navigate. Dade City's hospital is smaller but current renovations of the front entrance have highlighted the need for ambassadors.

"They closed the main entrance on Monday of this week for remodeling. Where people were used to going in, now there's a wall," Welcher said. "Volunteers from Zephyrhills offered to go to Dade City and help as ambassadors. They are still working their shifts at Zephyrhills, too. They are just adding a shift in Dade City as renovations are expected to continue for the next four months."

Volunteers will typically select a four-hour shift to help the hospital through peak hours. There's a shift from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. and another from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m. For every four-hour shift, volunteers get \$8 to spend on a meal in the cafeteria. They get a discount in the gift shop and every March there is an annual banquet for volunteers.

However, the real reward in volunteering is not tangible, it's spiritual.

"I love it (volunteering)," information desk volunteer Marge Jarvis said. "If people want to give back, this is the place to do it."

Jarvis would know. Her experience in 2010 at AdventHealth Zephyrhills spurred a career in volunteerism. Jarvis' late husband, Richard, was admitted to the hospital with severe heart problems. He succumbed to them on Sept. 1, 2010 but Jarvis' interaction with nurses, doctors and even the chaplain, made a lasting impression.

"I remember one of the nurses pulled me aside to share something with me. She had been telling her husband about Richard and was crying just relating the story - I was so touched by that," Jarvis said. "The chaplain would come into the room three or four times per day to pray over Richard. Sometimes, he would just stand toward the back of the room and just be

there. When they finally decided to take Richard off life support, I remember Dr. Tun stood there and cried and said, 'I should have been able to help him.'"

Two months later, Jarvis had taken the training classes and was volunteering at the hospital. She is now closing in on 11,000 hours. It was former volunteer services manager Suzie Bennett that setup Jarvis at the information desk. Jarvis has been there ever since.

"Working the information desk is great, you get to meet people, you're able to pray with people," Jarvis said. "Sometimes you can tell by looking at peoples' faces, you can see that something is wrong."

The humanitarian heart extends into the gift shop at AdventHealth Zephyrhills as Donna Moyer volunteers there. Moyer is no stranger to volunteering, public service or the medical field. Tax Collector Mike Fasano announces hourly starting salary increase to \$15 at Pasco's Tax Collector Offices

Mike Fasano, Pasco County's tax collector since 2013, announces that with the New Year comes a new starting salary for employees. New hires who join the office after Jan. 5 will receive a starting salary of \$15 per hour. Any existing employee who may currently be earning less than that amount will be increased to at least the new wage.

Increasing staff salaries was one of the first goals Fasano set when he took over reins of the office over five years ago. Appalled at how low many employees, most long-term career staff members, were receiving, he set out on a deliberate course of increasing salaries so that they truly will be a living wage for employees.

"In 2013 starting salaries were only \$9.25 an hour," said Fasano. "Our jobs are complicated and require in-depth training and experience. When I learned that people, especially those who have loyally served this organization for many years, were making so little, I knew I had to make it a priority to

increase their wages."

Over the next several years Fasano and his fiscal and human resources teams set about to incrementally increase wages to the level they are today.

"Over the past 5 plus years we've been able to raise the starting salary by 62 percent," Fasano continues. "In 2013 the starting salary was \$19,240 per year. Today, it is \$31,200 per year. Professionals who rely on this job for their livelihood deserve to be paid what they are worth. Their jobs are not easy. The transactions we do for local and state agencies are many and require accuracy and precision. It is my belief that to attract and maintain good employees they must be paid commensurate with their skills, abilities and experience."



asleep and they yanked him out of the trailer."

The young men's actions did not end there, Cannon said. They stood on a nearby picnic table and worked at putting the fire out with a garden hose. Not long after that, Pasco Fire Rescue and the Pasco Sheriff's Office responded.

"They literally jumped the fence and took it upon themselves to put it out," Cannon said. "Actually, they had it out before the fire department got there."

For his part, Acrivlelis was somewhat confused when the young men entered his trailer that night.

"They came in and said the place was on fire," Acrivlelis recalled. "The four of them grabbed me and pulled me out. I thought it was a joke at first. I guess the air conditioner on the roof got a short in it and caught fire."

"I thanked them," he continued. "To be honest with you I couldn't stop laughing. I was in shock."

Asked if he smelled smoke or was awoken by the fire, Acrivlelis responded that he did not, adding, "I smoke cigarettes, so my sense of smell isn't that good."

Acrivlelis, 74, is a U.S. Air Force veteran who served in the Vietnam era. He purchased the trailer, which was completely destroyed, in 1998 when he lived at Southern Charm. He said he relocated it from that RV resort off Chancey Road in Zephyrhills to Andy's six years ago.

"I really liked being at Andy's," Acrivlelis said. "I didn't quite like leaving the way I did. They're very good people."

Acrivlelis salvaged a Bose music system and his Calico cat, named Catastrophic, survived and was given to a neighbor.

After the fire he was met by an American Red Cross representative who he said gave him a \$350 credit card to purchase some clothes and

stay in a hotel for two nights. Later, his niece and her husband, Kathleen and Pat Hogan took him to the James Haley Veteran's Administration Hospital in Tampa. Ironically they were down visiting from upstate New York.

Not long after staying at the hospital in Tampa, the Hogans helped get Acrivlelis into Elmcroft of Carrollwood, a senior living facility where he now resides.
