Skydive City gets through downturn caused by coronavirus pandemic and jumpers keep coming out

Down but not out is how many businesses have weathered the storm through the past year of shutdowns and restrictions stemming from the ongoing coronavirus pandemic. At Skydive City Zephyrhills, it is more a case of keeping planes and skydivers up in the air, even if it means less frequent jumps than in years past.

"Our business is down this year, as you can imagine," said Susan Perkins Stark, president of Skydive City Zephyrhills. "We have a big international clientele and that's just been a bust."

The facility, which attracts all kinds of jumpers from numerous countries and has several contests per year that often result in world record-setting jumps, closed in March. That temporary shutdown lasted six weeks.

"We put in (many safety) procedures and protocols," Perkins Stark said.

Stark said.

Although some international skydivers have been missing this past year, Perkins Stark noted that there are local jumpers that still come out. Unlike in the past, though, spectators are not allowed in order for the facility to maintain social distancing.

"They've done a great jump," said Jim Lewis, who is from Zephyrhills and has 750 jumps. "We still get to jump because of the stringent protocols they put into action. This is a high-risk sport as it is, so they're very safety conscious."

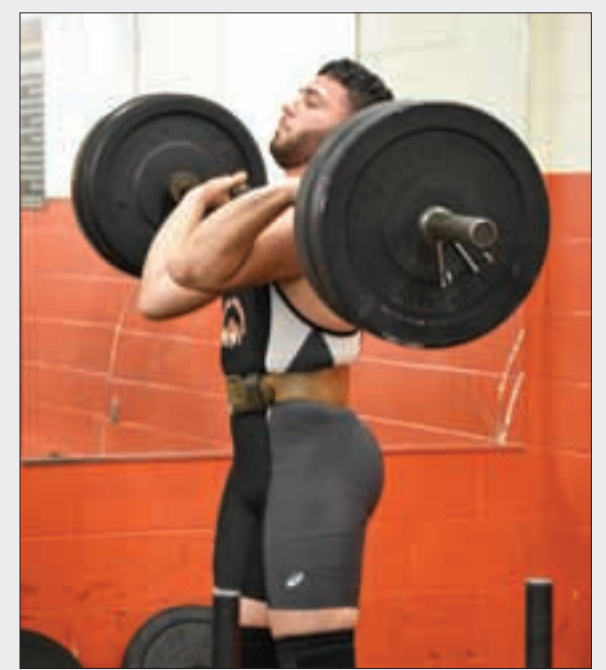
There are signs that the skydiving business at the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport is somewhat revived of late. Last Saturday, a few dozen skydiving enthusiasts came out early. Many waited for the sun to come out after a morning of mostly cloudy conditions and when it cleared up for enough visibility to make jumps from 13,500 feet there was a lot of joyous shouts.

As the morning clouds began to clear, Jonathan Turberville said, "Man, I'm keeping my fingers crossed. I just want to jump, that's it."

Turberville, a student with 18 jumps before Saturday, is from Lakeland. He seeks 25 jumps, which would be enough to earn an A license.

One group that planned to jump on Saturday as part of a monthly training regimen was the Phantom Airborne Brigade. Some in the

Bulldogs are stronger than the Coyotes

Host Zephyrhills defeats Cypress Creek 50-29 in the season opener for both boys weightlifting teams

In the season opener for both boys weightlifting teams, host Zephyrhills proved to be much stronger than Cypress Creek, a fourth-year team that hasn't exactly excelled in the sport in its brief history. The Bulldogs won handily, 50-29.

Chris Barrick, now in his sixth season coaching at Zephyrhills, did not hide the fact that he expected as much from a team of 22 weightlifters and consisting of many underclassmen.

"For the first meet we had a lot of young guys, but overall I was pretty impressed," he said, noting that most of the Zephyrhills lifters are freshmen and sophomores. "They all had decent form and most of them hit the numbers we expected them to hit."

Among those new young lifters was Tyler Hitchner, who follows in his brother's footsteps. Dylan Hitchner, a standout weightlifter and football player who now helps coach the Wesley Chapel Coyotes in youth football, is a 2019 Zephyrhills graduate.

"He was one of the first lifters I had," Barrick said of the older Hitchner, who was part of the team for all four years of his high school career.

Neither team had any lifters in the 119-pound division, which left nine weight classes up for grabs rather than the standard 10 in a meet. Zephyrhills

Bulldogs falter in district final, 48-43

Despite a furious fourth quarter push, the Bulldogs could not overcome a 20-2 first quarter deficit

The 18-7 Bulldogs were riding high on Friday night. They'd dispatched their opponent, Fivay, in the regular season. They'd torched Pasco and Springstead in the opening rounds of the district playoffs, the win over Springstead advancing them to the regional playoffs. They

were riding high, perhaps too high. "They (Fivay) came ready to play tonight," Bulldog head coach Chris Smith said.

The 17-4 Falcons erupted out of the starting gates. Six-footer Marielis Creque struck early and often, slipping behind the Bulldog defense for a series of easy baskets. In the blink of an eye, the Falcons were up 6-0. Creque kept getting open in the same spot and quickly it was 10-0. It didn't help that the Bulldogs were ice cold shooting from the perimeter and the Falcon zone defense with six-footers Creque and Jania Jones proved almost impossible to penetrate.

Finally, with 2:35 left in the first quarter,

Whether it is the excellent nursing care, the Wellness and Rehabilitation departments, or the Cardiac Cath and Electrophysiology programs, there is a focus on patient wellness and whole person healing.

At AdventHealth Zephyrhills, if you have chest pain, you'll get vital testing and diagnostic studies to determine whether you have a need for cardiac medications and interventions. Diagnostic tests allow your doctors to see how your heart is performing and to address any changes. These tests may include EKGs to check for arrhythmias, heart attacks or conduction disorders. An echocardiogram is a type of ultrasound for the heart that allows your physician to see your heart size, valves and the squeeze of your heart. A stress test allows us to see the flow in your heart vessels. If you are having chest pain, and we discover your heart vessel is greater than 70 percent blocked, a stent can be placed in your cardiac vessel to improve your symptoms and restore flow to your heart.

Patients with syncope or heart palpitations, may

receive implantable recorders or an electrical study with advanced equipment to locate the origin of these heart palpitations. If you have a low heartbeat, we can place a pacemaker to help regulate your heart rhythm. And, if you experience heart failure, we use medications to improve your breathing, and can offer an implantable cardiac defibrillator to help detect dangerous arrhythmias and shock the electrical system back into a normal rhythm.

dominated by winning seven of those nine classes.

"For a younger team it was surprising to win that many weight classes," Barrick said, adding that he has seen his lifters improve on a daily basis since practice began earlier this month.

Victories for the home team, which came in a weight room that in the offseason was dedicated to former coach and current athletic director Bruce Cimorelli, began with Jacob Smith. Competing at 139, Smith bench-pressed 115 pounds and scored 135 in the clean-and-jerk for a total of 250.

Raleigh Allen won the 154 class by lifting 170-155—325. Mike Barber hoisted 245-155—400 to win at 169. Nick Sheldon had the best lifts at 183 with a score of 255-225—460.

The Bulldogs then won three of the next four divisions. Nick Patrias lifted 215-195—410 to claim the 219 class. At 238, winner Kamil Mehrab scored a 240-205—445. Lastly, Jarrin Galyan easily took the heavyweight division with a dominating score, 345-260—605. Such stellar numbers this early in the season indicate that Galyan has a legitimate shot at a state title.

Cypress Creek only had two winners, but coach Mike Johnson was pleased that his team inched a bit closer to Zephyrhills than it had in its first three seasons.

"Overall, I was very pleased," said Johnson, who also is Cypress

Creek's head football coach. "I've got more of a veteran group this year mixed in with some young talent. The veterans showed up. By far this is the best showing against Zephyrhills. We're getting there."

Cypress Creek's two winners were Mekhai Santiago and Vincent Tre. At 129, Santiago turned in a score of 100-85—185. Tre totaled 235-170—405 in the 199 division. Another solid showing for the Coyotes was Gabriel Kolakoff finishing as the 219 runner-up.

Both coaches hope to get in a full season, unlike last year when the coronavirus pandemic resulted in the sport being discontinued in March. That was a bit disheartening to Barrick, who felt that Ben Rodriguez and Justin Clark were viable contenders for state championships.

"We had them for four years, but they didn't get to fulfill their potential," Barrick said of the 2020 graduates.

In part because Barrick makes the schedule for teams on the east side of the county, Zephyrhills has all home matches this season. That includes the Sunshine Athletic Conference tournament that the Bulldogs will host on March 10.

Makenna Campbell followed up a missed layup from Taija McCullough to put the Bulldogs on the board at 12-2. Creque continued to dominate inside and Jones even scored a blocked shot as the Falcons went on an 8-0 run to end the quarter up 20-2.

The Bulldogs battled back. Timneta Clemons got the Bulldogs on the board early and Maya Llanes bagged a steal with a layup on the other end to cap a 4-0 run starting the quarter. Yet, Creque continued to find her spot on the floor and bank easy shots in. An assist from Llanes to Madison Driggers and a Llanes steal on an in-bound pass made it 26-12 but again Creque found her spot to counter the come back. Creque would hit her spot for the last score of the half, much to the chagrin of Coach Smith but the Bulldogs had clawed back some of the ground. They'd out-scored Fivay 15-10 in the quarter and trailed 30-17 heading into the break.

"Our post players cost us the game," Smith said. "Everyone, especially the post players had a challenge tonight and they did not step up to the challenge."

Yet, they would continue to close the gap, even with the abysmally cold shooting. As much as Fivay dominated the paint, the third quarter was Mikayla Cintron's. She battled for rebounds, got a late put-back and even blocked a shot from Fivay's Jones. Llanes hit a floater, a three-pointer and bagged a steal before she got into foul trouble and headed to the bench. The Bulldogs had closed it to 37-33 heading into the final quarter.

Madison Driggers hit a three-pointer to start the fourth quarter and it cut the lead to three. Stingy defense kept the scoring down and Llanes finally checked back in with five minutes left. Ashauna Jones hit a shot with three minutes to play that made it 41-38 but Creque,

again, found that same spot on the floor for an easy basket. This time she was fouled and nailed her free throw.

With 1:36 left to play, the Falcons put their shooters on the floor, anticipating the need for the Bulldogs to foul in order to regain possession. Cintron got an offensive rebound and put-back to make it 46-43 with 13 seconds left. Llanes committed the quick foul to give the Bulldogs a chance. It would be her fifth and final foul. Remarkably, the Falcons missed both free throws but they managed to snag the offensive rebound and that was it. Fivay's Madison Sarif hit both of her ensuing free throws and the final score knotted at 48-43.

"The second half, we finally got what we wanted but we had another lapse," Smith said. "I was disappointed with how we played tonight but the girls never quit. It's been a while since we've had a team this good, so there's something to be said for that."

It was an excruciating loss on their home court but the Bulldogs can still be proud of their season. They won 18 games and were 10-3 at home. In the district final, Llanes scored 14 points with 4 steals, a rebound, a block and a pair of assists. Cintron only scored 5 points but hauled in six rebounds and had a whopping four blocked shots. Driggers made some solid contributions in the second half with 8 points, a pair of blocks and a pair of steals. Creque was the deciding factor as she racked up 26 points for the Falcons, with Jones gobbling up 6 rebounds and 3 blocked shots.

The season isn't over for the Bulldogs. They travel to Orlando Jones for the first round of regionals tonight. It won't be a picnic as Jones is the sixth-ranked team in Class 5A, according to Maxpreps but the Bulldogs have hope even beyond this season. Only McCullough and Mercedes Kruger are seniors, the rest will return.

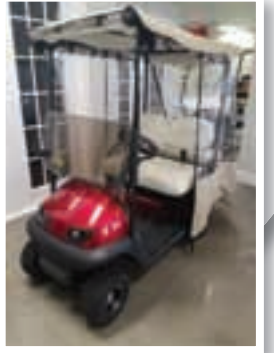

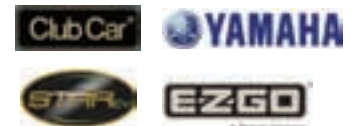

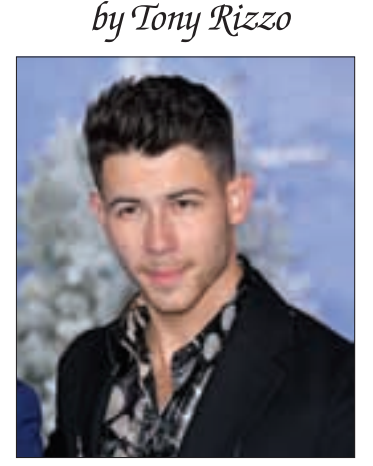

HOLLYWOOD -- "The Social Network" Oscar-winning director/screenwriter Aaron Sorkin is helming a new Amazon film about Lucy and Desi (from his screenplay). It takes place during a production meeting of "I Love Lucy" when both faced a crisis that could end their careers and marriage. Oscar-winner Cate Blanchett was first choice as Lucy, but when she bowed out, Sorkin cast Oscar-winners Nicole Kidman and Javier Bardem to play Lucy and Desi.

While everyone loves Nicole, when she took on Elizabeth Montgomery's "Bewitched" role in the 2005 film reboot (which also starred Will Farrell, Shirley MacLaine, Michael Caine and Kristin Chenoweth), it flopped, costing \$85 million while grossing just \$131 million. Written and directed by the late Nora Efron (of "When Harry Met Sally," "Sleepless in Seattle" and "You've Got Mail"), critics said "Bewitched" "was haunted by scattered laughs and a lack of direction."

Of note: Lucy was 43 and Desi 40 when they did "I Love Lucy" in 1951, and Nicole is 53 and Javier 51. Maybe for insurance, two of the executive producers Sorkin hired are Lucy's children, Lucie and Desi Arnaz.

When the pandemic is done, will movie fans return to theaters? "Earnings are down more than 80% from previous years, making this the worst year in three decades," according to the market-research firm Statista. Streaming services proved with "Roma," "The Irishman," "Trolls World Tour," "The Invisible Man" and, just recently, "Wonder Woman 1984" that opening films on streaming services and theaters at the same time works well.

In the 1960s studios fought TVs popularity with Cinemascope, etc.; in the '90s they used IMAX and 3D. Now streaming services are offering staggering sums, such as Amazon's \$200 million bid for the Chris Pratt starrer "The Tomorrow War." Theaters need to come up with something spectacular to put the genie back in the bottle.

Two of the Jonas Brothers are having quite a competition. Nick (28) scored big with the two "Jumanji" sequels and "Midway," and he has completed the post-apocalyptic thriller "Chaos Walking," with Daisy Ridley and Tom Holland, due March 5. Nick is now shooting "The Blacksmith" with Laurence Fishburne and doing his second season as a "Voice" coach.

Joe, 31, who's done a lot of voice work, including the Kraken in "Hotel Transylvania 3," has been cast in the war film "Devotion," playing a fighter pilot. But Nick is one up, having been tapped to play Frankie Valli in the Disney remake of "The Jersey Boys," despite Clint Eastwood's 2014 "Jersey Boys" being less than a success. It's being directed by "Bohemian Rhapsody's" Graham King. No matter who wins, the whole town's talking about the Jonas boys!

group of former military members departed while others stayed for an afternoon cookout.

Among the nearly 100 members who make monthly jumps at Skydive City is 87-year-old Fred Vocatura, who learned his craft at the U.S. Army's jump school in 1956.

"As long as they stay safe we're good," he said.

"We appreciate Skydive City doing everything safely," added brigade member Jeff Wheaton of Lakeland.

Several of the brigade's members expressed their gratitude for Skydive City keeping the jump zone open and not having to close the facility for longer than it was.

"It means a lot," said Toby Trudel, of Palm Bay. "Being locked up in a house is not going to be much of a difference than being out here."

Cameron King, Skydive's operations manager, said that is a familiar refrain from jumpers appreciating the fact that the facility did not shut down for long and ensures that safety measures are in place everywhere on the grounds.

"It's positive feedback that we're open," he said.

Still, like Perkins Stark, he added, "Our numbers have been down from previous years. With the vaccine coming out I'm hoping that our numbers will come back to normal."
