First-year team challenges
front-running Hunters Run
atop the league standings

Much like the Las Vegas Golden Knights making it to the Stanley Cup as a National Hockey League expansion team two years ago, a fledgling horseshoe team in Zephyrhills is making an indelible impression on its competitors and poses a serious challenge to a league championship.

Settler's Run, a first-year team in the Zephyrhills Winter Horseshoe League, is challenging front-running Hunters Run, the defending champion, atop the league standings. Through last week the newly formed team was a mere two points behind Hunters Run, which led the league with 14.

Among those not surprised by the impressive start of Settler's Run is league director Bryan Jorgensen, who also pitches for Hunters Run.

"I know a couple of players on their team and they're pretty good," he said. "I figure they're going to be Hunters Run's biggest competition."

Cal Osmond, captain of Settler's Run, also felt his team would do well from the get-go. A key to the team's success is that it combines players from Settler's Run and neighboring Sweetwater with five players from each community. In the Tuesday Oldtimer's League, Settler's Run and Sweetwater are rival teams.

"We thought we were half-decent anyway, because we have some talent on our team," said Osmond, who felt Settler's Run would at least rank among the league's top-four teams.

Osmond noted that it helps to make time for practices in addition to the twice weekly matchups in two leagues. On Fridays, players from both 55-and-older communities get together for practice in a round-robin competition at Sweetwater. They

Stewart Bulldogs
overrun by Rushe
Ravens 8-0

They survived the first half down just 3-0, but could not keep pace with the visiting Ravens in the second half

It was a mismatch before the athletes took to the pitch at Zephyrhills High School. Still without club players, Stewart head coach Katie Jeffcott has to cobble together a team with little to no experience. Captain Page Seymour is the only player with middle school soccer experience with Jeffcott on the roster. The Bulldogs field four sixth-graders. Expectations have to be tempered.

"I was ecstatic that we only gave up three goals in the first half against a team like Rushe," Jeffcott said. "That's one of the better halves we've played yet this season."

Rushe's Mackenzie Speer, Campbell Taylor and Payton Bluemke scored the first-half goals for the Ravens. The Bulldogs managed to keep the scoring down in that first half, much credit to keeper Harmonie Scribner, who managed to stop 15 shots on goal. She would tally 26 saves before the end of the match.

"This is only her (Scribner) second season even playing soccer and her first time ever playing keeper," Jeffcott said.

The pressure was on the Stewart half and the

Zephyrhills honors five seniors in
regular-season finale

Harrison Barker, Austin Linville,
Dontae Marchman, Derico Quiles
and Garrett Price are recognized

Zephyrhills' Harrison Barker, Austin Linville, Dontae Marchman, Garrett Price and Derico Quiles made up the starting five for last Friday's regular-season finale. Another thing they had in common was being recognized on Senior Night.

"They did great for the last three or four years," Zephyrhills coach Mike Novak said in addressing those five seniors. "They've been a great group of kids. They always came to practices; came to work hard. Those kids have a lot of fight in them."

Unfortunately, they were not rewarded with a victory since the Bulldogs were taking on a powerhouse opponent. Anclote, ranked among the state's top teams in Class 4A and a team that also defeated Zephyrhills in last year's district final, cruised to an 82-60 win.

The host Bulldogs were no match for Anclote's two tall inside players, both of whom are 6-foot-6. Jalen Cooper and Jakob Hester led the senior-laden Sharks with 29 and 26 points, respectively. That high-scoring duo might have added to those daunting statistics, but both teams emptied their benches late in the fourth quarter.

"They were a better team, but we made them great," Novak said. "You've got to compete."

With the memory of last year's loss to Anclote in the district final, Novak urged his players to come out "with a chip on your shoulders." That advice did not

appear to be taken to heart when the home team fell behind early as the Bulldogs struggled against the Shark's fast-break offense and trapping defense.

"Just weather it and play basketball," Novak encouraged his team, which nonetheless fell behind 26-10 in the first quarter. The Bulldogs trailed 46-21 at halftime but rallied in the third to outscore Anclote

21-19 in that quarter. Still, they trailed 65-42 heading into the final frame.

Novak, noting that the Bulldogs scored as much in the third quarter as they did for the entire first half, credited Price with providing the Bulldogs a strong inside presence during the third quarter rally.

Stewart 18-yard box all night. The Ravens effectively cut the field in half, their back line playing much of the game at the midfield stripe. The Bulldogs did manage to keep their composure and not let the game get away in the first 30 minutes.
Jeffcott made some changes. She moved Seymour from defensive center-mid to offensive center-mid in an effort to kickstart the offense but Rushe was not having it. They opened up with another salvo to start the second half and despite Scribner's best efforts, the goals started racking up.
Sophie Minnillo put one in the net after shattering the Bulldog defense, just four minutes in. Five minutes later, Adia Symmonds

made it 5-0 with a shot to the far post. Only a minute after that, Campbell Taylor made it 6-0 Ravens.
Jeffcott called back the halftime switch with Seymour and went to more of a man-to-man defense. The Ravens, particularly Bianca Martinez sliced through the defense with near impunity. Stewart defender Coryn Graham managed to get in front of a few balls, knocking them back out of the 18-yard box but the Ravens kept up the pressure.
Graham made a great stop with nine minutes left in the match but Rushe's Drew Parker cleaned up the ricochet and made it 7-0. The eight-goal mercy rule nearly took effect in the last four minutes but Scribner managed to pluck the ball off the line and save the match, at least for the moment. Finally, with three minutes left, Minnillo got her head on a pass from a corner kick and made it 8-0.
It's hard to take away positives from an eight-goal mercy ruling but the mismatch is one that forces a different set of expectations. Holding the Ravens to just three goals in the first half was the night's silver lining.
"The girls just need to realize that they can do it, they have the ability to play against a high-caliber team like that," Jeffcott said.

Pasco Sheriff’s Office Newsletter

One of the most popular Pasco Sheriff’s Office units is our K9 Unit that is comprised of multiple K9 teams.

We currently have 25 K9 teams at the agency, which includes three teams that are in training. There are plans to add even more to our teams as the combination of a handler and dog is beneficial in many ways.

K9s are beneficial in many ways for our agency. They are what is called a “force multiplier,” which in military and law enforcement science, refers to a factor or a combination of factors that gives personnel or weapons (or other hardware) the ability to accomplish greater feats than without it.

How do K9s assist their human counterparts? Our dogs, depending on their specialty, are trained to run faster, jump farther, and if need be, attack targets with animal ferocity. Their sense of smell is hundreds of times more sensitive than humans, which again, depending on the dog’s specialty, can search for and find drugs, explosives or accelerants, cadavers, or track a live human scent, which can be a bad guy or girl fleeing from the law, or a lost child or elderly adult.

Our K9s often ensure quick compliance with the orders of a deputy from suspects. Many of our deputies will tell you that a suspect will have no problem resisting or fighting them, even after they have been pepper sprayed or tasered. But when a K9 team shows up, the suspect is more often than not ready to give up than have to tangle with an eager K9.

Currently we have 12 K9s that support our road patrol units. Most of our dog breeds in patrol are German Shepherds. Depending on their specialty, we also have Malinois, Bloodhounds, Labradors, and a Golden Retriever.

As you can tell by our many posts on our multiple social media accounts, citizens love

dogs, and especially dogs that help our deputies. Everyone knows the dangerous jobs our deputies do, protecting and serving our citizens. Our social media accounts allow us to highlight how the men and women of our agency work hard at their jobs, love working with citizens, and are everyday people. That goes as well for our K9 teams. The dogs don’t know that there are “good” and “bad” people. They go to work with their deputy handlers and think that it is all play time to them. Our K9 handlers will tell you that when it is time to go to work, their partners know the particular sound of the vehicle keys for their sheriff’s office vehicle. They get excited when travelling in the vehicle and the deputy turns on the siren to quickly get to a call for service. Our K9s love their “job” and are sad when the day comes that we have to retire them for health reasons and old age.

I have plans to increase our K9 unit even more, as their value and support is irreplaceable for the jobs that they do. Purchasing and equipping a K9 team is not cheap, but the job that they do is worth every penny. The cost of just the dog can start at \$8,000. Then we have to train them, and their deputy handler. Then comes the equipment including the K9 vehicle, which is a large SUV. As you may have seen from our social media accounts, I am pleased that many private citizens, social groups, and businesses have come forward to make the initial purchase of a K9 dog for us. Others have raised money to purchase equipment, including bullet- and stab-proof vests.

Our K9 deputies and their dogs are some of the hardest working members at our agency. They often have to track through woods and swamps, neighborhoods and buildings, during the sweltering heat of the summer and the cold of the winter. I would like to thank our citizens for their continued support of our agency and all of our dedicated members.

Saint Leo University breaks ground for wellness center

59,000-square-foot facility will provide space for health, recreation, counseling services

Saint Leo University broke ground Feb. 6, for a wellness center located on the west end of campus by Lake Jovita. The 59,000-square-foot facility will create an environment for holistic health and well-being that integrates student recreation, fitness, health services, counseling services, and campus ministry.

Focusing on the body, mind, and spirit, Saint Leo's new wellness center will provide space for group exercise, spinning and yoga classes, and a large community fitness center. In addition, there will be two indoor basketball courts, a healthy smoothie bar, and a recreational pool with a lakeside infinity edge, as well as a relaxation terrace and garden. There also will be several multipurpose rooms, which could be used as space for meditation, specialty classes, and gaming.

As the university has grown, there has been increased student demand on the current spaces. Saint Leo officials also wanted to provide a facility that will provide for students' physical and emotional well-being. Many of the services now offered in DeChantal Hall will move to the new facility.

Construction tentatively will begin in April, and university officials hope to open the wellness center in Fall 2021.

"This day is finally here; praise God," said D. Dewey Mitchell, chair of the Saint Leo University Board of Trustees. "This is a wonderful amenity for the university and the community."

Creative Contractors of Clearwater, is serving as the construction firm for the project while S3 Design Inc. of Braintree, MA., is handling the architectural design; and JLL of Tampa will provide project management services.

Fundraising is taking place for the wellness center, and the university is in discussion with several health care providers that potentially could serve the community by delivering medical services on-site.

Mitchell, chair of the Saint Leo University Board of Trustees, welcomed everyone to the wellness center groundbreaking while Dr. Melanie Storms, senior vice president, served as the emcee for the ceremony. Sister Roberta Bailey, prioress of the Benedictine Sisters of Florida, provided those in attendance with a historical perspective on the property, and university president Jeffrey D. Senese made remarks about the benefits of the wellness center. Prior to the groundbreaking, Abbot Isaac Camacho, OSB, a Saint Leo alumnus, blessed the site.

"You stand on sacred ground," Bailey told the crowd gathered for the groundbreaking. She reminded

everyone about the founding of the university by the Benedictine sisters and monks. They sunk "their roots deep into Florida's oldest incorporated town," she noted.

While the land that Saint Leo occupies once was home to orange groves, a different type of tree was found growing on the property as clearing began. The Saint Leo Abbey Church is known as "the church that orange juice built," as the Benedictine monks traded oranges and grapefruits to Saint Meinrad Abbey in Indiana for sandstone, which was used to construct the church, consecrated in 1948. As work began on the site for the wellness center, an original olive tree was discovered while clearing the overgrowth on the property.

The olive tree will be transplanted during construction for safekeeping, and then replanted into the meditative gardens of the wellness center, tying the history of Saint Leo to its future.

Emphasizing the impact the wellness center will make, university president Senese said, "We are creating an iconic building for Pasco County, Tampa Bay, and Florida. It is our vision that this building will take your breath away."
