## **Veterans Memorial unveiled** at Waters Edge RV Resort

Plaque and flags honor eight branches of the armed forces in the United States and Canada

Spawned by Hurricane Irma, a tribute to veterans at a Zephyrhills RV park has emerged nearly three years after that natural disaster. Last Wednesday, a Veterans Memorial was dedicated at Waters Edge RV

Jerry Richards, a snowbird from Michigan who has been coming to the park since 2012, is a retired engineer who designed the memorial with a plaque that recognizes five U.S. military seals and three for the Ca-

The memorial is more than an adequate replacement for two flagpoles that were irreparably damaged during the category 5 hurricane that did extensive damage to the U.S. eastern seaboard in September

"It snapped two flagpoles like toothpicks," said Richards, adding that the memorial was "long over-due. It's really well done. It exceeded my wildest expectations.'

Richards never served in the military, which helped inspire him to do something for the veterans. That's why I was so compelled to do this, be-

cause I couldn't serve," he said. Rod Rehrig, past commandant of the Marine Corps League Detachment 1124, led a surrounding

## City Council declares state of emergency

As schools and businesses shutter in an attempt to contain the virus, the city follows suit

At a special city council meeting on Monday, the three council members present, voted unanimously to declare a state of emergency in the City of Zephyrhills. The Resolution No. 769-20, follows on the heels of a March 1 executive order by the governor's office directing the Department of Health to issue a Public Health Emergency.

On March 9, a new executive order declared a state-wide state of emergency. On March 12, the Pasco County Board of County Commissioners declared a local state of emergency. Resolution No. 769-20 states: "WHEREAS, the City of Zephyrhills is threatened by the COVID-19 because of the apparent ability of the virus to spread rapidly among humans through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.'

It is within Florida statutes that a municipal corporation like the City of Zephyrhills can declare a state of local emergency for up to seven days and can be extended as necessary in seven-day incre-

What does this mean for city government? It means that it waives the procedures and formalities otherwise required of a municipal corporation by law pertaining to:

- Performance of public work and taking whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the community.

Entering into contracts.

- Incurring obligations. - Employment of permanent and temporary work-

- Utilization of volunteer workers.

- Rental of equipment.

- Acquisition and distribution, with or without compensation, of supplies, materials and facilities. Appropriation and expenditure of public funds.

The resolution went into effect at 12:01 a.m. March 18, 2020 and can either be rescinded or renewed after seven days. What does this mean for the city? Any employees traveling out of the country or on a cruise must self-isolate for 14 days before returning to work, whether or not they show symp-





On hand for the unveiling were a pair of U.S. Navy veterans, Harold Sanderson and Joe Loomis. Penny Wickstrom a park resident

and former nurse who assists Sanderson, noted how alert and active he is at the age of 94. "He does not stop. He's on the go constantly," she said, adding, "He loves to dance. He's a

very smooth dancer. As for the unveiling of the plaque, both elderly veterans appreciated the local effort and

were thankful for the recognition. "It means they care about the people that helped protect them," Harold said. "I'm glad

I'm still here.' Ron Talcott, a U.S. Army veteran and snowbird from Syracuse, helped raise the American flag: "This was the ultimate for the year down here. I was happy to be a part of it."

Also grateful for the memorial was Glenn Counsell, who served 43 years in the Canadian

Army, who said, "As part of North America we should all come together."

Counsell's wife Billie comprehended the importance of recognizing veterans from both countries. Her father, William Hanrahan, was in the Canadian military and fought alongside American soldiers in Europe during World War

Aric Showalter, property manager for Sun Communities that oversees seven RV resorts in east Pasco, lauded the park residents who led the patriotic effort.

We have a lot of residents in the park itself, both Canadian and American," he said. "In general, Sun (Communities) has a very strong pro-military stance. We like to honor our veterans for everything they're doing and every sac-

rifice they made. That was the least we could do.'

The new memorial at Water's Edge RV Resort is just one of many at the numerous parks and resorts throughout the east Pasco area. Additionally, there is a large veterans memorial with plaques and flagpoles for the American flag and other flags located at Zephyr Park.

Fire Rescue has purchased gloves for all departments and gloves and masks for fire and police departments. ZPD Chief Derek Brewer was present at the Monday meeting discussing the resolution with council members.
