First-year team clinches Zephyrhills Winter Horseshoe League title with season sweep of arch-rival

Heading into the 2020 Zephyrhills Winter Horseshoe League season, defending champion Hunter's Run was on a roll, staking claim to six of the past seven titles. Sweetwater/Settler's Rest, a first-year team of talented players, set a lofty goal of unseating the reigning champion.

Mission accomplished for the newly formed squad. The league's newcomer, which is comprised of players from two neighboring parks, defeated Hunter's Run 19-13, which included a 10-6 advantage in the first half of last week's match. That gave Sweetwater/Settler's Rest a two-game season sweep (including a 19-13 win on Feb. 26) and clinched the title. Even though his team defeated Hunter's Run earlier this season, Lawrence Pittman said that for himself and his Sweetwater/Settler's Rest teammates that previous outcome had no bearing on the rematch. "It didn't really matter, because we know they're good," Pittman

said during the late stages of the rematch. "They're not the defending champions for no reason. If we can win both games we'll have it mathematically." Now that the long winning streak for Hunter's Run is over, the team has its sights set on starting another one beginning with next season. "It gives you more incentive to come back next year," said Bob Keefer, an 82-year-old Hunter's Run player who has pitched horseshoes for 70 years. Added Hunter's Run player Gene Luering, "Those guys are tough. We know them well." Bryan Jorgensen, who along with Hunter's Run teammate Yvon Cote, won 6-2 in the second half against Sweetwater/Settler's Rest last week, gave the new league champion credit. He also vowed that Hunter's Run would be back next year to challenge for yet another championship. "Those guys took the best players from two different parks to beat us," Jorgensen said. That was their design. Those guys are really good. They said they're going to build a new trophy room and I said don't build it too big because we're going to take it back next year." The league, which includes a dozen 55-and-older communities in Zephyrhills and Dade City and runs from December through March, finished the 2020 season this week. The top three spots, however, were finalized last week with Sweetwater/Settler's Rest finishing two points (22-20) ahead of Hunter's Run. Morningside, a

Zephyrhills Little League comeback falls short in 12-9 loss to Dade City

The Zephyrhills boys dug themselves a deep hole early and almost climbed out of it before the inter-league game timed out

Little League games typically go seven innings unless one team is 10 or more runs ahead after five. There is also a two-hour time limit on Juniors-level games. The Zephyrhills Juniors team, the Rockies, ran into that time limit as they were trying to battle back from disastrous first and second innings. "This was our second loss by passed balls," Zephyrhills coach Robbie Little said. "But our back-up catcher Joseph Mohler stepped up and played a big role tonight." It wasn't just passed balls. It was pretty close to a 50-50 split between passed balls and wild pitches but the Zephyrhills boys could not find that pitcher-catcher rhythm early on. Zephyrhills walked the first six of seven batters. Pitches making the backstop let run after run skate across the plate. Finally, Little tapped Mohler to come in and catch. Zephyrhills starter Ethan Rich found his groove and struck out the last two batters to escape the top first but the damage had been done. The Zephyrhills boys were looking at a 6-0 deficit. Zephyrhills clawed two runs back in the bottom first. Joseph Starnes reached on an error, stole second, stole third and then scored on a throwing error. Rich would make it around to third and score off a ground out from Cayden Palumbo. However, the errors and lack of connection between pitcher and catcher haunted Zephyrhills in the second inning as well. Walks, stolen bases, wild

Zephyrhills hosts fifth annual skateboard competition

Local skatepark hosted Grind for Life fundraiser that has benefitted cancer patients since its inception

The first major event at the Zephyrhills Skatepark was part of the nationwide Grind for Life Series in which skateboarders help raise funds for cancer patients. Last Saturday marked the fifth anniversary of the annual event in Zephyrhills, which remains that skatepark's most notable competition. Zephyrhills resident Glenn Capps, a 48-year-old who has skated at the park since its inception and at the former skatepark adjacent to Charles M. Krusen Memorial Field before that, has yet to miss Grind for Life at the skatepark that opened five years ago. "It's amazing how what we saw on a piece of paper when we were having meetings with the city, for it to come alive like this," said Capps, who has been on skateboards for 40 years including time spent as a youngster in North Carolina. "This is a destination place." Grind For Life, which also was represented at the local skatepark's grand opening in 2015, was founded in 2003 by longtime skateboarder Mike Rogers after his second battle with sarcoma cancer. He had a tumor behind his right eye and nasal cavity with surgery resulting in a facial restoration. He beat cancer as a pre-teen, again 25 years later and today is a competitive skateboarder. "Thanks for not hugging and doing fist-bumps," said Rogers, in reference to the coronavirus precautions taken by the nearly 100 skateboarders and fans at the weekend event. "There's a lot of interest, but (the virus precautions) hurt a little bit."

Who is at elevated risk for COVID-19?

COVID-19 continues to dominate headlines across the globe. This novel coronavirus first made headlines in late 2019 after an outbreak in Wuhan, the sprawling capital city in China's Hubei province.

The virus has since spread beyond China's borders, leading to school closures and changes in public life, such as the shutting down of professional sports leagues, that many might never have thought they would see in their lifetimes.

Despite the relative infancy of COVID-19, doctors have learned much about it, including who might be most at risk. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, early information out of China revealed that some groups are at higher risk of getting very sick from COVID-19 than others. Older adults and people who have serious chronic medical conditions are at the greatest risk of getting very sick from COVID-19. Heart disease,

diabetes and lung disease are the chronic medical conditions that appear to make people especially vulnerable to sickness from COVID-19.

How people in at-risk groups can reduce their risk of getting sick

It's important that elderly people and people with chronic medical conditions take their risk for getting sick from COVID-19 seriously, as the virus had already contributed to thousands of deaths by early March 2020. The CDC notes that it is especially important that people at elevated risk take actions to reduce their risk of getting sick with the disease. The following strategies can be part of a proactive approach that may help at-risk people lower their risk of getting sick from COVID-19.

- Stock up on health supplies. Contact your physician and arrange to obtain extra necessary medications so you do not have to leave

your home should an outbreak occur in your area. If that's not plausible, the CDC recommends signing up for mail-order medications. Stock up on over-the-counter medications and medical supplies, including everyday items like tissues, so you don't have to leave the house if an outbreak occurs.

- Stock up on groceries. Make sure you have enough groceries on hand so you can stay at home if restrictions on leaving home are put in place during an outbreak.
- Embrace the basics. Basic strategies like avoiding people who are sick; washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing your nose, coughing, sneezing or spending time in public; avoiding touching your face, nose, eyes, etc.; and avoiding crowds can help to reduce your risk of getting sick from COVID-19.

Since the initial outbreak of COVID-19 in China in late-December 2019, doctors have learned that certain people are especially vulnerable to getting sick from the virus. Such people can take certain steps that may reduce their risk of getting sick. More information about COVID-19 is available at www.cdc.gov.

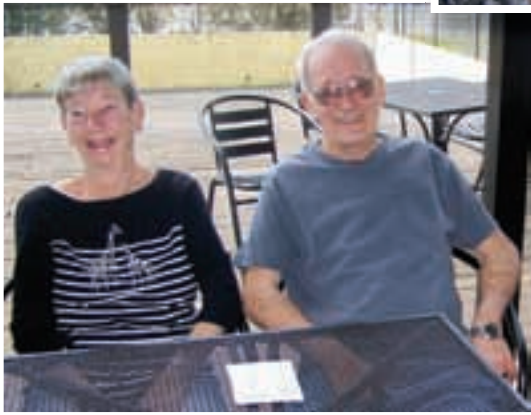

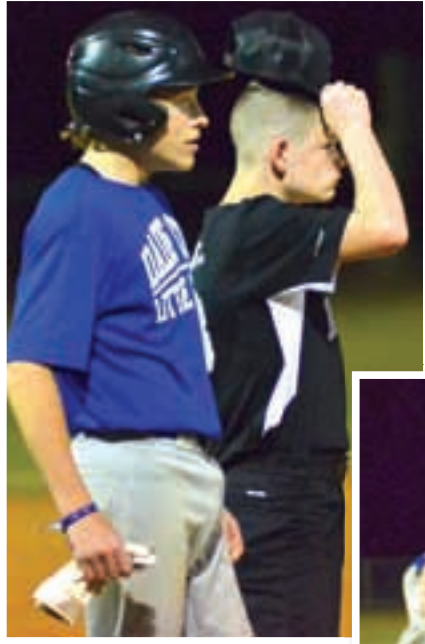

pitches and passed balls helped Dade City rack up even more runs. Before the dust settled, Dade City had plated five more runs and led 11-2.

Not lost in all of the commotion was an unassisted double play from Zephyrhills first-baseman Palumbo. Palumbo scooped up a hot grounder, tagged the runner heading to second base and stepped on first to catch the batter.

"We try to teach that, it's something we work on a lot," Little said.

Zephyrhills got one run back in the bottom second off an RBI single from Ryan Spivey but Dade City took the run right back in the top third off yet another passed ball. Then the Zephyrhills squad began to dig its heels in. They tapped Aiden Thorne to relieve Rich and they started moving runners around the bases.

In the bottom third, Thorne had what was probably the best hit of the game, a shot to right-center. Jason Finney would score on the overthrow and a passed ball let Thorne in. A third run scored off a wild pitch and Zephyrhills had closed it to 12-6.

Zephyrhills prevented more damage in the top fourth by catching a Dade City runner leading off of first base. Another wild pitch would have let a run in but Mohler managed to get the ball in and Thorne tagged the runner out at the plate. With a runner on third base, Thorne got

the strike out to escape the fourth with no damage done.

The Zephyrhills boys continued to battle back in the fourth. Eddie Wilkes led off with a single and passed balls let him all the way to third base. An error let Wilkes score, a passed ball let another in and Zephyrhills tallied three runs to close the gap to 12-9 before the end of the fourth inning. By then, the two-hour time limit had elapsed, turning out the lights on the Zephyrhills comeback bid.

"Thorne came in and did his job and we had the confidence to come back and do what we needed to do," Little said.

The Zephyrhills squad just ran out of time. Still, it was a big win for Warren Brooks and his Dade City team. Starting pitcher Karson Mathis had six strike outs and managed to limit the damage on passed balls and wild pitches. Catcher Max Heitzman had a lot to do with that.

"He (Heitzman) did a phenomenal job tonight, keeping it all under control," Brooks said. "Our pitching was great, even when Aiden (Reffuse) came in and closed it out."

The Dade City squad was happy with the win and thankful to have capitalized on the passed balls. They only registered one hit. Zephyrhills knows they let one get away but they also know if they can clean up their play, they have a chance against most anyone in the league.

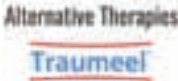

Rogers, a 54-year-old from Cocoa Beach who won the Grand Masters title, noted that more than \$300,000 has been raised since the Grind for Life Series began seven years ago. Grind For Life provides financial assistance to cancer patients and their families when traveling long distances to doctors and hospitals.

"We've saved a lot of lives doing these events," he said.

Rogers and many other skateboarders drew plenty of cheers and applause from family members, friends and other competitors who gathered around the skatepark. Among those who drew the loudest support was Tampa's Gabriel Lavallee, who on Saturday took first in the Street 9-and-under Division.

For the longest time he wanted a skateboard. Finally, when Gabriel was 7, his parents bought him one.

"From that point on he kept with it and just kept getting better and better," said Kenny Lavallee, his father. "He's had an inner drive. He likes to do well."

Another skateboarder at Saturday's event was Dillon Brown, a 20-year-old from Boca Raton with eight years of experience and never missed the Zephyrhills competition.

"I like this place," he said before dropping off into the deep concrete bowl. "The best part is the long rail, for sure, and the tortilla chip (an angled part of the track)."

While Rogers won his age group the best local finisher was Wesley Chapel's Abe Stewart, a runner-up in the Masters Division (ages 40-49).

Short city council agenda combines with CRA meeting

City council meeting layered in a CRA special meeting

Council members weren't in the right chairs at the dais to start the city council meeting but that was because of a short agenda for the regular meeting, the CRA meeting was placed at the top of the lineup. Councilwoman Jodi Wilkeson being the commission president, was seated at the center of the dais, where council president Ken Burgess typically sits.

Just one item was on the agenda, a subordination of an incentive grant program lien. The item at hand pertained to a private citizen's property at 5203 17th St. The CRA offers \$5,000 grants to citizens who are willing to develop or improve property in the CRA district. The property owner had interest in acquiring a new property but in order to secure the loan, the city's lien on the 17th Street property had to be subordinated.

Apparently, the lien as it stood, was a roadblock to the citizen attaining financing for the new property. The city was asked to make their lien subordinate to the banks. After some discussion and confirmation that the council had originally approved the grant, it was passed unanimously.

The regular city council meeting was brief

as well. The two Consent Agenda items on the list, approval of the Feb. 24 meeting minutes and a purchase of a public works department chipper/bucket truck purchase were approved unanimously.

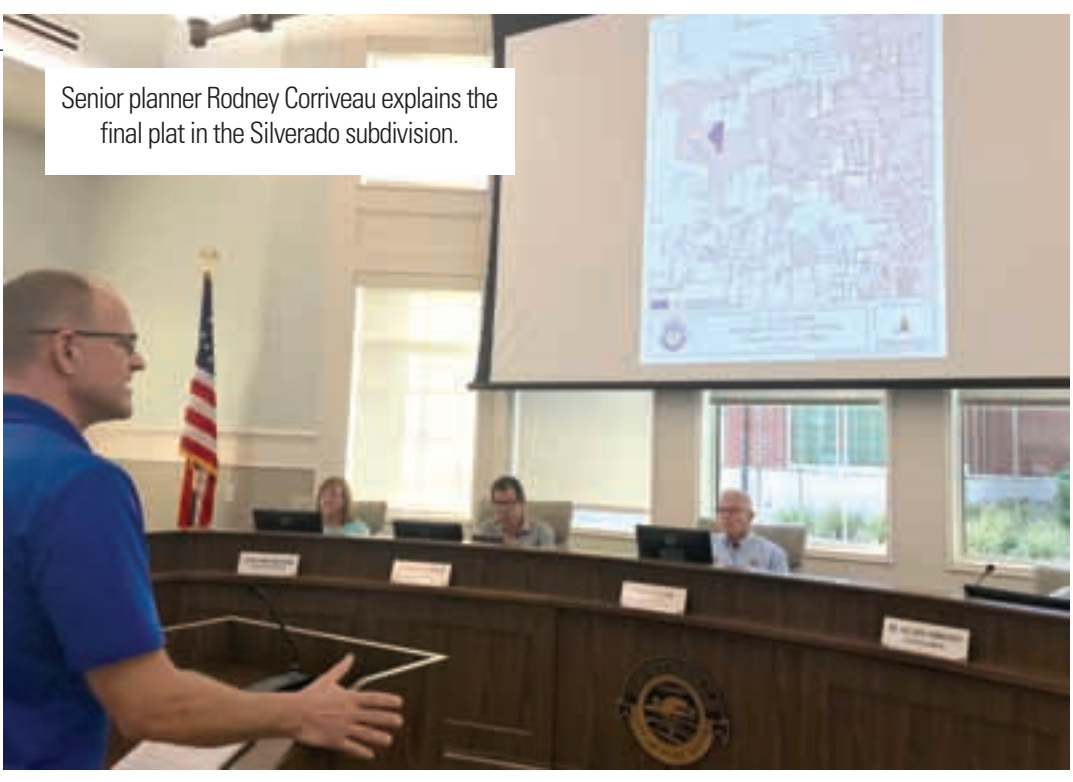
The lone Business Item on the agenda was a final plat in the Silverado subdivision, pertaining to section 5B. The final plat contains just 26 of the project's 450 homes and the plat review had been checked against the LDC and PUD regulations.

Senior planner Rodney Corriveau spoke about an issue with erosion that had been rectified and that the builder had done a good job of preserving existing trees, as well as planting new ones, "things you might not see in other subdivisions," said Corriveau. The measure passed unanimously.

In the City Manager's report, city manager William Poe Jr. asked the city to approve a 15 percent revenue sharing agreement with Tennis Pro of Florida, LLC, the agency that will operate the new Sarah Vande Berg tennis center.

The city's end of the obligation was to construct four slabs for the Padel courts at the new facility. Padel is a racket sport that combines the elements of tennis, squash and badminton. Think tennis with racquetball court walls. This item passed unanimously as well.

In the City Attorney's Report, a property swap with a local resident was put forth in order for the city to obtain clear access to a sewer line. The swap appeared to benefit both parties as it squared out existing private property and granted the city the access to the sewer line



as well as an easement for future road access on 8th Street for a parcel west of the area. The swap will also help with the proposed Gateway Project, slated to stretch down to 8th Street.

In the Comments Section, an update to the city's continuing work in the IT Department was discussed. The IT Department is attempting to not just get all of their forms online but to make them ADA compliant. It is neither a cheap nor an easy process. Discussed was the difference between fillable and non-fillable forms and the costs associated with making them available on the city's website. Fillable forms are ones that can be downloaded and filled out electronically. Non-fillable forms must be downloaded, printed, filled out and then scanned back into a device and then sent back to the city, a cumbersome process that the city is trying to avoid placing on its citizens.

However, the costs to produce the forms and the time devoted to the process by the IT Department are very demanding.

Wilkeson spoke about a threshold for the spending.

Burgess mentioned the prospect of having to pay to update forms and the length of some documents at the cost of \$4 per page.

Mike Panak, the city IT director noted that the cost could swell, particularly with larger documents like the city budget (120 pages).

There was no action taken. It was not an action item but the IT Department is working to make the documents available online and make them ADA compliant.

In the City Manager Comments, Poe spoke about a section of 20th Street that needed repaving due to a number of potholes. The stretch of road is one frequented by Zephyrhills water trucks and Poe is trying to get Pasco County to help with improving at least the worst section of 20th Street but Poe also indicated that the repair was not in the county's 2020 or 2021 fiscal year budgets.

Multiple council members praised the organizers of the Founders Day parade and the meeting adjourned before the stroke of 7 p.m.
