Draw doubles tournaments have an interesting spin to them. Shufflers have no idea who their partner is going to be, coming in. Any shufflers that are pros, draw numbers. The shufflers that are still amateurs draw numbers and the pro-amateur teams are assigned based on the draws.

"The basic format of these events is nice because you get to know your teammate," finalist Diane Bardsley said. "But still, you're on your own at the end of the court. Rapport with your new teammate comes as you learn to trust each other, trying to do your best."

Bardsley got a novel draw when she drew Don McNeil. The tandem, although having never played together, had some instant rapport. It helped that they both like to have fun and crack

jokes at each other and other players.

"Subconsciously, you start to understand what your partner does about six frames into the match," McNeil said. "If your partner has a funny look on their face, you know you did something wrong."

"And if your partner has a funny-looking face..." Bardsley quipped.

The chemistry between Bardsley and McNeil helped carry them into the main event finals where they faced off with Zephyrhills Shuffleboard Club's Jerry Collins and Janet Minor.

Collins and Minor had a battle on their hands in the semifinals against Dave Camp and Walter Shine of Betmar. After splitting the first two games, the third became a marathon as they traded leads. Camp and Shine led 59-43 only to see Collins and Minor close to 57-51 then flip the lead to 65-47. Finally, down 65-64, Collins and Minor scored the put-away points to advance to the finals.

Bardsley and McNeil were finished long ago, after setting down the team of John McLennan and Earl Reynolds 2-0.

"To some people it makes a difference if they played a long match in the semis," McNeil said. "I just take it in stride, I know what these tournaments are about and I took a little cat nap between

Bulldogs are solid Class 2A, District 6 contenders in girls tennis

A district runner-up in 2018, Zephyrhills is off to 7-2 start for this season

While the two losses have come against perennial playoff contenders, the Zephyrhills High girls tennis team is off to a strong enough start to make a run at the Class 2A, District 6 title. The Bulldogs just missed last season, finishing as the runner-up to district champion Nature Coast.

Zephyrhills, which so far has lost to Crystal River, host of this year's district tournament, and Pasco, improved to 7-2 with Tuesday's 4-0 home win against a depleted Wesley Chapel squad.

"I think we'll do well at districts," Zephyrhills coach Lorraine Hinkle said. "All of my girls are consistent in their spots."

The Wildcats (0-8) have just three players so on Tuesday the top three singles matches were played and one doubles match took place.

At No. 1 singles and No. 2 singles, the Johnson twins won their matches. Hope defeated Robee-na Tirbene 6-0, 6-0 while Paige beat Olivia March 6-0, 6-0. At No. 3 singles, Zephyrhills' Abby Wilder, who usually plays at No. 5, moved up two notches to defeat Meghan Ortiz 6-2, 6-4.

"I wanted her to get to play today," Hinkle said of Wilder.

Although Wilder has no illusions of moving up from her current slot, she did enjoy playing at No. 3.

"I like the challenge, so I try to play better, but I'm happy with my spot," she said.

In No. 1 doubles, Sophia Martin and Jaiden Ryker topped Tirbene and March 6-2, 6-3.

With only three players, the Wildcats are focused solely on winning the matches they compete in and improving their games over the course of the season.

"We've forfeited several matches, but we try to get them out and give them as much experience as we can," said first-year coach Jeannie Fagan, who also coached boys golf last fall. "We had hoped for more (players)."

Fagan attributed the low turnout to three factors. First, she noted that Cypress Creek drew players from Wesley Chapel when it opened in 2017. Secondly, some girls have opted for lacrosse, which now is a spring sport. Lastly, former coach Michelle Clark, who also coached soccer, used to encourage her players from that sport to come out for tennis.

"My approach is that we get as much experience as we can with playing time," said Fagan, who advises her players to "win as many points as you can. Each time out I want them to get better."

As the No. 1 singles player, Tirbene, who is in her second year at tennis, said she works hard to improve and is taking classes in the sport.

"I can definitely see a difference," she said. "My serves are way better and I'm trying to angle the racket quickly."

March, who also plays volleyball and was on the weightlifting team, is a newcomer to tennis. She also has noticed an improvement in her game from the start of the season.

"I think my hits have gotten a little more powerful and I can place it more," she said.

Also aiming to improve are the Johnsons, who both went to states last year in doubles and were district champions in singles.

"It was really cool to compete at that level,"

Bulldogs, Pirates compete in spring break baseball series

District rivals Zephyrhills and Pasco post matching 2-1 records in the Farm Bureau Tournament

While most of the high school baseball teams in Pasco County took some time off during last week's spring break, Zephyrhills and Pasco were among the select few to take part in the Sixth Annual Farm Bureau Tournament.

The Bulldogs and Pirates posted identical 2-1 records in that week-long series won by Mitchell, which defeated Springstead 7-5 in a championship game battle of unbeaten teams last Friday at Weeki Wachee. That gave the Mustangs their second tournament title and first since 2016.

In a head-to-head matchup, Pasco rallied late for a 2-1 victory over arch-rival Zephyrhills. With the scored tied at 1 in the seventh inning, Pasco got the winning run when Zephyrhills pitcher Zach Schnied-miller walked Brandon Mills to plate Austin Fiorelli with the bases loaded and two outs.

"It was an eight pitch at-bat," Pasco coach Ricky Giles noted, lauding Fiorelli for the way he worked

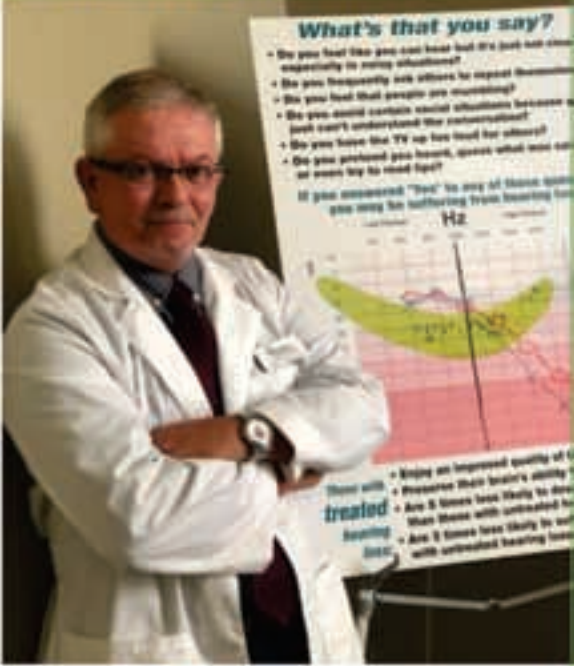

the count in that pressure situation. Naturally, Zephyrhills coach Rusty Guynn was not quite thrilled with the way that game ended. "It would've been better if we were playing in the semifinals," he said. "We let the Pasco game get away from us."

Pasco, which had not won a game before last week's tournament, snapped an early 0-3 skid with two straight victories — 13-7 over Fivay and the one-run win against Zephyrhills — before bowing out of the series after a 1-0 loss to Springstead.

In the game against Fivay, the Pirates got six runs in the first and finished with 11 hits for their best offensive effort of the season. Bryce Braxton went 4-for-5, scoring three times. Brian Schildt and Emilio Villa each added a pair of hits.

Brandon Mills, who went three innings and was the first of four Pasco pitchers, earned the win. Two nights later, Braxton delivered a stellar effort on the mound. The right-hander limited the Eagles to just four hits and an unearned run, but Springstead pitcher was even better. Bryce Holmes, a left-hander, scattered three hits with 10 strikeouts and one walk.

As for Zephyrhills, its most notable win of the series came against Nature Coast. Austin Green earned a 5-3 win against host Nature Coast in his first start of the season. The sophomore right-hander scattered seven hits with five strikeouts and two walks.

"Austin looked good," Guynn said. "He struggled a little bit with his curveball, but he threw it for strikes in good spots."

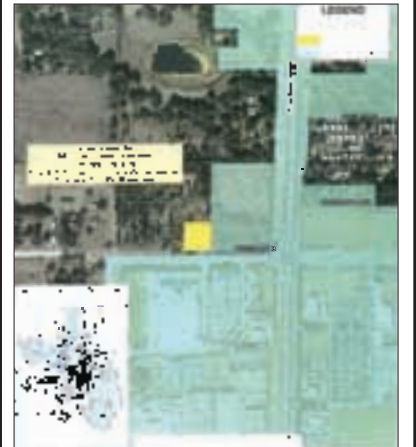

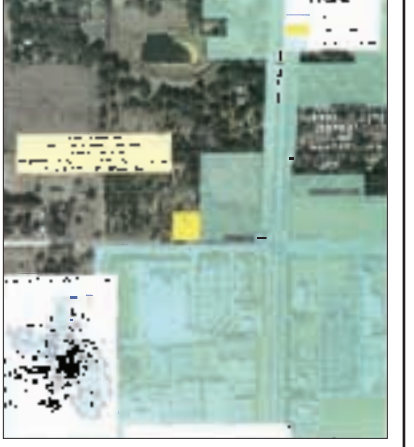

said Paige, who also was a district champion in No. 2 singles in 2017 and has lost just once in four seasons.

As for competing for a district title, which would be the Bulldogs' third (the 2010 and 2012 teams won districts), playing tough competition

could help them get ready for the postseason. Zephyrhills still has to play Citrus, Nature Coast and perennial state contender Wiregrass Ranch.

"It prepares us," Hinkle said of taking on tough teams. "It doesn't bother my girls. It doesn't change the way they feel going into districts."
