Jelly Bean Fling is fun-filled day before Easter

The Pioneer Florida Museum and Village hosts one of its most family-friendly events of the year

There have been many traditions and annual events established at the Pioneer Florida Museum & Village since that historical site in Dade City opened in 1973. Some took place even before that when the museum was chartered by the state and was initially housed at the Pasco County Fairgrounds.

Count the Jelly Bean Fling among the most popular events on the village grounds that encompass 6.5 acres, just north of the city's downtown area. The fun-filled family event featuring Easter eggs, chocolate bunny rabbits and such precedes Easter Sunday on April 17, which celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Among the Jelly Bean Fling activities on Saturday, none brought more laughter and shrieks of excitement from children than the easter egg hunts in a field at the bottom of a long hill. Hunts for various age groups took place throughout the morning and afternoon.

"Wouldn't miss it," said Joan Kerwin, who for

Tartan Day, water conservation and a conditional use change highlighted council meeting

A Water Conservation Proclamation followed by decisions regarding the future of water usage in Zephyrhills were the topics of conversation at Monday's meeting

Leading off the meeting was a proclamation regarding a resource too often taken for granted but that is recently attracting a lot of attention. Mayor Gene Whitfield declared the Month of April Water Conservation Month. Staying on topic was the recognition of the Zephyrhills 2021 Plant Operations Excellence Award. The award was earned at the recent Focus on Change seminar series in Haines City for furthering the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's goal of ensuring safe drinking water for all people in Florida. Originally issued on March 16, Whitfield handed the award to Zephyrhills Utilities Department head John Bostic.

The third opening item for Whitfield was the Proclamation for Tartan Day. Whitfield proclaimed April 6 as Tartan Day in recognition of Scottish heritage and its impact on American history. April 6 is a significant date in Scottish history, as April 6, 1320 was the signing of the Declaration of Arbroath otherwise known as the Scottish Declaration of Independence. Former Mayor and Zephyrhills resident Cliff McDuffee was on hand to receive the proclamation.

In the Consent Agenda, four items were on the list. Item 2.1 asked for an amendment to the contract with the Nieman Electric Motor Company that provides a Tsurumi Pump, a chopper pump in the lift station that grinds up

On March 17 at 1:19 p.m., the Zephyrhills Police Department responded to a 9-1-1 call at Skydive Čity, 4241 Sky Dive Lane, Zephyrhills, in reference to a hard landing of a solo skydiver.

Pasco Fire Rescue also responded to the location and the skydiver, James Southam, a 33-year-old male from British Columbia, Canada, was transported with severe injuries as a

trauma alert to Lakeland Regional Health Medical Center; he was pronounced deceased at the hospital.

Zephyrhills Police Department Detectives and Crime Scene Investigator were on scene for further investigation; the investigation is ongoing.



debris. The pump is part of the city's lift station rehabilitation project. The amendment sought to change the line "Estimated Expense: \$30,000 +/- yearly" to "Estimated Expense: Approximately \$100,000 annually."

Item 2.2 nixed a recent piggyback agreement with other counties to purchase plumbing supplies from Ferguson Enterprises, Inc. In August of 2021, the city renewed a piggyback agreement between Ferguson and Volusia County for Plumbing Supplies. Item 2.2 would have removed that option for future renewals and include an approximate annual cost of \$300,000 for purchasing purposes.

Item 2.3 requested council's approval to piggyback on the new Tampa Expressway Authority (THEA) agreement with Infotect Design Solutions, Inc. for General Information Technology Services. The agreement (notice to proceed) with the Expressway Authority is for three years with two one-year extensions. The City of Zephyrhills has contracted with Infotect Design Solutions since 2000 on a variety of information technology services.

Item 2.4 asked for a change order for a re-claimed water pipeline extension with B.R.W. Contracting, Inc. The project began in the middle of the COVID slowdown. Manufacturers were, and still are, very limited to what they make and with the increased demand and low supply. This change order satisfies the increase in those costs. The original budgeted amount for this project was \$1,500,000 in FY2021 with a winning bid of \$959,145. The cost increase of \$240,913.80 is due to the dramatic increase in the price of materials. The new contract amount would be \$1,200,058.80. All four items were bundled together and passed 5-0.

In Business Items, two conditional use changes came before council. These were the same two items that garnered a great deal of discussion at the last session, when the items were merely informational. Now they were on their first readings and stepping closer to becoming "entitlements." Item 3.1 pertained to a conditional use change, allowing for a proposed four-story apartment building at the Nick Apartments generally located at 6655 Fort King Rd. The applicants are proposing construction of four-story buildings on 10.63 acres of real property. The current zoning of the subject property permits a density of up to 20 dwelling units per acre. The applicants are proposing around 144 units at a density of about 13.5 units per acre. The Land Development Code allows for midrise structures (between three and five stories, inclusive) to be considered as a conditional use. The Site Plan Review Committee recommended approval of the conditional use to exceed the height limitations of the R4 zoning district at its regular monthly meeting on Jan. 18. The Planning Commission recommended approval of

the conditional use to exceed the height limitations of the R4 zoning district, with the condition of a turn lane on Fort King Road among others, at its regular monthly meeting on Feb. 15.

Discussion on the dais revolved around the particulars. Local residents, some with letters signed from residents in their adjacent community, opposed the project generally, due to the increase in traffic and other safety concerns. It was made clear that the development in question was not seeking to increase the density of the project but rather to allow for four-story buildings instead of the originally designed two-story buildings. The proposed Conditional Use change saw an actual decrease in the density of the project from 168 units to 144 units. Current code allows for 20 units per acre. The project in question has a density of 13.5 units per acre. The question was not over increasing density but simply the height of the building.

Still, councilman Ken Burgess and Charlie Proctor dug their heels in on principle.

We have all these projects in the pipeline and I'm opposed to the conditional use change until we figure this out," Burgess said.

Proctor echoed Burgess' sentiment.

"We have serious issues we need to address and we have to start somewhere," Proctor said.

Concern over the precedent set by approv-ing the Conditional Use was discussed and Zephyrhills City Attorney Matthew Maggard tempered them by stating that Item 3.1 was, "project specific" and not necessarily binding for future Conditional Use change requests. Council members leaning toward approval also stated their case.

"If a project comes to us later with an increase in density, we can always say, 'no'," Smith said.

Smith also noted the lack of affordable onebedroom housing in Zephyrhills.

"With this new plan, we have lower densi-ty, landscape buffering," Wilkeson said. The vote went 3-2 with council President

Alan Knight's affirmative vote tipping the scale and passing the measure. Item 3.2 received a request from the developer for a continuance until April 25. That motion passed 5-0.

In Noted Items, Item 4.1 approved minutes from the March 7, Council/Planning Commission Workshop.

Item 4.2 issued a Mary Cypert Proclamation on the occasion of her 104th birthday and the many accomplishments of her life, includ-ing raising two children, 17 grandchildren, 15 great-grandchildren.

Item 4.3 was a contract between the FAA and the City of Zephyrhills to provide a reconfiguration flight inspection of the PAPI on Rwy 01 at Zephyrhills Municipal Airport. This agreement provides funding for the FAA to establish these services at the rate of \$6,974.10.

MOMENTS IN TIME The History Channel







What to know about dietary cleanses

The NCCIH indicates a need for more substantive research before the efficacy of cleanses and detox diets can be confirmed. The NCCIH notes that, thus far, studies have been too small

or too low-quality for scientists to say with certainty that cleanses and detox diets are safe and effective.

consider-Women ing cleanses also should know that various companies selling cleansing and detox products have been accused by the Federal Trade Commission of making false claims about their products and/or pro-ducing products with potentially harmful ingredi-ents. Such actions underscore how important it is that women discuss cleanses and detox diets with their physicians prior to beginning any new

dietary regimen. When speaking to a doctor about a cleanse or detox diet, women should be as specific as possible, noting which products they are considering. Doctors can examine the products to determine any risks associated with them. For example, the NCCIH notes that juices made from high-oxalate foods such as spinach and beets could increase risk for kidney disease if consumed in significant quantities. Doctors also may note that some cleanses and detox diets that limit calories may produce short-term weight loss, but that any pounds shed may only be regained when women return to their normal diets once the cleanse ends.

Women considering dietary cleanses or other detox diets should discuss them with a physician prior to beginning a regimen. Doctors may recommend more proven dietary strategies that can help women get healthier and stay that way over the long haul.



Outside were several jeeps from the Vietnam time period as well as a 1968 OV-1 Mo-




