## Zephyrhills JROTC conducts flag retirement ceremony at Oakside Cemetery

*Cadets continue annual tradition of burning flags in disrepair and cleaning headstones as part of Project Patriotism*

The meaning of the United States flag is not lost on the Zephyrhills High JROTC, which conducted Project Patriotism last Friday morning at Oakside Cemetery. Cadets get an annual reminder of the importance of that American symbol of patriotism and freedom during a flag retirement ceremony that also includes cleaning the headstones of veterans who gave their lives for the nation at that site.

"It's a great honor to our country," said captain Aiden Macumber, a Zephyrhills junior who took pride in being the officer in charge. "The flag, to me, is patriotism and freedom. 'I believe that this should be a tradition

till who knows; till the end."

As the captain, Macumber notes that it is imperative that the cadets understand the meaning of such an event.

"They're learning more about their community and about honoring the veterans," he said, adding, "It's a great team-building opportunity."

In all, more than 40 cadets took part in last week's ceremony, which included a burning of about 100 flags in disrepair. The JROTC's Bulldog Battalion included two other specialist groups.

The school's honor guard and saber arch units played key roles in the event, which began in 2016 with a flag burning at Tampa Bay Sporting Clays in Land O' Lakes. It has since moved to Oakside Cemetery for every year except 2019 due to the coronavirus pandemic.

"This is to understand the honor that we have to extend to Old Glory; the knowledge of it, the meaning behind it," said Sgt. Jimmy Macauley, who along with

## City council looks at Pasco Partnership for Trail Connections

*Council meeting moved forward together with engineering firm AECOM and the Pasco County MPO to determine the future of trail, sidewalk and bike path connectivity*

Consent Agenda Items moved quickly, as Item 1.1 was merely an approval of meeting minutes from the Feb. 14 regular meeting. Item 1.2 approved minutes from the Feb. 15 Mayor's Caucus. That meeting was concise and straightforward. Sitting councilman Lance Smith was the only candidate applying for and attaining the necessary 25 signatures to run for Seat 1. Sitting councilman Ken Burgess attained the 25 signatures and was the only candidate applying to run for Seat 4. Both petition certifications were passed unanimously and the meeting took all of three minutes. With no opposition, Smith and Burgess accede to their respective positions.

In the Business Items, Item 2.1 was not an action item but rather a presentation by engineering company AECOM for designs and study of a multi-purpose trail along Wire Road. The study will look at various existing elements and infrastructure that may support future bicycle and pedestrian facilities within the corridors. The study area can be generally described as the area north of State Road 54 and south of Piedmont Avenue. The study area is bounded on the west by Dairy Road and on the east by 16th Street.

An opportunities and challenges matrix was created to document spatial requirements necessary for a range of bicycle-pedestrian facilities that could be utilized within the study area. This work will be used as the basis for a second project by the Pasco County MPO if the study area analysis shows the potential for active transportation facilities development. The range of bicycle-pedestrian facilities will include bike lanes, buffered bicycle lanes, multi-use trails, a cycle

Sgt. Michael Smith oversees the school's JROTC program. "It will always be a tradition." The event was especially rewarding to Macauley because his son Jimmy, a senior, and daughter Jasmine, a sophomore, are JROTC cadets. He also remembers the cadet who were involved in the first flag retirement ceremony at Tampa Bay Sporting Clays. Macauley oversaw that initial event and has been at all of the ensuing ceremonies as well.

Battalion Commander Zachariah Arnold, who as a JROTC student holds the rank of Lt. Col., spoke briefly on the history of the flag and how what initially represented 13 colonies now is a national symbol for 50 states.

"I try to make it the same every year," Arnold said of his annual speech on Old Glory, noting that it is very important to the ninth-graders getting involved with the school's JROTC for the first time. "I wanted all the freshmen to see that this is how we do this."

They also saw a strive for perfection from each JROTC unit that was involved in the community event. The cadets went through three dry runs, which included several tweaks after

each one, before finally conducting the ceremony.

Symbolically placing the folded flags in disrepair into a burning barrel was the flag retirement detail. That unit included Iann Mahoney, Rachel Diaz, Annaleese Thomas, Anesha Gonzalez, Mdeline Starnes and Destiny Colding.

Aside from the Zephyrhills JROTC, other groups on occasion have conducted flag retirement ceremonies. Several years ago, Cub Scout Pack 72 in Zephyrhills retired flags at Shepard Park.

The Zephyrhills High JROTC team, which was founded in 1985, also takes part in an annual flag day ceremony at the Zephyrhills Elks Lodge. Next up for the local JROTC are district competitions featuring a drill meet and a rifle match later this month.



## The History Channel

- On March 3, 1845, Congress reins in President John Tyler's zealous use of the presidential veto, overriding it with the necessary two-thirds vote. This marked Congress' first use of the Constitutional provision allowing veto overrides.

- On March 8, 1917, the February Revolution begins when riots and strikes over the scarcity of food erupt in Petrograd. A week later, centuries of czarist rule in Russia ended with the abdication of Nicholas II. Vladimir Lenin returned home and took control of the Russian Revolution.
- On March 9, 1979, Major League Baseball teams are ordered by the MLB commissioner to allow equal access to all reporters. The order came after Sports Illustrated reporter Melissa Ludtke's successful lawsuit for refusing her access to clubhouses at Yankee Stadium during the 1977 World Series.

# Wealth of Health

## 3 metrics to know if exercise is working

Obstacles are bound to appear as individuals embark on the road to getting healthier. Such obstacles come in many different forms, but one hurdle many individuals encounter is doubts about the effectiveness of their workout regimens.

Everyone would love to reap instant rewards from exercise, and immediate gratification is not necessarily elusive. 

2. Repetitions: Johns Hopkins Medicine notes that repetitions are another reliable metric by which to measure exercise progress. The more repetitions individuals can do without straining, the stronger their muscles are becoming. Individuals should resist any urge to overdo it. The repetitions metric is only a useful measure of progress if individuals are capable of doing a rep without straining.

3. Body composition: This metric should come as no surprise. The more positively exercise affects the body, the more that will show in how the body looks. Johns Hopkins notes that fat loss, specifically around the waist, and muscle growth are two telltale signs that an exercise regimen is progressing.

It can be easy to obsess over results when

beginning an exercise regimen. But remaining patient and persistent and utilizing certain metrics to measure progress can keep individuals on the path to getting fit.







track, sharrows and sidepaths. AECOM Landscape Architect Paul Kurtz presented the options and limitations of the study area. There are some areas that Kurtz dubbed as, "constrained," as in there was limited area on the roadsides but countered that there are also a, "range of facility types." Different types of facilities could be combined to obtain connectivity. For instance, where there is not sufficient shoulder or right-of-way for a multi-use trail, a sidewalk - which requires less width - could be used to connect the multi-use trail to other types of facilities. Tina Russo, Pasco County Transportation Planner for the Pasco MPO also addressed council. She said that the MPO has had the proposed project on the list of projects for some time and that they are now moving forward with some of the bigger projects. Much of the study area is outside of Zephyrhills City limits. Item 2.2 requested a public workshop on March 7, 6 p.m. on behalf of the planning department. The meeting between the city council and the planning commission will aim at discussion of growth patterns, city services and transportation. Council members all agreed on the time and date of the meeting without a formal vote.

In the City Manager's Report, Item 3.1 asked council to approve a bid by Kamminga & Roodvoets. On Jan. 21, the city distributed Bid 11-22-01 for the improvements of Jennifer Lane. The solicitation was distributed online through BidNet Direct which had 16 contractors download the bid package. On Feb. 11, the city received three solicitation responses. The Kamminga & Roodvoets bid was the lowest of the three at \$163,737.20. The original estimate for the project was \$120,000 but due to construction price escalation, \$43,737.20 will be subsidized to the project funding using Transportation Impact Fee (TIF) Contingency funds. Council members lamented the rising costs of construction but also noted that Jennifer Lane was the last "functional" dirt road in city limits. The item was approved 5-0 at the recommendation of city staff and Zephyrhills Public Works Director Shane LeBlanc.

In Citizen Comments, Dr. Randy Stoval stepped up to the podium to tout this Friday's Pigz in Zhills event. Some changes were that parking will now be free but a modest \$5 admission will be charged at the gate. Pig Bucks will be done away with and vendors will accept cash and credit/debit card payments. Stoval touted the 25 entries in the Friday evening kiddie cookoff and 55 teams entered for the Saturday barbeque cookoff.

# Bulldogs win home opener

*Zephyrhills staves off a late rally by Lakeland Kathleen for a 7-4 win and improves to 2-0 overall*

Prospects for a victory in the Zephyrhills baseball team's home opener brought out a decent crowd to John F. Clements Field last Friday night. The Bulldogs did not disappoint their partisan fans as they defeated Lakeland Kathleen 7-4.

Zephyrhills, which improved to 2-0 overall after opening the regular season with a 12-2 win at Lake Gibson, overcame an early 2-0 deficit to beat Kathleen. The Bulldogs tied the score in the bottom of the first inning,

took a 7-3 lead through the fourth then staved off a late rally by the Red Devils to hang on for a one-run victory.

"We'll be fine," said Rusty Guynn, a former Zephyrhills ballplayer now in his ninth season coaching at his alma mater. "We'll be there in the end. This is probably the best group that's going to swing the bat."

Zephyrhills did not have any seniors on last year's team and, not coincidentally, struggled to a 5-13 record. Guynn figures this might be the best team he's had since 2016 when the Bulldogs snapped a 10-year playoff drought and won a district title before being eliminated in the region quarterfinals by Tampa Robinson.

While Zephyrhills starting pitcher Mark Santiago struggled early, allowing two runs in the first, he settled down and did not allow another run until the fourth.

After one out in the fifth, he was taken out for reliever Reilly Perez. Santiago allowed four runs on four hits and four walks while striking out nine.

"He's just got to get settled in," Guynn said of Santiago. "He's going to be fine, because we're going to need him. We played pretty good defense, but we can't walk hitters. You're not going to do that and beat a pretty good team."

Perez gave up a pair of runs, but worked out of further damage in the sixth by striking out the side. He was replaced by Zephyrhills' third pitcher, Mason Denmark, for the seventh.

The promising freshman had two strikeouts while giving up a hit and a walk to close it out.

"He's young," Guynn said. "When he gets everything under control and stops trying to throw everything through a wall ... and he's got a good breaking ball."

As for the offense, it continued to click early. Coming off a game in which the Bulldogs scored 12 runs, they continued their solid hitting by scoring seven on 11 hits with three walks and a hit batter.


Trailing 2-0, Zephyrhills wasted no time in tying the game with a pair of runs in the bottom of the first. The first two batters, Jaxson Rivera and Micah Berrien singled. Rivera raced home on Denmark's double and Berrien scored on a wild pitch.

The Bulldogs then took a 5-2 lead with three runs in the bottom of the second. Santiago helped his own cause by leading off with a home run, the first of two for Zephyrhills that night. Zephyrhills added four more singles in that inning with Berrien and D.J. Pickett each driving in a run with a base hit.

Kathleen cut the deficit with one run in the fourth, but Zephyrhills increased the lead to 7-3

with two runs in the bottom of that inning. Berrien led off with a walk before Bryan Santiago blasted the baseball over the left field fence for a two-run homer. Santiago, a senior first baseman, is the older brother of Mark, who is a junior.

The Bulldogs compete in Class 5A, District 10 and although it is early they are the only unbeaten team in that district.

# Zephyrhills High School renovation gets big reveal

The scene was as ceremonial as it was celebratory. Poised at the new entrance of the renovated media center, the ZHS JROTC stood at attention. On cue, they marched to the center of the room and initiated the event that would reveal the \$46 million renovation of Zephyrhills High School in an open house setting. The color guard stood stoic during a playing of the national anthem and Pledge of Allegiance, eventually giving way to the ZHS Band and Chorus, the latter performing the school's alma mater.

Principal Christina Stanley gave opening remarks as a slideshow of before-and-after photos of the project played on brand new, high definition TVs. Stanley detailed the expansive project, recognized several individuals associated with the project and praised her staff at Zephyrhills High as being the, "best administrative team in the county."

Public officials were next to step to the podium and address the gathering.

"It's good to see you all here," School Board Member of District 3 and Chairman Cynthia Armstrong said. "It shows what a part of the community this school is."

Following Armstrong was District 1 School Board Member Allen Altman. Altman praised the voter-approved Penny for Pasco Initiative that passed in 2013. Altman stated that \$41.5 million of the \$46 million project was furnished by Penny for Pasco.

"We recognize that growth is huge, here in Pasco County," Altman said. "I'd like to thank the citizens (of Pasco County) for approving Penny for Pasco. Without their support (this project) would not have occurred."

Superintendent Kurt Browning addressed the audience.

"We are excited about this project, it was long overdue," Browning said. "We wish we had the money to do all these projects at the same time."

The speeches gave way to the ribbon-cutting ceremony just outside the media center and sparkling new main hall. Stanley performed the ribbon cutting and then a second cutting was performed by recent ZHS Principal Angie Stone. From there, guests were offered refreshments, snacks and self-guided tours of the school.

ZHS Outstanding Senior Kamil Mehrab detailed some of the improvements.

"The renovations started the beginning of my sophomore year," Mehrab said. "It started with small changes and then grew from there."

Mehrab detailed some of the changes in the existing

cafeteria, like lighting, the serving counters, seating, the entire kitchen. The renovation even added a new cafeteria that was classrooms prior.

One of the bigger projects was Building 26. One of the first projects to get started, Building 26 is an entirely new building with brand new classrooms, restrooms, motion-activated lights and even a breezeway connecting it to the older Building 25.

Mehrab, who lived through both the extensive renovations and the Covid-Era, remembered the challenges faced early on in the process.

"The biggest inconvenience was 1,300 kids going through one side of the school at once, for six periods a day,"

Mehrab said. "It took longer to get to classes and people were crammed in the hallways."

Coming back this August for his senior year, Mehrab was happy to see that most of the work was completed.

"There was just some touch-up work, light fixtures and stuff like that," Mehrab said. "The cafeteria was done, the commons were done."

It instilled a sense of pride in the senior.

"I have siblings that went here, my mom, my aunt - it's fun to talk about their experiences here," Mehrab said. "They still haven't seen the improvements yet. I think my mom would really enjoy it."

HOLLYWOOD -- It's taken 13 years for anyone to attempt to make a biopic of Michael Jackson's life (he died in 2009 at 50). This comes right on the heels of "I Wanna Dance With Somebody," the biopic about Whitney Houston (who died in 2012 at 48). Set for a Dec. 23 release in theaters, Naomi Ackie embodies Houston, while Aston Sanders plays Bobby Brown and Stanley Tucci plays record mogul Clive Davis. Graham King, producer of "Bohemian Rhapsody," is in the process of casting someone to portray Michael Jackson. # Zephyrhills fares well in postseason wrestling tourneys

*Bulldogs are district runners-up and finish sixth at regionals, send three wrestlers to states*

competitors in last year's district meet. Aside from Smith at 220 pounds, Jaiden Martinez at 145 and Kahona Martinez at 100 winning their weight classes, the other winners were Dalton Arrington at 182 and 170-pounder Blake Yearby.

District runners-up Jared Apple, 285; and Jose Castro, 106; rounded out the region qualifiers that included Eric Chaffin, 132; Lucas Gillespie, 195; Ethan Kocher, 160; and Griffin Lugo, 126. Jacob Smith, 152, was an honorable mention.

In the regionals at Palmetto Ridge, Theotis Smith was Zephyrhills' lone champion. Jaiden Martinez, who suffered neck and head injuries, qualified for the state meet but it is uncertain if he will be healthy enough to compete in the upcoming championships at Silver Spurs Arena in Kissimmee.

"Of the four (boys district) champions only two qualified for states, but I'll take it. That's 50 percent."

The coach also has high hopes for Theotis Smith at states, saying, "Right now, Theotis has a great chance to be in the top three."

Kohana Martinez also earned a state berth after finishing as a regional runner-up. She becomes the first Bulldog to earn a state berth in the girls division.

The Zephyrhills wrestling team, which has struggled in recent years, is on the rise. The Bulldogs have fared well in the postseason, finishing as district runners-up and seventh at regionals.

Individually, Theotis Smith, Jaiden Martinez and his sister, Kohana Martinez qualified for the state tournament. This is the first year that girls wrestling is sanctioned by the Florida High School Athletic Association.

"We just have more people and these kids are tough," Zephyrhills coach Mike Martinez said. "We have some fighters on the team."

In the district tourney hosted by Freedom, Zephyrhills qualified 10 wrestlers for regionals and came home with five district champions. By comparison, the Bulldogs only had seven
