The top eight players from the 2018-19 season in both mens and ladies divisions, converged on the courts at Betmar Park between April 1 and 4. It was a round-robin format where each player was ranked one through eight and then slotted in to play each of the seven other players. Four of the eight male competitors and five of the eight female competitors were Hall of Famers. Last week's Florida Shuffleboard Association (FSA) Masters Tournament was unlike any of the

others played at Betmar over the course of the season. Players from all over the state like Fort Myers or Bradenton or Saint Petersburg were on hand. A contingent of shuffleboarders from the St. Petersburg Shuffleboard Club were sporting their green shirts and proud that their club is in the throws of a renaissance. "In the 1940s and 50s there were over 7,000 members but by 2005, there were just 35," St. Petersburg Shuffleboard Club Executive Director Christine Page said. "We started doing a free Friday event with music and food and drinks, in an attempt to promote a community/festival atmosphere and the interest started again. We're now up to 1,400 members." St. Petersburg Shuffleboard Club will host the 2019-20 Masters Tournament and they had a male shuffler battling for one of the top spots by Thursday's final round. Heading into the last round, Erik Hahnman was facing Hall of Famer Earl Ball, Ball attempting to defend his home turf. Hahnman had

## Two club wrestling teams compete in state championships

*Underdog Wrestling Club and ZCA Warriors fared well in FAWA Folkstyle State Tourney*

Two club wrestling teams from Zephyrhills fared well in the Florida Amateur Wrestling Association's Folkstyle State Championships. Last month's event took place at Kissimmee Osceola High School with both local youth teams competing in the rookie division. Representing the Zephyrhills area, with some team members from Wesley Chapel as well, was the Underdog Wrestling Club, founded in 2014 by former Zephyrhills High assistant Mike Martinez. Also taking part in the tournament in central Florida was an upstart club team, the Zephyrhills Christian Academy Warriors. The Underdog club had 11 wrestlers, including seven who placed among the top 3 in their weight class, at Kissimmee. "We did very well as a club," Martinez said. "We took a lot of first-year kids who have only been wrestling for three months. They battled well." Meanwhile, the Warriors had 10 wrestlers in the Kissimmee area meet, seven of whom cracked the top 3 in their respective groups. "We started this year and the kids are doing really good," said Ingrid Medrano, who along with her

## Little League seasons near midpoint in Dade City and Zephyrhills

*Proposed county fees for park usage could have adverse effect on baseball and softball programs*

As the 2019 Little League season nears the midway mark, baseball and softball teams in Zephyrhills and Dade City are focused on the action in the field. For league officials, however, it's another story as an upcoming financial decision could result in changes to each league. Ballplayers at John S. Burks Memorial Park in Dade City and the Samuel W. Pasco Recreation Complex in Zephyrhills show up daily to pitch, hit and run to their heart's content. This could be the last season where they play and how many show up if a plan by the Pasco County Parks and Recreation Department is approved by county commissioners. Brian Taylor, the county's parks and recreation manager, recently met with Little League officials on the east side of the county in Dade City to inform them of possible fees to play at county parks soon.

"We're just in the beginning stages," he said, adding that commissioners could approve a plan by the end of 2019. Taylor said the county's annual budget is \$12 million with about 10 percent from parks and recreation fees. Competitive or elite-level travel teams currently pay \$10 per child while there is no cost to use the county's fields for recreational players. Costs for the latter group are for the specific sport or league they play in. Adam Wilkes, formerly in charge of the Zephyrhills Police Athletic League's football and cheerleading program, is now in his second season as the Zephyrhills Little League president. He noted that his league would be overtaken with a proposed rate of \$3 per hour to use a county field. Zephyrhills has about 240 ballplayers who are charged \$120 apiece with many paying less due to financial issues. Wilkes noted that nobody is turned away. By comparison, the Land O' Lakes Little League has about 700 players who are charged \$250 each. Wilkes mentioned two options: the city annexing the county field off Chancery Road or refurbishing Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field, which formerly was the site of the city's Dixie Softball League.

# Wealth of Health



## Health screenings every woman should get

Routine wellness exams are essential for women who want to maintain and/or improve their health. Women may not be familiar with all of the screening options that can keep them on the right track.

Preventative health screenings can shed light on risks for certain diseases and provide insight into patient behaviors that may be harmful. Screenings also may help save a life.

Healthy diets and daily exercise are hallmarks of healthy people, but routine wellness exams are just as important. The following are some screenings women should include in their health and wellness routines.


- Blood pressure: Doctors will typically test blood pressure at every visit. Women whose blood pressure is below 120/80 mmHg can go every two years between blood pressure readings up until age 20, advises The American Heart Association. Adults 40 or older, or those with conditions that put them at risk for hypertension, should go annually or as advised by a doctor.
- Cervical cytology: The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists recommends routine pelvic examinations with cervical testing that includes Pap testing and HPV testing. Consult with an OB-GYN for testing frequency, which depends on age.

- Cholesterol: Cholesterol levels alone are not indicative of one's overall health. However, a complete cholesterol test can determine a person's risk for heart disease. If levels are consistently normal, this test may only need to be performed every five years, advises the National Institutes of Health.
- Mammogram: Mammograms screen for breast cancer. Given the risk of false positives, debate continues as to how frequently women need these screenings. The most recent guidelines from the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force says mammograms are recommended starting at age 50, and should occur every two years. The American Cancer Society advises starting at age 45 and having a mammogram annually through age 55.
- Blood-glucose test: The National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive Kidney Diseases says women should be screened regularly for prediabetes or diabetes beginning around age 45. Women can speak with their physicians to determine how often they should receive these screenings.
- Osteoporosis screenings: Bone density can be measured starting at age 65 or earlier if a woman has a


high fracture risk, states Regis College.

- Skin examination: The American Academy of Dermatology suggests speaking with a dermatologist about skin exams. Self-examinations should be routine, but dermatologists may recommend more formal tests to women who meet certain criteria.

Women should speak to their doctors about personalized screenings based on family history and other risk factors.

husband Frank Cisneros and Will Thomas, coaches the Warriors.

Cisneros and Medrano have had their share of success in the sport. Both won gold medals representing El Salvador in the 2008 Olympics held in Beijing, China. Cisneros won his division in judo while Medrano was a champion in wrestling.

Additionally, Thomas wrestled at Zephyrhills High (Class of 2013) for Mike Smith, that school's former coach who now is the principal and pastor at Zephyrhills Christian.

Thomas said the goal for the young wrestlers "is to really learn their body control and get the fundamental mechanical skills down."

The lone state champion among wrestlers from both club programs was Izak Rodriguez, who won at 73 pounds to cap a 4-0 run in that tourney. A year ago while wrestling for Top Brother, which had been run by Cisneros and Medrano, Rodriguez was a state runner-up.

"It feels way better than last year," he said. Three Warriors — Paul Burke, Yaritza Santiago and Bentley Cooper — finished as state runners-up in Kissimmee. There also were three third-place finishers in Matheo Cisneros, Jordan Lopez and Destiny Darko.

Rounding out the team, although missing out on the top 3 placements, were Carlos Santiago, who took fourth, fifth-placer Giovanna Gonzalez and David Maduro.

Another wrestler who is on the team, but did not compete at the state series is Talon Maple. The 12-year-old, who competed in the National High School Coaches Association Nationals at Virginia Beach, is the son of Pasco High wrestling coach Tim Maple.

The Underdog club, which placed 11th overall as a team, were led by five state runners-up. That group was comprised of Colten Hibbard, Austin Hibbard, Joshua Hibbard, Marcus Cara and Kohana Martinez.

Also placing were third-place finishers Jonathan Bryant, Carl Pignard and Mason Cara. Finishing just out of the running in fourth were teammates Alexander Camarillo, Jonah Knotts and Mariah Miley.

"It started out a little rough," Martinez said of his wrestlers' early showing. "What we've been drilling to the kids is hard work pays and it showed."

In addition to the state tourney, both local club teams have taken part in the first three tourneys of the Tour of Florida series. Two of those wrestlers from the Underdog club to compete have been Martinez's children: Jaiden, a freshman at Zephyrhills High, and Kohana, and eight-grader at Stewart Middle.

Kohana also competed in the United States Marine Corps Folkstyle Nationals in Oklahoma City. She placed sixth in that event to earn All-American honors.

"A while ago they were talking about the city annexing the (Sam Pasco) park. I hope that could be done," Wilkes said, adding he prefers the Krusen Field option since it is in the city boundaries. "We should be playing in the city."

At Monday's city council meeting, councilwoman Jodi Wilkeson mentioned to the other members that she had been in contact with Wilkes about the situation and that she planned to discuss it further with county parks and recreation officials.

As for the league itself, Wilkes feels things are running smoother after a transition year. The local league spent \$18,000 this past offseason to

improve baseball and softball batting cages, add three new scoreboards, purchase chalk boxes to line home plate and, of course, new uniforms.

Those changes, in part, resulted in about 50 more players coming out for this season, Wilkes noted.

"I think transparency's a big deal," he said. "It makes a big difference. Every time we spend money I put it up on the Facebook site so they can see where it's going."

Wilkes said that when he and the current board took over two years ago "the biggest issue for me is that (the league) didn't have that hometown feel to it. I think we gained a lot of it back."

In Dade City, the numbers are a bit better with public relations director Hiedi Perez

reporting nearly 400 ballplayers for this season. She also noted that, unlike in years past, Dade City will not host any District 25 All-Star games this season due to plans for a new concession building.

Construction is slated to begin at the conclusion of the regular season.

"We need it. It's overdue," she said of a new concession stand.

some difficulty adjusting to the courts at Betmar and was in third, with 11 points heading into the final match. Ball was already sitting on a score of 14 and needed to win just one game to make his fourth Masters Tournament victory a reality. It was a close game and Ball led 64-50 deep into it. Hahnman ended with a shot in the kitchen to fall behind 71-40. With the hammer in his pocket, Ball cleared the board and scored an eight to win the game 79-40 and clinch the Masters title.

"This was at my home court and as a nine-time Roll Champion, Betmar and Zephyrhills were expecting great things and I tried my darndest to deliver," Ball said. "He (Hahnman) has had my number all year, too. He beat me at Sebring last week (in doubles) and he beat me one-on-one at the Tournament of Champions."

While Hahnman is far more familiar with his home courts in St. Pete, he had played at Betmar three times this past season. The courts at St. Pete are different. First, they are outside. Some are covered but all 78 courts are outside. Second, the surface is different. At St. Pete, the cement courts have glass beads spread over them, not unlike table shuffleboard, which tends to use coarse salt. At Betmar, the beads are embedded in the cement.

"It plays a little different," Hahnman said. "The speed is different, too. Earl knows the drift here and all the courts drift."

Ball and Hahnman were the top two point-scorers from the season. It was only fitting that they face off in the last round. Once Ball locked up the title, he could finally relax.

"I came out today knowing I just needed to win one game," Ball said. "I did a lot of clearing, which is something I don't normally do but then I relaxed after that first game and played well the second and third."

Ball cruised to a lopsided win in the second game and then came back from behind to win the third game 78-23. Once Hahnman knew he'd lost his chance at the title, his game loosened up, too.

"This was my 18th Master tournament but I will tell you that Erik (Hahnman) is very good," Ball said. "He's a 300 (point) bowler and his stride is just like bowling. If he could play all the time, he'd be the top player in the state. These young guys have such good hand-eye coordination, they can pick a hair off the court."

Ball, certainly has enjoyed a rein of dominance years. However, this season, he had some significant obstacles. Ball lost his wife last October and underwent cataract surgery in November. Still, he managed to pull off a win at the Masters to cap the season.

Hahnman dropping all three games to Ball left the door open for Dean Myklejord. Myklejord led Hahnman by one point, heading into the final round. He knew he needed to have a good match. Perhaps at first, he'd hoped Hahnman would sweep Ball and give him a chance at the title. When Ball won the first game, Myklejord's strategy changed.

"Earl is like a machine," Myklejord said. "Then when Ron (Nurnberger) won his first game, I knew I needed to win two (games)."

Nurnberger had 11 points heading into the final. Myklejord had the head-to-head tiebreaker but needed to keep pace to take second. Myklejord, the president of Lakeland Shuffleboard Club, was up 57-30 after winning the first game. Up 73-53, Myklejord hit a seven to win the second game and clinch second place in the tournament. Nurnberger took third and Hahnman fourth.

On the ladies side, Terri Smith was slotted in against Joyce Smith for the final round. They were the two leading scorers through the first seven rounds, Terri Smith with 12 and Joyce with 11. Joyce needed to win at least two out of the three games. When Terri Smith won the first game 81-46, it put the pressure on Joyce Smith to stay alive and Terri to close it out.

"In Game 2 there was a lot of pressure at first," Terri Smith said. "I just kept telling myself, 'Don't play stupid.'"

She did not. Terri Smith got out to a sizeable lead, 66-37 and had Joyce Smith on the ropes but Joyce kept staving off elimination. Joyce climbed back into it, down 63-51 but Terri hit an eight that gave her a 71-51 lead. Still, Joyce battled through six more frames before falling 76-51.

Terri Smith made it her third time winning the Masters Tournament in five appearances. The Bradenton Shuffleboard Club member just made the hall of fame in 2018.

"I knew I had to bring my A-game," Terri Smith said. "I had a hard time playing on these courts, especially against people that live here. They are used to them (courts)."

Terri Smith would finish with 14 points, winning her match with Joyce Smith 2-1. Joyce Smith, having dropped two games to Terri, left the door open for Ruth Brown to leapfrog into second place.

Brown, a Sebring Recreation Club member, knew she had the head-to-head tiebreaker against Joyce Smith but she would need to at least get to that tie by winning two games in her final match. Brown even held the tiebreaker over Terri Smith, having beat her 2-1 in earlier rounds. However, with the two wins by Terri Smith, all Brown could salvage was second and she did just that with a pair of wins in her final round match.

"I've played these courts before but not often," Brown said. "There's a lot of drift here. Sometimes I like a lot of drift but I found it hard clearing. Sometimes you just have to let the drift take it. I'm still very happy with second place."

The top finishers from each division were: Mens, Earl Ball, 17; Dean Myklejord, 14; Ron Nurnberger, 13; Erik Hahnman, 11; Tom Putnam, 9; Michael Seyfer, 8; Ken Offenther, 6; and Ray Buck, 6.

Ladies, Terri Smith, 14; Ruth Brown, 13; Joyce Smith, 12; Glenda Brake, 11; Debbie Norton, 10; Arlene Gurerrini, 10; Pam Nurnberger, 8; Alice Enos/Flo, 6; and Kowaleski (alternate).

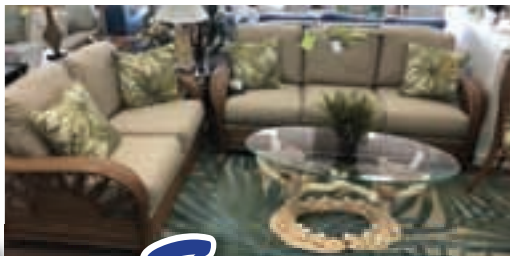

# City awards road improvements contract to low bidder

*Aviation proclamation made by mayor and special meeting to canvas votes*

In a city council meeting that proved to be a bit more condensed than most — perhaps due to Monday being the day before municipal elections — a key road improvement contract was awarded. Additional items on the docket included an aviation proclamation as well as an upcoming special meeting to make changes following the election.

Closing out the meeting with a hearty thanks to his constituents was council president Lance Smith, who this week attempted to defend Seat 1 against challenger of former council member Manny Funes. Meanwhile Ken Burgess was unopposed for Seat 4.

“Hopefully I’m sitting up here somewhere (after the election),” Smith said, adding, “Hopefully I’ll have another three years.”

Before the most notable topic of the meeting was discussed, Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield made a general aviation proclamation to Nathan Coleman, manager of the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport.

“Come and jump out of an airplane and let’s go flying,” Coleman said.

Added Smith, “We sometimes forget about it, but a lot of people come here because of the airport.”

The topic that brought about the most discussion, however, was approving a contractor for the Simons Road Construction Project. The city received six solicitation responses with Florida Safety Contractors being on the high

end at \$3.8 million and BRW Contracting coming in the lowest at \$2.8 million.

Council unanimously approved the bid by the Land O’ Lakes-based company, but not before it was scrutinized by council members and city staff. Ken Burgess, the council’s vice-president, noted that keeping costs low for a project utilizing taxpayers’ money factored into the equation.

Councilman Alan Knight expressed the most serious concerns, which centered on language in the consent item. It was noted that with city staff contacting references some comments were mediocre, which prompted a meeting with the contractor.

“Everyone wants to get Simons Road paid for,” Knight said. “I’d like some guarantees.”

Knight said he understands the savings of \$600,000 or more. Nonetheless, he added that he is concerned about the project going over budget, saying, “I’m leery.”

Billy Poe, deputy city manager, was among a handful of city employees to meet with the contractor and assured Knight that the choice was worthy.

“We feel that they will do a good job,” Poe said. “We will have someone on sight, not just once a week but daily.”

Smith asked if Poe was “comfortable enough” to go with BRW and when he responded positively, Knight said, “With great apprehension I’ll go with however

the council’s going to go.”

As for costs, public works director Shane LeBlanc pointed out that a \$367,000 contingency was built into the contract, but he did not expect it to go over. He added that the city did a diligent review, somewhat more than is usual.

Another point, brought up by city attorney Matthew Maggard, was that BRW has been with the same bonding agent for 14 years and only had one claim, which was denied.

Smith recommended that the Land O’ Lakes company provide monthly updates “to put us a little more at ease” once the project gets under way. The agreement calls for work to be completed within 180 days.

At about \$3 million, Smith labeled it one of the biggest road projects ever in the city.

The first phase will extend from Eiland Road to the curve and end just before the old Simons Road, LeBlanc explained.

“We’ll keep an eye on it,” he added.

Lastly, city clerk Lori Hillman proposed a special meeting to take place Friday night in order to accept the canvassing of votes, administer the oath of office to candidates and reorganize the council.
