City council swears in newly-elected and changes seats

The first part of Monday's Zephyrhills City Council meeting went quickly. The council moved to approve three Consent Agenda Items: approving the April 8 meeting's minutes, a bid for an HVAC system at the Zephyrhills Police Department and a fire department renovation. All three items passed unanimously without discussion.

Into business items, the council had two members pass through elections on April 9. Kenneth Burgess won Seat 4 without opposition and Lance Smith won in an election for Seat 1 against former councilman Manny Funes. The first part of the business item was to recognize the results of the election. The next was the official swearing in by Zephyrhills City Clerk Lori Hillman. The third part of the business items was a reorganization of the council.

Smith was commended for his service as council president and councilman Charlie Proctor nominated Burgess to be the next council president. No other nominations were made and Burgess advanced to the position of council president with unanimity. Burgess would conduct the rest of the meeting as president. Councilman Alan Knight nominated Proctor to be the next vice president and no other nominations were made as Proctor took over as vice president with unanimity.





Zephyrhills City Attorney Matthew Maggard.

After an analysis of the comprehensive plan, we decided we needed to make some holistic changes to the plan," planning director Todd Vande Berg said.

The changes were designed to assist with the development of the intersections of Gall Boulevard and 6th and 7th Streets.

"It allows us to make changes in coordination with the Department of Transportation (DOT) in that corridor," Vande Berg said. "We're working on a final design and will bring it before the council when it's completed."

In the City Manager's Report, Zephyrhills City Manager Steve Spina discussed the naming of a section of sidewalk in Zephyr Park that would connect the event pavilion to the rest-rooms for use by wheelchairs. Spina noted an event he attended in the park with a Ms. Irene Dobson and how she had to traverse over unpaved ground to reach the restroom facility. Spina proposed that this section of sidewalk be named after her. A 2013 resolution requires that a committee be formed in order to be presented with the naming rights before it becomes official. Councilwoman Jodi Wilkeson filed the initial motion and the council approved the formation of the committee unanimously. In the City Attorney's Report, the first reading of a resolution authorizing the Zephyrhills City Council to participate in joint meetings with the Municipal Association of Pasco to discuss matters of mutual interest was read. This resolution was passed unanimously. In the Citizen Comments portion of the meeting, Winifred Turgeon of the Woman's Club of Zephyrhills shared some details about renovations at the club, which included installing projection screens on stage, painting the interior and installing new LED lights. The club is open to the public on Wednesdays from 5:30-6:15 p.m. President of the Greater Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce Randy Stovall then gave a presentation regarding the efforts put forth by the chamber in recent months. Stovall discussed ideas about how to help the public schools in Zephyrhills bring up their state ratings and council members traded ideas. At the end, the council voted unanimously to renew the agreement between the city and chamber. In the announcements, the biggest issue that arose was the council commenting on a letter written by concerned citizens regarding the extension of the runway at the airport. The details of the letter were not disclosed but the obvious conflict with the proximity to Skydive City is an issue that the council hopes to sort out as the expansion of the airport seems inevitable. Spina noted meetings his department has had with the concerned residents and that they are ongoing. Spina also noted that both the State and the FAA are now involved in the process and that, "we are not the final decision-makers but we are working on it." Pasco County is no longer accepting glass in their recycling bins and due to an interlocal agreement with the county, the City of Zephyrhills must also comply. The Zephyrhills Public Works Department and the city asks that residents stop putting glass in their recycling bins after April 25.







"I wanted to do it, because I was looking for a way to do outreach in this community," she said. "I thought this would be a good fit."

Zephyrhills resident Sherry Matthews, who attended with her husband Thomas, noted that "they have some good information," adding that she has been to larger events along those lines.

Admission and parking were free with the forestry's blow-up Smokey the Bear greeting visitors at the entrance to the parking lot. Organizers explained that countywide and state services were made readily available at no cost to

Among the departments and groups who took part in the informative and educational sessions were parks, recreation and natural services, animal services, human services, veterans services, mosquito control, libraries and tourism.

"It was organized and very informative," said Land O' Lakes' Jerry Santiago, who was there with his wife Genesis.

Added Genesis, Eden's mother, "(Eden) gets her green thumb from her father."

At the entrance, Keep Pasco Beautiful representatives Kristen King, the coordinator, and president Lottie Kelly handed out soil with sunflower seeds in ice cream cones for people to take home at no cost.

"That way you don't have any pot to deal with," Kelly said of the use of an ice cream cone to hold the seeds and soil in.

Rick Buckman, the county's parks and recreation director, summed up the session rather succinctly, saying, "I think the reason we're here is to get people outside. Hopefully, at some

point, they take some sense of caring to protect (the environment)."

and more than 176 at this year's breakfast. "We outgrew that," he said of relocating the breakfast from Lake Jovita to Covington Farm.

Kim Price, the county's community services director, noted that people benefitting from the east-side effort are predominantly from Zephyrhills, Dade City and San Antonio. Similarly, breakfasts to raise funds to feed hungry seniors on the west side of the county have taken place for the past five years.

Countywide, there were about 19,000 meals served to more than 175 seniors in 2018. Those statistics were cited by board member David Lambert, who also is the manager of member relations for the Withlacoochee River Electric Cooperative.

He also pointed out that since its inception the program has doled out more than 50,000 meals, which drew a round of applause from the audience.

"The mission is one thing," Lambert said matter-of-factly. "To feed the folks who are elderly in our community."
