City council swears in new patrolmen, buttons up final plat at Zephyr Lakes

Monday's city council meeting saw new ZPD officers sworn in among other business

Monday's meeting was a familiar packed room, as new Zephyrhills patrolmen were being sworn in. Officers Steven Walker and Brandon Furr, got their oaths taken and badges affixed and became a part of ZPD. Walker was born in Pasco County and comes to the force with six years of law enforcement experience. Furr was raised in Tampa and spent five years with the U.S. Army, attaining the rank of sergeant. He is currently a National Guardsman. The new hires were greeted by a standing ovation. ZPD now has just one vacancy remaining to fill.

Item 2.1 in "Unfinished Business" was an item carried over from the last meeting. However, at the request of the applicant, a continuance to May 23 was voted on and approved 5-0 by council.

All Consent Agenda items were bundled and passed 5-0. Item 3.1 approved the regular meeting minutes from the March 28 meeting.

Item 3.2 was a resolution asking council to approve the City of Zephyrhills to participate in a May Municipal Association of Pasco (MAP) meeting to "discuss matters of mutual interest."

Item 3.3 amended a manufacturing agreement with Odyssey Manufacturing. Odyssey Manufacturing provides liquid sodium hypochlorite (bleach) as a disinfectant for drinking water and wastewater treatment. They asked for an increase of 18.9 percent or from \$0.925/gallon to \$1.10/gallon. It will have a net impact on the city's budget line item of \$47,250. This increase will not go into effect until August of 2022.

Item 3.4 asked council to approve a Right of Entry Agreement with Adventist Health System/Sunbelt, Inc. The city installed a reclaimed water line from the Daughtery/Dairy Road intersection north to the back side of the hospital for a future connection to the hospital cooling towers. With the construction of the Wire Road reclaimed water project, the reclaimed line needs to be connected to the main line on Dairy Road.

Item 3.5 approved new Historic Preservation Board members Eileen Westerman and Erica Freeman.

Update on road projects in Zephyrhills and East Pasco County

Three significant road projects affect commuters in and around Zephyrhills

The first project hits closest to home and is also the one that's in its earliest phase. That is the widening project on County Road 54, running east-west and sitting north of Zephyrhills High School. The project is a joint undertaking between the City of Zephyrhills and Pasco County. The costs for the project are split but the construction will be done by the county.

The scope of the project entails a number of intersection and shoulder improvements from the Wawa at Gall Boulevard and CR54, going east all the way to 23rd Street. The intersection at Wire Road/12th Street and CR54 will have traffic signal mast arms to replace the cables there currently. Wire Road/12th Street will also get designated right and left turn lanes. Further down

CR54, 23rd Street will get a traffic signal light on mast arms. The south side of 23rd Street will get a designated left turn lane.

There are a number of safety measures and accommodations for pedestrians, too. A 10-foot multi-use path on the south side of CR54 will run from Dairy Road, all the way to 23rd Street. On the north side, a five-foot sidewalk will connect to existing paths at Dairy Road and terminate at 23rd Street.

"It's a safety project," Technical Specialist III and Project Manager Patricia Arndt said. "Additional pedestrian signals at the intersection, which we don't have right now, will improve public safety."

Right now, the arduous task of relocating the utilities is being completed. The project requires coordinating with Duke Energy in relocating power poles. Frontier Communications also has a lot of fiber-optic cable under the ground on the shoulders of the road.

"This is critical infrastructure that we're still relocating," Arndt said. "We've been relocating it since September. Most people can't see

Local school is one of two in Pasco County to offer the innovative, hands-on learning program to students

The STEM Innovation Center at Centennial Middle School was the place to be last Tuesday night when that school's popular program hosted Candyland Family Night. Sure it was billed a fun-filled family night with plenty of food, but the evening served to showcase the innovative program.

Centennial Middle became one of two schools in Pasco County to offer the STEM program in 2015. The other is Bayonet Point Middle on the west side of the county. The Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics program is a comprehensive model for engaging and challenging students with real-world problems to solve.

"They loved the whole Candyland theme," said Sharon Morris, one of the school's assistant principals who formerly was an administrator at Zephyrhills High. "We were rewarded when we saw the kids and their families on campus as to why we do what we do. It rejuvenated us."

School personnel, which included the 26

staff members who showed up to help with the night's activities, met earlier this week to discuss feedback from among them as well as a survey that parents responded to. Morris noted that the positive feedback has them considering another theme night to promote the STEM program at the beginning of the next academic year.

Teachers and administrators spoke highly of business and community sponsors who have stepped up to support the educational program. Among that group Keeley Karatinos, a Dade City attorney.

"I just love the STEM program," said Karatinos, who has no children but feels strongly about supporting them. "They had a need and I saw an opportunity to help them."

Incoming sixth-graders with a desire to be part of the STEM program, along with seventh-graders and eighth-graders from other schools, showed up with their families. They worked on such interactive projects as a virtual reality goggles, a laser 3-D printer, ozobots, a programmed sphere and lava.

"Everybody thinks STEM is just computer stuff, but it isn't," principal Rick Saylor said. "It's a way of thinking. We call it the STEM mindset. It's literally thinking about things like an engineer."

Currently, 628 students are enrolled in Centennial Middle's program.

Josh and Stephanie Moats brought Julian, 10, a Pasco Elementary student who plans to enroll in Centennial Middle's STEM program next fall.

"He's struggled with other things and I

think this is really going to help him because it's interactive," Josh said. "It's hands-on."

Added Stephanie, "This is a very unique school."

Another parent, Kelly Joe, described the program as "innovative and it's going to capture the kids' attention."

Jessica Freeman plans to enroll her 10-year-old son Bronx in Centennial Middle's STEM program next year. Her son currently is in the fifth grade at the newly opened Pinecrest Academy off State Road 54, just past the New River Branch Library in Wesley Chapel.

"I liked programming the sphere," Bronx said.

Scotty Carroll, the school's STEM coordinator, and Amanda Prince are learning design

coaches for the program. They touted the benefits of STEM.

"If you get kids who want to come here the environment changes," said Carroll, who formerly taught at Zephyrhills High. "You can learn to your strengths. The kids have more of an investment because they own their learning."

Carroll's work is noticed by more people than school personnel, students and their families. Karatinos, for one, is among folks who admire him for his efforts.

"His love and passion for teaching and students, and teaching them how to learn, not what to learn, is contagious. It is hard not to be on board with someone like that."

The History Channel

- On April 28, 1916, Ferruccio Lamborghini is born in Italy. After experiencing mechanical difficulties with his Ferrari, Lamborghini decided to start his own rival sports car company. The Lamborghini 350 GTV, a two-seater coupe with a V-12 engine, debuted in 1963.
- On April 29, 2004, the World War II Memorial opens in Washington, D.C., providing overdue recognition for the 16 million American men and women who served in the war.
- On April 30, 1993, computer scientist Tim Berners-Lee releases the source code for the world's first web browser. Originally called Mesh, the browser he dubbed World Wide Web became the means of exploring the emerging information network that developed into the Internet.
- On May 1, 1960, an American U-2 spy plane piloted by Francis Gary Powers disappears while on a flight over Russia. The CIA reassured the president that the plane was equipped with self-destruct mechanisms, but Russia produced not only the intact wreckage, but also the captured pilot -- very much alive.
- On May 2, 1972, Steven Spielberg begins filming "Jaws." The production, which used three mechanical sharks, enthralled audiences and grossed \$458 million in its theatrical release.
- On May 3, 1952, a ski-modified U.S. Air Force C-47 becomes the first aircraft to land on the North Pole. Aboard the flight was Dr. Albert P. Crary, an American scientist who in 1961 traveled to the South Pole by motorized vehicle, becoming the first person in history to have stood on both poles.
- On May 4, 1916, Germany responds to a demand by U.S. President Woodrow Wilson by agreeing to limit its submarine warfare. However, on Feb. 1, 1917, Germany announced the resumption of unrestricted submarine warfare, and the United States formally entered World War I.

Common triggers for headaches

Headaches can be a nuisance unlike any other. When suffering from headache, it's not uncommon for individuals to experience difficulty concentrating and many people also find it hard to sleep.

Headache is a significant issue for adults across the globe. According to the World Health Organization, as much as 4 percent of the world's adult population experiences headache on 15 or more days each month.

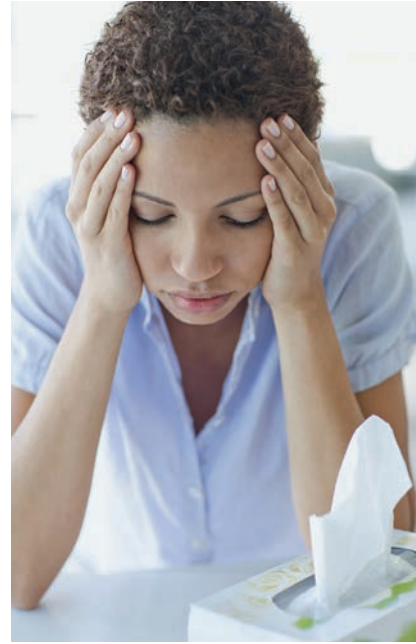
byproduct of allergies can consult with an allergist for tips on how to treat their allergies and potentially reduce the frequency of their headaches.

· **Caffeine:** Mount Sinai notes that the relationship between caffeine and headaches is complicated. Over-the-counter headache medicines commonly include caffeine because it helps the body absorb the medication more quickly, leading to faster relief. However, overstimulation from caffeine is a common headache trigger. Individuals can speak with their physicians about their caffeine consumption, including how much is too much. Limiting such consumption could reduce the frequency of headaches.

· **Smoking:** Even non-smokers can suffer from smoking-related headaches. The Cleveland Clinic reports

that nicotine, which is the primary ingredient in tobacco products, may stimulate pain-sensitive nerves as it passes through the back of the throat. That stimulation contributes to headaches in some people, including the people smoking as well as those around them who are exposed to secondhand smoke. Avoiding tobacco and urging smokers around you to quit or to avoid smoking in your presence may reduce instances of headache.

Mount Sinai notes that light sensitivity, especially high blood pressure and hormonal imbalances are some additional headache triggers. Individuals suffering from routine headaches are urged to contact their physicians.

Trio honored on Senior Night

Bulldogs recognize three seniors before 9-6 win over Fort Meade for just their second victory of the season

Last Friday's game against Fort Meade will not soon be forgotten by a trio of Zephyrhills High softball players, their families and friends. The outcome had no bearing on what will always be etched in their memories.

That's because first baseman Brooke Lea, center fielder Izabella Mathis and pitcher Amberlynn Davis were recognized on the team's Senior Night. They are the only seniors on a roster predominantly filled with underclassmen.

The girls have not only been teammates at Zephyrhills High, but they were part of a Dade City All-Star team that placed third in a Little League state softball tournament in the summer of 2018.

"I've had them for three years, the first as an assistant," said Kristen Dumont, a former assistant now in her second season as Zephyrhills' head coach. "All three are leaders and all the girls look up to them. Brooke's our biggest leader. Her mouth goes 24/7."

Dumont meant that in a good way, noting how Lea encourages the fielders from first base and often starts chants in the dugout when the

"It really means a lot because I started with them," said Lea, alluding to going out with her two teammates she has shared so much with on several teams.

Davis said she will remember "all the ups and downs."

What Mathis will always remember is belting a home run over the left field fence to lead the Bulldogs to a 9-6 win.

"As soon as it hit the bat I could feel it," Mathis said of the first home run of her high school career. "I almost started crying because I've been in a hitting slump for so long."

On the field, so have her teammates. Zephyrhills has struggled in recent seasons and this year is no different. Before last Friday the team's lone victory came in the eighth game of the season, 9-7 over Fort Meade. Now they have two victories over the Miners.

Early on, it did not look good for Zephyrhills as Fort Meade took a 2-0 lead in the top of the first. In the bottom of the inning, however, the Bulldogs bounced back with four runs.

Hannah Helms, who legged out an infield single with one out, raced around the bases to score on Isabella Rivera's triple. Rivera raced home when the Fort Meade outfielder dropped a ball hit by Maddison Schroeder, who then scored on a double steal with Lea. Laila Woolfolk, who drew a walk, came in on a single by starter and winning pitcher Alex Bowe-Wootton.

Zephyrhills never trailed again, opening up a 9-3 lead before staving off a late comeback

bid by the Miners, who scored three in the seventh.

Senior from both teams were honored in the second Zephyrhills-Pasco game. The Pasco seniors recognized were Aliyah Zito, Laci Carter and Abigail Mofford. The Zephyrhills trio and the Pasco seniors have played together on several teams in the past.

The Bulldogs have more travel players than ever. That group includes Aria Drovandi, Rivera, Helms, Schroeder, Mathis, Woolfolk, Emily Mohler, Harmonie Scribner and Hope Tackett.

CITY COUNCIL: From Page 1

Item 4.1 was a staff report on the final plat for the Zephyr Lakes Phase 4C. Senior planner Rodney Corriveau spoke of this being the, "last plat south of Kossick Road." The project contains 37 homes and developer Hamilton Engineering is slated to build at least a portion of Dairy Road connecting to Zephyr Commons.

New council president Jodi Wilkeson made certain of Corriveau that the development was already entitled and already part of the city's calculation of water consumption.

Corriveau confirmed this and the measure passed 5-0.

Item 4.2 shared results from a fourth meeting and previous meetings to create a City of Zephyrhills Development & Disaster Resiliency Plan. The fifth and final meeting is set for May 23. This was not an action item.

Item 5.1 asked council to approve the 2nd Annual Eagles/ Acts of Kindness 'Wheels in the Hills' event for May 14. This item passed 5-0.

In the City Attorney's Report, Items 6.1 and 6.2 were pulled from the agenda, the applicant asking for a continuance to May 23. This was passed 5-0. Item 6.3 was the first reading of an ordinance dealing with conditions in the Abbott Park / Zephyr Lakes PUD Master Plan. The ordinance is designed to come in line with intersection improvements on Wire Road. A lighted intersection at Kossick and Wire roads and a round-a-bout at Pretty Pond and Wire Road could go forward if this ordinance follows unchanged through subsequent readings. This item passed 5-0.

In the Comments Section, councilman Lance Smith mentioned the efficiency of the city as opposed to larger government entities. He referenced a concerned resident who spoke at the last council meeting regarding a dead tree that was a hazard to pedestrians but on Pasco County property. The Zephyrhills Public Works Department went out, assessed the tree and removed it.

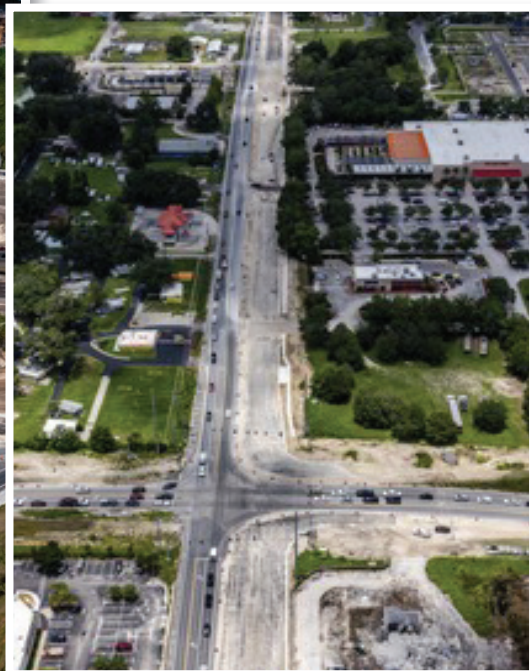

all that work that we're doing. It's been a lot of hard work along that whole corridor."

Nevertheless, the light at the end of that tunnel is lit. Arndt says that the county expects to issue a Notice to Proceed by July 1. This is somewhat fortuitous because the high school will be out of session by that time.

The next project is the widening of State Road 54 between Curley Road and Eiland Boulevard. This project is widening the existing two-lane road to a four-lane highway with medians. A sidewalk will be built on the north side of the road and a 10-foot wide multi-use trail will be built on the south side. The sidewalk and trail will run the entire length of the project. The 4.5 mile, \$42.5 million project began way back in 2017 but was one of the projects that suffered

from the D.A.B. default. Cone & Graham have taken over the project.

It consists of widening the existing two-lane road to a four-lane highway with medians. A sidewalk will be built on the north side of the road and a 10-foot wide multi-use trail will be built on the south side. The sidewalk and trail will run the entire length of the project, from east of Curley Road to east of the Morris Bridge Road/Eiland Boulevard intersection.

Watch out for closures south of SR 54 on Morris Bridge Road this week. The next major public impact will be to close the south side of this intersection (Morris Bridge Road) to reconstruct the connection to SR54. The just-scheduled plan is to close the Morris Bridge Road connection to SR54 for a few

days, weather permitting.

The last of the three is the I-75/SR56 Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI). This was another of the defaulted D.A.B. projects that is back underway. This project will reconfigure the I-75/SR56 interchange between CR54 and Cypress Ridge Boulevard in Pasco County. The existing diamond interchange will be modified and converted to a diverging diamond interchange (DDI). The main change will be to diverge (cross) SR56 traffic to the left side of the road through the interchange, and then cross vehicles back over to the right side of the road on the opposite side of the interchange. The idea is to take left-hand turns out of the intersection in order to move traffic through the area faster. It is a \$33.6 million project being undertaken by Superior Construction Company Southeast. The project began back in January of 2019 and is finally moving at a fast clip.

The transition of the interchange to the Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) is now scheduled to happen on April 30 to May 1. SR56 will be closed at I-75 from 11 p.m. Saturday, April 30 to approximately 10 a.m. or later on Sunday, May 1. A previously-scheduled attempt was rained out, so all of these details are weather-permitting. Just two interchange ramps will be open during the closure, the eastbound SR56 ramp onto southbound I-75 and the northbound I-275/ I-75 exit ramp onto eastbound SR 56.

Eastbound SR56 traffic will be detoured to the north-east on Wesley Chapel Boulevard (CR54) to SR581 (Bruce B. Downs Boulevard), then south on SR581 (Bruce B. Downs Boulevard) back to SR 56. Additionally, the right turn lanes on the south side of SR56 at Grand Cypress Boulevard onto eastbound SR56 will be closed and the left turn lanes at Grand Cypress Boulevard on the north side of SR56 will be closed to prevent travel onto east-bound SR56. The eastbound SR56 ramp onto southbound I-75 will be open; any traffic traveling on east-bound SR56 past Grand Cypress Boulevard will be forced to enter southbound I-75.

For westbound traffic during the closure, SR56 traffic wanting to cross I-75 will be directed north on SR581 (Bruce B. Downs Boulevard) to SR54, then southwest on CR54 (Wesley Chapel Boulevard) to SR56. Any westbound SR56 traffic between SR581 (Bruce B. Downs Boulevard) and Cypress Ridge Boulevard will be directed to U-Turn at Cypress Ridge Boulevard to head back east on SR56 to SR581 (Bruce B. Downs Boulevard). This is one detour drivers will definitely want to avoid.
