Zephyrhills and the outlying area continue its recent growth spurt as projects remain under way

Countless parts of Florida, ranging from municipalities to the rural fringes, have witnessed growth spurts in recent years. Count Zephyrhills and the outlying areas among those with residential and commercial developments that have the state booming in population growth.

Is Zephyrhills running out of water?

As the building boom continues, can Zephyrhills keep up with the ever-increasing demands on water use?

Is Zephyrhills running out of water? The short answer is no. The long answer is - maybe. The City of Zephyrhills is currently permitted to draw 3,308,400 gallons-per-day. The usage tabulated in 2021 was 2,503,869, leaving a cushion of 804,531 gallons-per-day (GPD). When we carve out the numbers allocated for residential use - 583,503 GPD is the expected use that includes current and "entitled" developments. "Entitled" projects are ones that have their construction plans, plats and Planned Unit Developments (PUDs) already approved.

The margins are narrowing and they are narrowing quickly. It's not time to panic but it is indeed time to start taking measures, drastic ones, to both curb current use and reduce future demand.

City council and city staff are well aware of this elephant in the room and they are working with Pasco County and the SouthWest Florida Management District (SWFMD) on solutions. City council is revising its Comprehensive Plan this year. 2022 is a golden opportunity to put some measures in place that will help avert this potential problem. Here are three things that must be accomplished in order to keep the water flowing: slow down development; reduce current water usage; and identify new water sources.



"We'll probably never catch up with Wesley Chapel because that's such a large area," he said of the unincorporated part of central Pasco extending from Zephyrhills to Land O' Lakes highlighted by thoroughfares of Interstate 75 as well as State Roads 54 and 56. "Percentage-wise, we're growing. We're becoming more diverse."

Among the top three residential developments are the Hidden River tract with 220 homes, the 550 homes being built in Zephyr Lakes and Abbott Square, with 560 homes, the latter being a combination of single-family, townhomes and villas.

Vande Berg can appreciate the variety available in Abbott Square.

"We're looking for that," he said, noting that some developments with single-family homes as the only option rules out a certain percentage of people desiring other options. "It kind of leaves out the middle people who can't afford (new single-family homes in the \$300,000-\$500,000 range)."

Two other neighboring communities are nearly built out with The Oaks and Links of Calusa totaling nearly 200 homes and bordering the Silverado Golf Course. Just across Simons Road, dormitories are going up as part of an expansion of the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis and Wellness Center.

While city and county planners did not deal much with affordable housing in Zephyrhills in the past it is coming to the forefront

more of late.

As for housing, Vande Berg noted that "most of those projects are coming to fruition."

Other projects recently opened or about to open later this spring are in the commercial sector. There is a new Ace Hardware next to the Big Lots in a shopping plaza off Allen Road. Near the intersection of Eiland and Gall boulevards, a veterans clinic and marijuana dispensary are about to open.

North on Gall Boulevard near the Walmart, work is ongoing for a large Radiant car wash and inside the Walmart there is a change for fast food. Charleys Philly Steaks has replaced McDonald's at some Walmarts, as is the case for the one in Zephyrhills.

"We are excited about this opportunity to partner with Walmart and to bring smiles to our guests with an updated and whimsical environment," said Brian Hipsher, chief marketing officer for Charleys.

Just north of the Walmart, The Hungry Greek will open soon. It is sandwiched between Game Stop and Capri Pizza & More.

Lastly, on the south side of the city, a Dollar General is under construction at the corner of Gall Boulevard and C Avenue.

While there are plenty of project still under way, not to mention the industrial corridor out by the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport, that remains in the planning stages, Zephyrhills is filling up.

"The amount of undeveloped land in the city has decreased in the last decade," Vande Berg said.



Strategies to prevent back pain

Men and women are well aware that minor aches and pains are part of aging. A balky knee that acts up on rainy days or an old sports injury that still triggers periodic discomfort may not be much to worry about, but a more serious condition such as chronic back pain can be so debilitating that it's wise for individuals to do whatever they can to avoid it or delay its arrival.

Millions of cases of chronic back pain undoubtedly go unreported. That's because many individuals accept back pain as a side effect of aging, while others lack access to health care, making it difficult to pinpoint just how prevalent chronic back pain is. However, the Global Burden of Disease Study 2017 estimated that around 577 million people across the globe experience lower back pain, or LBP.

That prevalence should not give the impression that chronic back pain is unavoidable.

In fact, various strategies can be employed to prevent back pain and all the negative consequences that come with it.

- **Be active.** The Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion notes that physical activity strengthens the back and lowers the risk for developing back pain. The ODPHP recommends individuals engage in back-strengthening and stretching exercises at least two days per week. Chiropractors or personal trainers can recommend safe back-strengthening exercises, which the Mayo Clinic notes include the bridge exercise and shoulder blade squeeze. Stretches individuals can try include the knee-to-chest stretch, the lower back rotational stretch and the cat stretch.

- **Embrace new exercise routines.** Individuals accustomed to strength training that involves dumbbells and circuit training machines should know that there are other ways to build

strength and benefit the back at the same time. For example, studies have shown the value of Pilates in increasing the strength of core muscles, including those in the lower back. In addition, the ODPHP recommends yoga to individuals who want to make their backs stronger and lower their risk for back pain. Many fitness facilities have long since recognized the value of yoga and pilates and now include each approach in their class schedules.

- **Perfect your posture.** Another way to prevent back pain is to make a concerted effort to maintain good posture. The ODPHP urges individuals to avoid slouching when standing and sitting and to stand tall with head up and shoulders back. When sitting, sit with back straight against the back of the chair and feet flat on the floor. If possible, keep knees slightly higher than hips when sitting. Alternate between sitting and standing to avoid being in the same position for too long.

- **Lift correctly.** Poor technique when lifting things, even items that are not excessively heavy, can contribute to back pain. When lifting items, do so with the legs and not the back. The ODPHP urges individuals to keep their backs straight and bend at the knees or hips when lifting items. Avoid lifting especially heavy items without assistance.

Despite its prevalence, back pain is not a given. Individuals can keep various strategies in mind to avoid joining the hundreds of millions of people across the globe who suffer from back pain every day.



Founded in 2018 and disbanded two years later due to the coronavirus pandemic, the Spirit of Zephyrhills was revived in 2021. Chamber recognize to local service organizations and scholarships

The Greater Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce recognized local youth groups, civic clubs, volunteers, sponsors and more at the annual Pigz Pay it Forward Dinner. More than 100 attended the dinner held at Alice Hall Community Center. The chamber hosts this dinner every year to recognize volunteers and sponsors for their contribution to the chamber's signature event, Pigz in Z'Hills BBQ & Blues Fest.

Attendance at this year's event held March 4-5 at the Zephyrhills Airport Venue, was counted just over 4,000. "An event this size doesn't just happen," said Melonie Monson, executive director. Let's break them down. Slow down development

Pasco County issued a moratorium on multi-family building applications in District 2 (basically Wesley Chapel and Land O' Lakes, between U.S. 41 and I-75 and between S.R. 54 and S.R. 52) last year and then summarily passed a 185-day extension, pushing it to April 1, 2022. The dreaded "M" word has been uttered at city council meetings but council members universally are not ready to drop that heavy hand; at least not at the moment. Terms like, "pump the brakes" and "pause" are however, becoming part of the regular vernacular on the dias.

The tidal wave is not just on its way, it's already here. Statistics floated at the recent water workshop in March, statistics issued by the Shimberg Center - a housing research group, part of the University of Florida, stated that 1,000 people move to Florida every day. By the year 2030 - 2.5-million people will move to Florida. 5,000 residents are expected to move to Zephyrhills by the year 2035. Zephyrhills will need 2,432 new housing units to accommodate this. Zephyrhills already has 2,334 units "entitled," most on the north side of the city. The problem isn't here yet, but it's coming.

Two developments that came up at the last city council meeting, asking for zoning and conditional use changes, met skepticism and concern from council members, even though they were non-action items. These items will come up again at the next meeting and council will have to make a very difficult decision whether or not to approve the changes.

What can the average citizen do about it? Talk to your council members. They know what's going on and will almost surely appreciate your constructive input. Come to city council meetings. See for yourself. These are difficult decisions that are nuanced and require context. Only seeing them unfold in-person can give residents a clear picture of what's happening.

Reduce current water usage

Another statistic floated at the recent water workshop was that residential units average 250 gallons per day of water use. As much as 50 percent of this is used for "irrigation" purposes; the primary culprit being lawns. Sprawling lawns of installed Saint Augustine grass might need to become a thing of the past. Saint Augustine grass requires twice the amount of water that Bermuda grass requires in cooler months and as much as four times the amount of water in hotter months. Saint Augustine grass also requires more frequent fertilization and cannot be re-seeded. While both are suited to southern climates, you might start to see changes in the city's 2022 Comprehensive Plan that reflect this concept. Artificial grass might start wedging its way into city code, particularly for larger developments with smaller yards.

There are other ways to reduce residential usage. Turning the tap off when you brush your teeth or taking shorter showers are baby steps but if we take those steps collectively, we

can make a larger dent in overall usage. This is something we can all work on together. Low-hanging fruit is cutting off your sprinklers when it rains or fixing broken sprinkler heads quickly. Replacing your Saint Augustine lawn with Bermuda grass or zero-scaping (a no-grass landscape concept) might be tall tasks for the average resident but they are options to consider. They are options that could creep into code for future developments, for certain. These ideas are on city council's mind.

Councilman Lance Smith, at the last meeting, stated that he uses 2,000 gallons-per-week on his lawn and resolved to do something about it.

"We've got to change our mindset on that (watering lawns)," Smith said. "And we can use the LDC (Land Development Code) as a way to think about that. I am personally going to do something about my (water) use."

Business and industrial use of water is yet another elephant in the room. At the water workshop, Zephyrhills Planning Director Todd Vande Berg stated that a car wash can use up to 11,000 gallons of water per day. Again, watch for changes in the Comprehensive Plan and LDC.

Identify new water sources

This concept was discussed at the last water workshop. Zephyrhills Utilities Director John Bostic sees the writing on the wall.

"At some point, we are going to have to look at alternative water supply," Bostic said.

Zephyrhills draws from a protected water basin. Thus, increased draws from current use have to be approved by SWFMD and SWFMD is not an organization that acts quickly. Alternatives like drawing water from the Floridan Aquifer, using the Sunburst Interconnect, drilling additional wells and using water from Tampa Bay Water - a non-profit, special district of the State of Florida wholesale drinking water supplier serving Hillsborough, Pasco and Pinellas counties, are options that the city can pursue.

Bostic was not an advocate of the latter option as Tampa Bay Water uses a different chlorination process as the city. This would mean retro-fitting a lot of the piping that already exists in the city's municipal system. One or all of these options should be on the table as city council seeks to head this potential problem off.

Another option is increasing the use of reclaimed water. Reclaimed water is already being used in the city and the infrastructure to move it around is growing. Watch for the use of reclaimed water entering into code and comp plans.

In summary, the water situation is not critical...yet. However, it will be unless steps are taken now. City council and city staff are powerfully aware but this needs to be a community, rather a city-wide effort. It can be accomplished if we all engage and work together on it. Come to meetings, engage with your city council members, do what you can at your home or business. The City of Zephyrhills can continue to be The City of Pure Water into the future but it's going to have to be a team effort.

Easter Wishes

8 tips for dyeing Easter eggs

Coloring eggs is a beloved Easter tradition. Eggs long have been symbols of fertility and rebirth, making them fitting icons for spring.

One story links eggs to Easter as well. According to some religious scholars, Mary Magdalene, the woman who was the first person to see Jesus Christ after His resurrection, was holding a plain egg in her hand while waiting for the emperor to share the good news. The emperor then told her that Jesus' resurrection was as improbable as that egg suddenly blushing. The egg then turned red.

Dyeing eggs is an entertaining activity, but one that also may have some religious significance. Many families will color eggs this Easter, and these guidelines can make the process go smoothly.

• Wait until just before coloring to hard-boil eggs. Good Housekeeping recommends boiling eggs for 11 minutes for a hard boil. Do not chill the eggs afterward; warm eggs absorb color more effectively for more vivid results.

• Egg dye can stain furniture, clothing or tablecloths. Therefore, dress in clothing that you're not worried about staining. Also, cover work surfaces with an old tablecloth and newspapers to soak up any spills.

• Make a drying rack to ensure that eggs will dry evenly. This can be a rimmed cookie sheet lined with layers of paper towels to absorb any excess dye that runs off the eggs. Or push pins into thick foam board and place the eggs on top to allow air to circulate.

- Consider using glass bowls or ceramic mugs to house the colored dye solutions. These vessels are more sturdy than plastic cups, and less likely to be overturned by eager young hands.
- Scissor-style tongs are ideal tools for retrieving eggs from the dye. Eggs tend to slide off of the spoons or wire rings provided in kits, leading to splashing and kids dunking their fingers in to grab eggs.
- Stir dyeing cups often to guarantee consistent color.
- Use electrical tape to make patterns on Easter eggs. Dip the eggs and let dry. Afterwards, remove the tape to reveal the designs.
- If food coloring-based dyes seem too

messy, use watercolor paint sets and allow everyone to get creative.
 While some people may want to use Easter eggs for recipes later on, it may be safer to boil up a fresh batch of eggs for that purpose, even if it seems wasteful. According to Emily Rubin, RD, LDN of the Thomas Jefferson University Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology, "hard-boiled eggs should be refrigerated within two hours of cooking and discarded if left out for more than two hours at room temperature." Chances are it may take two hours or more for children to find hard-boiled eggs hidden by the Easter bunny.



Despite a 7-0 loss to Land O' Lakes, the resurgent Bulldogs head into district play with four wins

worse last year when they were a dismal 1-10-1.

There is a resurgence this year and despite Monday's 7-0 loss to a Land O' Lakes team that improved to 11-1, Zephyrhills is vastly improved and sports a respectable 4-6 record. "We play every Pasco County school. Land O' Lakes is probably the second strongest team we'll play all year," said third-year coach John Soellner, who also coaches boys soccer at Zephyrhills.

The strongest would be perennial state

contender Wiregrass Ranch, but Zephyrhills is in Class 2A, District 10 while the Bulls are in another district. The Bulldogs are gearing up for the district tournament that begins next Monday at McKeel Academy in Lakeland and includes neighboring rivals Wesley Chapel and Cypress Creek.

While Zephyrhills lost five singles and two doubles matches against the Gators earlier this week, the team did get solid play from its No. 2 doubles team. That pairing of sophomore Billie Boyd and freshman Joel Torres extended Land O' Lakes' Ryan O'Connor and Krishna Chundi to extra play in a 9-7 loss.

Boyd and Torres, who at 4-0 had been unbeaten in No.2 doubles before the Land O' Lakes match, are the nucleus of a young team on the rise. Aside from senior David Castro and junior Shawn McGinley, the top two singles and doubles players, the Bulldogs have young upstarts in freshmen Jonah Whalen, Joseph Soellner, the coach's son, and Bradley Berman.

"We're young and our 3, 4 and 5 (singles players) all have winning records," the coach said. "We're adequate this year and we should just keep getting better."

The lineup is also much deeper this season with nine players. That compares favorably to last season when at times the Bulldogs only had four players show up for matches, which forced them to forfeit several times at No. 5 singles.

The mindset of the players also is better collectively. Castro, who as a sophomore was slotted seventh in the lineup, moved up to No. 2 last year and this season plays at No. 1, is the team leader. Aside

from being Zephyrhills' best player he is encouraging with his teammates and puts losses against other team's top players in proper perspective.

"I definitely put him up as one of the better players I've gone against," he said after an 8-0 loss to Land O' Lakes' Neil Patil. "Even though he had one of the strongest serves, I was able to return it. Really, this game was kind of a showcase of where I've come from compared to the start of the year."

Castro, who has taken additional instructions at the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis Center, credits that with his improvements on the court. He also noted how much it helps when he spends time working with younger players in and SVB program for Stewart Middle School tennis players.

"It was rough last year, but I started going to SVB and that's really propelled me," Castro said, adding that by working with younger players at the middle school "I was able to learn the game while teaching the game to young students."

Meanwhile, the girls team did not play on Monday, but showed up for team photos. They will also play in next week's district tournament in Lakeland.
