The two equine-based non-profits have forged a promising partnership

It started with a phone call in February, 2010. Beverly Levitt was not too far removed from a bout with cancer and had only recently lost her husband Daniel to lingering effects from exposure to Agent Orange in Vietnam. She'd been forced to give up a long-time passion:

"I had to give up the horses," Levitt said. "I was busy working and my life changed when my husband died."

Yet, on that fateful February, Levitt could have no idea she was about to get back into the saddle. Her son, Travis, was working a remodeling job and the property

owner had some horses, they said wanted some pasture

"I'm not one to turn down any horses that need grass," Levitt said.

And so the conversation went that the property owner had six horses she was looking to board or just share grazing pasture. It sounded pretty innocuous at first. Then, six months later, they setup the meeting. The property owner brought just three horses the night before the prescribed meeting day.

"Even in the dark, I could tell they were in bad shape," Levitt said.

The next morning, the property owner brought eight more horses.

"She brought one bin of feed and one bail of hay for all 11 animals," Levitt said. "They (horses) were in horrid condition. One horse, Moonlight, was so thin you could count every bone. She was leaning on the gate, barely alive."

Mask ban lifted in Pasco County

Schools, courthouses and hospitals retain mask requirements despite executive order from county administrator

A mandate to wear face coverings in Pasco County, initiated in June of 2020 as an effort to combat spreading the coronavirus, has been rescinded somewhat but not completely.

On April 5, an executive order from the Pasco County Administrator's office came down declaring masks would no longer be required. The order was due, in part, to lower COVID-19 hospitalization rates and a recent increase in vaccinations against the virus.

Among county residents 65 and older, 70 percent have been vaccinated with an additional 57 percent of 50 and older receiving at least one dose of the vaccine. Now, all state residents are eligible for vaccination shots at such places as retail pharmacies, hospitals and doctor's offices.

Nonetheless, wearing masks, maintaining social distancing and frequent hand-washing are recommended until further notice. The county also recommends wearing masks indoors.

"Increasingly, Pasco County residents are getting vaccinated and we're seeing fewer people with severe COVID-19 symptoms in area hospitals," said Dan Biles, the county's administrator. "It's the right time to relax the face covering requirement in Pasco County."

Biles noted that while the mask mandate has been lifted, certain companies or locales have the option of deciding policy at their own

"Local businesses have the authority to require customers to wear face masks," he said, adding, "The county supports the continued

efforts to reduce the spread of the virus."

Not everyone, however, is on board with lifting the face covering ban. Masks remain required on public transportation, in county schools and at the main courthouses in Dade City and New Port Richey. There are other locales as well, such as hospitals and other busi-

For now, schools at every grade level in the county still require masks to be worn on

reaching out to the terminally ill. Levitt remembers Roger Kennedy and how her rescue "Moe" took a 'Moe had been through a lot," Levitt said. "But when Roger would come up on his electric scooter, they'd be waiting at the fence for him. Moe would follow him to the playground. It extended his (Kennedy's) life and when he finally did pass, it took Moe a month to get over it."

Time marched on. Levitt would end up losing her son and then took full custody of Alexis. Eight Hundred horses would come in and be adopted out until 2021. Moonlight, now 29 years old, is still around and Healing Horses was discovered by the Pasco Sheriff's Mounted Posse, also a non-profit en-

"I joined the posse about two-and-half years ago and we were already donating to Healing Horses," president of Pasco Sheriff's Mounted Posse Petra Squires said. "I'm a horse owner myself, two rescues, so I was naturally drawn to Healing Horses."

Pasco Sheriff's Mounted Posse VP Marnie Bennett is also a horse owner.

"We were looking for worthy causes to support and we found one," Bennett said.

The mounted posse donates to other non-prof-

its like Hospice and works parking coordination at public events to raise funds. They have a special place in their hearts and pocketbooks for a place like Healing

Horses.
"They (mounted posse) actually care," Levitt said. "What they do for people like us is just amazing."

There are always needs at Healing Horses. The population swells and contracts as rescues come in and adoptees go out. Development around the property and tree damage from Hurricane Irma in 2017 felled several pine trees on the property, taking large sections of fence down with them. Levitt is currently working on

a new section of fence, taken out by a 140-foot pine tree, that would open up another section of her property to equine activity. That's where the mounted posse comes in. With rolls of wire fence and pressuretreated posts already laying about, the mounted posse issued Levitt and Healing Horses a check to help with the labor costs of installing the fence.

"What we do and what Healing Horses does are directly related," Squires said. "And we try to donate to the underdogs.'

The lady never came back and Levitt called the Pasco Sheriff's Office to report the abuse. No arrests were made and no charges filed. The horses were, after all, now in the care of Levitt. However, the call would plant the seed of a support network that has sustained Healing Horses for the last 11 years. Veterinarian Steve Miller with Blue Skies Equine helped Levitt nurse the horses back to health. Mystic Acres in Brooksville helped when Levitt couldn't take in

any more abused or neglected horses. It would not be long before benefactors, Dr. Wendy Rice and Helen Rich, emerged and helped Levitt start a non-profit and connect to funding sources. The notion to use the rescues as therapy horses came about as Levitt was caring for her granddaughter Alexis, who is severely handicapped. A phone call with Dr. Rice ended with Rice saying, "You're going to use them for kids, aren't you?" The notion was already fixed in Levitt's mind. She began to bring in special needs children to bond with and also care for the rescued horses. That expanded into teens looking for community service hours for Bright Futures scholarships. That expanded into Healing Horses



Pasco Parks 2021 Summer Day Camp is June 14-July 30, 9a.m.-5:30 p.m. for children ages 5-13 and children ages 7-13 at Jay B. Starkey Nature Center.

campuses and in district offices. That goes for students, staff and visitors alike.

Pasco School Superintendent Kurt Browning, who last year had his own bout with COVID-19, wasted little time in responding to the ease of restrictions by the county administrator by recording a video pasted on the school board's web site.

"I cannot in good conscience abandon our health and safety protocols at this time," he said in a press release from the school board offices. "Our protocols have helped to prevent, and certainly reduce, the spread of COVID-19 among our students and

The authority of Pasco Schools to require masks is dependent on whether or not Governor DeSantis' Executive Order is extended beyond the expiration date of April 26. If the Executive Order is not extended, the district will have no choice but to make masks optional.

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention continues to recommend wearing of masks in schools as Florida remains under an emergency order until April 26. That order could be extended by Governor Ron DeSantis, who for the most part has supported business openings and in-school teaching during the pandemic while promoting a seniors first agenda for the vaccine

Steve Hegarty, a school district spokesman, reported that positive cases of COVID-19 among students and staff decreased significantly since January. There was, however, an increase in March, likely related to spring break. Still, he noted the increases were below the number of positive cases reported earlier this

As for the AdventHealth hospitals in Zephyrhills, Dade City and Wesley Chapel, masks and social distancing will remain in affect for now.

"Wearing a mask is one of the most selfless acts you can do to protect yourself and others in public," said Robin McGuinness, senior executive officer of patient outcomes for AdventHealth's West Florida Division. "We encourage everyone to get vaccinated if they are eligible and to continue to social distance, cover their mouths and nose and sanitize hands frequently to lower the number of people contracting COVID-19."

Sgt. Michael Smith, who along with Sgt. Jimmy Mcauley oversees the JROTC program at Zephyrhills, expressed pride in talking about the cadets' most recent community effort. In Smith's assessment, the cadets continue to go above and beyond.

"I'm always surprised by the kids," he said. "They're starting to learn that they want to give back to the troops who served, not just the ones you see walking around in uniform but the ones that people have forgotten."

Notably, Smith added, men and women who served in Korea and Vietnam. While

Smith did not serve his country in those or any other wars he did spend served 20 years in the U.S. Army as an engineer and recruiter before coming to Zephyrhills to head up the JROTC program.

Smith and Mcauley were initially contacted by hospice worker Julie Sanchez, a volunteer manager at Seasons Hospice & Palliative Care, to be part of the March 29 event. The JROTC cadets were among hundreds of community members coming together for a joint thank you to veterans at the Land O' Lakes nursing home.

"The Crusaders do volunteer work in the community," Smith said of the branch of JROTC cadets that took part in the letter writing and video. "They wrote letters (to the veterans) and gave them Bulldog (drinking) glasses.'

In recent weeks, Sanchez also collected gifts such as 150 hand-sewn bears, dozens of hand-painted crafts and thank-you videos from community members.

Dawn Bergamo, assistant activity director at Baldomero Lopez Memorial, noted that the letter writing and video could not have come at a better time for the veterans.

> 'It means a lot, because during the coronavirus pandemic we had to do a lot of one-onones," she said of limited contact with others from the outside. "Now, little by little, we're getting back to normal."

> Like the residents and nursing home staff, the kind gesture from the JROTC students was not lost on Marlies Sarrett, administrator of the facility that was established in 1999 and lists nearly 100 residents.

> "This was a great opportunity to have our community support our veterans locally," she said. "It brightens their day."
