City council approves purchasing agreement, gets Economic Development update

Monday's city council meeting got a ZEDC update among other business

The six items in the Consent Agenda were bundled together and passed 5-0. Item 1.1 approved minutes from the April 11 meeting. Item 1.2 approved minutes from the April 18 special meeting and Item 1.3 approved minutes from the April 25 meeting. Item 1.4 approved bringing on new Parks and Recreation Board Member Lily Mohler.

Item 1.5 formally adopted the City of Zephyrhills Economic Development & Disaster Resiliency Plan drafted by Kimley-Horn. The city secured a grant from the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) through the Competitive Florida Partnership (CFP) Program to create an Economic Development and Resiliency Plan. The city retained Kimley-Horn to facilitate the CFP process. The process included a Community Inventory, community meetings with Zephyrhills residents, city staff, DEO staff, and representatives from Florida Department of Transportation and Florida Department of State Historical Resources. After two community meetings, Kimley-Horn created a survey specific to the conversations had during those meetings. The survey's purpose was to capture various demographics of the community residents to better understand and identify ways to meet the community's needs.

Item 1.6 approved a Cooperative Purchasing Interlocal Agreement with The National Cooperative Purchasing Alliance. The NCPA has set up a number of Master Agreements to provide goods, products and services based upon

Memorial service pays tribute to fallen law enforcement officers

Somber ceremony takes place on the footsteps of the old historic courthouse in Dade City

Law enforcement personnel, their families and supporters gathered for a somber ceremony last Friday at the steps of the old historical courthouse in Dade City. They were there for the 2022 Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Service.

In a longstanding tradition that began in 2005, representatives from the Pasco Sheriff's Office, as well as police departments in the county's other municipalities of Zephyrhills, Dade City, New Port Richey and Port Richey, were on hand to laud fallen officers for their dedication and sacrifice.

They are never to be forgotten. Reggie Roberts, formerly a Zephyrhills Police Captain who now is an inspector of community and talent development for the Pasco Sheriff's Office, was the master of ceremony. He opened the service with some heartfelt words and later concluded it



national volumes. The competitive solicitation and selection process required that suppliers allow Participating Public Agencies to purchase goods, products and services on the same terms, conditions and pricing. Purchases through this program shall be deemed to meet the cities competitive purchasing requirements. There are over 380 local governments with NCPA including Pasco County, Hillsborough County, Dade City, New Port Richey and Temple Terrace. This agreement will provide cost benefits based on the volume of goods purchased.

Only one item was in the Business Items, that of Item 2.1 which was an amendment to ordinance conditions affiliated with the Abbott Park/Zephyr Lakes Planned Unit Development Master Plan. City staff has been working through the Duke transmission pole issue with Metro and their representative - Attorney Clarke Hobby. Conditions have been drafted in an amended ordinance to outline the agreement between the City of Zephyrhills and Metro. The conditions confirm Metro's commitment to connect Kossik Rd to Wire Road. In lieu of designing and constructing lanes 3 and 4 the conditions provide the financial contributions that will be made to the city by Metro and foregoing \$59,000 worth of transportation impact fee credits.

Metro is also in agreement to design and permit a roundabout at the intersection at Pretty Pond and Wire Road. The skinny is that Kossick Road, originally designed as a 4-lane road, will now just be a 2-lane road. This allows the project to now move forward, as the 2-lane road will not encounter the transmission pole. It does not settle the issue of the transmission pole but it gets the project started. There is also a plan for a round-a-bout at Pretty Pond and Wire roads.

In the City Manager's Report, Item 3.1 brought in Dr. Randy Stovall to give an update on the Zephyrhills Economic Development Council (ZEDC). The ZEDC brought news of a technical high school coming to east Pasco County, as well as the likelihood of a vocational training school.

Stovall shared some statistics about the job market: 1.5 million people quit their jobs in 2021, that there are two jobs for every unemployed person and that one of the biggest challenges to businesses in the city is finding and retaining employees.

The ZEDC formed a new non-profit called the East Pasco Chamber Foundation. It will handle fundraisers and the extant Citizen of the Month Program.

In the Comments Section, a surprise presentation, JROTC cadets, Lieutenant Colonel Parker Stuckey and Sergeant Major Austin Lewis presented Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield and the council a plaque acknowledging the city's help with civic projects the JROTC participates in.

Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. announced that the city's summer program is on for 2022. It will run from May 31 to July 7 and is filling up quickly. Poe stated that 90 of the 120 spots were full as of Monday afternoon.

In Noted Items, the city entered into a consulting agreement with Pamela Wood Municipal Software Solutions in order to provide on site consulting services on an as needed basis which will include analyzing current Tyler Munis procedures, training staff on current Tyler Munis procedures as well as any new functionality, documenting current Tyler Munis procedures and outlining when new practices may be warranted. The terms of contract were awarded at \$125/hour, up to 160 hours.





Important reasons to visit a primary care physician

It is vital to make personal health a priority. Despite that widely accepted truth, far too often people delay trips to see their doctors. The coronavirus pandemic only compounded this issue.

An April 2020 report from Modern Health-care found roughly one in three Americans delayed medical care as they coped with the financial loss and stress caused by COVID-19. A report from CTV indicated Canadian cancer diagnoses were down 16 percent from 2018 to 2020 due to closed facilities or fear of getting COVID-19 from medical offices.

Concerns about the pandemic are not the only reasons individuals may skip doctor visits. Some avoid going to the doctor due to fear of the unknown. Dr. Barbara Cox, a psychologist based in San Diego, told NBC News that it's common to feel reticent and anxious about

going to the doctor. Around 3 percent of the population actually suffers from iatrophobia, the medical name for fear of doctors. Most just worry about getting bad news.

A refresher course on the benefits of visiting a primary care doctor may compel millions to schedule appointments and get back on top of their overall health.

Chronic disease management: An individual with a chronic disease, such as kidney disease, diabetes or hypertension, should consult with a doctor about the ideal frequency of visits and to coordinate medication and testing with specialists.

Vaccines and shots: Primary care providers (PCPs) offer routine vaccinations and can ensure that individuals are up-to-date on the immunizations they need to stay safe. Tetanus, diphtheria, shingles, pertussis, flu, and now

COVID-19 vaccines are vital to overall health.

Medical referrals: A PCP can assess a health situation and refer a patient to the correct specialist if more extensive care is needed. However, many chronic conditions can be monitored and addressed by a PCP.

Cancer screenings: UW Medicine, which specializes in patient care, research and physician training in Seattle, says most people will need a few cancer screenings as they age, including colonoscopies, Pap smears, mammograms, and other important diagnostic tests for cancer. PCPs are usually the first line of defense against cancer and can ensure patients receive the screenings they need.

Non-life-threatening illnesses or injuries: Unless a situation is life-threatening or severe, thereby warranting a trip to the emergency room, most people can visit their PCPs for help treating a variety of conditions. When in doubt, individuals should first consult with their general practitioners about the right course of treatment.

Routine lab work: Blood and urine tests often are part of annual well visit checks. Many PCP offices have phlebotomists on staff so that lab work can be conducted in the convenience

of one place and then sent out for testing.

Work or sports physicals: Certain employers require physical examinations, as do schools and recreational sports leagues. PCP offices are the place to go for these types of examinations, which are generally recommended annually.

Primary care physicians are often the first people to turn to for a bevy of health and wellness needs.



with a stirring rendition of the song, "Proud to be an American."

"We must continue to remember the fallen law enforcement officers and the survivors they've left behind," he said. "Thank you for honoring all our heroes."

Another local representative was among those who spoke reflectively during the service. State Senator Danny Burgess, a Zephyrhills High graduate who once was the city's youngest-ever mayor, led a handful of significant

speakers. "These moments invoke some passion and some thought," he said. "Today, we remember their names, we honor their stories and we commend their service."

Burgess recalled the story of Pasco Deputy Sheldon Nicks, who was fatally shot as he accompanied his father Henry Nicks, then the town marshal of Fivay, to serve a warrant.

Burgess noted that Nicks, along with other fallen officers, "were putting others first and the community above self."

In 2021, 604 law enforcement officers perished in the line of duty nationwide. That includes Pasco Deputy Raymond O'Williamson, who died from complications after contracting Covid-19.

"It's just sad to see his plaque up here," said Pasco Sheriff Chris Nocco, who espoused the importance of faith and staying united to get through trying times.

The annual memorial service always has taken place at Dade City's courthouse. The significance of that location stems from federal prohibition agent John Waters and Pasco constable Arthur Crenshaw being shot and killed while investigating illegal stills.

The service for those heroic officers brought the late J. Edgar Hoover, the first director for the Federal Bureau of Investigation, to Dade City.

Another tragedy that hit close to home was the deadly shooting of Pasco Lt. Charles "Bo" Harrison while on surveillance near a nightclub in Lacombe.

Those fallen officers were memorialized by nine plaques on two tables at the footsteps of the courthouse with a large symbolic wreath in between.

"My only prayer is that there never will be another plaque on these tables as long as all of us are here," said State Senator Ed Hooper, filling in for State Senator President Wilton Simpson who was called away by the governor.

Other tributes during the annual memorial service included the national anthem, sung by Pasco Sheriff's Cpl. Jamie Garcia, taps and "Amazing Grace" played on the bagpipes by Tampa Airport Police Officer Beth Baucom.

Additional parts of the event were a three-volley salute, taps, a riderless horse, flyover and end of watch radio message. Rev. Clyde Carter of Friendship Baptist Church gave the invocation and Rev. Mike Moore of Grace Family Church delivered the benediction.

Words on the back of a program for the service put it into proper perspective: It is not how these officers died that made them heroes, it is how they lived.





HOLLYWOOD -- Ben Affleck is directing and starring with Matt Damon in an untitled film for Amazon in which Damon plays a salesman for a fledgling shoe company named ... Nike. Affleck's psychological thriller, "Deep Water," with Ana de Armas, dropped in March, and his "The Flash" film is due in June 2023. Damon is upcoming in "Thor: Love and Thunder" and in Christopher Nolan's "Oppenheimer" (father of the atomic bomb).

Affleck, a two-time Oscar winner, holds on to long-time relationships. He and Jennifer Lopez first connected in 2002 on "Gigli." She filed for divorce from Cris Judd that July and by November they were engaged. She was even willing to become Jennifer Affleck! Just days prior to the 2003 wedding, it was called off. In June 2004, Lopez wed Marc Anthony, and Affleck coupled with and married Jennifer Garner the following year.

Flash forward to April 2022, when they officially became re-engaged. Affleck popped the question while she was in a bubble bath, and they went house hunting in the exclusive Holmby Hills community. For her 52nd birthday, they hid away on a yacht just off the beach from Monaco. Can Jennifer make it this time, or will they call it off again?

In 1959, Billy Wilder's "Some Like It Hot" premiered with Tony Curtis and Jack Lemmon as musicians forced to flee Chicago after witnessing the St. Valentine's Day Massacre. Disguised in drag, they joined an all-girl band headed to Florida. Their lead singer was Marilyn Monroe (aka Sugar "Kane" Kowalczyk). The film cost \$2.9 million to shoot and grossed \$49 million (about \$480 million today).

In 1972, songwriter Jule Styne ("Gypsy" and "Funny Girl") and lyricist Bob Merrill ("Carnival" and "Funny Girl") wrote the music and lyrics for "Sugar," the Broadway musical of "Some Like It Hot," starring the late Robert Morse (in the Tony Curtis role), Tony Roberts (in the Jack Lemmon role) and Elaine Joyce (in the Marilyn Monroe role). It ran 505 performances. In 2002-03, Tony Curtis toured in a national company of "Sugar" (as Osgood Fielding III, the man romantically pursuing Jack Lemmon's character), which they called "Some Like It Hot: The Musical."

On Dec. 11, a new "Some Like It Hot: The Musical" will open on Broadway with a score by Marc Shaiman ("Hairspray"), and a book by Tony-winner Matthew Lopez and "Late Night with Seth Meyers" staff writer/performer Amber Ruffin (with a show on Peacock). Here's the twist: While Broadway actor Christian Borle of the TV series "Smash" will play the Tony Curtis role, both the Jack Lemmon and Marilyn Monroe roles will be played by people of color, J. Harrison Ghee and Adrian-na Hicks. If audiences don't warm up to this "Hot," they can't blame it on the weather.
