The 2021 Pasco Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Service at the Dade City Historic Courthouse brought out families and supporters

After a one-year hiatus due to the coronavirus pandemic, a longstanding tradition of honoring those who lost their lives in the line of duty returned to Pasco County. Last Friday, the 2021 Pasco Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Service took place on the front steps of the Dade City Historic Courthouse.

Kevin Doll, public records director for the Pasco Sheriff's Office, served as the master of ceremonies. He noted that 359 U.S. law enforcement officers died in the line of duty in 2020.

"It is of the utmost importance that we never forget these men and women and their families," he said.

On hand to remember eight fallen officers were representatives of the Pasco and Hernando Sheriff's Offices, police from Zephyrhills, Dade City, New Port Richey, Port Richey and Tarpon Springs, as well as members of the Florida Highway Patrol.

The following officers were recognized for giving their lives in the line of duty — Pasco Deputy Sheldon S. Nicks, Prohibition Agent John Van Waters, Pasco Constable Arthur Fleece Crenshaw, Pasco Deputy William Henry O'Berry, Pasco Deputy John Herbert McCabe, Florida Highway Patrol Trooper James Bradford Crooks, Pasco Deputy Charles "Bo" Harrison and Hernando Deputy John Charles Mecklenburg.

The event, which coincided with National Police Week, began with the ceremonial presentation of a large wreath marking the embodiment of fallen officers. Reggie Roberts, a captain in the Zephyrhills Police Department, sang the national anthem. He later sang a stirring rendition of Amazing Grace.

A Look Back ... MAY 13, 1976

New series harkens back to days gone by. Let's look at the above date

This week's nostalgic article, the second in our series, harkens back all the way to May 20, 1971. So enjoy A Look Back to a time in Zephyrhills, specifically 50 years ago.

As was the case in our first installment, we take a look at the news of the day. In addition to the news, which targets Zephyrhills and the outlying east Pasco area, you will discover the costs of some goods and services. As always, the local weekly newspaper has always had a place for club and park news.

A banner headline in the May 20, 1971 edition revealed just how dangerous it can sometimes be living in a rural area: Rattlesnake Alarm Sounded In Area Of City.

That story let folks in the southeast quarter of the city to be on the lookout for the venomous serpents. "Not the common ground rattler variety, but the big, mean and dangerous diamondback kind," from an excerpt. Snake hunters were called in to search out a den. City Police Chief W.R. Eiland contacted the San Antonio Jaycees, who each July conducted rattlesnake roundups.

In another story that many people in Zephyrhills can relate to nowadays, rain flooded several areas including a downtown portion. The city was reported to have the most rain in the state — 7.05 inches — from one particular storm. In a front page photo several men attempted to push a Mercedes out of water and a wrecker from Chitwood Chevrolet was called in.

Speaking of Chitwood Chevrolet, a full page advertisement appeared on page 3. The car dealership, located back then at 301 Gall Blvd., showed 16 employees with their job titles in the ad. Joie Chitwood, king of the thrill show auto daredevil business, had recently purchased the dealership previously owned by the Reutimann family for 57 years.

In a news story that literally came to the front door of *The Zephyrhills News*, a car was stolen from the parking lot behind the building and found abandoned along U.S. 301, just north of the Hillsborough River Bridge.

In other news on the front, a new state bank was rumored to have its sites on replacing Hotel Zephyr, the Zephyrhills Democratic Club met to discuss a presidential primary and a story previewed an intra-squad Zephyrhills High football game to symbolize the end of spring drills.

On the inside pages, Diana Hayward was hired as the new radio dispatcher for the

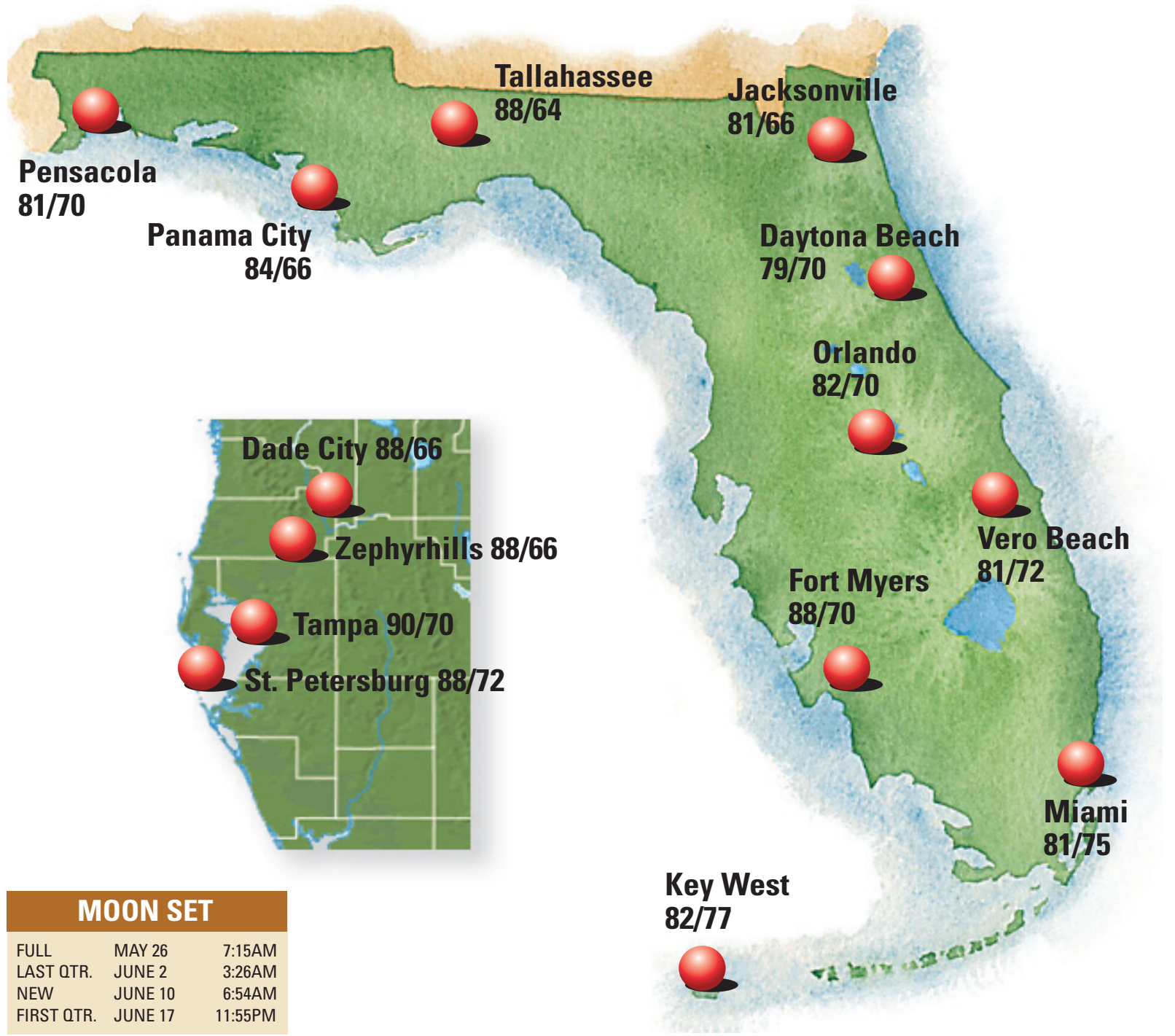

Zephyrhills Police Department, talented teens displayed their skills in the annual spotlight on talent and new restrictions were placed on the use of school buses. The Pasco County School Board policy changed to eliminate usage by outside clubs such as Girl Scouts and 4-H.

In club news, the Zephyrhills Garden Club installed new officers, the Women's Club of Zephyrhills had its last luncheon of the season and Nettie Leonard wrote a column for the Tourist Club.

There was a public discussion piece on the merits of an East Pasco County Race Track and Recreational Complex with plans to build on the outskirts of Dade City. There also was the usual church calendar with several church advertisements.

As for prices of the day,

Geiger's Feed-Seed Garden Supplies offered specials like a 50-pound bag of Purina Dog Chow for \$5.79, 100 pounds of Cattle Mineral Salt for \$1 and 2 cubic feet of pecan. Scotty's had lawn sprinklers ranging from 77 cents-\$4.95 and screen doors for \$9.99.

Groceries at Thriftway in Zephyrhills featured a half gallon of ice cream for 58 cents, a five-pound bag of sugar for 49 cents and chuck steak at 74 cents a pound. The Valley View Restaurant promoted a \$1.25 Sunday Special.

Additionally, the classifieds were full of rentals, merchandise and services, help wanted and travel opportunities. Plus, Jim Glosson Mobile Home Sales listed some properties ranging from \$6,400-\$40,000.

Mailbox Improvement Week arrives in time for spring cleaning

The U.S. Postal Service is asking all homeowners to inspect and repair their mailboxes during Mailbox Improvement Week, May 16-22.



"Repairing suburban and rural mailboxes improves the appearance of our community and makes delivering and receiving mail safer for our carriers and customers," Florida 2 District Manager Stephen Hardin says. "The Postal Service makes this annual request because of the wear and tear that occurs to mailboxes every year."

Some activities homeowners may need to consider include: Replacing loose hinges on a mailbox door; repainting a mailbox that may have rusted or has started to peel; remounting a loosened mailbox post; replacing or adding house numbers; and clearing in an around the mailbox to minimize insects.

"If a homeowner plans to install a new mailbox or replace a worn one, they must use only Postal Service-approved traditional, contemporary or locking full/limited service mailboxes," said Hardin. "Customers must be careful when purchasing curbside mail receptacles because the use of unapproved boxes is prohibited."

"Customers may use a custom-built mailbox, but they should contact their local Post Office to ensure it conforms to guidelines applying to flag, size, strength and quality of construction," he added.

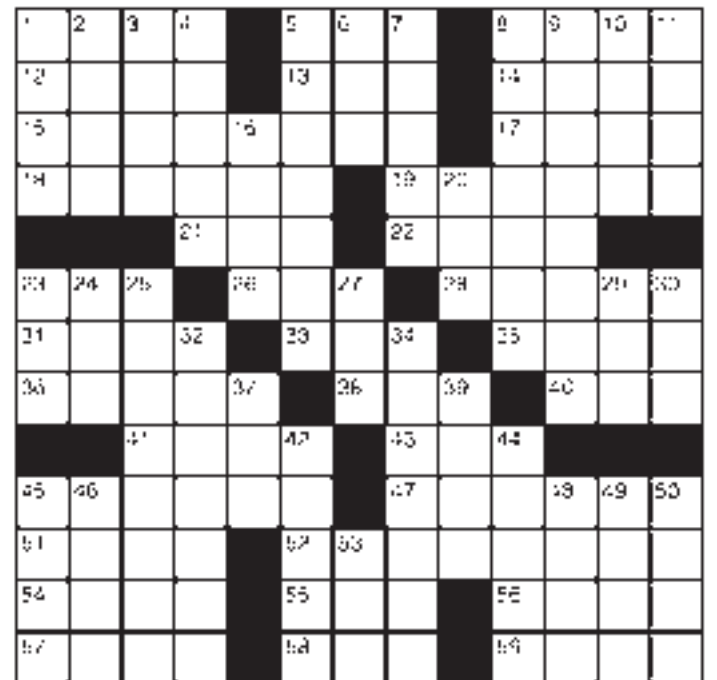

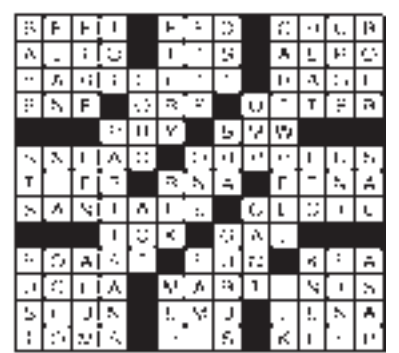

How exercise can help you live longer

There are many reasons to get in shape. Weight loss is a prime motivator, as is reversing a negative health effect, such as

high cholesterol or increased diabetes risk. Routine exercise also can improve life expectancy.

WebMD says exercise keeps the body and brain healthy. That's why exercise should be an important component of

daily life no matter one's age.

Research published in the journal *Immune Aging* found that how people age is 75 percent lifestyle and only 25 percent genetics, which underscores the importance of the lifestyle choices people make.

Cardiorespiratory fitness

Many health experts say that cardiorespiratory fitness may be just as valuable a metric to determine overall health as blood pressure and lipid levels. People with a high aerobic capacity can deliver oxygen to tissues and cells efficiently to fuel exercise, according to data published in 2014 in the journal *Aging & Disease*. In a study involving 11,335 women, researchers compared V02 max, also known as aerobic capacity, in women with mortality data. Women who were fit from a cardiovascular perspective had a lower death rate from all causes, irrespective of the women's weight.

Manage stress and mood

Exercise has direct stress-busting benefits that can promote longevity. The Mayo Clinic says physical activity can increase the production of endorphins, which are the body's feel-good neurotransmitters. In addition, exercise can imitate the effects of stress, helping the body adjust its flight or fight response accordingly, and help them cope with mildly stressful situations. While engaged in exercise, people may forget about their problems as they are focused on the activity at hand.

Improve bone health

Strength training and physical activity can stave off the effects of frailty and osteoporosis, which affects bone strength. A study published in the *Journal of Internal Medicine* in 2017 found that hip fractures are associated with diminished quality of life and survival among the elderly. One in three adults aged 50 and over dies within 12 months of suffering a hip fracture, and older adults have a five- to eight-times greater risk of dying within three months following a hip fracture. Building muscle strength, balance and bone density through exercise can reduce falls and frailty, helping to prevent fracture-related health risks.

Addresses sarcopenia

The health and wellness resource *Healthline* defines sarcopenia as the loss of muscle mass specifically related to aging. Doctors once considered this muscle loss inevitable, and it can affect stamina and lead to weakness. However, new indications suggest that exercise is the main treatment regimen for sarcopenia, particularly resistance training. This is designed to improve muscle strength and help balance hormone levels by turning protein into energy for older adults.

Following an invocation by Rev. Clyde E. Carter of St. John Missionary Baptist Church, three keynote speakers addressed a gathering from the podium. Dade City Police Chief James Walters spoke before Pasco Sheriff Chris Nocco, who was followed by Craig Laporte, a Port Richey attorney.

"We preserve the pledge to never forget," said Walters, who knew Harrison personally and coached his son in football at Pasco High. "I can't imagine anyone who met Bo would ever forget him."

Walters also fondly remembered Mecklenburg "and his amazing smile he always seemed to wear." He also thanked his widow, Penny, on the 10th anniversary of his death.

In attendance was Danny Burgess, who has come a long way from mayor of Zephyrhills to his current position as a state senator representing District 20. Nocco lauded Burgess, who often attends community events such as last week's memorial.

"He truly understands the hardships of our position and what we go through," Nocco said of Burgess, who also is a captain in the state's national guard.

Nocco also thanked families and local dignitaries who give love to law enforcement members.

"Today we remember those who sacrificed their lives to make a positive impact to protect others," said Nocco, noting that without masks, "the nice thing now is that we can see each other smiling."

Laporte heads a group aiming to construct a permanent memorial for fallen officers on the grounds of the historic courthouse. Pasco is the only one of Florida's 67 counties without a permanent law enforcement memorial. Volunteers have been raising money in an effort that also has been backed by Ron Oakley, a county commissioner from Dade City.

Near the conclusion of the ceremony, taps was played, there was a 21-gun salute, a moment of silence as a riderless horse was led through the gathering and a flyover by law enforcement helicopters. There also was a retirement of colors and a piped-in radio message about the last watch.

Perhaps Nocco summed things up best when earlier he said, "Together, we fight as one."

Added Doll, "Thank you for honoring all of our heroes."

ZHS track brings home the hardware from states

The Bulldog boys track team came home from the state track meet in Jacksonville with some medals draped around their necks

Thankful just to be able to compete at a state meet, the Bulldogs travelled to the University of North Florida for the Class 3A state track meet last Thursday with competition starting on Friday. There was no state track meet in 2020.

One of the Bulldog athletes didn't even think she was going. High jumper and basketball star Maya Llanes was a casualty of poor planning at the regional meet at Lake Region High School, where they used an uncertified official for high jump. The FHSAA initially ruled that only the regional champion and runner-up would advance to states. They reversed their decision in an email to coach Bryan Thomas on Thursday.

"We found out the night before," Thomas said. "We were already at the hotel, so Maya (Llanes) came up with Clayton's (Cornelius) grandparents."

Llanes was thrilled at the opportunity but her run would be short-lived. She cleared her initial height but finished at 1.47 meters or 4-feet, 9.75-inches for 15th place in the event.

"It was a great atmosphere, she was happy to be there," Thomas said.

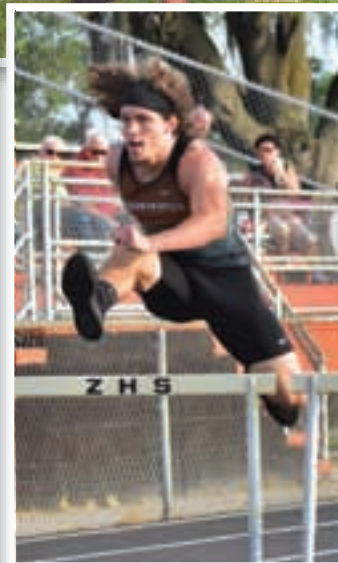
It wouldn't be a Bulldog track meet without some dose of adversity flown in their face. The team's top prospect, Maguire Neal, clipped a hurdle with his trail leg and fell during his 110 meter hurdle race. While it relegated Neal to last place in the event, he got up and finished the race.

"I was proud that he got back up and finished the race," Thomas said. "I think he ran with a chip on his shoulder the rest of the day."

Neal ran a 10.86 to place 12th in the 100 meter dash. He ran a 39.09, just off his personal best of 38.55 in the 300 meter hurdles. It was good enough for sixth place in the event, another state track medal coming home to Zephyrhills.

"Most kids don't react well after a fall but Maguire showed his character by bouncing

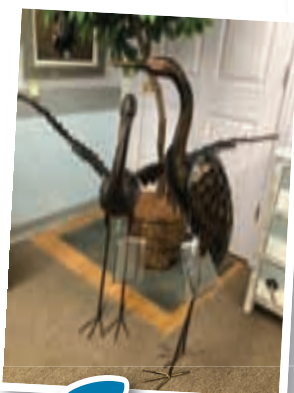

back for the 300 hurdles," Thomas said.

Neal wasn't quite finished, either. He slotted into the anchor leg of the 4x100 meter relay with teammates Willie Queen, Clayton Cornelius and TJ Jackson. Together they ran a 42.39, two-tenths of a second faster than their regional time but just shy of the school record of 42.27. It was a run good enough to put the quartet on the podium in seventh place.

"They trusted the plan, ran a good race," Thomas said. "Everything took care of itself and they earned it."

Pasco's Darrien Smith placed 14th in the triple jump with a mark of 12.59 meters or 41 feet, 3.75 inches.

Looking back, Thomas can say that he built a successful season around a core of mostly younger athletes. He got kids into pole vault and javelin. Javelin is a brand new sport to high school and the marks set by his first-year throwers are going in as school records, at least until next season. Thomas hopes to rebuild the throwing corps from the football and weightlifting teams next season. That was one area the Bulldogs lacked in 2021 and one they are traditionally strong in.

"I think we got better throughout the season and we finished with some hardware," Thomas said. "We're a young team looking ahead to next year. We have just three seniors on the boys side and one on the girls."

additional fifth quarter that was similar to the extra time utilized at the conclusion of regulation middle school football games.

All-in-all, Zephyrhills coach Nick Carroll and his coaching staff relied on the traditional scrimmage to get a glimpse of next year's team. Next up, though, is this Friday's spring game against Mitchell at Bulldog Stadium. Kickoff is at 7 p.m.

"What a beautiful night to do it," Carroll said before the Orange-Black game. "There's a cold front coming in and we've got a breeze. We're just excited to get them on the field and see what they can do."

After the Orange-Black game, as both teams struggled on offense, Carroll, who enters his sixth season coaching at his alma mater, summed up what he saw best by saying, "The defense is always ahead of the offense."

That's right. The teams combined for three turnovers and four sacks, which is typical for spring programs that do not include graduating seniors or promising incoming freshmen who could make early impacts.

On Orange's first possession with returning quarterback Jaxson Rivera leading the way he was picked off by his brother Maddox. The Black team, led by R.J. Allen, last year's junior varsity quarterback called up to the varsity late in the season, had a hard time putting together anything on offense as well.

Marcell Tucker also had an interception and Xavier Salgado recovered a fumble to account for the three turnovers. Other defensive standouts included Maguire Neal, Kamil Mehrab and Xavier Salgado.

In a scoreless first half, Black had the best chance to score after Willie Queen's 10-yard run to the 2-yard line. Orange made a nice goal-line stand, stuffing Queen on a fourth-down run for no gain.

Black finally got on the scoreboard with a 23-yard field goal by Jaxson Rivera in the third quarter. Black added a touchdown in the fourth on Tymar Mckever's 4-yard run that followed a 24-yard gain by Queen.

One player who had a couple of impressive runs was Angel Rodriguez, one of four quarterbacks who saw playing time. Rodriguez scrambled twice for decent gains, setting up his 2-yard touchdown pass to Lawrence Graham Orange touchdown in the fifth quarter. Orange added another touchdown on an 8-yard scramble by Rodriguez.

In the Powder Puff tilt, the juniors took a 20-0 halftime lead by capitalizing on three early turnovers. They returned three interceptions for touchdowns, two by Madison Driggers and one by Maya Llanes. Driggers added another interception on the final play of the first half, but her flag was pulled before she reached the end zone.

The mock cheerleaders drew the fans' attention at halftime with Jacob Smith and Nicholas Ferguson serving as the flyers for several stunts.

As for the second half, the juniors added another late touchdown to account for the final margin. Down the stretch Llanes and Savannah Baptist hooked up for two passes downfield before Madison Poe made it to the 1-yard line off a pass from Llanes, who then found Briana Padron for a short scoring pass. Padron passed to Brooke Baldus for the extra point.
