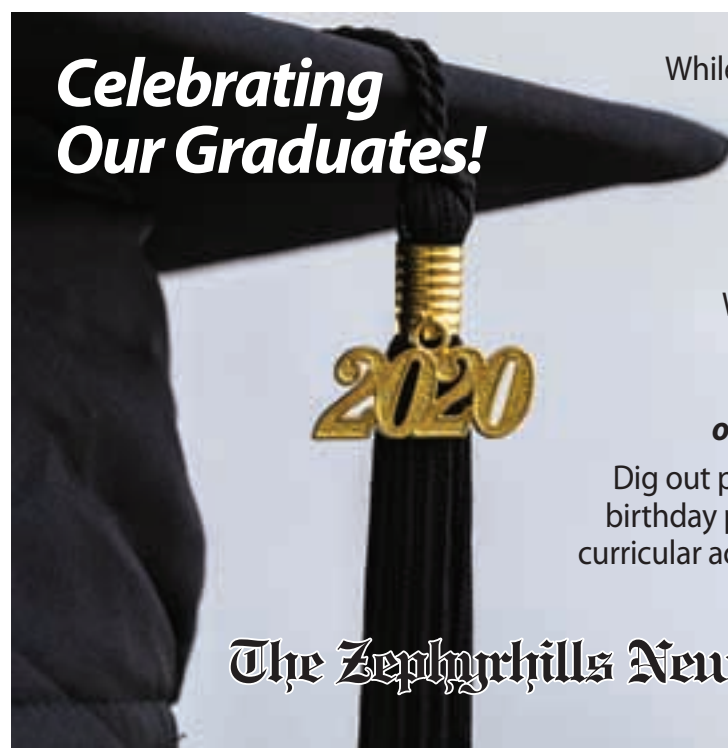

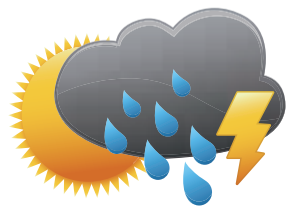

The Shops at Wiregrass hosts Farm Share Food Distribution for hundreds

The community spirit was alive and well on Wednesday morning at The Shops at Wiregrass, where more than 600 boxes and bags of food were doled out to

people in need during these trying times of the coronavirus pandemic.

Beginning at 9 a.m., vehicles lined up in the parking lot that fronts Bruce B. Downs Boulevard. Organizers estimated between 600-700 people received goods as part of a Farm Share Food Distribution. That organization distributed food to the needy every Thanksgiving at the Dade City Business Center.

"With the amount of folks out of work and not knowing where their next check or next meal is coming

Reopenings expand to libraries, gyms and hairdressers

Governor continues efforts to help the state's economy recover from coronavirus pandemic

The state's economy continues making inroads in the recovery process from the coronavirus pandemic. Last Friday, Governor Ron DeSantis made several declarations along those lines that affect local businesses.

Gyms and libraries, as well as barber shops, hairdressers and nail salons, are allowed to open albeit at limited capacity. Additionally, restaurants and some retail outlets and select businesses can expand their services. Those changes are permitted for up to 50 percent capacity as long as social distancing and other precautions are taken.

Locally, the Pasco County Library System is making various branches open to the public on a somewhat limited basis. Such is the case for area gyms, barber shops and hair salons as well.

"Local governments can actually make these calls," DeSantis said during last week's televised press conference. "Make sure you have respect for social distancing capacity."

All seven of the county's library branches can be open, but only the Hugh Embry branch in Dade City has the okay to open to the public from 10 a.m.-6 p.m. with a noon-1 p.m. closure for a break. The Zephyrhills Library is lacking a few precautionary measures, such as glass partitions at the front desk that are expected to be put in place next week, and the

Take an adventure to see crystal clear natural springs

Plantation on Crystal River offers kayaking, fishing and swimming with manatees among various activities

Crystal-clear blue water in a natural-springs setting off the Gulf of Mexico can make for a memorable and tranquil experience at Plantation on Crystal River. Some people come for a day while others make it a longer visit with overnight stays. Either way, there are plenty of options at the resort.

Located just east of U.S. 19 in Crystal River, a coastal city in Citrus County, is the 50-year-old resort situated on 232 acres and surrounded by Kings Bay. Just off the bay is Three Sisters Springs, one of the state's most expansive aquifers. A primary attraction is the hundreds of manatees that annually migrate there.

Among the other activities in the bay are boating, fishing and golfing with plenty of choices to spend time in or on the water such as kayaking, paddle boarding or scuba diving.

from, this is what we're here for, trying to supplement them," said Dave Reynolds, facility manager for Farm Share. "This is the best job I ever had. I just wish I didn't need it."

Mike Moore, chairman of the Pasco County Commission, and Randy Maggard, State Representative of District 38, teamed up with Reynolds as organizers of the community event. The idea stemmed from Moore's aide, Andy Taylor.

"These are tough times for people," Moore said. "Anything we can do we had to."

In all Reynolds estimated 33,000 pounds of food were dispersed on Wednesday morning. Since March 1, he noted, Farm Share has given out 22 million pounds of food. Among the numerous items were canned goods, tomatoes and zucchini, spaghetti and rice, cereal and chicken, etc.

Greg Lenner, general manager of the outdoor

mall, was happy to oblige when he was approached to host the event.

"We're always about helping the community," he said. "It was an honor for us that we were chosen for that."

As cars waited in line to receive numerous food items, several people rolled down their windows to express their gratitude.

"It's pretty cool. It's a blessing," Dade City's Jean Wick said.

Added Diana Moro, of Tampa, "It's very helpful for people in need, especially when groceries are so expensive right now. We appreciate it."

There were about 50 volunteers from Saint Leo University, various Rotary Clubs and government and non-profit agencies who helped out.

"What's more gratifying than seeing people in

need is to see the volunteers come together," Maggard said, noting that he was eager to help after receiving a phone call from Moore. "I said, sure, I'm there."

Among the volunteers was Beth Aker, executive director for East Pasco Meals on Wheels.

"I think this is wonderful, because you see so much about the farmers losing out on everything," she said. "It's a great way to support our local people and give back to the community. I think it really makes a difference."

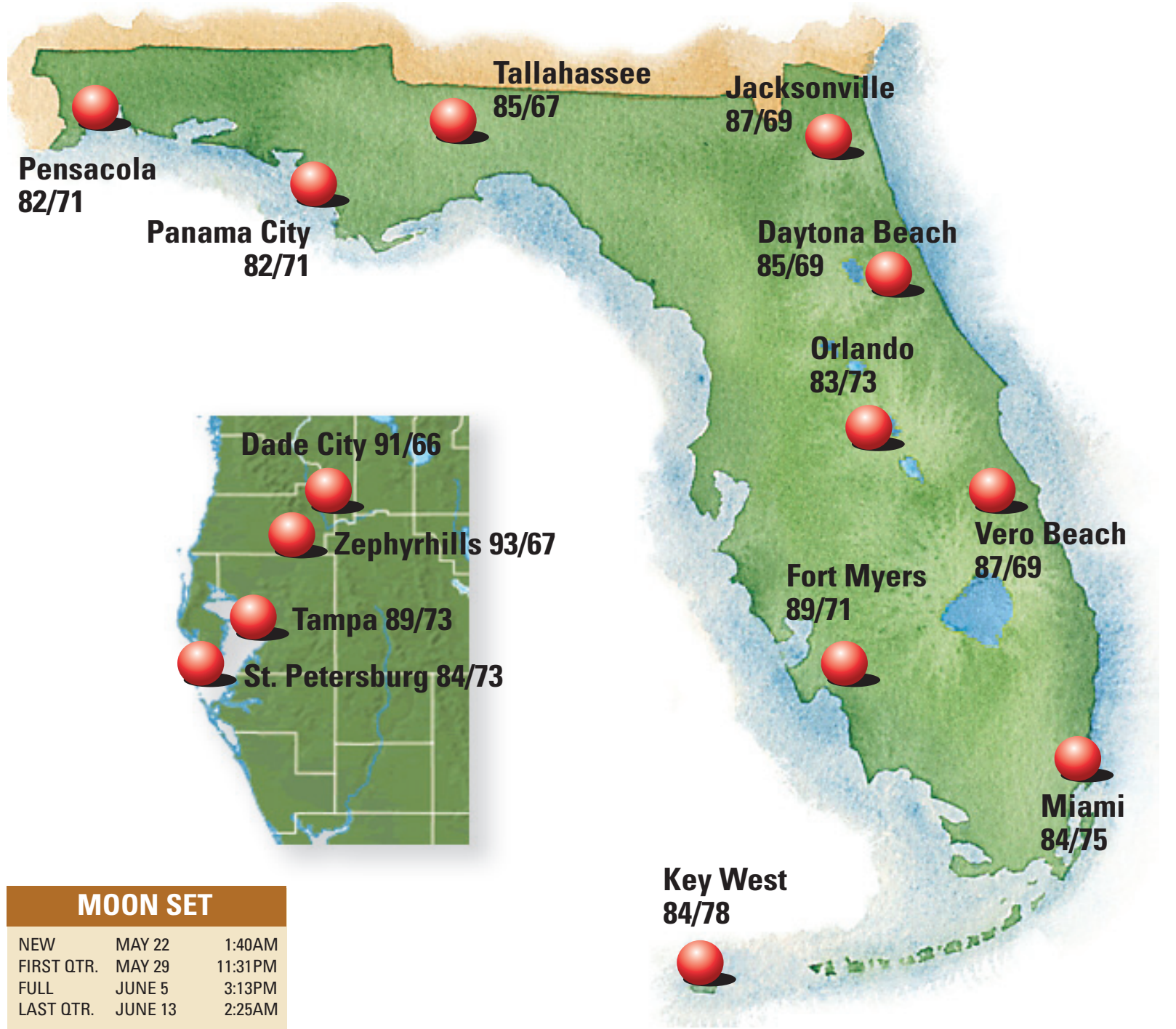

New River branch is closed while being renovated.

"We are taking this extra slow and safe, so we're not quite to that 50 percent level," said Bob Harrison, the libraries' marketing program manager. "For now it's one person (in a library) for every 500 square feet. We'll up that as time goes on."

At the Zephyrhills Library, which unlike the other branches is owned and operated by the city, only call-ahead curbside service (for books and movies) and wireless printing are available.

"We are working to restore library service to our customers in a gradual and safe manner as safety measures are put in place to ensure the protection of employees and the public from the further spread of COVID-19," said local library director Lori Brightwell.

The governor had more specific words for gyms, which he noted often attract people who already are in good health.

"Don't we want people to be getting exercise? Don't we want people to stay in shape?" he questioned. "It's going to actually make them more resistant to severe consequences."

The East Pasco YMCA and Retro Flex Fitness, the latter of which has gyms in Zephyrhills and Dade City, are ready to go.

Retro Flex opened its doors on Mondays with young and old members alike expressing their gratitude for being able to get back into the gym. Count Jake Starling, a 2016 Pasco High graduate who played quarterback and was a soccer forward who went on to play soccer at Florida Southern, among that group.

"I'm relieved. It's been a long month," he said of getting back into the gym.

So too was Ray Puerine, a 69-year-old Zephyrhills retiree who worked out at Retro Flex on Monday: "This is great. It's been a long time coming."

"It's awesome to be open," co-owner Jim Taylor said, adding, "The small businesses that have taken on all this debt the past few months is incredible."

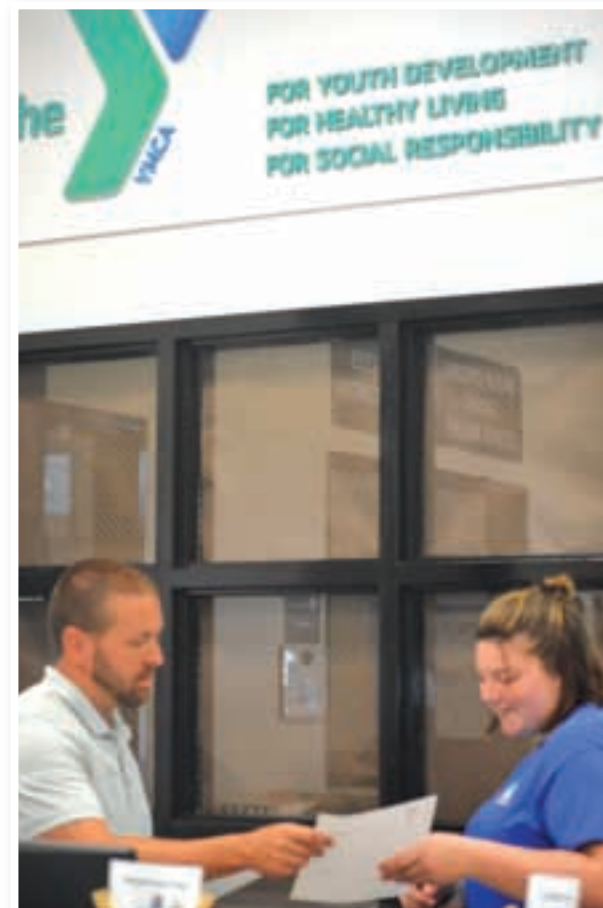
Before the reopening of Retro Flex, Taylor's wife Jenny, an award-winning bodybuilder, and trainer Kristen Dumont had been hosting online fitness and body pump classes.

At the East Pasco YMCA, Ryan Pratt, the membership and wellness experience director, said that facility would open the wellness center workout area and pool for limited hours on Wednesday of this week. Social distancing must be adhered to, he noted, adding that equipment has been spaced out accordingly.

As for restaurants, Sugar Shack owner Fran Hubbard noted that business has picked up since the expansion of seating capacity allowed.

"I see the need to go slow, but I'm happy," she said. "We're wiping everything."

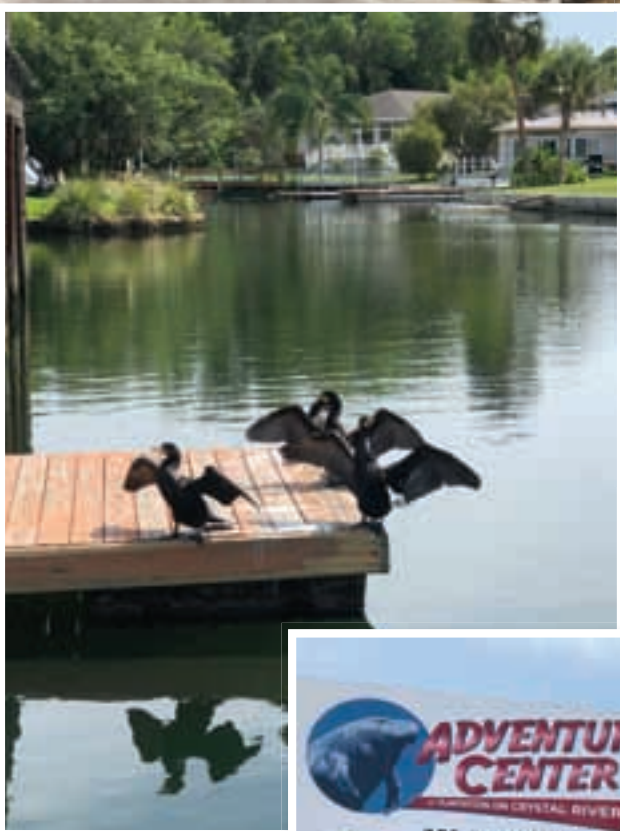

"It's a one-stop shop," said Paul Cross, the resort's director of operations. "There are multiple family opportunities you can do. When I go on vacation, I try to find something like this." Based on feedback from visitors as well as his own personal feeling, Cross ranked snorkeling with the manatees and scalloping as the top two attractions. "Customer service is always at the forefront and the manatees make that easy for us," he said. "The snorkel tour is literally a bucket-list item. (Scalloping) is like an adult Easter egg hunt. It rivals lobstering in the keys." A recent trip to the resort was taken by three women from *The Zephyrhills News* — publisher/editor Jan Linville, sales manager Theresa

LeBlanc and graphic designer Nancy King. Each came back with raving reviews. "The people were all really nice and it was awesome," Linville said of the springs. "It was the most beautiful thing I've ever seen. It was clear blue and there was plenty of fish in there. We saw snook, bass and schools of fish." Added LeBlanc, "It's very peaceful there; relaxing, kayaking and just enjoying nature. When you're out in that spring you feel like you're a hundred miles away." Another can't-miss part of the trip is having a bite to eat at the Old Mill Tavern. You can eat inside or on plenty of nearby benches. While there the trio from Zephyrhills ran into Wade Thomas and his family. The owner of Thomas and Son, an auto dealership, his wife Diane, 16-year-old daughter Brooke and son Andrew, 28, were also there enjoying an

afternoon at the springs. The Thomas family has owned a home in that area for the past eight years and visits there often. "It's well worth going; a beautiful place," Thomas said. "We usually swim. My kids like to snorkel there." So did King, who said, "I dove down a few times and the water was crystal clear blue. There were lots of fish swimming underneath

me and we saw manatees." Noting how much the trio from Zephyrhills enjoyed their visit, Cross said, "They were cool girls. They had a good time." He added that the good-time sentiment is shared by countless visitors who venture to the Plantation on Crystal River. For her part, Linville said, "It was fun. I'd do it again. I think we'd all do it again."

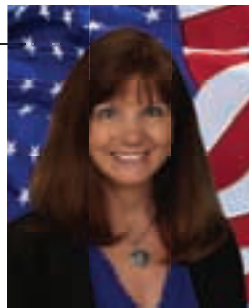

Mental Health Awareness Month

May was Mental Health Awareness Month but the Pasco Sheriff's Office responds to calls relating to mental health or substance abuse each day. In 2019, PSO announced the formation of the Behavioral Health Intervention Team to help mitigate these calls and help citizens take steps in recovery or treatment.

Originally setting out to work with citizens in Pasco with multiple calls for service relating to mental health, such as Baker Acts, the goal for BHIT is to build meaningful relationships with their clients and ultimately help those clients change their lives for the better. BHIT detectives find that some people have lost faith in the systems that can help them, or simply don't know where to turn. Building those relationships over time can help amend some of those issues.



One in five Americans experience a mental illness and nearly one in 25 adults live with a severe mental illness. With COVID-19 at top of mind, mental health-related calls for service have been on the rise in Pasco. It's imperative to find ways to cope with stress. BHIT detectives have gathered a list of coping strategies to employ during this arduous time.

Limit your time watching the news or reading about the pandemic. Take in small doses to stay informed, but not overwhelm yourself with news.

Take care of your body: take deep breaths, stretch, meditate, eat healthy and well-balanced meals, exercise, avoid excessive alcohol consumption and never take drugs.

Make time to unwind: find something you enjoy such as a craft, reading or spending time with pets

Get outside and enjoy fresh air, while maintaining your physical distance

Stay in touch with friends and loved ones. Calling, texting or video chatting are all helpful tools to stay connected.

If you, a friend, or a loved one is struggling with substance abuse or suicidal thoughts, contact these resources: Substance Abuse: (800) 662-HELP or Suicide Prevention Lifeline: (800) 273-TALK (8255).

The team, which is comprised of a captain, two sergeants, 12 detectives, two Animal Assisted Therapy K9s and an analyst, has expanded its purview since its inception. They now cover additional types of work, such as reaching out to homeless citizens to connect them with services, such as work placement or housing services. Furthermore, BHIT detectives meet with those who recently overdosed. Detectives want to use that momentous event in a person's life as a turning point, and link them with programs that may help them work through their addictions.

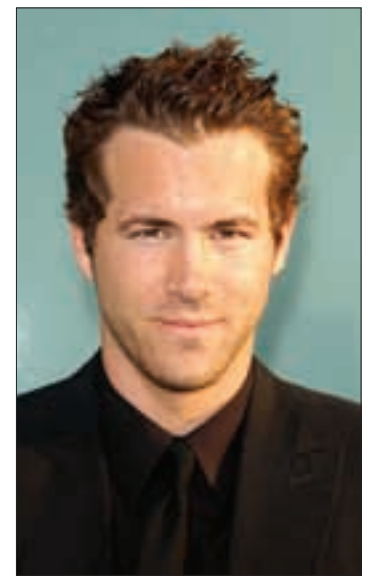

HOLLYWOOD -- Our current pandemic will have a major effect on the next Oscar Awards on Feb. 28, 2021. 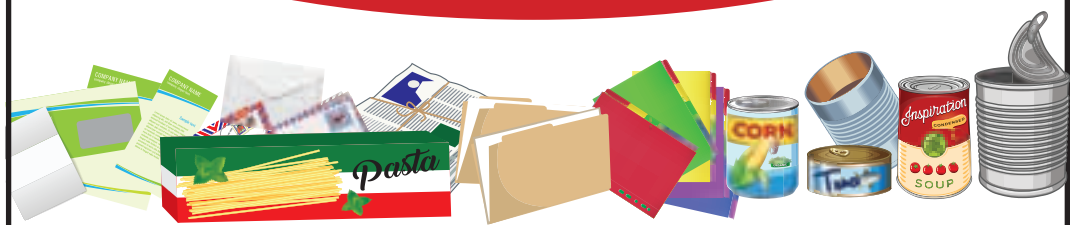
