







# Zephyrhills dedicates sidewalk extension at Zephyr Park to Irene Dobson

At her 95th birthday *celebration, the City* of Zephyrhills issued a proclamation dedicating a portion of sidewalk to one of Zephyrhills' icons Ms. Irene Dobson

It actually began during Ms. Dobson's 92nd birthday party at a pavilion in Zephyr Park. She needed to use the restroom and enlisted the help of her youngest daughter Betsy. At that time, there was no sidewalk connecting the pavilion to the restrooms.

"I was actually pushing her through the sand," Betsy Dobson said. "My brother Robert came over to help and it was still difficult. Once we got there and back I made a comment to Steve (Spina). He said it had never crossed his mind that we needed a sidewalk there and that he'd bring it up to the city council."

Outgoing city manager Spina is a long-time friend of the family and of Dobson's. Spina attended that 92nd birthday party. He was also in attendance at the dedication ceremony marking Dobson's 95th birthday. Dobson's actual birthday is April 30 but the friends and family members in attendance last Saturday at Alice Hall, were a testament to the impact that Irene Dobson has had on the Zephyrhills community.

Three years later and not only is a portion of sidewalk connecting the pavilions to the restroom complete, but that section of sidewalk will be hereafter named after Irene

# Zephyrhills High art students proudly show off their works

Displays at annual show featured plenty of variety, including art forms in two dimensions

Last Thursday students, friends and families milled around the concession stand in front of the Zephyrhills High gym, but nobody was there for a sporting event like volleyball, basketball or wres-

Instead, that early-evening gathering, complete with food and refreshments, took place so people could check out student's works for a school art show. It was the only one of the year.

The kids have worked so hard this year and have done a great job," said Amanda Luby, one of two art teachers along with Catherine Burgess who helped arrange the annual high school art show.

It's just to give the kids an opportunity to d play," added Burgess. "If they're interested in selling their work they're free to do that too. Most of them are attached to their things, so they ask when they can have them back."

Luby, a 1997 Zephyrhills High graduate, transferred from Fivay High in Hudson and is in her first year at Zephyrhills. On the other hand, Burgess has taught art classes at the high school for the past 15

On display were the works of about 75 students, who delved in 2-D and 3-D dimensions. Art shown by the students, ranging from freshmen to seniors, were in various forms such as drawing, sculptures, ceramics, clay and mosaics.

Since it was not a juried show, there were no prizes and no judges to rank the art forms of the stu-

"It's just to display and socialize," Burgess said. Zephyrhills senior Brooke Brown had nearly a dozen works on display, including her prized possession she called Jupiter, a 6-foot-6 acrylic painting.

"Finally getting to show it off is nice," she said. Brown, who plans to pursue art in college, followed in the footsteps of her older brothers who

likes to do art. They did it more as a hobby, but I got hooked on it," said Brown, who began to take art seriously as a student at Stewart Middle.



how Ms. Dobson was like a godmother to him and how she guided him with her frank advice. Daughter Elaine Dobson sang a rendition of "Amazing Grace."

Sixty-year friend Mary Ellen Ahrens shared that she had three boys of her own that all called Ms. Dobson, "Nanny." Ahrens even performed a rap commemorating their enduring friendship.

"This is very exciting, I did not expect anything like this," Ms. Dobson said. "I've been active in Zephyrhills for a long time and I've always been a people person. Color never made any difference to me.

Ms. Dobson had high praise for Spina as

"He's just a nice person, born to be a good guy," Ms. Dobson said. "He never saw above anyone. If he could help someone he did it."




