Zephyrhills comes up short in 28-24 loss to East Ridge

Young Bulldogs hampered by loss of starting quarterback and cramping issues on the field

For the Zephyrhills High football team, spring practices ended on a bit of a sour note with last Thursday's 28-24 loss to Clermont East Ridge, a team that won just three times last season. The exhibition game signaled the conclusion of spring practices and preceded a summer of 7-on-7 tournaments to prepare for the upcoming 2019 season.

The Bulldogs went into last week's spring game without Nick Novo, the starting quarterback who broke the middle finger in his right hand a week prior. They also had to overcome some inexperience due to the graduation of 23 seniors and only two returners on defense.

Making matters even worse was a half-dozen Bulldogs leaving the game at various times in the second because of leg cramps. Still, coaches spoke of the players' obvious talents and abilities, mentioning that the summer focus would be on conditioning and game knowledge.

"Learn from this. Be your biggest critic," Zephyrhills defensive coordinator Bryan Thomas told the players afterward.

"Keep your head held high," added Zephyrhills coach Nick Carroll. "This is a humbling experience. We've got a lot of young guys here that need to learn how to play football."

East Ridge scored the only points in the fourth quarter to erase a 10-point Zephyrhills lead. Quarterback Robbie Sanders, who ran for three touchdowns and passed for another while amassing 239 yards (138 passing and 101 rushing), put the game away on a 5-yard scoring run with just 14 seconds left in the game.

"When your backs are against the wall we've got to make plays," Thomas said. "We've got to move forward and we've got to be better fast."

With Novo out, Zephyrhills utilized three players at quarterback — Zion Williams, Zyre Roundtree and Jackson Rivera.

Second-year Panthers, winless in their inaugural season, have been tournament runners-up twice

Before the Panthers formed in the spring of 2018 the only feeder programs for the Zephyrhills High boys basketball team were middle school teams at Stewart and Centennial. Now, some of the players on the second-year travel team have a chance to gain valuable experience in their pursuit to play high school basketball.

"The goal is to be better basketball players," said Sgt. Michael Smith, who heads up the JROTC program at Zephyrhills High and after briefly coaching the school's girls basketball squad formed the travel boys basketball team last year.

For others, however, being part of the Panthers organization is not so much about improving their skills for high school but simply a way to have fun on the court and enjoy the camaraderie that comes with being part of a team.

"It's just the kids going out and having fun and learning basketball," Smith said. "Some kids won't play prep sports, so this will help keep them busy."

Pasco Pirates have great showing versus Cypress Creek in spring game

A 35-14 victory in a complete spring game against Cypress Creek has the Pirates heading into summer on a high note

The last few years have been train wrecks for the Pasco Pirates. For many years the class of the county, the Pirates have fallen on sub-par if not abysmal seasons, the last few years. A new coach and a heavy graduated class of players doesn't bode well for the 2019 Pirates. However, if Friday's spring game against Cypress Creek was any indication, the Pirates have an awful lot to look forward to in 2019.

Five players for the Pirates truly availed themselves last Friday, RB/LB Malcolm Gibbs, OL/DL Cody Rand, ATH Darion Robinson, ATH Jabrounze Cooley and QB/DB Devin Jernigan. Although the Pirates turned the ball over on a quarterback-running back exchange on their first play from scrimmage, they were solid the rest of the way.

Gibbs made his presence felt early. On the Pirates' second drive, Gibbs ran for 12 yards and then 55 yards for a touchdown, showing balance, burst and an ability to setup blocks. It certainly helped that his offensive line was opening up craterous holes for him to run through.

"He (Gibbs) looks methodical when he runs but he makes guys miss at the last second," Pirate head coach Jason Stokes said. "He has that second, third, fourth and fifth effort and he's a lot of fun to watch."

Gibbs only got a few touches in the second half but finished with six rushes for 130 yards and two touchdowns. His average of 22 yards per carry was the primary ball-carrier for the night. Pasco might have just found their eye-popping star for 2019.

Gibbs won't be alone, the Pirates have several other options. Robinson only had three carries at running back but they went for gains of 15, 25 and 26. He had two catches for 50 yards as well and even started off the wacky shovel-pass-double-lateral play that went for 45 yards and a touchdown to end the game, but Robinson also proved to be a menace on defense. Nothing got around him when played to his side. The same went for Cooley

and Cooley is just a rising sophomore. "The kid (Cooley) is everywhere and has great sideline speed," Stokes said.

Cooley caught three passes for 110 yards and a touchdown. They were all screens or short passes that Cooley turned into big gains.

Not a big night in the stat book, but Rand proved himself to be an anchor point on both the Pirate offensive and defensive lines. Rand managed to log a sack, a tackle-for-loss and a solo tackle but often dealt with double teams. On one particular run

How to avoid illness while traveling

The destination is picked, the tickets are purchased and now you're about to taxi down the runway, waiting for your plane to depart. Just then several coughs ring out in the cabin as the dry overhead air starts pouring out of the vents. - Avoid uncooked fruit and produce. Fruit and produce may have been rinsed in tap water before being served. Stick to cooked foods instead.

- Ensure food is thoroughly cooked. Opt for medium to well-done meats, and be sure that foods are served piping hot. If you are not careful, you may inadvertently expose yourself to E. coli, shigella, salmonella, giardia, campylobacter, cryptosporidia, or cyclospora. Exercise caution when hitting the buffet as well, as that sneeze guard may not keep food completely safe.

- Protect against the sun and heat. One way to sideline a trip fast is with an uncomfortable, and even dangerous, sunburn. Use a sunscreen with a minimum SPF of 30 and reapply frequently, especially if you are sweating or

going in the water. The Mayo Clinic says that signs of heat exhaustion can include fatigue, dizziness, heavy sweating, and cool moist skin with goose bumps. Increase your fluid intake and get into a cool environment promptly.

While they can't prevent every illness while traveling, vacationers can go a long way toward safeguarding their health.

Remembering Our Veterans on Memorial Day

On Monday, May 27th we will honor the memory of the brave soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice to protect our nation and our way of life. Their dedication to country and freedom makes us proud to be Americans, and we owe them a debt of gratitude that can never be repaid. On Memorial Day, we salute our nation's fallen and the families who carry on without them. Their heroic spirit and sacrifice will never be forgotten. We will always remember that freedom is not free.

These local businesses humbly pay tribute to our veterans past and present for their courage, sacrifice and service to our country.

The History of Memorial Day

- The original name for the holiday was Decoration Day.
- Memorial Day is set aside to honor those who died in our Nation's service.
- Originally started to commemorate the deceased of the Civil War.
- Waterloo, NY was declared the official birthplace of Memorial Day by President Johnson in 1966.
- Over two dozen towns claim to be the birthplace of Memorial Day.
- Southern women are said to have started the tradition of decorating the graves of Confederate Soldiers with flags and flowers.
- Memorial Day was officially proclaimed on May 5th, 1868.
- A General, not a President, declared Memorial Day.
- Memorial Day was first observed on May 30th, 1868.
- Memorial Day is celebrated on the last Monday in May.
- The first state to recognize the day was NY.
- On the first, official Memorial Day a large ceremony was held at Arlington National Cemetery and flowers were placed on the headstones.
- Most southern states refused to recognize the day officially until after WWI.
- After WWI the Day was adjusted to celebrate the deceased in all wars.
- A National Holiday Act was signed by Congress in 1971, ensuring a three day weekend for the Federal Holiday.
- Texas, Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, South Carolina, Louisiana, and Tennessee, all have separate days to honor the South's Civil War heroes.
- Red poppies are the unofficial flower of Memorial Day.
- The VFW was the first veterans' organization to sell poppies nationally.
- The "Buddy" Poppy Program sells imitation poppies made by veterans.

- Memorial Day parades were once a standard of the day.
- In 2000 the National Moment of Remembrance was initiated.
- The National Moment of remembrance asks that all Americans at 3:00 pm, pause from any action to somehow honor the deceased of our many wars.
- In 1951 the Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts of St. Louis began the placement of 150,000 flags at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery. This tradition still stands.
- In 2004 Washington D.C. held its first Memorial Day parade in over 60 years.
- Memorial Day is the, unofficial, beginning of summer activities.
- US death tolls for Memorial Weekend are higher than almost any other weekend.
- On Memorial Day the flag should be flown at half staff until noon and full staff the rest of the day.
- Hundreds of thousands of motorcyclists descend on Washington D.C. each Memorial Day in a parade of appreciation for fallen soldiers, MIA's, and POW's. This tradition started in 1988 with 2,500 motorcyclists.

play in the first half, Rand shed his offensive lineman, ate up the lead block by the full back and made the tackle on the running back.

"Rand is a program builder," Stokes said. "His toughness and leadership are great and he's got one of the highest football IQs that I've ever coached."

Jernigan took most of the reps at quarterback on Friday for the Pirates. While his receivers gave him a lot of help with runs after the catch, he ended up with six completions for 175 yards and three touchdowns, hitting both slants and screens. He also picked up 18 yards on three carries.

"He (Jernigan) shook off the scrimmage against Wiregrass Ranch (the Friday before) and showed a lot of poise tonight," Stokes said. "He put us in good plays and took us out of bad ones. The last touchdown he threw was his check down."

The Pirate offensive line deserved praise for Friday night as well. They only gave up a few negative plays and opened big holes for their running backs.

The Coyotes were very competitive in the first half. In fact, their longest sustained drive in what head coach Mike Johnson called, "the best drive in school history." It was their fourth possession of the first half. They started at their own 39-yard line. They went 15 plays and marched down the field mixing up nine runs and six passes. They finally scored on a two-yard run by Brycen Hernandez. It tied the game at 14-14 and was the high water mark for the Coyotes.

The Coyotes used rising sophomore Andrew Burgess a great deal on Friday and while he didn't break any huge gains, he showed himself steady and durable.

"He (Burgess) can do it all," Johnson said. "He's tough as nail as it is, he even rolled his ankle tonight and fought through it - I'm very proud of the kid."

The Coyotes didn't get to see one of their big prospects for 2019 in Ameen Saed as he dislocated his shoulder on the very first play of the game. Saed is set to pickup some carries on offense and play defensive line, particularly end when the fall season comes back around.

The Coyotes and Pirates will face each other in the regular season in 2019 on Sept. 13.

Roundtree ran for a game-high 151 yards and two touchdowns, including a 78-yard run that helped erase a 7-0 deficit and a 23-yard run that gave the Zephyrhills its first lead at 18-14.

The Bulldogs went ahead 24-14 on Jaylin Thomas' 3-yard touchdown run. Earlier in the game, Tre Gallimore ran for a 40-yard touchdown. He finished with 88 rushing yards.

While the Knights had plenty of success in the passing game, Zephyrhills struggled and relied almost entirely on the running game. Roundtree completed 2-of-4 for 16 yards, both passes going to Thomas in the last minute of the game. Williams, who gained 26 yards while alternating at quarterback and running back, was 0-for-2 in the passing department.

"We've got to be able to throw the football," Carroll said.

Novo did his best to cheer on his teammates while watching from the sidelines and Carroll expects the former junior varsity starter back some time during the summer for 7-on-7 competitions. On the sideline last Thursday, the righthanded throwing signal-called joked that "I'm going to start working on my left hand."

Doug Crawford, last year's quarterback for Zephyrhills, watched from the sideline

and spoke highly of Novo.

"He's pretty good, but this injury isn't going to help him," Crawford said.

While Novo should return soon, there is another area that needs to be shored up. Zephyrhills did not have a kicker against East Ridge, which forced Carroll to go for two-point conversions after every touchdown. Offensive coordinator Chris Barrick said that likely was the difference in the outcome.

"We scored four touchdowns. If we get two two-pointers we win the game. If we can kick extra points we win the game," he said.

Now that spring practices and the exhibition game are in the past, Carroll was quick to remind his players that they gained some valuable experience.

"We are 0-0," he noted. "This is what the spring game is for."

Having not won a game in any tournament last year, the Panthers have twice been runners-up in tourney's this season. Some of the weekend tourneys consist of more than a half-dozen games over a two-day span.

"I play them a lot, so they can get better," Smith said. "We got better from last year. We're improving."

The practices and game sessions began in April and will conclude in mid-June. Practices take place two-three times per week in the high school gym. Occasionally, if the gym is occupied, practices

are held on the courts outside next to the weight room and football locker area.

Joseph Torres, who has played basketball and football in the Zephyrhills Police Athletic League, feels that joining the Panthers has enabled him to improve his game. He feels he is getting better at layups, dribbling and just shooting better.

"I learned a lot," said Torres, a sophomore. "Plus, I'm with these guys. They're like my brothers."

Like many of the other players, Torres said he likes the travel, which has included playing competitively throughout the Tampa Bay

area as well as in Orlando.

Kayvion Roberts is a freshman who also said his skills on the court are improving. Now, he said, he can dribble left-handed and his shot is more consistent. He is glad to have heard about the Panthers from friends at school.

"They said it would be fun, so I just came out and started playing," he said.

Temarcion Chapman did not play middle school basketball as a student at Steward, but he did play on Zephyrhills' junior varsity squad last season. He figured coming out for the travel team would give him time to work on honing his skills and get some more game experience.

"It's just to work on myself and be better team-wise," he said.
