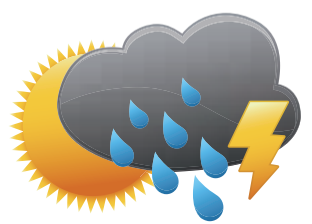

Monday's city council meeting saw a number of residents speak on behalf of the municipal golf course near the airport

The meeting kicked off a positive note. Lawrence Vickstrom took the podium and addressed council regarding his work with Food and Fellowship - a recovery and rehabilitation program that meets in Shepard Park. Vickstrom had an inspiring testimonial, having gone through many of the trials shared by the people he helps

with his program. He touted helping 12 people get off the streets and find employment and that five of them have been baptized. He thanked the city and the police department for allowing him to operate in the public park.

"I never thought I'd be in front of you doing this," Vickstrom said to the council. "It's been a long hard fight but it made me who I am today."

Vickstrom presented council with two commemorative plaques and a hand-sewn flag for Shepard Park. He concluded by expressing interest in attaining a physical building in the city to continue his services.

There were seven items in the Consent Agenda items. Councilman Ken Burgess filed the initial motion to pass all seven together and the measure passed 5-0.

Item 2.1 approved minutes from the May 10 meeting. Item 2.2 approved a professional agreement services

A Look Back ...

MAY 27, 1982

New series harkens back to days gone by. Let's look at the above date

This week's remembrance of a time gone by, which marks the third in our series, takes us back to May 27, 1982. So enjoy A Look Back at Zephyrhills as it was 39 years ago and feel free to send us feedback on the new feature.

One story tied into the current news appeared on the right column of the front page, explaining how the city's summer recreation program would be cancelled for that summer in exchange for expanded pool hours. Similarly, this summer's recreation program has been cancelled due to ongoing renovations of Zephyrhills High School, which have led to increased administrative use of Stewart Middle School for the next few months.

Also on the cover that week was a feature story by associate editor Steve Spina, who went on to serve twice as the city manager. The entertaining piece revealed how then-city manager Louie Holt rebuilt an antique airplane — a 1936 Canadian Fairchild — as a rather unusual hobby. Holt and his father Willy worked on the plane for about two years.

Another story advanced the city's upcoming celebration of Memorial Day. Just as it is the case today, the traditional observance of that holiday to honor veterans of the U.S. armed services, took place at Oakeside Cemetery. There also was a parade back then.

Along the military lines there was a story on the front page about Maj. S.G. Deans, a decorated U.S. Army veteran from Zephyrhills, recalling the Bataan Death March in the Philippines in 1942.

Inside there was a news story about turning a city election investigation over to the Zephyrhills Police Department. Other news included dogs attacking a farmer's calves, burglaries at West Zephyrhills Elementary School and a Zephyrhills News truck set on fire.

Entertainment, as always, highlighted several local groups. There was a spring concert at the high school, dancers from Lois Ann's Dance Studio took the stage at the Pasco County Fairgrounds' Dan Cannon Auditorium and Zephyrhills High senior Stanley

Saint Leo celebrates graduates

University campus, Florida locations and online students join in three graduation ceremonies

They juggled masks, Zoom backgrounds, social distancing, and online and hybrid classes during the academic year, but on May 21 and 22, Saint Leo University students gathered with family and friends to celebrate their graduation. This year, Saint Leo celebrated the graduates at three in-person ceremonies at the Florida State Fairgrounds in Tampa.

The university awarded more than 1,250 bachelor's, master's, doctoral, and associate degrees. Members of the Class of 2020 were invited to join the Class of 2021 for these ceremonies and more than 250 did so. The graduates studied at the main campus north of Tampa in St. Leo; at its Florida education centers in Tampa, Ocala, Lake City, and Jacksonville and at the East Pasco Education Center locations in Pasco and Hernando counties; at MacDill Air Force Base (Tampa) and Naval Station Mayport (Jacksonville), and online throughout the world.

These commencement ceremonies looked a little different as masks were required and social distancing was in place in keeping with COVID-19 safety practices. However, the graduates and their families enjoyed coming together in person to mark the occasion and celebrate an educational milestone.

On May 21 evening, 388 degrees were awarded to College of Education and Social Services Doctor of Education: school leadership and Education Specialist: educational leadership graduates; College of Arts and Sciences graduate students; and WorldWide

undergraduate students—those who studied online and at Saint Leo's Florida education centers.

Saint Leo conferred degrees to 471 students in a morning ceremony on May 22 to Tapia College of Business and College of Education and Social Services graduate students. In addition, there were 22 students who received both their bachelor's and master's degrees in the morning. At Saturday afternoon's ceremony, 409 students—University Campus

undergraduates and Tapia College of Business Doctor of Business Administration students—received their degrees.

ceremony, 409 students—University Campus undergraduates and Tapia College of Business Doctor of Business Administration students—received their degrees.

U.S. Air Force veteran Brianna Holman of Plant City, who earned a Bachelor of Social Work degree, addressed her fellow graduates on Friday evening. Holman noted that after receiving a medical discharge from her military service, her life was in a tailspin. "I did everything right, but things somehow went left," she said.

Holman prayerfully considered her next step and decided to major in social work in order to make a difference in people's lives and to help other veterans who may be struggling.

"As we leave here tonight and continue with our future endeavors, you will have moments in your life where you will feel like you have done everything right, but things still go left," she told her fellow graduates. "But, you will have tonight and this degree to remind you that if you have done everything right, things can still go left. However, now you have proof that left is not defining your trajectory in life. We all have the strength and accomplishments to regain the right footing and move forward."

Jodi Slone of Brooksville, received her Master of Education: educational leadership degree, and gave the student farewell at the Saturday morning ceremony. She is the assessment coordinator for D.S. Parrott Middle School in Hernando County, and has accepted an offer to become dean of students for the 2021-2022 school year.

"Gandhi told us to 'Be the change we want to see in the world.' Though that may sound cliché, it

has never been truer nor would it be more appropriate than with this group of graduates in front of me. Thanks to the guidance of my professors and support of those who I work with, I was able to embrace these words and live by them. I urge you to do the same. The highest honors went to Chloe Padron of Spring Hill, who is the Class of 2021's valedictorian. Padron earned a Bachelor of Arts in management. Padron was selected to give the farewell to her classmates at the afternoon commencement ceremony.

"From sharing a room in Henderson, Benoit, Marmion and Snyder, Alumni, or Roderick, to learning how to cook ramen noodles with a microwave freshman year, we did it!"

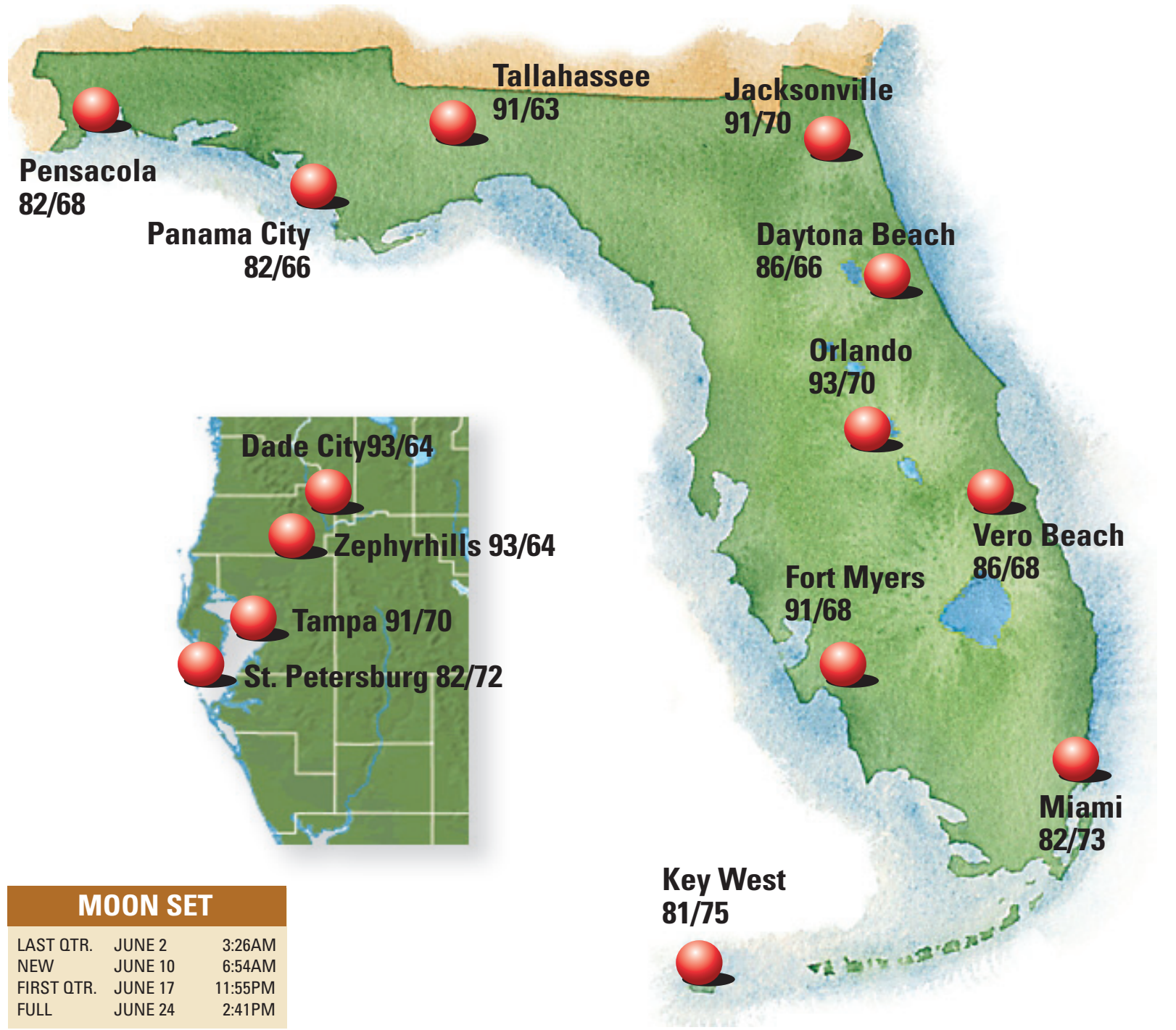

Castor, a student organist, won a state solo competition. Columns were written on protecting teachers from student assaults, American Patriotism and a poll on Democrats on the upswing. On the adjoining page were some of the typical cub news from Girls Scouts, Founders Circle of Zephyrhills and the League of Women Voters. A few pages back there was plenty of park and church news.

In sports, the Zephyrhills High football team, coached by Jim Davis, gave fans a glimpse of things to come in the fall with an entertaining Orange-Black game at Bulldog Stadium. Several graduating student-athletes were highlighted for their achievements and memories of playing sports for the Bulldogs.

There was a bit of controversy in the Zephyrhills Dixie Softball League. Umpires Lynn Greene and Debbie Hotrum vowed to fight the board of directors, complaining of being stripped of their constitutional rights. Greene was ejected and Hotrum resigned.

Additional sports news included roundups for the Zephyrhills Little League as the final week of the regular season drew near, a Ladies Summer Golf League at Valley Oaks and a local adult softball league for men and women.

As for costs of various items at that time, Kash n' Karry listed ground beef at \$1.28 per pound, margarine quarters at 39 cents and a six-pack of Budweiser for \$2.29.

Huston's had a new Zenith color TV with a 25-inch console priced at \$599, The Flower Shop offered a special on a dozen roses for \$21.95 and summer breakfast specials at Pflueger's Restaurant began at \$1.59.

TV listings, classified ads, a real estate guide and fun page closed out that week's newspaper.

Dr. David P. Wilcher

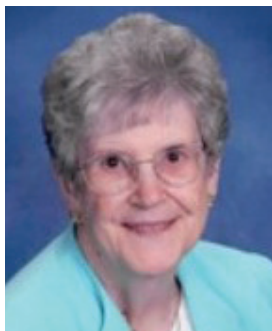

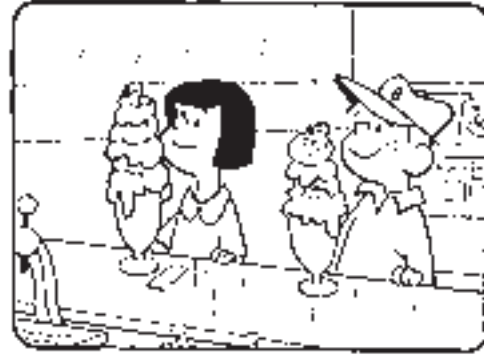

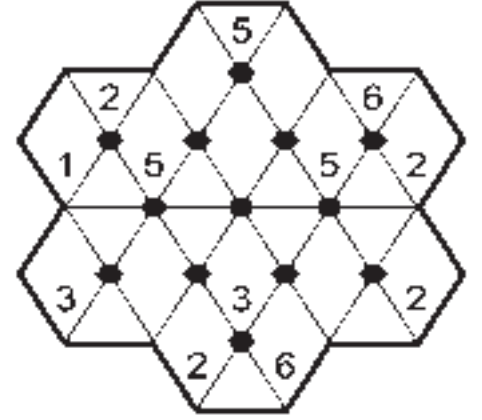

Effective exercises for seniors





extension with Cornelison Engineering & Design, Inc. (CED). The agreement amended Article 1 and extended the contract with CED to June 10, 2024.

Item 2.3 was another agreement extension, this one with Furr & Wegman Architects, P.A. to continue their professional services through June 10, 2024.

Item 2.4 was yet another contract extension, this one with Jones Edmunds, extending also to June 10, 2024.

Item 2.5 extended the city's contract with Kimley Horn and Associates through June 10, 2024.

Item 2.6 asked Council to approve a task order for an airport taxiway rehabilitation project, to be executed by AVCON, Inc. in the amount of \$366,421. The project entails pavement rehabilitation for almost 5,000 feet of taxiway at the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport. It also includes the removal and replacement of the taxiway edge lights and airfield signage improvements. The task order is dependent on an FAA grant approval coming this October.

Item 2.7 awarded a five-year contract with American Infrastructure & Development for design and construction services at the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport. In other words, to take on the runway extension project. The top three bids from a March 21 Request For Proposal (RFP) were ranked and American Infrastructure & Development ended up at the top of the list. Senior VP of Aviation at AVCON, Inc. Jim Kriss later addressed Council in the Citizen Comments section. AVCON was the second-ranked bidder but the motion was already

spoke about his memories there.

"(the golf course) Has immeasurable value to the community," Roberts said. "It's part of who we are."

Lee Parrish spoke about how the golf course was one place people were able to go during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic and how he had volunteered there for six years. Other residents spoke in favor of keeping the golf course intact, as well. owner/operation Aya Burkhart touted the golf club's 50 members and 150 golfers a day they host during the winter season.

Pro Shop Manager Craig Sexton voiced his concern.

"I understand the city has to look out for the city but I don't see why one has to die for the other to live," Sexton said.

Nearly every city councilmember shared anecdotal stories about the golf course, as well as Zephyrhills City Attorney Matthew Maggard.

Wrapping up the meeting, Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. made a few announcements. The first was for a Wednesday mural reveal at 5 p.m., the second was that new budget workshops were coming up and lastly that summer rec programs were going to be cancelled.

passed before Kriss took the podium.

In Business Items, Item 3.1 was an application for conditional use at Zephyr Commons. The request was to allow a four-story structure to be built. Council members expressed some misgivings about setting a precedent but ultimately agreed to allow the conditional use. It passed 5-0.

In the City Manager's Report, Dr. Randy Stovall gave an update from the Zephyrhills Economic Development Council (ZEDC). He stated that the ZEDC added new members and conducted an economic summit last October, as well as sent 50 letters to different state legislators in favor of certain appropriations they felt would help the city.

Item 4.2 merely set a date and time for a workshop on how to develop Hercules Park. That time and date is June 10 at 6 p.m.

In the City Attorney's Report, Item 5.1 amended the Master Plan for the Gagne Trust Property. It detailed the types of screening and berm topography that will be implemented between the exterior fence of the development and the main access road. The item passed 5-0.

"I think we've raised the bar on how this project will look from the outside," councilwoman Jodi

Wilkeson said.

When the Citizen Comments section came up, council chambers were still teeming with residents. They were waiting to voice their support and share stories about the municipal golf course that could potentially lose a significant portion of their leased property. The Florida National Guard is a governor's signature away from receiving a state appropriation to acquire land in Zephyrhills and the northwest portion of the golf course is a likely candidate. It would sever a large portion of the golf course and possibly even force its closure.

Resident Jake Roberts shared his experience as an eight-year-old playing for the first time at the golf course. Roberts' father Art also

Wesley Chapel left-handed pitcher Josh Wollerman, who took the mound in the late innings, will not soon forget the experience of taking part in an all-star game.

HOLLYWOOD -- Leonardo DiCaprio is already working on the remake of the Danish film "Another Round," this year's Academy Awards Best International film. Bulldogs take charge in spring game victory

Zephyrhills caps month-long practice sessions with a dominating 27-7 win over Mitchell at Bulldog Stadium

Zephyrhills capitalized on a quick-strike offense to score on its first offensive play from scrimmage and again on the second play of the second half to defeat Sunshine Athletic Conference rival Mitchell 27-7 in Friday night's spring game at Bulldog Stadium.

"We always try to score on the first series and on the first series when we get the ball back in the second half," said coach Nick Carroll.

After the defense forced Mitchell into a three-and-out to start the game, the Bulldogs took over on their own 48-yard line after the punt.

On the very first play, returning quarterback Jaxson Rivera hit T.J. Jackson with a hard pass over the middle and the speedy wide receiver left a pair of defenders behind as he raced into the end zone. A Rivera kick for the point-after and the Bulldogs had a quick 7-0 lead.

Then, with the Bulldogs leading 14-7, they wasted little time adding another touchdown at the start of the second half.

On just the second play after the break, Rivera and Jackson hooked up again on a post pattern down the right sideline for an 80-yard score. The point-after kicked was botched but Zephyrhills still had a 20-6 lead.

Coming a week after the Orange-Black game in which the defense dominated, the Bulldogs continued that trend. The smothered what traditionally has been a high-powered Mitchell offense, racking up a handful of sacks and quarterback pressures and not allowing the visiting team to establish a running game.

Maguire Neal had three sacks while saying he was shooting for six and Lawrence Graham had five defended passes, nearly intercepting two of those footballs thrown in his direction. Nick Sheldon and Tymar McKeever were among the team's other defensive standouts.

In essence, Zephyrhills dominated the line of scrimmage and came close to a shutout. The Mustangs' lone score

came on their only substantial drive of the night. They marched downfield and gained 74 yards on 11 plays with a couple of first downs on Zephyrhills penalties to score a touchdown on Chris Ferrini's 6-yard pass to Dimitri Edmonds with 55 second left in the first half.

Carroll was not happy with that drive, the longest and most time-consuming of the game for either team, primarily because of untimely penalties. The Bulldogs were flagged often and totaled more than 150 yards worth of infractions.

"There was some good stuff that came out of this game, but we've got a long ways to go," said Carroll, a former Bulldog entering his sixth season coaching at his alma mater. "We got what we wanted, but the penalties are killing us."

For the most part, however, Carroll said he and his coaching staff were pleased with the players' performances in the only test they'll get until practice resumes in August. Next up is a summer of weight training.

"We're proud of how the kids came out," Carroll said. "This is a stop in the right direction. They made plays when we needed to."

Having to make a play so as not to go into halftime tied at 7, Zephyrhills countered Mitchell's touchdown late in the first half with one of its own. Getting the ball with less than a minute left until the break, the Bulldogs scored in four plays. Rivera's 18-yard scramble came just before Jackson's 53-yard halfback pass over the middle to Neal. Rivera then kicked the extra point.

Leading 20-7, the Bulldogs got a late touchdown to account for the final margin. Backup quarterback J.J. McGovern ran up the middle for a 3-yard score and Chrain Clemons added the extra-point kick.

Rivera left the game midway through the third quarter with an apparent right shoulder injury and did not return. R.J. Allen and McGovern alternated at quarterback for the rest of the game.

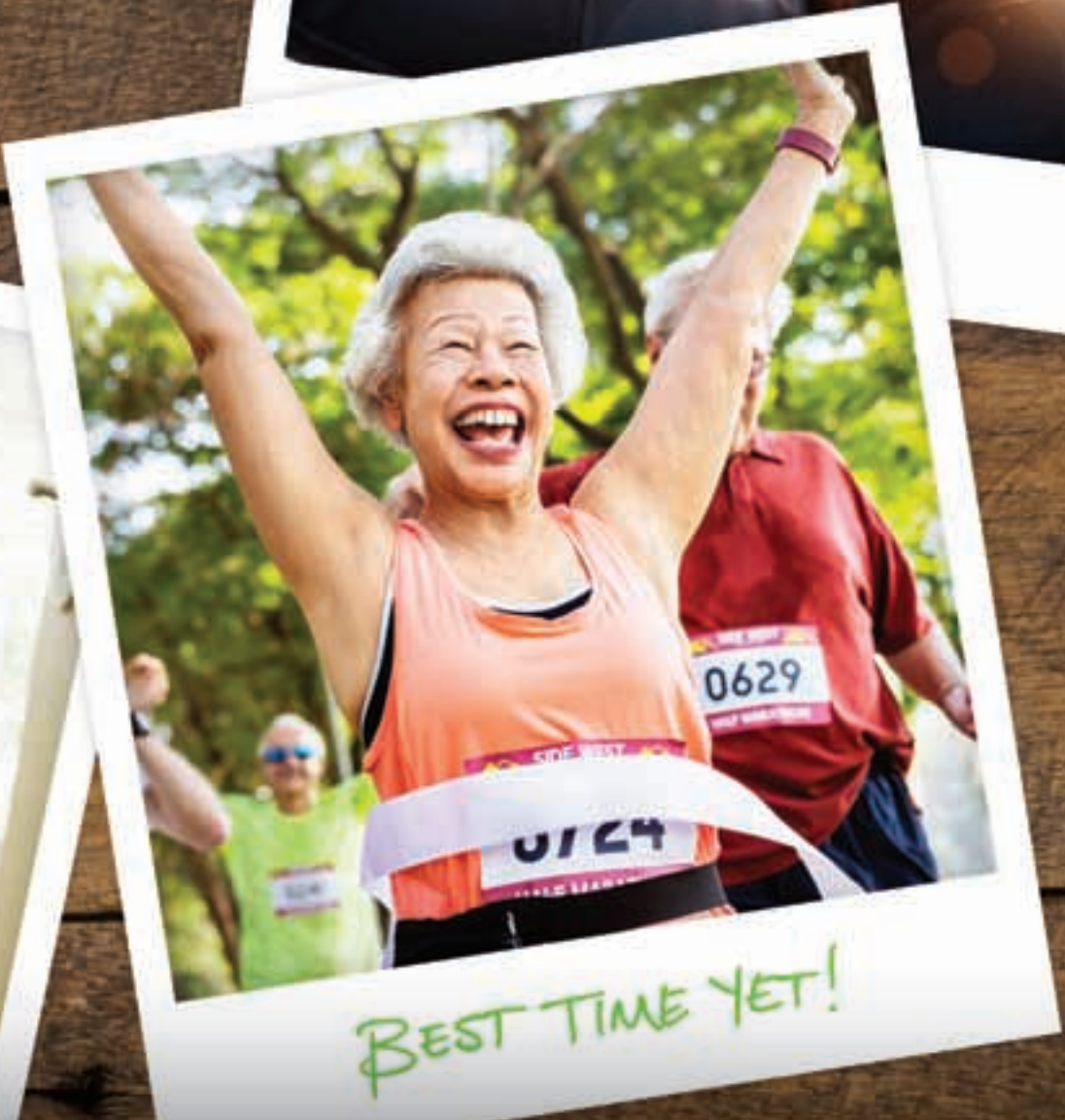
