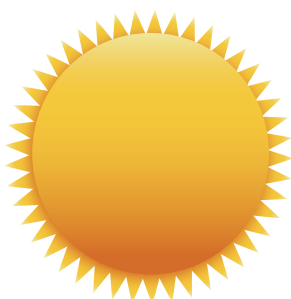

Veterans groups, civic leaders and local dignitaries join forces at Oakside Cemetery

As is always the case, Memorial Day ceremonies are both somber occasions as well as celebratory in recognition of soldiers who fought for our freedom. At Zephyrhills' Oakside Cemetery on Monday, those emotions and more were on display during the traditional tribute to U.S. veterans and fallen soldiers.

For Glenn Shaw, VFW Post 8154 Honor Guard Captain, remembering heroes of the U.S. Armed Forces who paid the ultimate sacrifice hits especially close

to home.

"They're all very important to me," said Shaw, a U.S. Marine who served in Vietnam in 1968-69. "I could've been one of them."

While there were many elderly veterans in attendance, plenty of families showed up as well as the younger generation. Count Zephyrhills High School's JROTC Honor Guard — Brooklyn Campos, Jacob Schutte, Amber Leach and James Laferreire — among that latter group.

The honor guard was led by Olivia Laginess, a Zephyrhills sophomore who is a Sgt. Major in that school's JROTC program.

"I have a lot of pride. It's a real honor," she said of leading the honor guard. "I love coming to these events, because it's inspiring; talking to all these veterans and hearing their stories."

Hurricane season begins Saturday, June 1 - Are you prepared?

We are just days away from the start of Hurricane season in Florida. It's important to install safety precautions prior to an emergency situation

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association (NOAA) is predicting a 70 percent chance of nine to 15 named storms during the 2019 Hurricane Season. The hurricane season starts on June 1 and continues until Nov. 30. The National Weather Service defines a hurricane as a "tropical cyclone with maximum sustained winds of 74 miles per hour or higher."

Tropical storms are given names when they display a rotating circulation pattern and wind speeds of 39 miles per hour. A tropical storm develops into a hurricane when wind speeds hit the 74 miles per hour threshold.

Decades ago, storms were designated by a system of latitude-longitude numbers. This information was useful for meteorologists tracking the storms but was confusing and inaccessible to people living in coastal regions seeking information about the storms.

In the early 1950s, a formal practice of naming storms was developed for the Atlantic Ocean by the United States National Hurricane Center (NHC). In the initial years, storms were named according to the phonetic alphabet and the names were repeated in subsequent seasons. This made for a bit of confusion with the first, second and third storms in any given season being named, "Able, Baker and Charlie." Then in 1953, the system was revised by giving storms female names. In 1978-79, the system was revised again to include both male and female names.

Today there are six lists of hurricane names in use for Atlantic Ocean and Eastern North Pacific storms, although they still follow an alphabetical order. The lists rotate every six years to cycle in fresh names. However, names of particularly devastating storms like Katrina (2005) are retired. In March of 2019, the World Meteorological Organization removed the names of Florence and Michael from the lists for the Atlantic Ocean basin and replaced them with Francine and Milton. Hurricane Irma in 2017,

Zephyrhills High makeover targets a late 2021 completion

First of three phases nearly finished on a \$33 million school renovation project

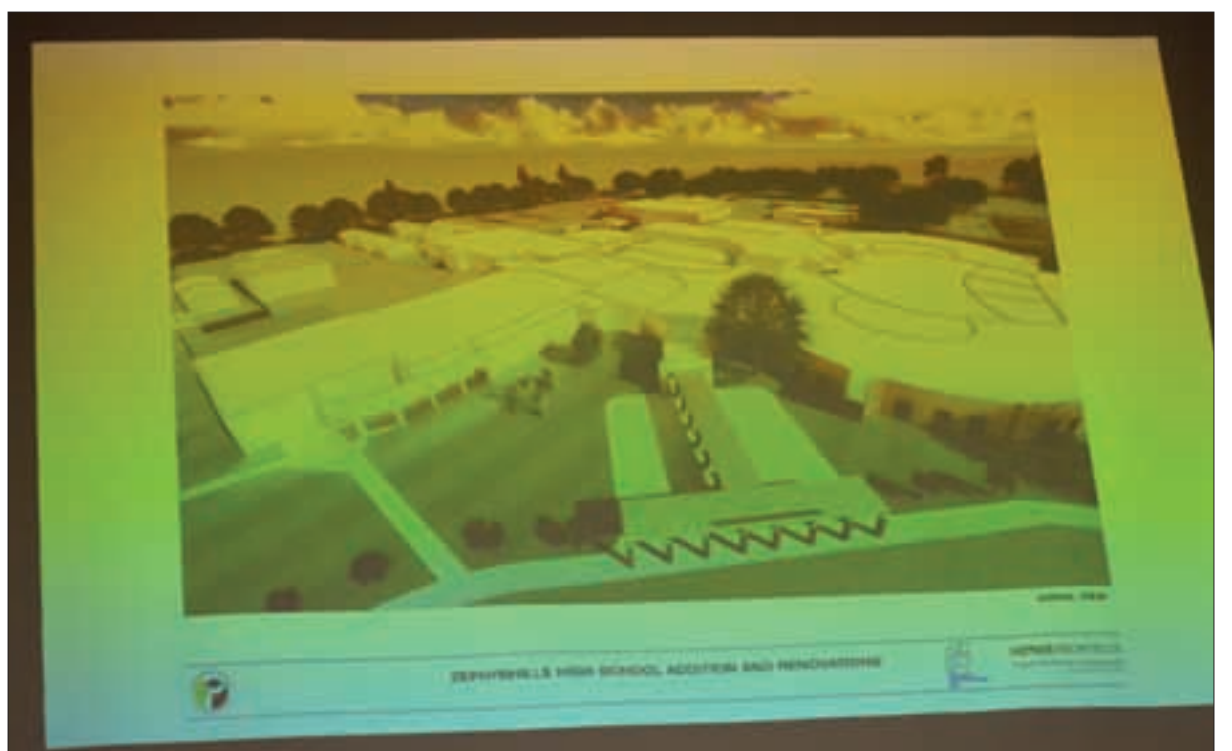

Bayonet Point Middle and Land O' Lakes High, which have similar layouts to Zephyrhills High, are the latest renovation projects approved by the Pasco County School Board and completed by Creative Contractors.

Now it is Zephyrhills High's turn for a collaborative effort by Hepner Architects and Creative Contractors.

A \$33 million upgrade of various components as well as additions to the local city's high school that opened in 1971 began before the current academic year. With the first of three phases nearly complete, the target date to finish the extensive school makeover is by November or December in 2021.

"We are excited about the changes coming to Zephyrhills High School," said superintendent Kurt Browning. "We're just finishing up Land O' Lakes

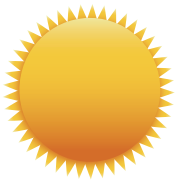

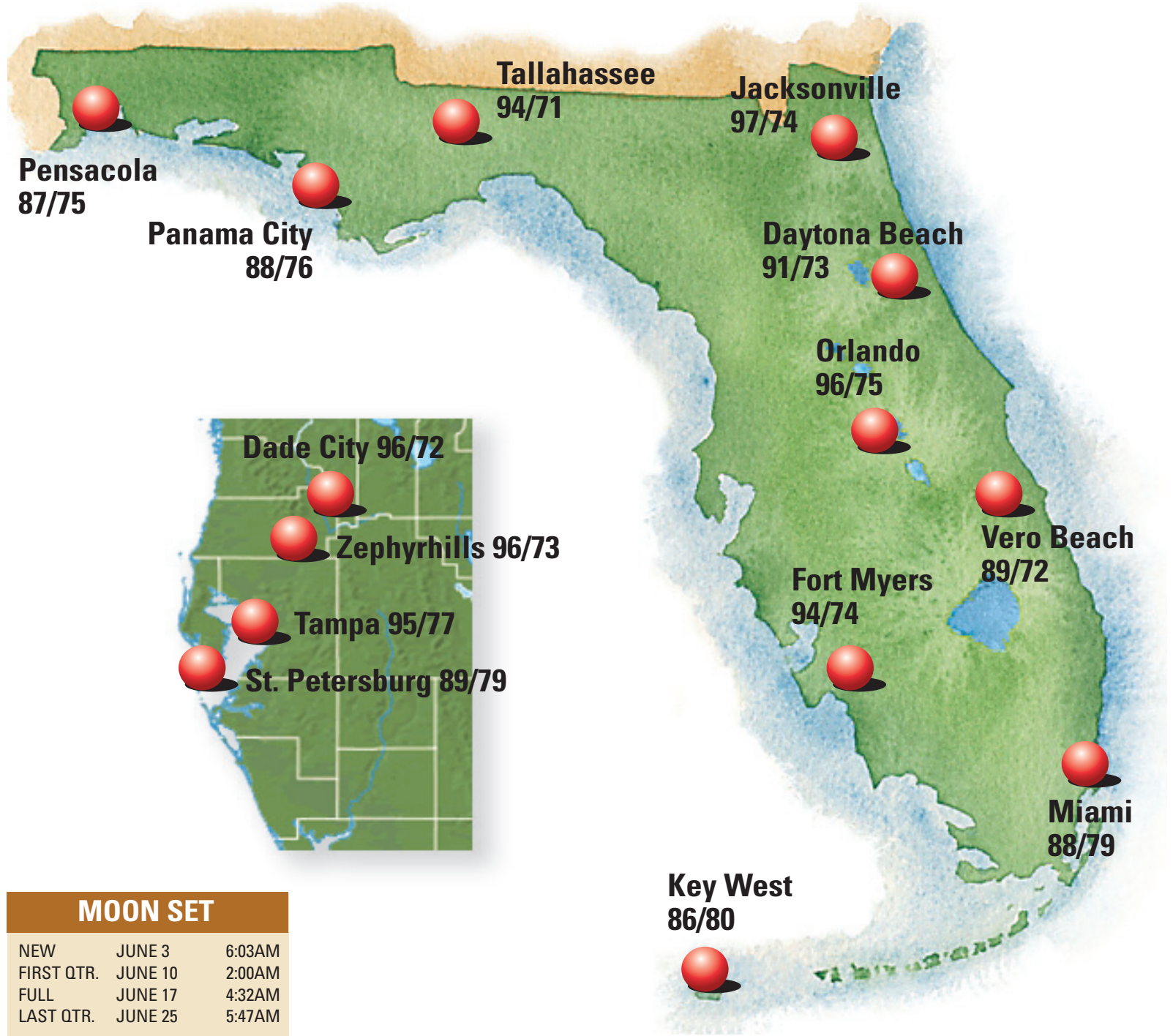

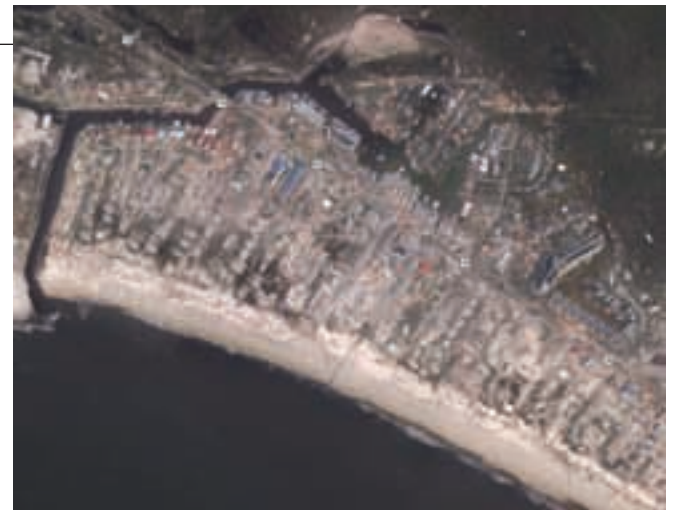

which increased to a Category 5 storm while at sea and gave East Pasco residents their biggest scare in many years. Irma is off the list too, being replaced with Irene.

The NOAA predicts between four to eight hurricane-strength storms for this upcoming season with two to four storms reaching Category 3 or higher.

Here are some ways you can prepare right now.

- Your Disaster Plan - Make sure everyone knows where to go and what to do in an emergency.

Pick two meeting places. One should be just outside your home or business for sudden events. The second should be outside of your neighborhood, in case a family member can't get home or if they are separated. Choose a contact person that does not live in your area. That person can relay information to family members that might not be able to contact each other directly. This is also a good person to send copies of important papers like drivers license and insurance documents. Keep you contact information up to date. It's not a bad idea to keep emergency contact cards to bring with you.

Know if you're in a Hurricane Evacuation Zone or a FEMA Flood Zone. It's also not a bad idea to take a CPR and/or first aid course. Numerous local hurricane shelters are established when a hurricane is in close proximity or is on a likely path to reach a certain area. Many times public schools are made available as hurricane shelters. You'll need to decide if you're going to a friend or family member's house, a public shelter or if you're getting out of the area altogether.

If you're going to a friend or family member's house, make sure you are provisioned and do not put a strain on their emergency provisions. If you're going to a public shelter, make sure that the shelter is open and can accommodate you. A handy list of shelters with other great tips and information is available through the Pasco County website.

• Disaster supplies

Medicines - Keep at least a two-week supply of prescription medicines as well as doctor and pharmacy phone numbers.

Food - Keep enough food to feed the whole family for three to seven days. Choose foods that do not need refrigeration or cooking. Also remember and special dietary needs. Make sure to replenish those supplies every hurricane season and make sure they are not closing in on their expiration date.

Drinking water - You should plan on one gallon of water per person per day, plus additional water for cooking and washing.

Extra batteries - for camera, for flashlight

Infant items - medicine, diapers, formula (if needed)

First Aid Book and Kit - make sure things like aspirin or ointment are well within their expiration date

Flashlights - battery operated, hand crank, even solar powered flashlights are available

You'll also want to keep things handy like: a portable radio (hand crank or battery-powered), manual can opener, fire extinguisher, tire sealer, whistle and/or distress flag, bug repellent, plastic tarp or screening, tools, nails/screws, water purification tablets, cleaning supplies, camera, garbage can or bucket, plastic trash bags, toilet paper/paper towels/wipes. If you elect to evacuate, you'll want to bring things along like: sleeping bags, air mattresses, pillows, blankets, extra clothing, eyeglasses, hearing aids and corresponding batteries, folding chairs, personal hygiene items, important documents.

Cash - You'll want to make sure you have cash on hand as banks may be closed and merchants might not be accepting credit cards. Think if it like packing for a camping trip. Bring along a small grill and charcoal. Please don't

use it indoors. Ice in a cooler is always a good idea, too.

- Bracing for a storm
Stay tuned to the latest information and remember that hurricanes can be unpredictable. There is always potential error in the forecast track.

Clean and fill your bathtubs and sinks so you have extra clean water should the power go out. Turn your refrigerator and freezer dials to their coldest settings and only open the doors to said appliances when absolutely necessary

Make sure your yard is clean of lawn furniture, potted plants and anything that might turn into a projectile in high winds.

Dumping a lot of chlorine in your pool will sustain it in the event of power loss.

With hurricane-force winds, you'll want to cover your windows with plywood, corrugated metal or other material. Plylox clips are available at your local hardware store and allow you to fix a wooden piece of plywood into the frame of your windows without drilling holes into the stucco or siding on the exterior of your home.

Fill your gas tank, check your tire pressure.

- Evacuate or stay

If you stay, find a safe room in your home, preferably one without glass doors or windows. If flooding threatens your home, shut off the main breaker. If you do lose power, turn off all major appliances so that when the power does come back on, it will reduce damage from surge.

If you decide to evacuate, don't wait until it's too late. Evacuation routes will be clogged with other Floridians trying to evacuate as well.

In 2017 during Hurricane Irma, many Floridians found themselves trapped on the interstate highways with exits closed by local law enforcement. Let friends and relatives know where you are going and make sure you are not heading to another evacuation zones.

Turn off your electricity, water and gas if officials tell you to do so. Lock all windows and doors and stay tuned to your local radio and television station for emergency broadcasts.

- When returning

Be patient. Depending on the severity of the damage and flooding, you might not be able to return to your home immediately following a hurricane. Plan accordingly. It could be days, several days before flooding recedes or emergency crews have enough time to clear hazardous debris or downed power lines.

Make sure you have a valid picture ID with documents proving ownership of your property.

Avoid driving, especially through water. Once you're back in your home, open windows and doors to ventilate. If your home or business has been flooded, have a licensed electrician inspect the electrical system and appliances before turning the power back on.

Be aware of critters that might have been driven to high ground by flooding.

Take photographs of all damage before repairs and keep all receipts.

If using a gasoline or propane generator, never connect it to building wiring, plug appliances directly into the generator. Make sure generators are outdoors and away from doors and windows. Before refueling your generator, let it cool down. Check oil when adding gasoline and keep generator dry.

Stay safe out there.

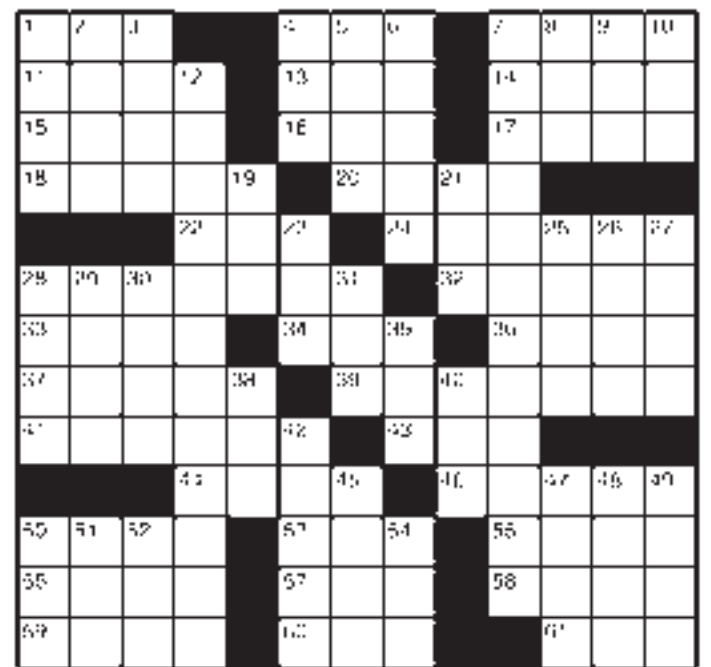

allegiance there was a tribute to fallen soldiers with members of VFW Post 8154 bringing to the front of the podium a rifle, boots, helmet and dog tags. Then came members of various military organizations pinning carnations on a wreath.

The symbolism of those items, along with the carnations, reminded everyone of why they were there as several chosen people spoke. First up was mayor Gene Whitfield, a proud patriot who holds a special place in his heart for U.S. veterans.

Whitfield mentioned Armed Forces Day, D-Day and Veterans Day, noting that U.S. veteran soldiers and officers are "all around you. Although they no longer serve (on active duty) they continue to wear the uniform and serve the community."

Memorial Day is perhaps most endearing to Whitfield, who said, "It's the day that we recognize honor and remember those who died in their uniforms. They are buried all around us. Those blood-soaked uniforms helped purchase the greatest gift in all the world."

Following Whitfield at the dais was Danny Burgess, Zephyrhills' prodigal son who served as the city's mayor and as a state representative before becoming the executive director of the Florida Department of Veterans' Affairs.

Some might question why he left an elected office for a job working with veterans, Burgess told the gathered crowd. For him, a captain in the U.S. Army Reserves, it was a no-brainer.

"For me it's about service, it's about the mission," Burgess said. "That's what motivated me to do this."

Burgess, who no longer must drive to Tallahassee to represent District 38 as a member of the state's House of Representatives, is now closer to home. That sets well with his wife Courtney and their three young children.

"We're still local in Zephyrhills and, believe

me, I'll never leave," he said.

Noting that not all cities in Florida recognize Memorial Day with a traditional ceremony, Burgess said, "This is really uniquely special. That's what makes Zephyrhills very special. It's an honor to address my hometown in this new role."

Like Whitfield, Burgess brought up several war heroes and shared their stories. Burgess also mentioned that, thanks to advances in DNA testing, the remains of more fallen U.S. soldiers are being found in various countries throughout the world.

"Over 1.4 million have paid the ultimate sacrifice to ensure that we remain free," Burgess said, adding that "each year more and more of the remains of fallen service members are found and brought home."

Also recognized were Gold Star families, which includes family members of fallen U.S. veterans.

High School. It's beautiful and the same thing's going to happen here. On behalf of the school board, this district is committed to Zephyrhills High School."

On May 22 representatives of the contracting firm, school district and Zephyrhills High were on hand in the commons area to share some updated information with the public. To say that all are eagerly looking forward to the completed makeover would be an understatement.

"I'm excited about the overall look of the building," said Angie Stone, who is in her second stint as principal of Zephyrhills High.

Added Peter Hepner of the architectural firm out of Tampa, "We're thrilled about this. The folks that we've worked with here have been unbelievable. I think everybody's approached this with a level of passion that's really going to be special."

Highlighting the current renovation project is the addition of a two-story building that will house 17 additional classrooms on campus.

"We know that this high school is going to continue to grow, thus the additional 17 classrooms," Browning said.

There also will be new office space as well as CTE classrooms, as well as realigning and adding on to the kitchen and cafeteria areas. The first phase should be completed during this summer.

Eventually, the renovations will amount to increasing the number of student stations from 525 to an overall capacity of about 1,950. The 17 new classrooms in the new building on the north side of the school's campus is the first part of that process.

"The overwhelming goal is to bring this 1970s building back to life a little bit," said Stone, who as the former principal at Sunlake High is well-versed in modernized academic facilities in Pasco County. "This remodel is giving us an opportunity to fit our programs to our classrooms."

The commons area, cafeteria and media center, along with a new air conditioning system and fire sprinklers, are the primary areas that will be significantly changed. So too will be the entrance, which will have a more modern look to it similar to the recent

renovation at Land O' Lakes High, which also was built in the 1970s.

"There's a lot of things about these old structures that are unique," Hepner said.

Assistant principal Matthew Hayes, who also is a Zephyrhills graduate (Class of 2005), now has two perspectives of his alma mater. One as a student and another as an administrator.

"The big thing is all the natural light," he said of plans to open up the commons area and add LED lighting. "It'll be much better safety-wise."

One question Stone said she has been asked repeatedly is "what are we going to do with Gus?"

Gus, a heavy bronze Bulldog that greets visitors at the school's main entrance, will be relocated to the gym, most likely somewhere in front by the concession area, Stone explained.

After this summer's completion of the two-story building expansion, more changes are in store for the local high school.
