## Zephyrhills football revamped and reloaded for 2019 season

*The Bulldogs will lose some irreplaceable talent at the end of this school year, but they already have some key pieces in place for the spring*

The 2019 Bulldogs are losing an exemplary class of seniors in a few weeks. The 2018 group that a year ago graduated Charles Harrison III, Elijah Thomas, Zac Masci, Kameron Allen and Sterlin Williams, managed to put it back together and repeat as district champions. This summer they'll say goodbye to Jaquan Sheppard, Cartrell Strong, Sam Bergeron, Alex Winbigler and Caleb Keeling. It's not going to be easy to recover from that. The 2019 Bulldogs are going to try.

They are off to a good start. Firstly, they have no question marks

at quarterback. That's a huge bonus. The Bulldogs struggled all season to find the right fit at quarterback a year ago and still managed to win 11 games. This year, rising junior Nick Novo is the guy. No other quarterback even took pass attempts at a Monday afternoon practice.

"He (Novo) has gotten a lot stronger the last four months, he's picking up knowledge in the film room, he and I have a good rapport and we've had the opportunity to groom him for a couple years," Bulldog head coach Nick Carroll said.

Novo cuts the traditional figure of a quarterback. He's thickened up a bit from last season and stands a solid 6-3, to where he can see over his offensive linemen when he drops back to pass. The biggest thing is that he's played in the system, albeit sparingly in games but it's a much better situation than throwing in first-year transfers like the Bulldogs had to do a year ago. Great starting point.

Two. Zyrle Roundtree is back. The rising junior served as the Bulldogs' north-south, closer last year, showing glimpses of what he is capable of. He should get the lion's share of carries in 2019 and the Bulldogs have him playing some safety on defense.

## East Pasco players represented well at state tennis tournaments

*Pasco's Logan Haga is state champion, Zephyrhills' Judy-Hansen and Wiregrass Ranch's Ramesh fare well*

While a handful of boys and girls from three east Pasco high schools advanced to last week's state tennis tournaments in Seminole County, three boys who play No. 1 singles emerged as the top players from the area.

None, however, did better than Pasco's Logan Haga, who won a state title. Wiregrass Ranch's Kanishk Ramesh and Zephyrhills' J.P. Judy-Hansen each won two matches in the state tourney with both eventually losing to the state champion in their classes.

Haga, a sophomore, is the first-ever state champion for the Pirates. He won all five of his matches at that level, defeating Benjamin Zipay of Venice for the title.

"I'm so proud of him," Pasco coach Mickey Wilks said. "He has a good chance to make a good name for himself and Pasco County. There's some good tennis here, especially in east Pasco."

The Class 3A, District 6 runner-up Pirates wound up with a 13-4 team record with Haga finishing up at 16-4. Pasco also lost the first round of regional play, 4-3 at Ocala Vanguard.

## Zephyrhills falls one win shy of playoff berth

*Bulldogs post 1-1 record in Class 6A, District 7 tournament at Dade City*

After a 10-0 drubbing of Hudson on Senior Night, Zephyrhills coach Rusty Guynn told his players they were plenty capable of winning two games to earn a playoff berth. The Bulldogs came pretty close to fulfilling that promise.

Zephyrhills opened the Class 6A, District 7 tournament on Monday with a 2-1 win over host Pasco. On Tuesday, the Bulldogs lost 1-0 to Land O' Lakes, which has won two of the past three district titles and advanced to the final. Wesley Chapel, which has not made the playoffs since 2015, defeated River Ridge 9-6 in the other district semifinal.

"We always turn it up a little bit and they're aware of it," Guynn said, alluding to four one-run games against Land O' Lakes in the past four district matchups with three won by the Gators. "We just come here to compete and have fun."

The Bulldogs lose four seniors and late in the season have had as many as five freshmen in the lineup, most of whom got some postseason experience in the district tourney.

"This is what we've played for, to get this opportunity," he said. "It's a good thing to let them be able to get some experience."

Zephyrhills had trouble finding any semblance of offense against Land O' Lakes ace Nick Jennings, who was coming off a perfect game and allowed just one hit. Dylan Wood singled in the first inning and Jennings wound up striking out 12 Bulldogs.

Zephyrhills, which entered the tourney as the fourth seed, finished the season with a 10-14 record and has not made the playoffs since winning a district title in 2015.

That same year, Wesley Chapel was the district runner-up.

## How exercise benefits your heart

Ischemic preconditioning is another way that exercise can potentially benefit the heart. According to a 2017 article in JAMA Cardiology, heart disease patients who exercised found that exercise could trigger short periods of ischemia, or reduced blood flow to the heart. After resting for a few minutes, these people saw improved performance when they renewed exercise and got their heart rates up. It is believed that small doses of IPC can help the heart adapt more readily with ischemia and avoid a major response issue down the road. Those at the Cardiovascular Performance Program at

Harvard-affiliated Massachusetts General Hospital found that IPC could reduce damage from heart attack by as much as 50 percent.

Physical activity also allows better blood flow in the small blood vessels around the heart, potentially preventing clogs that can lead to heart attacks. Furthermore, there is some evidence that exercise can help the body grow more blood vessel branches so there are additional routes blood can take if a usual path is blocked by fatty deposits or narrow arteries.

Johns Hopkins Medical Center says exercise also works like a beta-blocker medication that can slow the heart rate naturally to alleviate hypertension. It also can raise levels of HDL, the good cholesterol in the body, helping

to improve overall cholesterol levels.

There are several reasons why exercise is important to heart health. It's never too late to get with a fitness regimen to prevent or reverse cardiac episodes.

"Logan's definitely our catalyst," Wilks said.

Zephyrhills, which did not make the state tourney as a team, sent Judy-Hansen in No. 1 singles and No. 1 doubles, along with partner Isaac Vincent. Judy-Hansen went 17-0, winning his fourth district title without giving up a set. He then won two rounds at states before bowing out after a loss to eventual champion David Lins of Fort Lauderdale Pinecrest.

"I can barely express how very proud I am of J.P. and how he represented ZHS, both in competition and sportsmanship," Zephyrhills coach Karl Hinkle said. "He never made a bad impression on any opponents and made friends of all of them and their coaches as well. They all like this young man. We might never see his like again at ZHS."

"Both he and Isaac carried themselves well and represented excellence and sportsmanship. The school should be very proud of these young men. I most certainly am."

That pair, along with Braden Venger, Jadel Rodriguez and Yahir Torres, led Zephyrhills to an 11-6 record, the best in Hinkle's tenure as coach.

Two Zephyrhills girls also made it to states, twins sisters Hope and Paige Johnson, although neither advanced far.

The seniors made three state appearances in four years.

"I'm very proud of the twins for their achievements, not only on the court, but academically," Zephyrhills coach Lorraine Hinkle said. "I will miss their leadership and sense of humor."

Meanwhile, the Wiregrass Ranch boys, who made states in 2014 and 2015 before winning it all in 2017, cruised to their 10th straight district and eighth consecutive regional titles. They placed fifth in the state tourney for the second year in a row. In all, Wiregrass Ranch is 196-18 in 13 seasons.

"It's unusual, I think, for a public school to have the consistency that we have," Bulls coach Dave Wilson said.

Following this year's Class 4A, District 6 tournament victory, Wiregrass Ranch defeated Lakeland 4-1 in the region semifinals and Celebration 4-0 in the region finals. In the state series, they were eliminated in the first round with a 4-1 loss to powerhouse Fort Lauderdale St. Thomas Aquinas.

Individually, Ramesh won his first two No. 1 singles matches before bowing out in the third round to eventual state champion Randy Wilson of Palmetto. That last match was closer than the 6-3, 6-2 score indicated, Wilson noted, since nearly

every game went to deuce.

"We've had a lot of talented kids and he's right up there with the best," Wilson said of Ramesh, a junior. "He's opening up some eyes (of college scouts)."

Aside from Ramesh, Wiregrass Ranch's regional winners in singles play were Josh Abrams, Destiny Okunbowa and Adam Mansour.

That marked the last playoff appearance for the Wildcats as well.

Wesley Chapel appears to be on a roll offensively. Before the 9-6 win over River Ridge, which was not close until the Royal Knights rallied for five runs in the bottom of the seventh inning, Wesley Chapel defeated Anclote 12-2.

"We're swinging the bats. That's what's happened," Wesley Chapel coach Gary Moye said.

Against River Ridge, third seed Wesley Chapel (12-8) broke open a close game with three runs in the third and four more in the fourth to take a commanding 7-1 lead.

Ethan Jones had three hits, a single and two doubles, and drove in three runs for the

Wildcats. Austin Coultas added a run-scoring double and Jackson Choinski had an RBI single.

Jones also excelled on the mound for Wesley Chapel. The lefthanded starter scattered three hits, fanned nine and walked just one in 5 and 1/3 innings.

There was some solid defense on display Tuesday as well. Zephyrhills' Dylan Wood, who often plays catcher or third base, took over at shortstop late in the Land O' Lakes game when Zach Schneidmiller relieved starter Austin Green. Wood charged an infield grounder and threw out a runner at home.

Wesley Chapel pulled off an impressive 4-6-3 double play in its game against River Ridge.

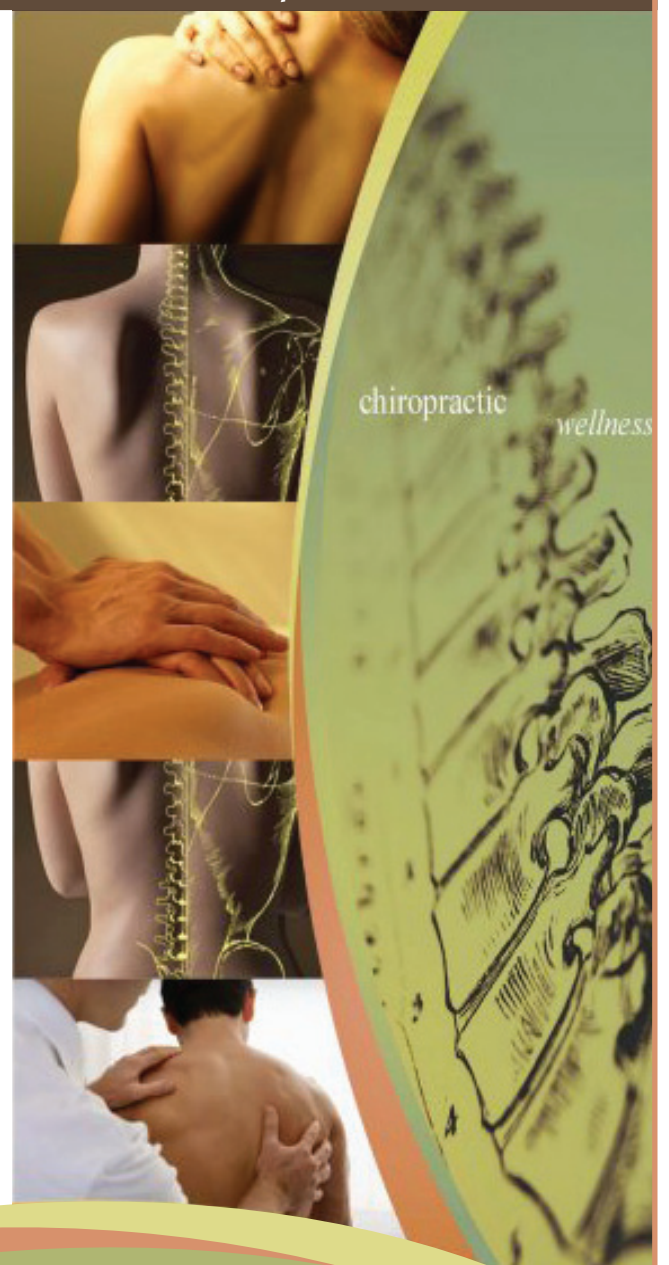

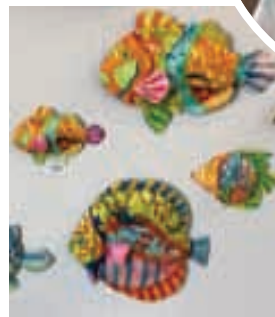

Roundtree will have some help. Heaven Simmons, a rising senior and Willie Queen, a rising sophomore took carries during Monday's practice and will likely be counted on to carry the football to supplement Roundtree.

One of the Bulldogs' big-heavies up front, Jarrin Galyan is lining up on the right side so far, both at guard and tackle. Carroll says that Galyan is improving his footwork and he's already a 300-pound bench presser. Up front with Galyan is Djuan McCullough, who'll slot in at guard and defensive tackle. McCullough won a district title in wrestling a couple months ago and Carroll has been pleased with his effort so far this spring.

Along that front is returning All-American Honorable Mention Demetrius Wright. Wright is the mainstay of veteran leadership on that front and will be counted on to step into that role. Prospective defensive end Ja'bari Mention cuts just the type of figure you like at the position; tall, broad wingspan and good size have coaches trying him also at tight end and even H-back.

"We hope to create some mismatches with him (Mention)," Carroll said.

Helping out that group is former Pasco assistant and former Pirate head baseball coach Pat Fortunato.

"He (Fortunato) has been coming out all winter and he's already got a good rapport with

his defensive linemen," Carroll said. "We're glad to have him on staff, he takes pride in what he does."

This spring, Carroll is going to try out coach Chris Barrick calling the plays as offensive coordinator. Carroll has called the plays the last couple years but now has the confidence in Barrick to hand over the reins to him, at least during the trial run in the spring. It sets up an interesting rivalry between defensive coordinator Bryan Thomas and Barrick and also frees up Carroll for other things.

"It's nice because I can focus on everything," Carroll said. "I can walk around and not be stuck on one side of the ball. Like today, I was working with the linebackers more."

And the speed? It's Zephyrhills, speed is coming in. It's always there. Zion Williams, Tre Gallimore, Jaylin Thomas and TJ Jackson are the tip of the iceberg. Gallimore is poised to be one of the team's top cover corners and the rest will help out both at defensive back and wide receiver. Four-hundred meter runner Clayton Cornelius should factor into that group as well.

The district digs are very much unchanged from last year. Pinellas County's Tarpon Springs moves in and the Bulldogs are now in Class 5A District 11 but River Ridge is still going to be the biggest roadblock for the Bulldogs. No one besides the two teams has won the district in the last four years, even though the new points system to make the playoffs is now in play.

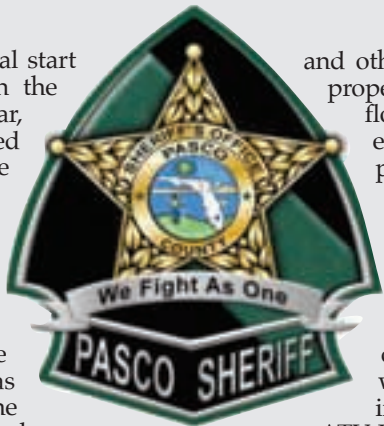
"To me, it's win the district and you're in (the playoffs)," Carroll said. "That's our goal, to win our third straight district championship. We've got a lot of work to do between now and the end of October."

# Pasco Sheriff's Newsletter



June 1 marks the official start of the hurricane season in the United States. Last year, Pasco County again dodged a bullet when Hurricane Michael slammed into the Florida Panhandle, which was recently upgraded to a Level 5 hurricane due to its destructive power. This reminds us that it can happen here and we all need to be prepared as much as possible when the unthinkable happens. It is that time of year for all of us to go over our hurricane and disaster preparedness before it is too late.

### Personal/family preparedness

Know your risk. Know whether you are in an evacuation zone and if so, which one. Develop a plan for sheltering your family whether it is with friends, family, hurricane shelters, or your own house. Let your family and friends know where you are relocating to in case communication infrastructure is damaged in the storm.

Stock up supplies. Water, non-perishable food, batteries, toiletries, first aid supplies, medications, cash, and fuel. Do not forget about extra supplies for your pets too! You should have enough water (one gallon per person per day) and food for at least seven days.

Items for a "go-bag" (such as a duffel bag or suitcase) include blankets; electrical chargers; games, etc. Consider obtaining kennels for pets if you do not already have one.

Ensure pet vaccinations and related records are up-to-date.

### Home preparedness

Purchase plywood and fabricate shutters for your windows now. Do not wait until days before the storm when you will likely not be able to find necessary supplies. If you already have storm shutters, locate and inspect them for any necessary repair. Trim trees, remove dead or damaged trees, pick up and dispose of all limbs

and other debris on or near your property. Secure garbage cans, flower pots, lawn furniture, etc., so they do not become projectiles during a storm.

Obtain sandbags now. Do not wait until everyone else is trying to do the same thing.

Purchase or inspect your current tarps, tie-downs, and straps to assist with securing large items in your yard, like a boat or ATV. Have them ready along with a plan in case you need it. Pre-planning reduces prep-time.

Purchase or inspect your current equipment (chainsaws, pole saws, generators, etc.) to make sure they do not require any maintenance.

Check house for pre-existing damage that could be aggravated during a storm. Consider a roof inspection.

Clear and clean gutters. Seal windows and doors.

If you intend on sheltering your family at your residence, consider identifying or constructing a safe room.

### Financial preparedness

Review your homeowner's insurance policy - know there is typically a 30-day waiting period so the time to obtain adequate coverage is now. Do not wait for a storm. Review clauses covering damage related to wind, water, flooding, and specifically hurricanes. Most insurance policies have a separate hurricane deductible and most do not cover damage from flooding without separate flood insurance.

Make copies of and/or protect important documents. Back-up important electronic files.

Document valuable items. Record serial numbers.

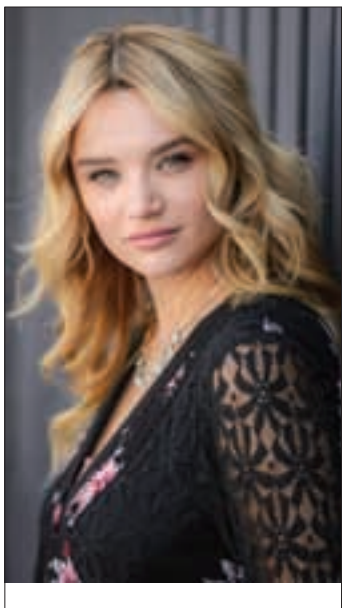
