Elks Lodge 2731 continues longstanding tradition of promoting the United States' symbol of freedom

United, not divided, marked the theme of a Flag Day Ceremony on Tuesday afternoon at Elks Lodge 2731. The honoring of the American flag continued a longstanding tradition of the local lodge off Wire Road

in Zephyrhills.

"It stands for freedom and that's the major thing," said Cliff McDuffie, the city's former mayor and a proud patriot. "People appreciate that and will fight to the death for it."

Another prominent speaker at the ceremony, State Representative Randy Maggard, feels that one day a class similar to this week's flag day ceremony will be taught in schools.

"Flag Day isn't often celebrated like the Fourth of July, but I think it should be," he said.

Jay Klamer, the local lodge's exalted ruler who

City council taps Hercules Park construction manager

Monday's council meeting saw reports from the utilities and planning departments, as well as the city manager

The meeting kicked off with a pair of proclamations issued by Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield. The first, marked June 14 as National Flag Day. The first Flag Day was commemorated on June 14, 1777 by the Second Continental Congress and today's 50-star flag was first flown on July 4, 1960. Marie Wunderlich of the Daughters of the American Revolution accepted the proclamation from Whitfield.

The second proclamation was presented by councilman Charlie Proctor to Sam Turgeon acknowledging his service to the community of Zephyrhills.

In the Consent Agenda, five items were bundled and passed together unanimously. Item 2.1 appointed board members to different civic boards whose terms are set to expire June 30.

Item 2.2 approved a 50-50 grant from the Department of Environmental Protection to replace septic systems with city wastewater

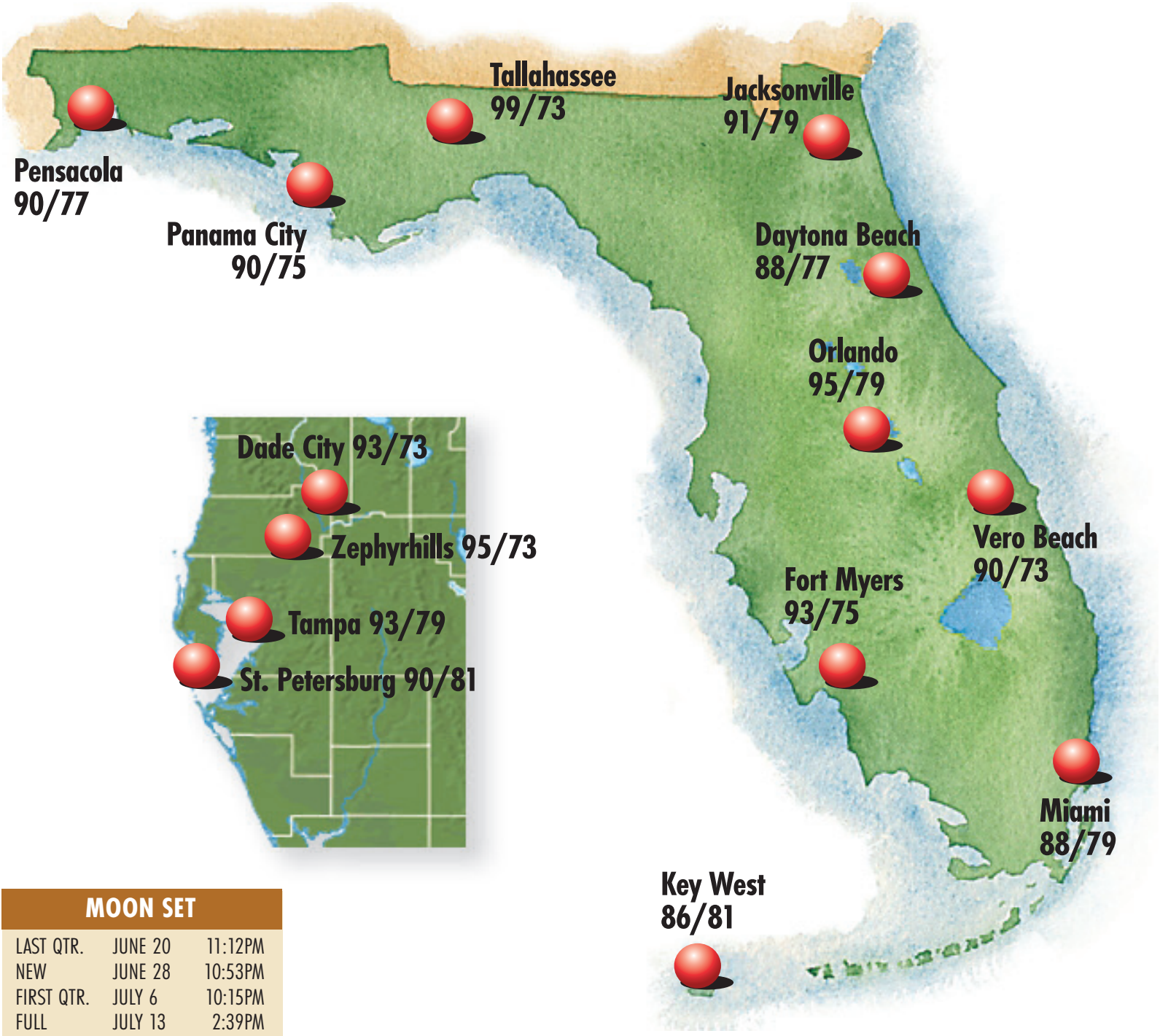

services. The area of focus is in south Zephyrhills, south of C Avenue, to Tucker Road, along the US Highway 301 Commercial Corridor.

Item 2.3 approved the purchase of a roll off truck for the utilities department. The funds for the purchase from the Florida Sheriff's Association. The purchase price of \$249,734.00 is to be taken from Budget Line Item(s): \$125,000 Streets Capital FY 21-22 and \$125,000 Sanitation Capital FY 21-22.

Item 2.4 approved a change order from contractor BRW for their work on a reclaimed water line. There were five contract modification requests, amounting to a \$42,886.90 increase.

Item 2.5 approved modification of a previously-approved consulting agreement with BerryDunn to review the city's processes and information system requirements related to utility billing and customer service area. Consultants have requested four minor changes to the agreement with a one-time monetary increase of \$100,000. The items were bundled together and passed 5-0.

In Business Items, Item 3.1 got its second reading. SVB Housing, LLC's Healthier Stay Planned Unit Development (PUD) consists of approximately 10.15 Acres and is generally located on the west side of Simons Road, north of Crestview Landing Way. The estimated population density of the development is 6.8 persons per acre. Proposed uses include: a mix single-family and townhomes at 14.0 units per acre and a maximum height of two stories; a 32,235-square-foot dormitory building containing 29 units, with a maximum height of three stories; a roughly 22,500-square-foot, mixed-use medical/office/residential building with a maximum height of 48 feet; and a 27,300-square-foot Indoor Multi-Purpose Recreation/Tennis Facility with a maximum height of 48 feet.

Two public meetings are required to be held for the Developer's Agreement and the project will have a fiscal impact of impact fee credits to the developer in the amount of \$176,000, which will be applied to the project over phases I, II, and III. There was no public comment on the item and it passed 5-0.

Item 3.2 was the first reading for an annexation ordinance. The subject property is located within the jurisdictional boundaries of Pasco County but is contiguous to the city's boundaries, abutting properties located within the city directly to the south and west. The approximately 5.0 acres is located at 4909 Kitty Hawk Dr. The item was actually a simultaneous review of applications to annex, amend the comprehensive plan and rezone submitted by Heyl Truck Lines, Inc. There was no public comment and the item passed 5-0.

In the Utility Director's Report, Tony Harrison of Raftelis, who recently conducted a Utility Capacity Fee Study, walked council members through a presentation that detailed consumption and potential rate increases. Significant details were that the city currently has a 27 percent growth cap for water use and a 57 percent growth cap for sewer services. The study also recommended one-time hookup fee increases. The last year a study was conducted and the last time those fees saw an increase was 2017. An example of the increases for a single-family home would be \$130 for water and \$310 for sewer. It was noted in discussion that these are one-time fee increases that only pertain to new construction. It was not an action item.

In the Planning Director's Report, Todd Vande Berg submitted the final two plats for the Abbott Square development west and north of the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center. Details emerging from the report were that a designated right turn lane from Simons Road onto Eiland Boulevard, as well as designated right and left turn lanes from Eiland onto Simons were part of the plat. A traffic signal at the intersection looks like a surety as well. This was an action item and it passed 5-0.

In the City Manager's Report, two Requests for Qualifications (RFQs) were discussed. The first determined which company would be tapped to take on a branding and marketing campaign on behalf of the city. Between ranked responses and follow up interviews, Northstar was selected. The city originally budgeted \$75,000 for the services and Northstar's request not-to-exceed quote was for \$65,000. The item passed 5-0.

The other RFQ tapped Wharton Smith to conduct construction management services for Hercules Park. The same rubric was applied and Wharton Smith came out with the highest composite score. Council voted 5-0 to permit city staff to begin negotiations with Wharton Smith.

In the City Attorney's Report, items 7.1, 7.2 and 7.3 were all requests for zoning changes. Item 7.1 followed up the request issued in Item 3.2 by changing the county zoning to a synonymous city zoning designation.

Item 7.2 requested a zoning change from PUD to C2, basically a residential to commercial zoning change. An application was submitted by North American Development Group (NADG) on behalf of Zephyr Commons Out-parcels to rezone approximately 0.73 acres located on the north side of Kossick Road, east of the intersection of Kossick and US Highway 301.

Item 7.3 asked for a change to the Land Development Code (LDC) with regard to indoor storage facilities.

Item 7.4 scheduled City Charter review sessions. All four items passed 5-0.

In Citizen Comments, Seth Healy on behalf of Zephyrhills Police Department requested departmental raises. He stated that state law enforcement entities, on Oct. 1, will surpass ZPD in salary. Healy spoke of the department's fast response time and, "unparalleled service." Council members universally expressed their appreciation for ZPD and promised to do all they can to effect raises.

In Noted Items, Item 9.1 detailed rental terms for city facilities and Item 9.2 gave May and June City of Zephyrhills Bank Depository details.

The History Channel

- On June 16, 1961, Rudolf Nureyev, the young star of the Soviet Union's Kirov Opera Ballet Company, defects during a stopover in Paris. While preparing to board the return flight, Nureyev threw himself into the arms of airport security people, screaming, "Protect me!" He was given political asylum.

- On June 19, 1856, the first national convention of the Republican Party comes to its conclusion. After the Civil War, the Republican-dominated Congress forced a radical Reconstruction policy on the South, which saw the passage of the 13th, 14th and 15th Amendments to the Constitution.
- On June 20, 1782, Congress adopts the Great Seal of the United States after six years of discussion. The seal depicts a bald eagle clutching an olive branch in its right talon and arrows in its left. On its breast appears a shield marked with 13 vertical red and white stripes topped by a bar of blue. The eagle's beak clutches a banner inscribed, E pluribus unum, a Latin phrase meaning "Out of Many One."
- On June 21, 1916, the controversial U.S. military expedition against Mexican revolutionary Pancho Villa brings the U.S. and Mexico close to war when Mexican troops attack U.S. Gen. John J. Pershing's force at Carrizal, Mexico. The Americans suffered 22 casualties, and more than 30 Mexicans were killed.
- On June 22, 1964, Dan Brown, author of the "The Da Vinci Code," is born in New Hampshire. Brown's bestselling novels are known for symbols, conspiracies and secret societies.

Wealth of Health

What to do about wellness after 50

Reaching one’s fiftieth birthday in optimal health is an accomplishment to be proud of. The hard work required to be healthy in midlife includes adhering to a nutritious diet and exercising regularly. Once individuals cross the threshold and enter their 50s, they can look to some additional strategies to maintain their physical and mental well-being for decades to come.

- **Get a pet.** Many people 50 and older qualify as “empty nesters,” a term applied to adults whose children have grown up and moved out of their homes. Some empty nesters experience a phenomenon known as “empty nest syndrome,” which the Mayo Clinic notes can be marked by feelings of sadness or loss. Pets can help people over 50 with no children at home overcome feelings linked to empty nest syndrome. In 2018, the University of Michigan National Poll on Healthy Aging found that 86 percent of pet owners felt their pets make them feel loved while 73 percent said their pets provided a sense of purpose. - **Prioritize learning.** Whether it’s taking music lessons, going back to school or mastering a new hobby, learning has a profound effect on aging brains. For example, a 2013 study published in the journal Psychological Science found that memory function is improved by engagement in demanding everyday tasks. That study reported that people who learned new skills experienced greater memory improvement than people who only socialized or participated in activities that were not as cognitively engaging.



- **Make an effort to improve balance.** Various factors contribute to a decline in balance as adults age. For example, a decline in muscle mass that begins when people are in their 30s is a normal part of aging. Over time, that natural decline affects strength and agility. Balance exercises can be a valuable component of a fitness regimen that help individuals reduce their risk for falling as they advance through their 50s and into their 60s and 70s. That’s a significant benefit, as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that one out of every three adults age 65 and older experiences a fall each year, and as many as 30 percent of those falls lead to serious injury.
- **Embrace your inner socialite.** Socialization is important for people of all ages, including individuals 50 and over. A 2017 study from researchers at Michigan State found that valuing friendships was a strong predictor of health and happiness among older adults. Opportunities to socialize with friends may increase as people navigate their 50s and children move out or become more independent. Individuals can take advantage of opportunities to socialize whenever possible.

Various strategies can help people maintain mental and physical wellness as they make their way through their 50s and beyond.

Did You Know?

Men and women may have more free time after 50 than they had in previous decades. As children grow more independent and even leave the house, parents look to various activities, including travel, to fill their free time. Travel is often seen as a luxury, but heading off for parts unknown can produce some serious health benefits.

A joint study from the Global Coalition on Aging and the Transamerica Center for Retirement Studies found that women who vacation at least twice a year have a lower risk for heart attack than those who travel once every six years. The study also found that men who do not take annual vacations are at a significantly higher risk of death (20 percent) and heart disease (30 percent) than those who make who take time to get away each year.

Vacations don’t even need to be long to produce significant, positive results. A 2018 study published in the International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health found that a four-day long weekend vacation positively affected well-being, recovery, strain, and perceived stress for as long as 45 days

Tampa Bay Buccaneers' practice facility hosts Eighth Annual King of Kings 7-on-7 tournament

Two Pasco County teams competed in the Eighth Annual King of Kings 7-on-7 football tournament for high school teams last weekend.

The Fellowship of Christian Athletes event, held at the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' practice facility adjacent to Raymond James Stadium, went somewhat better for Zephyrhills than it did for Cypress Creek.

The Bulldogs, who won two of three preliminary games, were among eight teams invited to advance following the eight squads with the best results. They made it all the way to the semifinals, obviously performing much better as the tourney progressed.

Meanwhile, the Coyotes struggled and never got out of the first round. Cypress Creek went 0-1-2 and was eliminated before the second afternoon session began at One Buc Place.

Afterward, Zephyrhills coach Nick Carroll spoke about

the ups and downs of his team playing in such a high-quality tourney that attracted teams from Pasco, Hernando, Hillsborough and Pinellas counties.

"We progressed," he said. "We were able to overcome some adversity and find a way to win games."

Given a second chance to advance to the playoff round the Bulldogs defeated East Lake and Countryside before losing by just one point against Largo. The Packers went on to the championship game where they lost to Calvary Christian.

Three players, two of them being newcomers from other schools, were singled out by Carroll for their stellar play during Saturday's tourney.

That trio included new quarterback Brendyn Colella, a transfer from Wiregrass Ranch where he was the junior varsity quarterback last season; running back Fred Adams, a transfer from Zephyrhills Christian Academy who also lines up as a slot receiver and corner back on defense; and returner Jakobe Campbell, a wide receiver and defensive back.

In the first three preliminary games, Colella threw for seven touchdowns, hooking up with Adams, who also can line up as a slot receiver, for four of those scores. Also catching touchdown passes were solid returners Campbell, Lawrence Graham and Maddox Rivera.

"We've got to try to get to know each other; to build trust on and off the field," Colella said of the early connection he seems to have with Adams.

As for why he transferred, Colella replied, "I'm more comfortable at Zephyrhills."

Among Zephyrhills' other players who stood out in the weekend series was safety Fred Maixner, a rising junior who had an interception of East Lake quarterback Jake Bechtel early in that matchup. He said he has plenty to work on over the summer as Zephyrhills competes in various 7-on-7 tourneys.

"I want to learn how to scan the field and how to lead a team," Maixner said.

As for Cypress Creek, new quarterback Jack Niemann, last year's junior varsity starter, is replacing two-year varsity starter Owen Walls. Niemann and wide receiver Shawn Smith hooked up for a few good pass completions.

"The speed of the (varsity) players and the defenses being able to draw coverage is the hardest part," Niemann said, noting that he needs to work on reading defenses better.

Smith feels that Niemann already has made significant gains, even since the spring football jamboree in May.

"His reads are crazy," Smith said. "Even if I don't get the ball I know it's going to a good place. He's starting to get comfortable, like trusting his receivers and airing it out by throwing to where they're going to be and not where they are."

Added Aman Patel, Cypress Creek's offensive coordinator, "He can make every throw, but he still has some learning to do. He's got to get the speed of the game down."

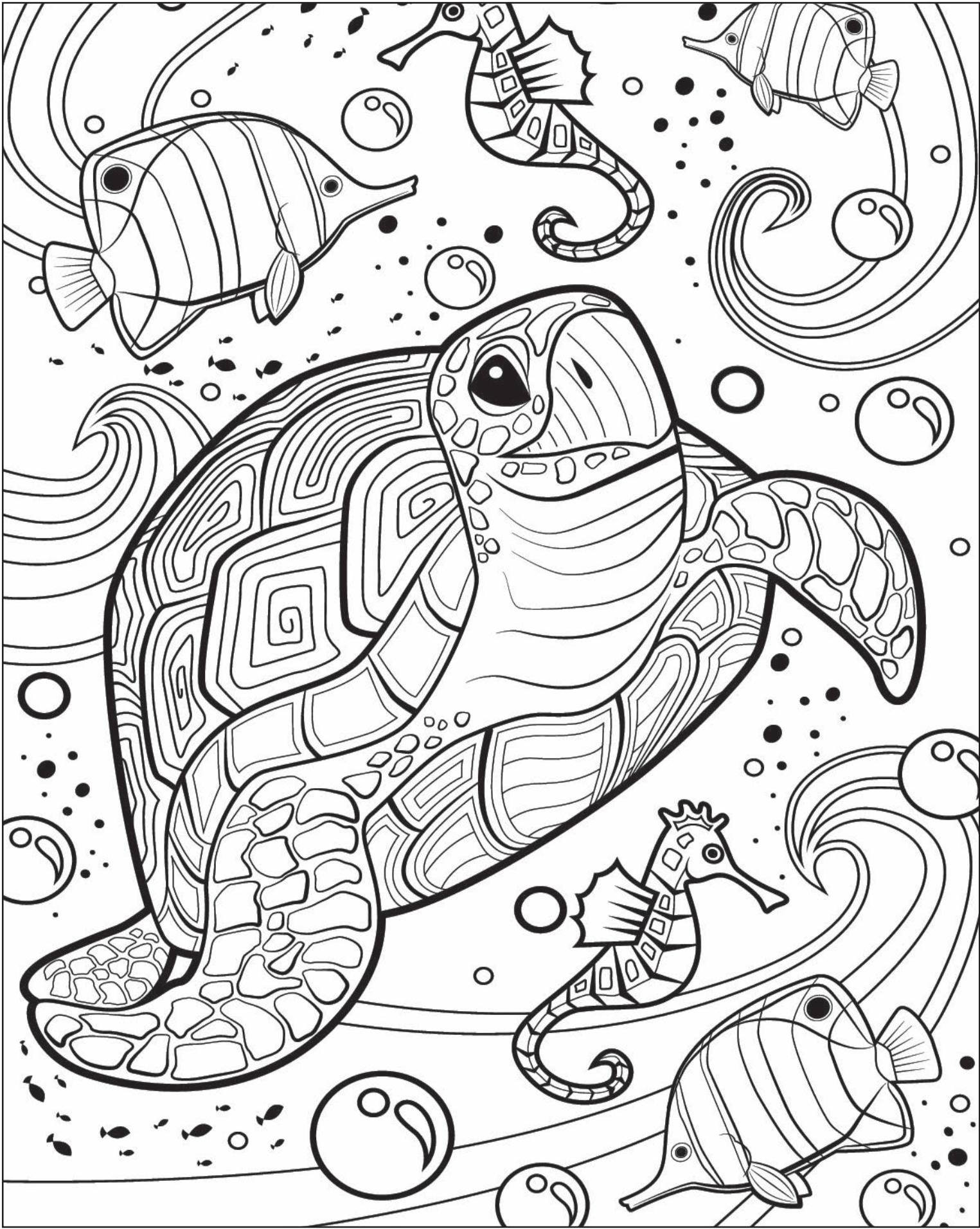

served as the mater of ceremony, explained the Elks' historical ties to the flag and unwavering efforts to promote that national symbol of freedom. "Our flag is, at once, a history, a declaration and a prophecy," he said of a holiday celebrated by the Elks since 1907.

Nick Schwob, the local chapter's secretary, spoke

some about the history of the stars and stripes and what it means for life, liberty, happiness and peace.

"The price of liberty is eternal vigilance," Schwob said, noting that "it has been repurchased by each succeeding generation and must be rewon again, again and again until the end of time, lest it too shall pass like the ancient empires of Greece and Rome."

Madeline Starnes, a rising senior and the command sgt. major who oversees the Zephyrhills JROTC Honor Guard, lists the Flag Day Ceremony at the Zephyrhills Elks Lodge 2731 as one of several ways to "help the community. On Flag Day we give back and we're helping the Elks do their thing."

Taking down worn American and POW flags on a tall mast in front of the Elks building at the beginning of the ceremony were Zephyrhills JROTC members Aiden Macumber and Mitchell Risner. They unfurled new flags to take the place of the ones they took down.

Joining that duo by bringing various flags inside to be set in stands were fellow JROTC members Ellena McPratney, Alyssa Carlton, Ashton Baker and Starnes.

The evolution of the flags were on display, symbolizing various periods of our history.

From the founding of Jamestown, Va., in 1607 until 1775, the flag of England was flown. In 1775, the Pine Tree Flag was adopted for the colonies.

In 1777, however, Congress decided on a more suitable banner for the new country. It was a flag of 13 alternating red and white stripes with a blue field in the corner containing 13 white stars, recognizing the 13 colonies. Then came the so-called Betsy Ross Flag making the stars five points instead of six like they had been.

The flag design stayed the same from 1818 until 1907 with 28 stars added to represent 28 new states. More stars were added as more states formed and in 1959 Alaska and Hawaii were added to create the 50-star flag of today.

Having served overseas, Cliff Moffett, president of the Zephyrhills Museum of Military History, noted that the American flag is recognized worldwide.

"Anywhere you go, every country recognizes the American flag," he said.

Earlier outside the Elks building and before the lowering and raising of flags by the Zephyrhills JROTC, a 21-gun salute and the playing of taps were displayed by the Zephyrhills VFW 8154 Honor Guard.

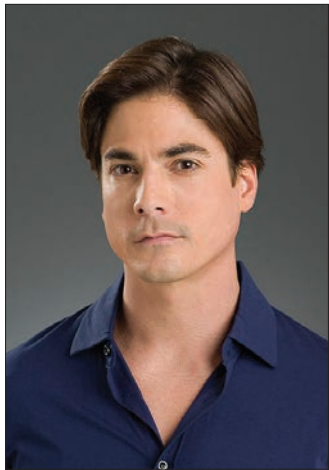

Class of 2022 has its commencement ceremony at the University of South Florida's Yuengling Center

The Zephyrhills High School commencement ceremony returned to its traditional format this year. On June 9, the Class of 2022 celebrated its graduation at the University of South Florida's Yuengling Center.

Graduations for the east Pasco school had been held at that 10,411-seat arena before a two-year hiatus due to the coronavirus pandemic. The classes of 2020 and 2021 graduated with some attendance limitations on Tom Fisher Field at Bulldog Stadium.

"The best part is that all their family can be here and hearing all the cheering," assistant principal Matt Hayes, a Zephyrhills High graduate, said about a return to the USF campus in Tampa.

Dr. Christina Stanley, Zephyrhills High's principal, echoed that sentiment.

A fond remembrance, she added, was not having to be as concerned about Covid as seniors. It was somewhat of a return to normalcy.

"We didn't have to worry about being quarantined and possibly missing something important to us, just because of who we sat next to in class," Poe said. "We were able to have our family and friends at our important activities to support us and cheer us on."

As for the future, the class speakers spoke highly of their classmates.

Valedictorian Alyssa Perez has no doubt about this class achieving anything they want to, noting that there will be some trial and error.

"We will achieve great things, but we will also fail," she said. "However, what we choose to do with that failure will determine our success. Do not give up. I know it is cheesy, but I promise you if you want something bad enough and you work hard enough you can and will achieve it."
