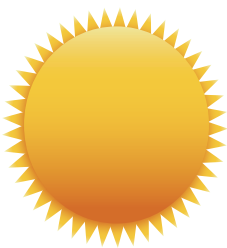

Following a year hiatus stemming from the coronavirus pandemic a special celebration is brought back

Not since 2019 had a Flag Day Ceremony been held at the Zephyrhills Elks Lodge 2731. That longstanding tradition, however, was revived on Monday at the local chapter off Wire Road.

The celebration, complete with Zephyrhills High School's JROTC presenting the colors and some keynote

speakers in addition to Elks members, took place for the first time in two years. Restrictions due to the coronavirus pandemic prevented it from occurring last June.

"They're looking forward to it," Sgt. Mike Smith, who along with Jimmy Mcauley oversees the school's JROTC program, said before the June 14 ceremony. "It's the first thing we've done for the community since COVID."

While the JROTC program was literally shut down from competitions for more than a year, cadets did participate in a flag retirement ceremony at Oakside Cemetery this past February. Capt. James Laferriere was part of the ceremony in February as well as the Flag Day event at the Elks.

A Look Back ...

JUNE 17, 1999

New series harkens back to days gone by. Let's look at the above date

This week's Look Back is the sixth in our series. The year we selected is 1999 and there was plenty going on that week. A longstanding tradition was Flag Day at the Zephyrhills Elks Lodge with a photo of Zephyrhills High's JROTC cadets changing out an American flag.

Other stories on the cover featured summer storms. There was a photo of damage to a lanai and carport in Spanish Trails West after a storm. The top story centered on a flash flood from that storm with a Zephyrhills Police Officer rescuing a mother and child from a flooded car at U.S. 301 and Fort King Road.

Mike Marshall, a former Cy Young Award winner as a major league pitcher who retired in Zephyrhills and passed away last week, dealt with noise complaints while he coached young ballplayers on his property.

Zephyrhills City Council President Liz Geiger called for the enforcement of Roberts Rules of Order in chambers. Council meetings in the previous weeks had been anything but orderly. In an item that most saw coming the Zephyrhills Fire Department became unionized in a unanimous vote.

Page Two, as it was called, centered on the police beat and local group meetings and announcements. A milestone page included new babies, Holly Wight, whose parents resided in Gem Estates, being promoted to a U.S. Air Force Major and Meals on Wheels receiving a check from a sorority.

Back then there was a two-page special section of the paper for news about neighboring Wesley Chapel. In that zone the top story focused on two men allegedly impersonating law enforcement officers.

A Wesley Chapel woman was pulled over at night in her truck off Boyette Road by two men she thought were Pasco Sheriff's Deputies. When she got home and told her husband he called the sheriff's office to complain and two days later it was confirmed that the men were imposters and residents were alerted to watch out for them.

In school news there was a talent show at Weightman Middle and schoolchildren at

Airport runway extension is under way

The city hopes to attract larger aircraft to the municipal airport, but there are multiple steps before that can happen

The extension is under way. The \$6.4 million project got an April 15, 2021 Notice to Proceed. A \$5.9 million state appropriation from FY 2018-19, together with a \$600,000 contribution from the city in the FY 2020-21 Budget have the runway extension, taxiway and lighting, as well as an access road on the south side of the airport underway. The tentative completion date is February of 2022.

Upon its completion, Runway 1/19 will then be 6,200 feet, the extension being 1,200 feet. That will allow for 15 larger types of aircraft to use the runway, primarily C-II Class. It does not mean that suddenly there will be dozens of aircraft waiting to use the runway.

"The runway extension is one step of many to get us the ability to accommodate larger aircraft and be a destination point," Airport Manager Nathan Coleman said.

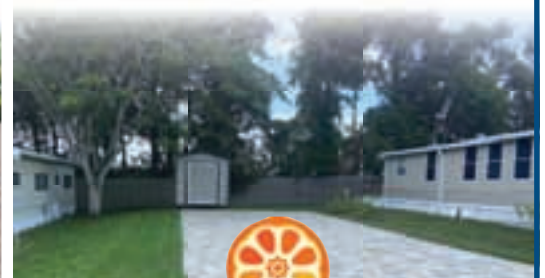

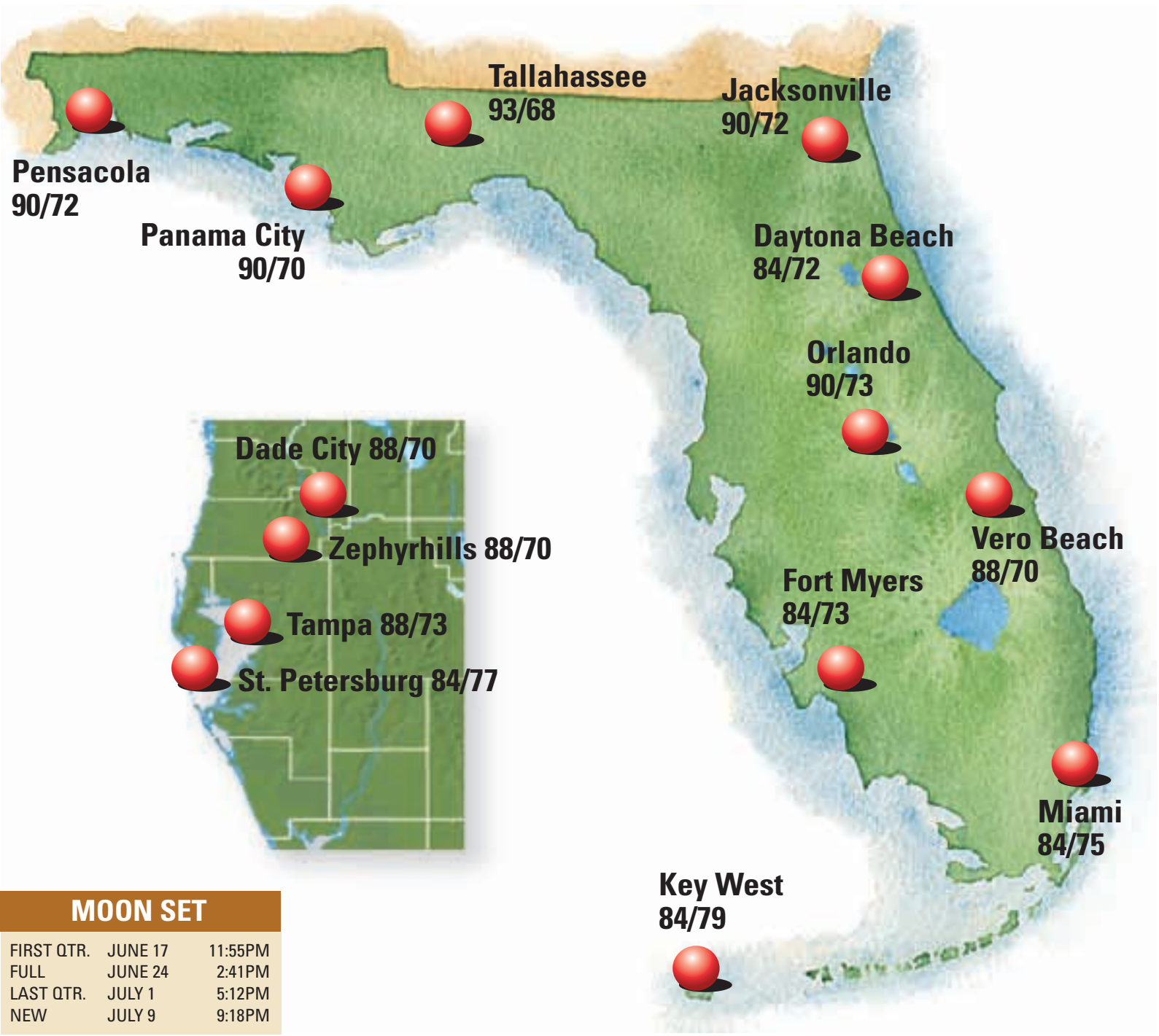

He was persecuting the believers of Christ. However, the Lord returns after his ascension to heaven, strikes Saul down, and asks him: Why are you persecuting me? And Saul asks back: "Who art thou, Lord?" The Lord says: "I am Jesus whom thou persecutest" (Acts 9). Right then, **Saul asks the Lord, What will you have me to do? Saul is now ready to do God the Father's will.** God chose Saul, also known as Paul, to be the apostle of his grace, and to be a chosen vessel to bear the Lord's name before all men. The Lord would show unto him how great things he would suffer for Christ's namesake. God committed unto Paul the revelation of the mystery for this present dispensation of grace, to reveal the accomplishments of Christ's death and resurrection on Calvary's cross. Christ came into the world not only to be Israel's redeemer and king according to prophecy, but Christ came into the world to save sinners, of whom Paul was to be a pattern of God's saving grace to all men and nations, with no works involved for man's salvation, which was a mystery, hid in God from before the foundation of the world (Rom. 16:25-27; Eph. 3).

NOW, the message of grace for all people: **Christ died on the cross to pay for our sins, he was buried, and he rose from the dead on the third day for our justification** (1 Corinthians 15:3-4). Will you believe God? If so...He will give unto YOU the forgiveness of your sins and eternal life in heaven. **Ephesians 2:8-9: "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: It is the gift of God. Not of works, lest any man should boast."**

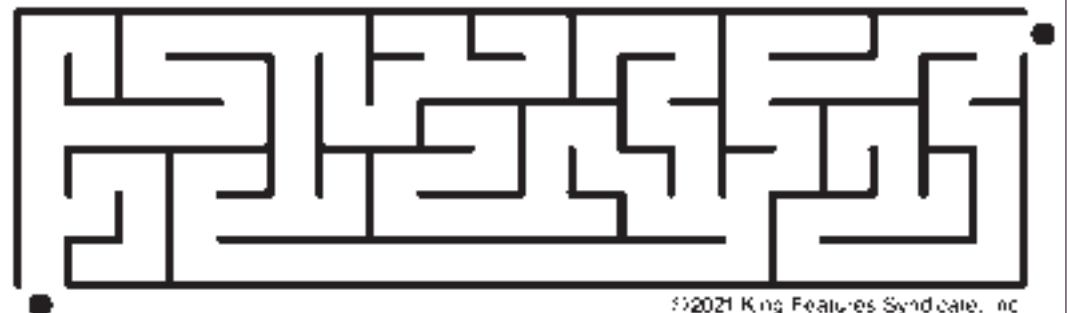

What seniors should know about herbal medicines

A lifelong commitment to healthy living can improve life expectancy and quality of life while reducing a person’s risk for various conditions and diseases, including cancer and heart disease. Healthy lifestyle choices like eating a nutritious diet and exercising regularly can greatly reduce a person’s risk for various ailments, but such choices don’t eliminate that risk entirely. As a result, even health-conscious men and women may need to rely on medication to stay healthy. That’s especially true for seniors since age is a risk factor for various conditions.

A 2014 analysis that appeared in the Archives of Gerontology and Geriatrics examined nearly 1,300 published articles that focused on the use of herbal supplements by elderly patients. Though only 16 of those articles met the researchers’ criteria, the analysis concluded that herbal supplement usage is common among elderly patients, as was a lack of dialogue about such supplements between medical professionals and seniors. A concerted effort to initiate such dialogue on the part of both patients and health care providers can help shed light on herbal medicines so people taking them, including seniors, can learn more about what they’re putting into their bodies.

What are herbal medicines?

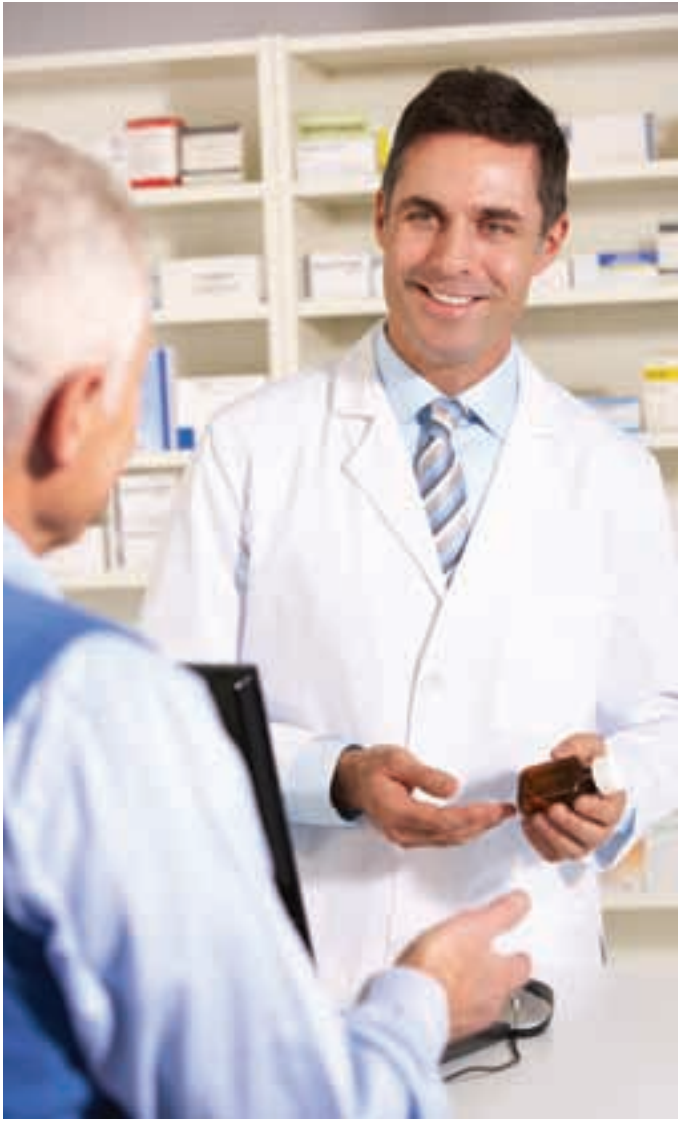
The National Health Service of the United Kingdom, a widely respected and publicly funded health care system, describes herbal medicines as those with active ingredients made from

plant parts like leaves, roots or flowers. Because herbal medicines are made from plant parts, many people assume they’re safe to take without consulting a physician. However, the NHS urges people to treat herbal medicines with the same care and respect as they would more conventional medicines. Herbal medicines can affect the body in various ways. A frank discussion with a physician can shed light on the potential side effects of herbal medicines and whether or not they’re safe.

Why should seniors be concerned about herbal medicines?

The NHS notes that seniors taking other medications may experience problems if they begin taking herbal medicines as well. The National Center for Complementary and Integrative Health, which is part of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, notes that more well-designed studies are necessary to fully evaluate interactions between herbal medicines and prescription drugs. However, the NCCIH notes that some evidence points to some harmful effects of mixing the two. For example, the NCCIH reports that prolonged exposure to concentrated garlic extracts may reduce the efficacy of some drugs. The potential for these types of interactions should be enough to compel seniors to think twice before taking herbal medicines without first consulting their physicians. In addition, the NHS has developed a list of various types of people for whom herbal medicines may not be suitable, and that list includes the elderly.

Seniors considering herbal medicines should discuss the pros and cons of such products with their physicians prior to taking anything.

On Monday, under Laferriere’s guidance, cadets Jaden Roberts, Austin Lewis, Jacob Tepper and Woodson Stuckey lowered United States and POW / MIA flags and replaced them with new ones, folding each as people gathered outside near the flag pole. Inside, Paul Nutting, the local chapter’s exalted ruler, served as the master of ceremonies before a late afternoon lunch.

“The Elks are distinctively American and intensely patriotic,” he said, adding, “This ritual is being done in every lodge in the country and has been for years. To be an Elk is to be an American citizen who lives for their country. We love our country and its flag. This is just one way we show that love.”

Nutting introduced key Elks members, flag historian David Moyer and Cliff Moffett, president of the Zephyrhills Museum of Military History. He also welcomed to the podium former mayor Cliff McDuffie, Randy Maggard, State Representative of District 38, and Dan Pash from the office of Congressman Gus Bilirakis.

In perhaps the most touching part of the ceremony, Maggard got a bit emotional when recalling the military funerals he’s been to in which the American flag plays a significant role in the service.

“It kills me,” he said of witnessing a folded American flag being handed to a surviving relative. “It would make any man cry.”

Heartfelt moments like that tend to bring our strong patriotism in some Americans. Count Moffett and McDuffie among that group.

Moffett recalled a time from years ago when he was serving in the Navy aboard the USS Dubuque when it was docked in the port of Hong Kong. While on land he encountered a couple from the U.S. who approached and asked if he was on the American transport ship out in the harbor.

Moffett, who described the flag as “an emblem of our unity,” recalled the couple approaching him and saying, “We saw the American flag flying on an American ship and we felt safe.”

McDuffie, who showed up in a shirt designed as an American flag, is a proud patriot and was happy to be part of the special event.

“I bought this shirt after 9-11. I’m about as patriotic as anybody you’ll find,” said the retiree, noting that he would still fight for this country.

As for the tradition of the flags during the annual Elks event, eight flags reflecting various key moments in American history were brought into the building and placed on a stand one-by-one by the four JROTC cadets.

Each flag was described for its special meaning and later an American flag was folded 13 times, taking on the appearance of a cocked hat, similar to one worn by General George Washington, the nation’s first president.

There are two factors in play. One is that these larger craft have to have a reason to land at Zephyrhills Municipal Airport. The second is that there are other projects that need to be completed.

"Are they going to Wesley Chapel for meetings, have kids or themselves in a tournament at SVB, is it a corporate jet with business at the airport," Coleman asked. "This is what we have to figure out. Once we get these amenities and have the infrastructure, we will be able to accommodate these larger aircraft."

Why would a C-II aircraft want to bring its 16-18 passengers to Zephyrhills, as opposed to Tampa International or another regional airport? What sort of attractions are at the airport or near the airport to attract it? The city is trying to move on that. SVB should be a major draw as it continues to grow and the city is courting a number of options that would develop the land around the airport to attract more manufacturing and even retail. It is not an overnight process.

Neither is item two. Item two is the subsequent steps that have to be taken in order to truly and publicly allow these larger C-II aircraft to land on Runway 1/19. Runway 19 can also be Runway 1 depending on how the aircraft approaches the runway. If the craft comes in from the north, they are looking at the 19 on the runway. If their approach is from the south, it's Runway 1. Similarly, the other runway that runs more or less southwest to northeast is either Runway 5 or Runway 23. The 1,200-foot runway extension is going at the south end of Runway 1/19. It is the first but not the only step to preparing a runway suitable for C-II aircraft.

Two other projects need to happen. First, 6th Avenue needs to be moved north about 350 feet. There's a technical term called, "displaced threshold," basically a stretch of runway that can't be landed on; a variance, if you will. There is a displaced threshold at both ends of Runway 1/19. It's indicated by the vertical white stripes or "piano keys." In effect, it shortens the runway and so the city sought to acquire the land south of the runway in order to mitigate this. The "protection zone" at the south end of the runway was taken care of with a \$725,000 grant from the Department of Transportation (DOT) in 2012. The 24-acre purchase was added to recently when the city purchased an additional 1.29 acres from Paul Corias of Sun State Aluminum.

Tall trees in that area shorten the runway by compromising the angle of approach. Now with the property under their control, the city can remove the trees and utilize the full length of the runway. Now, on to the north side. Sixth Avenue presents the same kind of obstacle, albeit with vehicular traffic instead of trees. Sixth Avenue will have to be moved 350 feet to the North. That project is not quite in focus, yet.

"There's no budget set and we have to figure out what the new alignment will be," Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. said. "There are a number of options on how to accomplish it but a big issue is that the city doesn't own the land. Right now, we're focusing on getting the runway done. At some point we will have to relocate sixth avenue."

The next step is runway strengthening. The current landing strip is only rated for the lighter B-II aircraft. B-II aircraft weigh about 60,000 pounds or less. The current Runway 1/19 is not rated for anything heavier. Engineers will have to take a core sample of the runway and determine

what needs to be strengthened. Does it need thicker asphalt? Will it need a deeper limerock subgrade? These are questions that have to be answered and remediated before the airport can publicize that they are online for C-II aircraft.

"(Runway strengthening) is something we just started talking about," Poe said. "The cost and time-frame are unknown at this point."

Further additions like a control tower and ARFF or Accelerated Rescue Firefighting Facility are desirable but not prerequisite to opening Runway 1/19 for use by C-II aircraft.

To address the elephant in the room, why these things weren't taken care of before the extension - the answer is basically the availability of funding. The time was ripe for procuring a state appropriation for the runway extension and the city had to move on it. They didn't have the luxury of waiting for the strengthening and moving of 6th Avenue to be completed first. Would they have preferred to do it another way? One can only speculate. Yet, the steps are being completed, it's just that there are more than just the extending of Runway 1/19.

Proposal for Hercules Park debated at public workshop

Kimley Horn representatives made a presentation for the city-owned property and issues arose over a BMX track and a pool

Preliminary discussions began last Thursday night in council chambers at city hall on the fate of Hercules Park. The densely wooded 12-acre tract with a retention pond and an open field where a pool once was is owned by the city.

Representatives James Pankonin and Chris Cianfagione from Kimley Horn, a planning and design consulting firm based in Sarasota, made an initial presentation at a public workshop. It outlined potential use for the site with a BMX track, as well as a pool that is not part of the recommendations, stirring the most debate.

Either way, council members and the city's recreation committee concurred with Gail Hamilton, director of the Community Redevelopment Agency, that it must be impressive enough for local residents to enjoy and draw people from outside the area.

"We want to create something at Hercules that is different than anything we have (in the city)," Hamilton said. "Don't forget, great cities have great parks."

Melanie Monson, president of the Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce, echoed that sentiment: "We want to make sure we maintain it and make it beautiful. I think we're on the right path. Find a way to do this and make it amazing."

A proposal from Kimley Horn, which has designed numerous parks and recreation areas throughout the state including parts of the Tampa Riverwalk and Sims Park in New Port Richey, featured a BMX track but not a swimming pool that some people have been clamoring for on social media.

Council members, Mayor Gene Whitfield,

members of the recreation committee and some local residents then offered their opinions on the proposal. As for funding, city manager Billy Poe said it was much too early in the process to discuss costs and that there were grants available, along with money from the CRA and city's general fund.

While there already is a BMX track at Veteran's Memorial Park, the proposed layout at the Hercules area would take up 5.3 acres. Aside from Hamilton, who said, "These kids riding their bikes, they're looking for something to do," most feedback, called for a scaled-down version and exclusion of the track.

"That's my least favorite part of this thing," councilman Ken Burgess said of the track.

Councilman Lance Smith noted that an alternative to the BMX track could be wooded picnic areas.

Council members and the mayor also mentioned the importance of public bathrooms with Knight agreeing with Smith on excluding the BMX track. Instead, he said, "I wouldn't mind seeing a nice band shell out there."

Sims Park in New Port Richey has a band shell, which is often used during festivals in that area.

The former pool, which had once been home to the Zephyrhills High swim team as well as various programs for children and adults, has since been removed. Poe and council members recommended keeping the pool off the drawing table.

"There's a reason the county didn't keep the pool," councilman Charlie Proctor said. "It's because they couldn't afford to maintain it or any aspect of it."

Councilman Ken Burgess, like others, noted that the pool is likely cost prohibitive. He did, however, like the shaded area near the retention pond.

In addition to the BMX track, other design elements included sidewalks and bike lanes, a playground, educational signage and public art. Council members and the mayor also noted that a water element should be a must.

"We are the city of pure water, guys," Smith said. "We need to have a water feature."

Zephyrhills Christian Academy brings in Tim Maple from Pasco to coach baseball and wrestling

Just because seasons are officially over for high school teams does not mean there is a lull in sports. Locally, there were spring football games in May at six area schools and now there is movement on the coaching front.

James Aguilera, a 1995 Zephyrhills graduate and former weightlifter, helped as a volunteer assistant in that sport for the boys and girls in recent years. This past season, he coached the Anclote boys team, which had three district champions and two state qualifiers. Now he is the boys coach at his alma mater.

Meanwhile, former Pasco wrestling coach Tim Maple will coach that sport at Zephyrhills Christian Academy, where he coached baseball near the end of last season. Maple, who previously was a longtime assistant at Pasco before head coach Mark D'Agustino took over at ZCA, now follows his former partner at that school.

At Zephyrhills, Aguilera replaces Chris Barrick, who coached the boys weightlifting team for six seasons but recently moved back to his home state of Texas. Barrick took over for Greg Mathis with Aguilera previously an assistant under Mathis.

"He's real passionate about it. He'll do a good job for us," said athletic director Bruce Cimorelli, Aguilera's coach back then. "I used to pick him up every morning to make sure he'd be in school."

"It's a great opportunity to come back to the school that did so much for me," Aguilera said. "I was just a one-sport athlete. That's why I'm so passionate about it."

Joe Rinaldo is looking forward to Aguilera taking on the

head coaching role. Rinaldo, the girls weightlifting coach at Zephyrhills, noted that Aguilera helped out as a volunteer assistant and served as a judge at many of the Bulldogs' meets.

"As the girls coach I'm excited just to have him around," Rinaldo said. "We can feed off each other. One thing that's unmistakable about James is the guy bleeds orange and black. Clearly it's in the bloodline of the family. It's passed down to Maddie."

Madison Aguilera, James' daughter and 2021 graduate, lifted for Rinaldo's team. She is a 2020 state qualifier who this season won conference and district titles.

For his part, Aguilera is equally excited to work with Rinaldo. He is well acquainted with Rinaldo since he was at so many girls meets serving as what he described as a "slash mentor, father and coach" to his daughter.

"Me and Joe, we work good together," he said. "We want nothing but the best for the Bulldogs, the girls and the boys teams."

As for Maple, he actually coached the ZCA baseball team for the last six games of the season. The Warriors had their only win in the final game.

Maple coached several San Antonio Dixie League baseball teams to several championships over the years. His son Talon, who will be a freshman at ZCA and has been at that school since he was a sixth-grader, played on those teams.

Maple, who has turned down previous overtures to coach at that private school, finally relented so he could coach and watch his son wrestle and play baseball.

"They offered me the job (initially to coach wrestling) a couple of years in a row, so I finally took it," Maple said. "My son doesn't want to leave (ZCA) and I just don't want to miss any more of his matches."

As for coaching baseball in the spring following the winter season as a wrestling coach, Maple feels it is an easy transition.

"I go straight to baseball for Dixie anyway, so it's going to be the same," he reasoned.
