Hurricane Season just around the corner for Florida

As summer draws nigh, so does the potential for hurricanes and other storms that could threaten Florida and Zephyrhills

The word "hurricane" comes from the ancient Taino word "hurkan," meaning big or great wind. The Taino were the original inhabitants of the West Indian islands in the Caribbean, like Hispanola and present-day Cuba, Jamaica and Puerto Rico. Those ancient islanders had to deal with the threat of hurricanes every summer-fall and they did not have the luxury of satellite imagery and oftentimes obsessive news media coverage of tropical storms and hurricanes. Hurricane Season in Florida starts June 1 and extends through the beginning of November with the peak season in the months of August and September.

Last year (2021) saw 21 named storms. Storms are named when they display a rotating circulation pattern and have wind speeds of 39 miles per hour. The 2021 season saw seven hurricanes and four major hurricanes eight had a direct impact on the United States. The 2022 Atlantic Hurricane Season forecast, according to AccuWeather, will have between 16 and 20 named storms, between six and eight hurricanes, between three and five major hurricanes, between four and six directly impacting the United States.

Tropical storms develop into hurricanes when their winds hit 75 miles-per-hour. Category 1 hurricanes sustain winds up to 95 miles-per-hour, Category 2 hurricanes reach wind speeds up to 110 mph, Category 3 hurricanes up to 129 mph and the dreaded Category 4 can sustain a maximum windspeed of 156 mph.



Naming storms is an interesting process. There are 21 names selected randomly and alphabetically, omitting the letters: Q, U, X, Y and Z. Names alternate between male and female names. The names for the 2022 season are: Alex, Bonnie, Colin, Danielle, Earl, Fiona, Gaston, Hermine, Ian, Julia, Karl, Lisa, Martin, Nicole, Owen, Paula, Richard, Shary, Tobias, Virginie and Walter. Every six years the names repeat, excepting storm names that caused a great deal of damage, like Katrina in 2005. Those names are retired.

Here are some important terms to keep an eye on while tracking a storm.

Tropical Storm Watch: Tropical storm con-

ditions are possible in the area.

Hurricane Watch: Hurricane conditions are possible in the area.

Watches are issued 48 hours in advance of the anticipated onset of tropical storm force

Tropical Storm Warning: Tropical storm

conditions are expected in the area. Hurricane Warning: Hurricane conditions

are expected in the area. Warnings are issued 36 hours in advance of

tropical storm force winds.

Eye: Clear, sometimes well-defined center of the storm with calmer conditions.

Eye Wall: Surrounding the eye, contains some of the most severe weather of the storm

with the highest wind speed and largest precip-Rain Bands: Bands coming off the cyclone

that produce severe weather conditions such as heavy rain, wind and tornadoes. Storm Surge: An often underestimated and

deadly result of ocean water swelling as a result of a landfalling storm, and quickly flooding coastal and sometimes areas further inland.

During a watch, prepare your home and evacuation plan in case a warning is issued.

Watch" denotes a significant chance of storm winds affecting you and your home. During a warning, carefully follow the directions of officials, and immediately leave the area if they advise it. A warning is less severe but it's important to be on the alert in any case.

Storm surge is not a threat to the Zephyrhills area but flooding and high winds certainly

Here are some steps to secure your home during a storm:

Cover all of your windows, either with hurricane shutters or wood. Plylox are small metal clamps that can wedge a piece of plywood into a window frame without drilling into the house. These can be found at local hardware

Although tape can prevent glass from shattering everywhere, be warned that tape does not prevent the window from breaking.

If possible, secure straps or clips to securely fasten your roof to the structure of your home. Make sure all trees and shrubs are trimmed and clear rain gutters.

Reinforce your garage doors.

Bring in all outdoor furniture, garbage cans, decorations, and anything else that is not

If winds become strong, stay away from windows and doors and close, secure and brace internal doors.

There are some things you'll want to stock up on before the onset of hurricane season, as well.

Gas: Make sure your tank is full far in advance of an approaching storm. Most people wait until the last minute, rush to get extra gas for cars and generators, and subsequently gas stations can run out early. Gas also does not have a very long shelf life. In general, pure gas begins to degrade and lose its combustibility as a result of oxidation and evaporation in three to six months, if stored in a sealed and labeled metal or plastic container. The gas you saved from last hurricane season is probably not very good anymore.

ATMS: Have extra cash on hand in the event no ATMS in your area are accessible or

Cell Phones: Charge your cell phone and limit use after power is out.

A/C: This can be the most uncomfortable side effect of losing power during a storm. Try to prevent as much light from entering and warming the house by covering up your windows on the inside. If you have back-up or battery operated fans, don't run them unless you are in the room. Fans create a difference in perceived temperature but do not cool the room; instead they create a cooling effect by dispersing the heat off your skin.

Water: Fill bathtub and large containers with water for washing and flushing only. Toilets do not operate on electricity, other than to refill the tank. Refilling the tank manually can allow for use of your toilet, even without pow-

Food: Turn your fridge temperature down and/or freeze any food or drinking water that can be frozen if you expect a power outage. Have a cooler with ice packs prepared to cool your drinks and snacks after power has been out for more than 4 hours. Freezing tupperware containers of ice and moving them into a refrigerator with no power, can keep the temperature cooler longer, in the event of an outage. Now is probably a good time to check the expiration dates on your stocked foodstuffs. Canned goods usually last a couple years but it's a good idea to check your stored food supply anyway.

Here are some other items that are recommended to stock up on for hurricane season.

Water (enough to last at least three days) First-aid kit (include any prescription med-

ication you may need)

Personal hygiene items and sanitation

Flashlights (have extra batteries on hand) Battery operated radio (again, have extra bat-Waterproof container with cash and impor-

tant documents

Manual can opener Lighter or matches

Books, magazines, games for recreation Special needs items: pet supplies and baby supplies if applicable

Cooler and ice packs

A plan for evacuation and for if family members are separated

The History Channel

- On June 2, 1865, Confederate Gen. Edmund Kirby Smith, commander of Confederate forces west of the Mississippi, signs surrender terms offered by Union negotiators. The event is regarded as marking the end of the Civil War.
- On June 3, 1956, in Santa Cruz, California, city authorities announced a total ban on rock and roll at public gatherings, calling the music "detrimental to both the health and morals of our youth and community." Similar bans were enacted in Asbury Park, New Jersey, and in San Antonio, Texas, where the city council was fearful of "undesirable elements."
- On June 4, 1896, Henry Ford unveils the "Quadricycle." The 500-pound vehicle had two driving speeds, no reverse, no brakes, rudimentary steering ability and a doorbell button as a horn. It could reach about 20 mph.
- On June 5, 1933, the United States goes off the gold standard, in which currency is backed by gold. All gold coins, gold bullion and gold certificates were to be turned over to the Federal Reserve for the set price of \$20.67 per ounce.
- On June 6, 1683, the Ashmolean, the world's first university museum, opens in Oxford, England. Today, the collection at the Ashmolean Museum of Art and Archaeology ranges in time from the earliest implements of man, made about 500,000 years ago, to 20th century works of art.
- On June 7, 1942, the Battle of Midway -- one of the most decisive U.S. victories in its war against Japan -- comes to an end. The outnumbered U.S. Pacific Fleet destroyed four Japanese aircraft carriers with the loss of only one of its own, the Yorktown.
- On June 8, 1968, James Earl Ray is arrested in London, England, and charged with the assassination of civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. In 1969, Ray pleaded guilty to King's murder. Three days later, he attempted to withdraw his guilty plea, claiming he had been set up as a patsy in a larger conspiracy.

Five kitchen emergencies and what to do

Kitchens are where we come together as families to cook, bake, share meals, and bond. But there are also some dangerous elements, from sharp knives to boiling water, making un-expected accidents in the kitchen fairly com-

"We want your kitchen to be a safe, joyful sanctuary and hope you never experience an accident; Nevertheless, we also want you to know that if an accident does happen, we're here for you at our full-service emergency rooms so you can get back home to create your favorite dishes," said Javier Gonzalez, MD, FACEP, DABT, an emergency physician, clinical toxicologist and medical director with AdventHealth Zephyrhills and AdventHealth Dade City.

Dr. Gonzalez is here to cover five common

kitchen injuries, how they occur and when to go to the ÉR.

Burns are common injuries in the kitchen as you move food in and out of ovens, navigate pots and pans on hot stoves and dodge sizzling oil and boiling water. Did the oven mitt slip as you removed a casserole from a hot oven? Did you forget the handle on your cast iron skillet was still scalding as you absentmindedly picked it up? These are understandable but painful accidents that can happen to the best of us.

To treat a burn at home, first cool the injury site as quickly as possible," instructs Dr. Gonzalez, "use cold water and react quickly to treat it to avoid the injury getting worse."

Go directly to the ER if your burn: has significant blistering; is bigger than the palm of your hand; is causing severe pain; is deep but doesn't hurt to the touch, which could mean the nerves are burned; or Worsens over the next several hours.

Cuts and scrapes

Kitchen cuts and scrapes frequently happen if your knife slips while chopping or slicing or a finger gets in the way while using a grater or zester. Dr. Gonzalez says, "while they're convenient, cooking mandolins used to

quickly slice vegetables can be dangerous, and are the culprit of many kitchen accidents, including lacerations." Use all your sharp kitchen equipment with care.

If there is bleeding, put pressure on the wound right away. Go to the ER: a bandage doesn't cover the area; the bleeding doesn't stop; the injury is over a joint or impairing your ability to move; or the underlying tissue is exposed from the cut.

Eye issues

Cleaning solutions, citrus juice, and hot peppers sometimes make unwanted contact with your eyes, which can be very painful. "First, rinse the affected area with lukewarm water," says Dr. Gonzalez, "milk might work better at neutralizing if the irritant is something like a hot pepper."

Go to the ER if your symptoms are severe, including when: your eyes are very irritated or swollen; your eyes are red or in pain; your vision is impacted; or the issue worsens over

"Falls in the kitchen can happen from slipping on spilled liquids, using step ladders to reach for something high, or simply losing your balance while you're concentrating on the task at hand," cautions Dr. Gonzalez.

Hopefully, you will catch yourself quickly enough to avoid a serious injury, but have someone get you to the ER immediately if you: can't bear weight on the injury; have excessive swelling or obvious deformity; hit your head; or lose consciousness.

Smoke inhalation


You might end up inhaling harmful fumes if you used strong chemicals for cleaning or something that caught on fire. Dr. Gonzalez warns, "inhalation concerns happen more for people who have an airway condition such as asthma or COPD." Treat it at home first with any airway medications you have. Head to the ER if you experience these symptoms: excessive coughing; shortness of breath; or symptoms that worsen or don't get better within a



Founders Day will not be rescheduled

After being cancelled, Founders Day in the future will face more scrutiny, council okays higher condos

This year's Founders Day Festival with a parade and other downtown events was a wash due to the threat of rain. While it never did rain, the day's scheduled activities from 4-9 p.m. with a parade at 7 were cancelled nonetheless.

"We were having volunteers show up at 11 (a.m.) and at 10 the forecast was for thunderstorms and rain," said Gail Hamilton, director of the Community Redevelopment Agency said in a meeting that preceded the city council meeting on Monday night at city hall. "It didn't rain and we didn't have a backup plan ... in hindsight, we should've included the city and

In the future if inclement weather threatens Founders Day, Hamilton recommended that in addition to Main Street Zephyrhills, which organizes the event, city staff and the police department would be included in discussions as well as a contingency plan.

"I think it's important to remember that this is a risk we take with any event," council president Jodi Wilkeson said. "I think they made the best decision with the public at heart."

Added Hamilton, "The volunteers were so incredibly disappointed. They worked months and months in putting this together. A lot of work went out the window when this event was cancelled.'

While city staff received complaints from some residents, councilman Lance Smith was quick to point out that there was not any particular person to blame: "We understand it was a

group of people that made the decision, not just one person."

This year's event will not be rescheduled. It was in jeopardy and already had been pushed back three months due to a conflict with the Pigz N Z'hills BBQ and Blues Festival.

A partnership with Zephyrhills High and the theme to recognize the Class of 2022 helped save Founders Day with the rescheduled date of May 21. Instead, it will return to its traditional time on a Saturday in March.

Hamilton reminded people that years ago the Founders Day celebration was held in September and later pushed back to March due to weather issues.

In the council meeting, a developer's request to increase the height from two stories to four for the Pretty Pond Apartments, along with some accompanying road improvements and landscape buffers, passed 3-2.

"This area of Zephyrhills is not suburbanizing, it's urbanizing," said Clark Hobby, a Tampa attorney speaking on the project's behalf.

"We're exploding," said councilman Ken Burgess, who voted against the higher buildings. "My issue is simply a density thing. We have to look at a way to slow down develop-

Councilmen Alan Knight and Smith mentioned the accompanying road improvements that would include turn lanes and partially funding a roundabout, added only if the height increase was approved.

"That's a pretty good deal and we won't

get that with two stories," Knight said.
In March, city council members voted 3-2 to approve a similar project. The Nick Apartments, planned on nearly 11 acres along Fort King Road between the Summerset Apartments and Valleydale Mobile Home Park, was given the go-ahead to rise from two stories to four.

Also at issue possibly in the future is city officials revisiting regulations of 20 multi-family units per acre. It had been 14. Affordable housing with a higher density could keep young people in the area, some city officials, like Smith, have maintained.

Aside from the density issue, traffic is a concern. Local businessman Kevin Bahr, a member of the planning commission, is among those concerned about growth, specifically more congested roads and water issues. Bahr opposed the higher buildings for both apartment proj-





Keep safe in severe weather

We Fight As One

Florida is known for its diverse weather conditions, often creating potential for hurri-canes, thunderstorms, tornadoes, heavy rain and flash flooding. Atlantic hurricane season is from June 1 through November 30. Pasco Sheriff's Office encourages citizens to prepare now, before a storm affects our area. It's vital to plan before a

storm to ensure you have necessities. Make sure your emergency kit is well stocked with supplies including water, food, prescriptions, first aid items, batteries and other important items.

If you live in a flood-prone or low-lying area, consider having sandbags prepared at the start of storm season to avoid searching for them when a storm is near. Make sure you have copies of important documents, such as insurance information, stored in a waterproof area that you can easily grab in an evacuation. Throughout a storm, follow updates from battery-operated devices in the event of a power loss.

After a storm, many citizens want to start the clean-up process quickly, but be cautious when doing so. Flooded areas may have hidden dangers, such as downed power lines, debris or wildlife lurking inside. Give emergency personnel ample time to clear road-ways of debris before driving, unless absolutely necessary. Be mindful of any curfews in place, and follow them to stay safe. When clearing your own property, be mindful of debris and power lines, and remember to give yourself ample time for breaks while working. Be sure to evaluate your damage carefully and know when to contact authorities for assistance.

PSO's Deployable Emergency Response Team (or DERT) provides aid in emergency situations where traditional resources are not effective. This unit includes specialty vehicles, such as high-water rescue vehicles, humvees, a mobile kitchen and a mobile command bus to establish a command post in a disaster area following a storm, should traditional command posts become unusable or inaccessible. PSO can deploy this equipment to assist in rescuing citizens from flooded areas or to deliver supplies to those areas made inaccessible

by flood waters. DERT achieves this in a self-sufficient manner, to support communities without becoming a burden on

The equipment was obtained through a federal program which allows law enforcement agencies to purchase equipment at a fraction of the cost and provides potentially life-saving equipment to our area. As Pasco County is often prone to flooding and has many rural areas, this equipment can make a difference after a significant tropical storm.

DERT trains monthly to practice efficient setup and ensure all equipment is ready when needed in an emergency. DERT is available to assist when needed, no matter the time of year. While DERT's primary purpose is to serve Pasco County, other agencies can request the support of DERT. In 2018, DERT deployed to Florida's panhandle, following the devastation of Hurricane Michael. They established and maintained an emergency operations center after facilities in the area were destroyed in the storm.

Planning for hurricane season in Florida is vital to ensure our citizens' safety. Preparing in advance of the storm by having resources within PSO allows us to serve our citizens no matter the conditions. PSO is proud to provide our community with specialized units and equipment such as DERT.



HOLLYWOOD -- Oscarwinner Diane Keaton's 55th film, "Mack & Rita," opens Aug. 12. The star of movie classics like "The Godfather" and "Annie Hall" has surrounded herself with three great actresses in her new comedy. First up is 91-year-old Lois Smith, who started her career on the CBS soap "Love of Life" (1951) and appeared in such classics as "East of Eden" (1955), with James Dean; "Five Easy Pieces" (1970), with Jack Nicholson; "Fatal Attraction" (1987), with Michael Douglas and Glenn Close; "Dead Man Walking" (1995), with Sean Penn and Susan Sarandon; and most recently "The French Dispatch" (2001). Also starring with Keaton are Emmy winner Loretta Devine, for "Grey's Anatomy" (2011), and "Hot in Cleveland's" Wendie Malick, most recently in nine episodes of "Young Sheldon."

Will "Top Gun: Maverick" finally push Miles Teller to superstardom? After 19 films -- including "Footloose" (2011) and "Whiplash" (2014) -- is his time at hand? At 35, "Maverick" is his best shot to break through. Teller's personal life has come together nicely, marrying model Keleigh Sperry in 2019. His futuristic sci-fi thriller "Spider-head" (opposite "Thor" himself, Chris Hemsworth), in which they play convicts who volunteer as medical subjects, hits Netflix June 17, and his 21st film, "The Fence," which was to have reunited him with his "Divergent" co-star Shailene Woodley, was postponed due to the death of their other co-star, William Hurt.

Oscar-winner Susan Sarandon, Bette Midler (who has three Emmys, a Grammy and a Tony) and two-time Emmy winner Megan Mullally are joining forces for the feel-good comedy "The Fabulous Four," which will shoot July through September (with a mysterious fabulous fourth?). Sarandon is lending her voice to the superhero animated film "Blue Beetle" and stars with Trace Adkins in the Fox series "Monarch," about a fictitious country-music dynasty. Midler has completed "Hocus Pocus 2," which will drop on The Disney Channel just in time for Halloween. Mullally stars in Hulu's just-released coming-of-age film "Crush" and has the drama "Summering" due in August.

"Father of The Bride" (1950), which starred Spencer Tracy, Joan Bennett and Elizabeth Taylor, was reinvented in 1991 as a star vehicle for Steve Martin and Diane Keaton, and grossed \$129 million. It's being revived yet again, this time starring Andy Garcia and Gloria Estefan. But film buffs will hardly recognize it since it's about a Cuban family, the intended bride proposes to the would-be groom, and her parents have a dark secret to reveal ... they are getting divorced. It hits HBO Max on June 16, and since all that's left of the classic film is the title ... "Everything old is new again!"






Two years after an abbreviated ceremony to honor U.S. veterans, hundreds turn out to Oakside Ceremony

The longstanding tradition of honoring U.S. veterans who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country continued with Monday morning's Memorial Day Ceremony at Oakside Cemetery. Fittingly, that hallowed ground, deeded to the city in 1911, serves as the final

resting place for veterans of six wars.
"It's a beautiful, bright sunshiny day in Zephyrhills, Florida; a day we can all be thankful for," said guest speaker Gene Whitfield, the city's mayor. "We have come here to rededicate this ground as a final resting place."

"Today, as we do every year, we gather to remember those who gave the ultimate sacrifice," added State Senator and keynote speaker Danny Burgess. "Today is about freedom and

Before Monday the last ceremony involving the military and local community was a 9/11 Memorial at Zephyr Park last September. That marked the 20th anniversary of terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center, Pentagon and a plane that crashed in Pennsylvania.

As for the Memorial Day Ceremony, roughly 200 were in attendance this year. That marks a substantial increase from last year's turnout of about 100 and well above the sparse group who came out in 2020.

That year, an abbreviated ceremony was held due to the coronavirus pandemic and rainy weather. Some Memorial Day ceremonies were cancelled in other parts of the nation but Rod Rehrig, past commandant of the U.S. Marine Corps League Detachment 1124 in Zephyrhills, and Whitfield, an avid supporter of the military, led a small group in keeping the ceremony alive.

As for this year, Burgess lauded Whitfield, who formerly served in the National Guard, for his ongoing efforts.

"From being our mayor, Gene Whitfield is embedded in our community and has been for a long time," said Burgess, a major in the U.S. Army Reserves who is originally from Zephyr-

Burgess, who often speaks at the annual ceremony, noted others who helped organize and support the event. Count volunteers who help plant flags on the grounds, scouts who join in that effort as well as a cleanup, and the Zephyrhills High JROTC among that group.

Not to mention local veteran groups that have long been a staple of the community and singer-songwriter Ashley Shannon, who sang the national anthem and had a brother serve in the U.S. Marines.

"It was a community effort and that's what makes this so special," Burgess said. "I look forward to seeing you all again next year."

Former serviceman Larry Pratt, who served in Vietnam and was alongside corporal Jerome Rouse when he was killed as their troop was ambushed, spoke of the importance of never forgetting those who served.

"He was a great kid. I think of him almost every day, certainly on Memorial Day. He's very important to me," Pratt said of Rouse, who was a medical specialist when he died in 1970 at the age of 19. "I hope you think about and pray for somebody who has given their life for our country.'

Among the veterans in attendance was Jay Collins, a Green Beret for 23 years who has since retired and is running for Congress. Collins is a candidate for a state seat in the House of Representatives.

The ceremony hit home for Collins, whose



left leg was amputated as part of the price he paid to serve in the military.

"If we don't protect our country, what are we doing," he asked.
