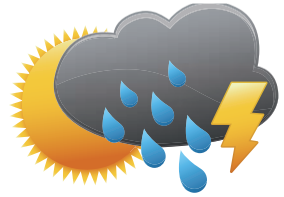

State Appropriations greenlight municipal projects in Zephyrhills

Governor Ron DeSantis' pen approves a trio of appropriations coming to Zephyrhills

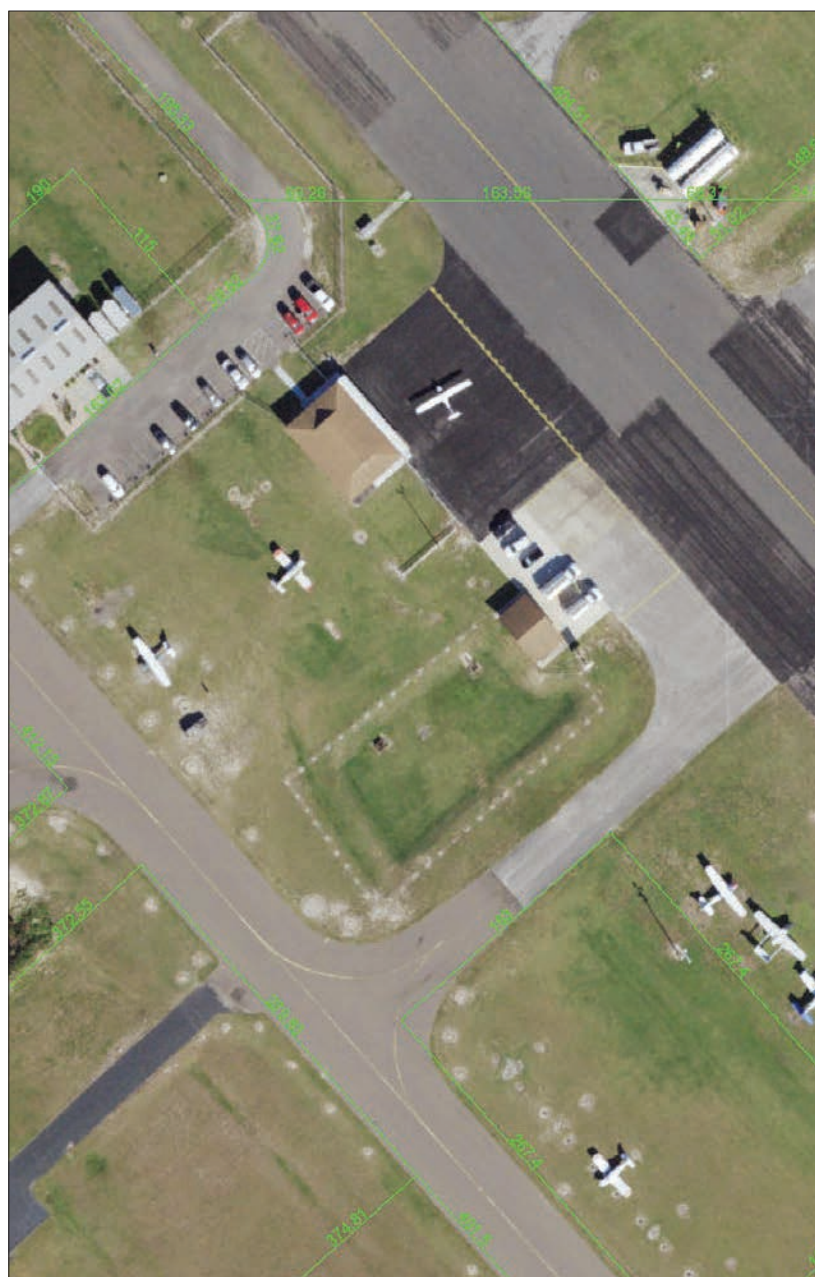
The City of Zephyrhills is receiving \$12.04 million in state appropriations for three infrastructure-related projects, as part of the 2022-23 Florida state budget. Governor DeSantis signed the budget into law on June 2 and the city stands to benefit.

"We try to foster relationships with our local legislators and not just when we're in Tallahassee, asking for things," Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. said. "Fortunate is an understatement. They see what we are trying to do in Zephyrhills and they want to help us."

The first appropriation, in the tune of \$6.6 million, is slated for the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport. Projects at the airport are ongoing. Phase I started as part of a \$5.9 million, 2018-19 state appropriation that did three things: one - it extended Runway 119, two - it extended the taxiway connected to Runway 119, and three - it built an access road on the south side of the airport, off Alston Avenue.

The second project or Phase II was a \$3.2 million, 2021-22 state appropriation for "inherent parking" or jet parking in the northern portion of the airport, just south of the terminal. The airport is turning a grassy area into a concrete or asphalt paved area where jets can park. With that project, the design is complete and it is ready to go out to bid. Poe expects the project to be completed in the next 12 months.

Look back to 1982

The Zephyrhills News begins another annual summer series of looking back to days gone by. The kickoff for the 2022 series incorporates the month of June in 1982

The current editions of *The Zephyrhills News* recently covered the local high school's graduation and flag day for two top news stories with the Bulldogs competing in a 7-on-7 high school football tournament at One Buc Place, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' indoor-outdoor practice facility adjacent to Raymond James Stadium.

The June 10, 1982 edition of the oldest weekly newspaper in Pasco County featured stories along those same lines. On the front page was a color photo — which was rare during that time period — of an American flag. A recent story in *The Zephyrhills News* reported on the annual tradition continuing with American and POW flags exchanged on a mast in front of the Zephyrhills Elks Lodge 2731.

Local and national patriotism reigned on both accounts with last week's tribute proving to be just as symbolic as the photo and humbling words of Woodrow Wilson, the 28th President of the United States, that ran in the local weekly 40 years ago.

A recent story on the Class of 2022, however, offered quite a different perspective from the 1982 Zephyrhills High graduates. The Class of 1982 numbered 236 and the commencement ceremony. That was a record for graduates, surpassing the 234 seniors in the 1980 commencement ceremony.

By comparison, this year's graduation class totaled 339 and took place at the University of South Florida. The Zephyrhills graduation returned to that school's Yuengling

Pasco Town Center to bring jobs/boost economy



965-acre property will include retail, office, hotel, industrial and residential spaces

go-to choice for developers of these high-quality projects."

Pasco Town Center will transform over 4.7 million square feet of industrial and corporate office space. Here's a breakdown:

- Industrial: 4 million square feet
- Office: 725,000 square feet
- Retail: 400,000 square feet
- Housing: 3,500 units
- Hotel: 300 rooms

"Once completed, the county will see an estimated \$100 return for every dollar invested," said commissioner Ron Oakley. "This project is a win-win for east Pasco - bringing new infrastructure and jobs with minimal cost to the county."

The agreement includes a \$55.8 million incentive package, funded mostly through property tax rebates, as certain milestones are met. Columnar Developers will also install key roads and utility connections beyond the Pasco Town Center Property - providing \$70 million in public infrastructure with no direct cost to taxpayers. The project is expected to be completed by December 2028.

It's one of the most ambitious economic growth and employment projects in Pasco County history. The Pasco Board of County Commissioners (BCC) recently approved the Pasco Town Center project - paving the way for 965 acres of industrial, office, retail, hotel and residential spaces. The project, at the southeast corner of I-75 and State Road 52, is expected to create nearly 6,000 jobs and after incentive rebates, is expected to generate at least \$330 million in revenue for the county over the next several decades.

"I'm very excited about the opportunities this project will provide to people in Pasco County," said BCC Chair Kathryn Starkey. "The Pasco Town Center ties in with Pasco's Connected City, and we're proud that Pasco is the

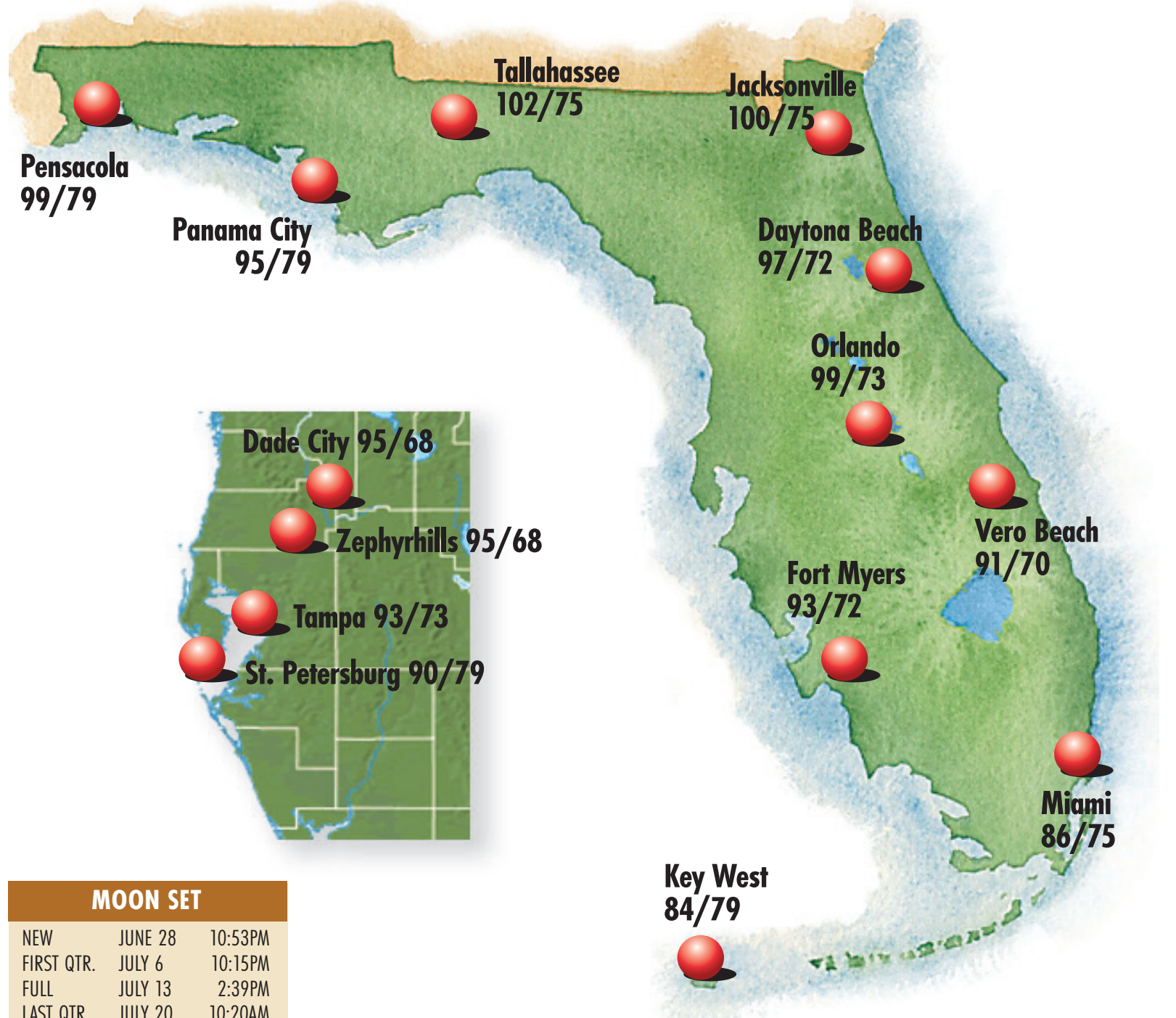

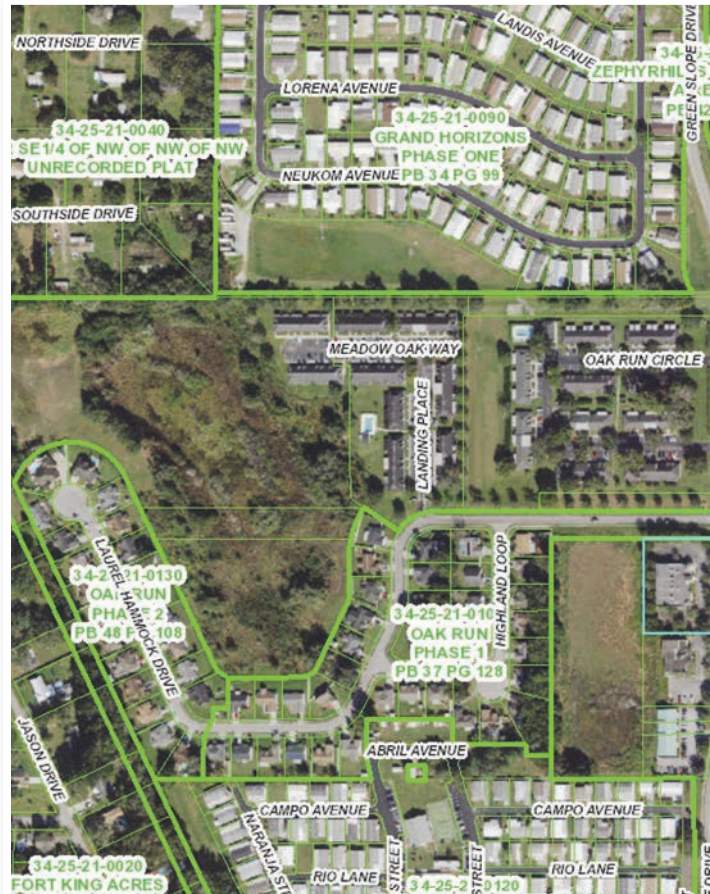

The 2022-23 state appropriation that just passed is designed to: re-build the FBO or terminal, extend Taxiway F and build two box hangars. The Fixed Base Operation or FBO is fancy airport lingo for the "terminal." Currently, it's just offices for staff with minor amenities. The project would create an 8,000-square-foot terminal, either a stand-alone structure or an addition to the current structure.

"The original plan was to build an entirely separate building but with the economy the way it is with cost of materials, labor and lead times, we are looking at the possibility of adding to the existing building," Poe said. "It's fluid how exactly we're going to build the FBO but with the appropriation, we can actually start planning now."

Taxiway F will extend roughly 1,700 feet and connect to the access road built during the Phase I project. The two box hangars will be built to accommodate 16-20 person corporate jets. The city and airport hope to attract more of that type of traffic. Poe mentioned well-known football coaches and politicians that have used the airport in the past and recently. The city wants to attract more of that type of GA or General Aviation.

"Our goal is to be the best GA airport in the area," Poe said.

The second state appropriation provided \$3.5 million to the city for a water and sewer main line extension. This money piggybacks on an earlier phase of the project. Phase I was funded by the federal Build Back Better bill passed in the 2022 legislative session. The \$1.5

million will enable running a sewer main along Otis Allen Road, starting at Wire Road and extending east. Construction has not yet begun. The city is in the design phase right now and will put the project out to bid once the designs complete. The new state appropriation allows the city to embark on Phase II.

Phase II will run a water line for approximately 4,000 square feet from Green Slope Drive (behind the Walmart), west toward Fort King Road. The plan is to tie the new line into an existing one in order to create a "loop" system. A "loop" system allows utilities to provide service to area residents, even when there is a main break somewhere. It equates to fewer customers having an interruption in their service. Several fire hydrants will be added along the water main line. The sewer line will run along Kossick Road from U.S. Highway 301 to Fort King Road - east to west - and from Phelps Road to Simons Road - north to south. The sewer line could take as many as 400 existing septic tanks out of use, connecting them to the municipal line.

The last appropriation provides \$1.9 million for an entrance road connecting the new National Guard facility. The Florida National Guard recently received a \$25 million state appropriation to purchase land and build a training center. They have selected a parcel north of 6th Avenue and South Avenue on the south side of town, north of the airport. The city will use their \$1.9 million to acquire right-of-way land to build the access road, construct the road itself, and install or extend existing water and sewer lines to the subject property.

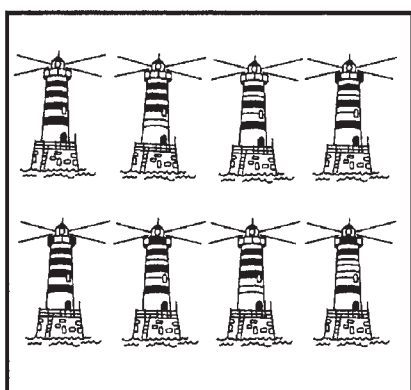

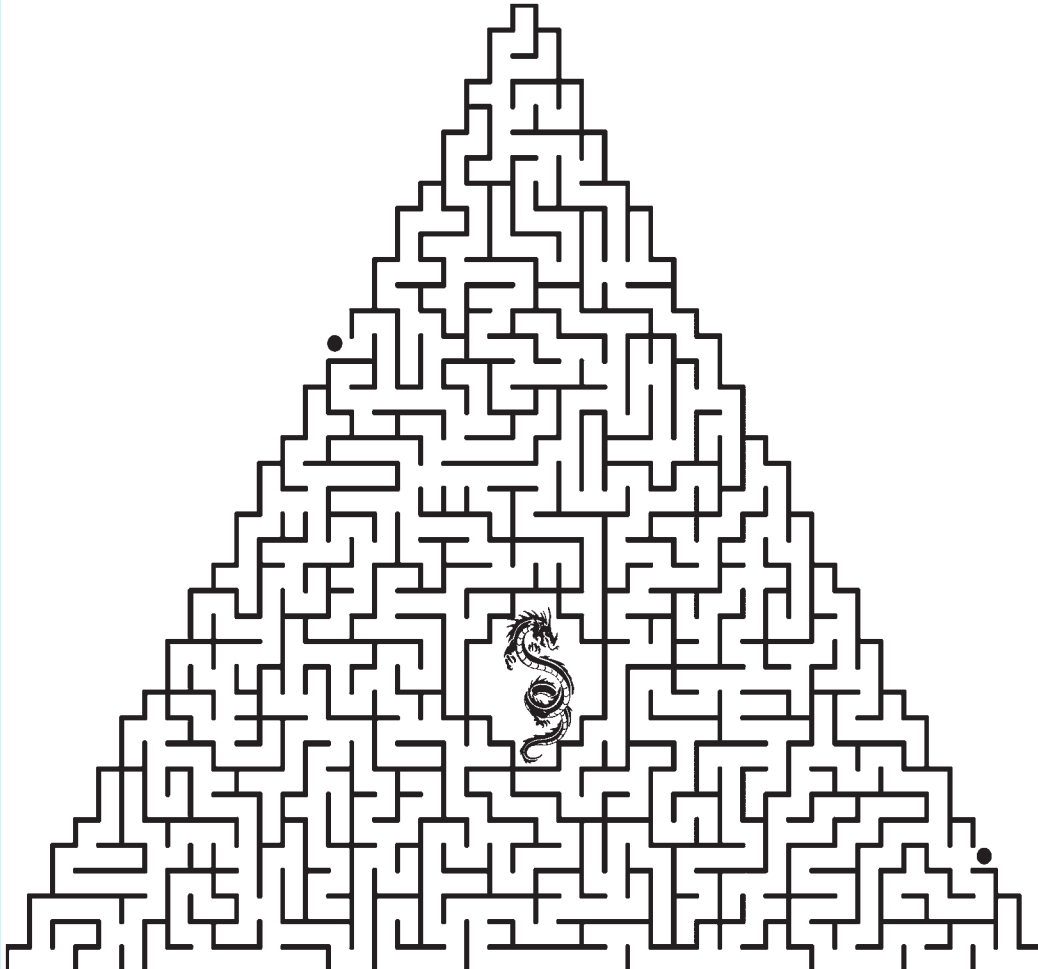

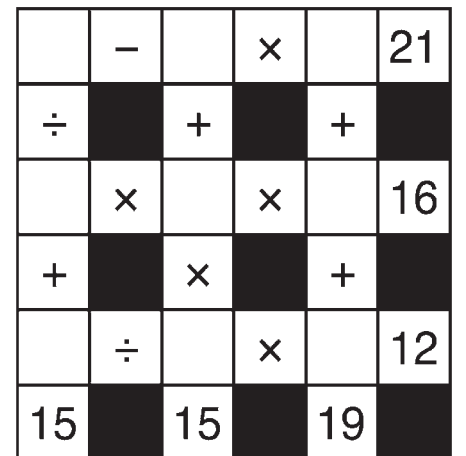

What to expect at a prostate screening

Catching prostate cancer early — before it spreads and while treatments are most effective — can save your life. Usually, your doctor will likely recommend annual prostate screenings for men who are at least 55 years old. However, the baseline can change if you are at a greater risk for the disease.

While these screenings can seem scary if you don't know what to expect, understanding them and what the results mean for your health can go a long way to ease your worries. Dr. Khaled Shahrouh, a urologist at AdventHealth Zephyrhills is here to offer you valuable information you can keep in your back pocket at your next appointment.

What are the risk factors for prostate cancer?
 "It's impossible to predict whether or not someone will develop prostate cancer," says

Dr. Shahrouh. But he says that you can look for certain risk factors that point to an increased chance of getting it, including:

- Age
- Ethnicity
- Exposure to certain chemicals
- Family history
- History of related conditions, such as an inflamed prostate
- Obesity
- Smoking

Dr. Shahrouh explains, "Having one or even several of these risk factors doesn't mean you'll develop prostate cancer. They are simply considerations that will help you and your doctor better gauge when to start your prostate screenings and take a look at your overall health."



How will I be screened for prostate cancer?

There are several tests that could be recommended to help your physician diagnose or rule out prostate cancer. No matter which screening you need, you can relax knowing that none of them are as bad as you think. Your primary care provider may perform one or both of these simple tests.

PSA Blood Test

This blood test checks your level of prostate-specific antigen (PSA). The normal level of PSA for a healthy male under the age of 55 is 2.5 nanograms per milliliter of blood. For men ages 55 to 70, the normal level is less than 3.5 nanograms per milliliter of blood.

"Since no two men are alike, a higher level doesn't necessarily mean you have cancer, and a lower level doesn't mean you're cancer-free. These numbers serve as a baseline for your doctor to determine if further testing is needed," says Dr. Shahrouh.

If you're an older adult male, your primary care physician may perform other lab tests, such as lipid and metabolic panels, at the same time as your routine PSA to screen for other common age-related health issues. You may be required to fast before testing.

Digital Rectal Exam (DRE)

During a DRE, your primary care physician will perform a physical exam, feeling for any nodules, lumps, masses or tenderness on or around your prostate gland. "The DRE exam itself is relatively painless, and the data obtained can be priceless," Dr. Shahrouh explains.

What if my results are abnormal?

Abnormal screening results may indicate you have prostate cancer, or that you need further testing before your physician can make a proper diagnosis. Either way, it's best that you've caught any potential health issues early to stave off future complications.

Zephyrhills heads list of signees from Zephyrhills Christian Academy, Pasco, Wesley Chapel, Wiregrass Ranch and Cypress Creek

While some local high school football players might not recognize the names of several former Pasco County standouts, they surely would like to mirror what they achieved.

Zephyrhills' Ryan Pickett and Ted Wilson; Pasco's Hambrick brothers — Darren and Troy — and Janarion Grant; Wesley Chapel's Greg Jenkins; and Ryan Benjamin of River Ridge all played in the National Football League.

Others, like Zephyrhills' Sederrick Cunningham, along with Wesley Chapel's Ellrie Allen and Pasco's Joey Ivie and Josh Johnson, briefly made NFL rosters but never played with a few spending a bit of time in the Canadian Football League.

Whether two dozen local football players get that far or not has yet to be determined. Either way, they are taking their next steps toward their dreams of one day playing in the NFL. That group from Zephyrhills, Zephyrhills Christian Academy, Pasco, Wesley Chapel, Wiregrass Ranch and Cypress Creek signed scholarships with a few planning to walk on at various universities throughout the country.

That number of local football players making commitments at the next level is more than double than in some recent years. Zephyrhills coach Nick Carroll, who played for the Bulldogs and later at Iowa State, has a good idea why.

"I just think that Florida is a hotbed for football and there's a lot of recruiting here," he said. "This is the second step. Now, they've got to take the same skills (learned in high school) and apply them at the next level."

Tony Egan, who has coached Wesley Chapel for the past six seasons, reasoned that Florida has increasingly become a part of the country that college coaches and scouts have flocked

to in recent years as they continuously strive to fill their rosters.

"Basically, if you're a starting high school football player in Florida you can play anywhere," Egan said, citing the growing number of talented athletes throughout the state.

The Zephyrhills contingent and where they are headed includes: Maguire Neal, University of North Carolina at Charlotte; Jaxson Rivera, Valdosta State; Theotis Smith, North Park; Nick Sheldon, Muskingum; and Jaylin Thomas, Dodge City Community College.

Players from Zephyrhills Christian Academy are: Demetri Whitehead, Seton Hill; Reggie Pry, Lake Erie; Adrian Miller and Austin Henderson, Southeastern; and Dontrevious Jackson, NM Military.

Wesley Chapel's signees are: Jordan McCaslin, Florida State; Ethan Harper, Sebastian Gutierrez, Jaylan Blake and Dylan Chana, Wittenberg; and Nehemiah Morgan, Keiser. That gives the Wildcats six signees.

"Last year, we had a very senior-heavy team, a lot of kids who could compete," said Egan, adding that there easily could have been nine or 10 players from his team moving on.

Four of those Wildcats will continue to be teammates with Ethan Harper, Sebastian Gutierrez, Jaylan Blake and Dylan Chana headed to Wittenberg, a Division III school west of Columbus, Ohio.

"They're all good friends and that's why they went together," Egan said.

Wiregrass Ranch players include: Rocco Becht, Iowa State; Cristian Loaiza and Logan Ridolph, Missouri State; Abram Beer, Ohio Wesleyan; and Corneil Mccrary, Myrtle Beach Academy.

Cypress Creek's group features: Colton Corrao, Air Force; Kione Roberson, Mississippi State; Andrew Burgess and Karl Campbell, College of St. Scholastic; and Dernere Jones, Ave Maria.

Pasco had two: Javon Jeune and Omarion Huffman, Bluffton.

As for the upcoming season each of the local schools must replace some talented athletes with four teams aiming for a return to the postseason. Zephyrhills, Zephyrhills Christian Academy, Wesley Chapel and Wiregrass Ranch are coming off playoff seasons.

SHERIFF NEWLETTER

Protect yourself and your valuables



Burglaries, especially from cars, is often a crime of opportunity and convenience. Taking the time to protect your car and valuables can remove the opportunity for criminals and prevent you from becoming a victim of a car burglary. The 9 p.m. Routine is a great reminder to make sure that you've removed any valuables left in your car and that all doors are locked before heading to bed each night. Pasco Sheriff's Office urges citizens to create a daily practice of checking that they have locked all their doors each night at 9 p.m.

Here are some essential steps to stay safe and prevent these crimes:

Remove any valuables when you get out of your car. Placing valuable items, such as purses, wallets, laptops, backpacks and guns, out of sight still leaves the risk of losing these items if you forget to lock your doors. Get in the habit of taking your belongings out of your car when you leave to ensure your items are safe. Items stolen from cars can often appear in other crimes, such as armed robberies or instances of fraudulent credit card use.

Always close your windows, lock your car doors and enable your car's alarm, if equipped, when leaving your car. Thieves can work quickly and car burglaries can occur even if you leave your car for just a moment. Additionally, leaving your door unlocked can give criminals easy access to things like your garage door opener, which provides access to the rest of your

home. Criminals often look to steal things quickly and without drawing attention to themselves. By locking the door to your home and car, most of a criminal's opportunity is eliminated. Enabling an alarm system may also deter criminals, who often run away once an alarm sounds.

When parking, be intentional with your parking spot. For example, parking under a tree may provide shade from the heat, but it can also offer shadows or blocked security camera views. Park in a well-lit area. Highly visible areas leave little hiding space for criminals to attempt to enter a car.

As always, if you see anything suspicious, be sure to report it to law enforcement as quickly as possible. Many car burglary sprees happen rapidly, with several suspects working together to quickly sweep through a neighborhood, searching for unlocked cars. Commonly, thieves test a car's door handle to see if its unlocked. If it is, they typically move on. Reporting this activity to law enforcement can help prevent your neighbors from becoming a victim.

Sticking to a daily 9 p.m. Routine by remembering to remove all valuables from your car and locking it is a great step in preventing yourself from becoming a victim of a crime. Set a reminder on your phone to help you remember each night, and don't forget to share the message with friends and neighbors to help ensure that your neighborhood is safe.

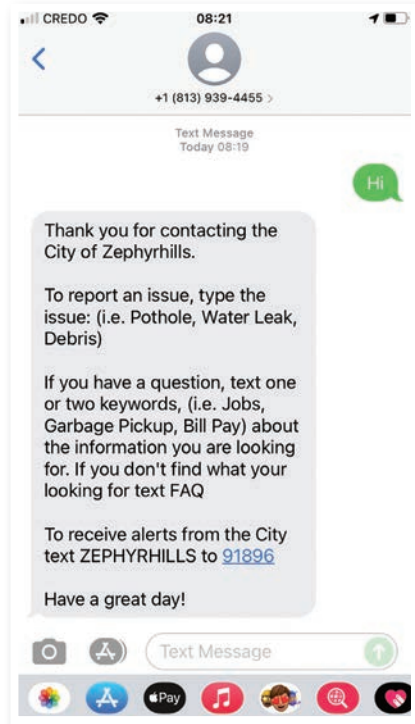

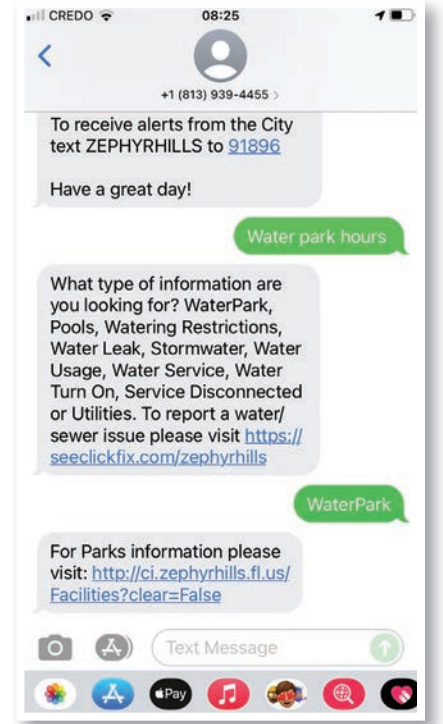

TextMyGov Service now available in Zephyrhills

The city's new notification and assistance service is now a text message away

In an effort to streamline customer queries as well as engage and inform Zephyrhills residents, the city has launched TextMyGov. TextMyGov is not

an app. There's nothing to download. Rather, it's a texting service that can both connect area residents to service-related questions and also inform them of upcoming events or outages in the city. City of Zephyrhills Public Information Officer Kevin Weiss helped bring the service to Zephyrhills.

"TextMyGov is being used by 400 municipalities, including Temple Terrace and several others in Florida," Weiss said. "I've already spoken with the public information officers of Dade City and Pasco County and they might be using it in the future, too."

TextMyGov is a text messaging service that has both incoming and outgoing phases. It soft-launched in Zephyrhills on June 13 and city staff is encouraging residents to sign up for it. You don't even have to be a Zephyrhills resident. You just have to sign up. The way the outgoing message system works is first you sign up by texting "HI" to "813.93ZHILL" or "813.939.4455." Once completed, residents are just a text message away from navigating the city website or otherwise being able to access a host of queries.

Here's an example. If a resident is curious about what to do about a stray animal, they'll text "animal control." The auto-generated reply will tell the resident that Pasco County handles animal control and direct the resident to the Pasco County website

where animal control can be reached.

If a resident is wondering when the splash pad at Zephyr Park is open, they just have to text "water park hours" and they'll get their answer right on their phone and without having to navigate the city website.

The service even connects to the city's See-Click-Fix App to report problems. The service has a long list of auto-generated responses to queries. For those queries that don't already have one, no problem, Weiss is building that database.

"We're pretty proud of this," Weiss said. "It helps us give a faster and better response. Obviously, you can still call the city or use the website."

An initial crop of rate-payers were signed up for Text MyGov when they used Water Smart - the city's service that notifies residents of upcoming water bills or regarding abnormal consumption activity. There was a little hiccup. The service sent out several duplicate messages in a glitch to those initial sign ups. Many opted out of it. Never fear, the issue has been fixed and the service is functioning as it should.

The second part of the service is the outgoing part. With this service, residents text "ZEPHYRHILLS" to "91896." This service will notify people that sign up of upcoming events or service interruptions.

"We try to be cognizant of what we're sending out there," Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. said. "We only send information you need, like road closures, accidents, pertinent information. We're not going to spam you with things like National Ice Cream Day and opting out is as easy as texting STOP."

The service can give residents a heads up for upcoming events like a farmer's market or Founder's Day. It also gives people the option to access the monthly newsletter that Weiss composes. It won't all be in that text message but a link to the newsletter will be in the text. Just click on the link and you will have access to the newsletter.

"TextMyGov helped us fill our summer rec program," Weiss said. "It also helps with outreach and awareness. People may pickup on something they didn't know about the city."

Wondering about a skate park in Zephyrhills? The text "skate park" to the number and information like location and hours of operation for the city's skate park will immediately be at your fingertips.

"We really like this service for our seasonal residents," Poe said. "It's a great way to keep them connected to things going on in the city, even when they're not physically here."

Weiss hopes to use Text MyGov to attract interest to the public meetings regarding the re-writing of the city's comprehensive plan. Interested parties can sign up for the assistance service and/or that notification service with just a few taps on their phone and they can opt out at any time.

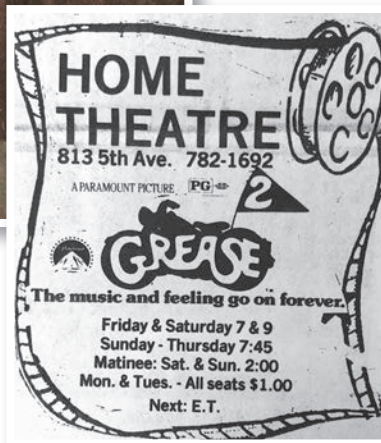

Center following a two-year hiatus in which the commencement was held at Bulldog Stadium due to restrictions stemming from the coronavirus pandemic.

Also on the front page was a story about city planners who gave consideration to an airport terminal site as part of a master plan. Access roads would be included in the expansion of the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport.

Ironically, there is an ongoing expansion effort at the airport now.

Additionally, there were brief reports on crime, fire and rescue. Pratt's Restaurant was damaged by a fire, a man in a car accident was rescued with the use of Jaws of Life and park rangers arrested a burglary suspect at the Hillsborough River State Park.

The 24-page newspaper back then had plenty of variety on the inside pages. There was a ribbon-cutting for a new Exchange Bank branch off U.S. 301, stories on candidates for the Pasco School Board and Pasco County Commission and discussions of new rules for the steer show.

There were several viewpoints expressed on the editorial page including the flag being

a symbol of our freedom. Other pages were dedicated to obituaries, religion, society, school daze, along with fire and police.

Even back then the section for mobile home parks was popular with enough news to fill two pages.

Sports always has been the talk of the town in this bedroom community of Tampa Bay and in the June 10 edition there was a battle for the Zephyrhills High starting quarterback position just as there is now. David Smith and Roosevelt Sanders were the top candidates to be decided by then-first year coach Jim Davis, who later became Zephyrhills' principal.

Coincidentally, following the graduation of two-year starter Jaxson Rivera, current coach Nick Carroll went into the spring football game evaluating the play of Tristan Lennon and J.J. McGovern. A third player, however, has been added to the mix with Wiregrass Ranch transfer Brendyn Colella getting most of the reps in the recent 7-on-7 tourney.

Notable Zephyrhills High athletes who shined at spring sports also were recognized and a poll indicated just how much Floridians love football. Additional sports stories touched on Little League, tennis, golf and fishing.
