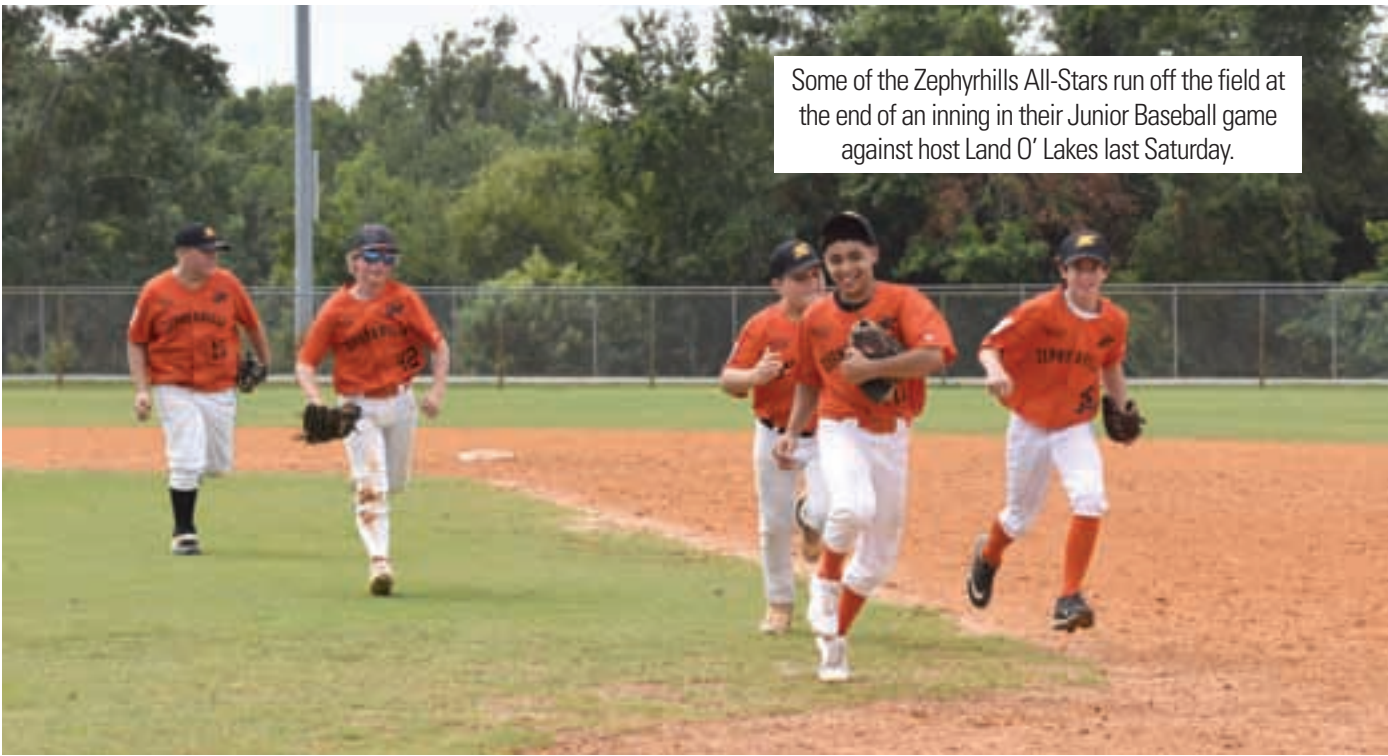

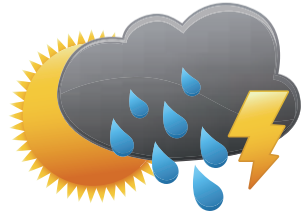

Feed the Kids Program has served thousands since its inception six years ago at Elks Lodge 2731

Last summer, during the peak time of the coronavirus pandemic, about 8,000 families benefitted from a Feed the Kids Program at the Elks Lodge 2731. People still drive up to receive meals at the lodge off Wire Road, but the numbers are down due, in part, to the pandemic waning.

"A lot of people were unemployed and they were able to drive their kids though," said Wayne Page, an Elks trustee who sits in front of the building at a table alongside Jim Miller.

Added Miller, a volunteer who gives drivers a number based on how many meals they need, "We're still getting them, but not as many."

The local Elks chapter has been distributing food during the summer months to needy families for the past six years and last year represented the most ever. That effort, made possible Mondays through Fridays from 11 a.m.-1 p.m., is greatly appreciated by those who drive through.

"I think it's a great thing for the community, especially in times like this when (people) need it," said

"Bed of Nails" horror movie production coming to Dade City

After enduring a COVID-19-related delay, the filming is set to commence this August

One thing is for sure. "Bed of Nails" is going to have a wicked-good soundtrack. The soundtrack and score of a horror film are some of the most important elements to help present the visual imagery and to cue the audience that something is about to go down. Writer/director Mike Malott, who has an extensive background in the music industry, puts it like this.

"Imagine you're on a beach looking out onto the ocean," Malott said. "There's the sun, the sand. Now cue the Jaws theme song and see how that vibe turns to fear. It completely changes the imagery and how you perceive what you're looking at."

"Bed of Nails" is Malott's and his production company - Bad Clown Films first foray into feature films and you can bet that the soundtrack is going to play an important role. Malott has more than 20 years of experience in the music industry and has developed some relationships that have helped drive and even shape the film.

"I was inspired in the 90s by Nine Inch Nails music videos and the way they incorporated visual imagery," Malott said. "I was taken aback by that and it remained in my mind as the film came together."

Thus, "Bed of Nails" is more than likely going to have that edgy, industrial, dark and gritty feel to it. It makes sense as the film is about three Goth kids road-tripping their way to the Florida Keys, camping in a tent on their way, when they are set upon by a group of locals who take it too far, fatally too far. Malott will lean on his friend and business associate Erik Sizemore, lead member of the band Empire 44, formerly Liers in Wait, an Atlanta-area Goth-industrial band. Malott will sample from Empire 44's album Spear of Destiny

A Look Back ...

JUNE 24, 1960

New series harkens back to days gone by. Let's look at the above date

This week's Look Back takes us further than we have gone so far in these new installments. It represents the seventh in our series. The year is 1960 when under *The Zephyrhills News* banner it read in all CAPS: VOICE OF THE PURE WATER CITY.

Back then it seemed the cover page was for as many stories as could fit. In the June 24, 1960 edition there were 11 items on the front with three headshots to go along with a photo of Mr. and Mrs. Waldo being award for their beautiful plantings. Carl D. Lippincott, the community development league's chairman, congratulated the couple, owners of Lamb's Toy Shop.

As the city has annexed some surrounding land over the years the Zephyrhills City Council and various civic clubs united to consider expanding the boundaries. Council president James Jarrett said he had been contacted by leaders of several groups, including the chamber of commerce, about expanding the city limits a half a mile in three directions; north, west and south.

Also in the city, a recount was being considered due to a low census thanks, in part, to a trailer park within city limits being listed as rural. Including that park could increase the population of Zephyrhills to 3,000. Another city matter discussed by the council focused on flood relief and drainage problems.

Other news out front included an advance on a countywide church revival scheduled for the Pasco County Fairgrounds, Zephyrhills High students Richard Miles and Barbara Higginson were selected to attend Boys State and Girls State sessions in Tallahassee, and Pasco County Groves had numerous vacancies where trees had died or been removed.

Inside on page 2 was a column by Alice Hall about the Garden Gate Club. Hall, who ranks among the most famous people in Zephyrhills, has a building named in her honor at Zephyr Park. There was a Tourist Club column written by Rosa Belle Morton and another column, entitled In This Corner, was penned by publisher George Wickstrom.

Tax Collector Mike Fasano's five offices will collect donations in July for the Pasco County School District's ABC (Assist, Believe & Care) Program. The program was created to provide financial assistance to students and their families who are experiencing economic hardship, especially when those needs interfere with the student's ability to be academically successful. The cash collected will go into a fund that teachers can use when they see or learn of a need a child may have. In past years this office has donated thousands of dollars to Pasco schools to support this important program.

"The management and staff of each of the five tax collector offices in the county will choose which school in their respective community they want to donate their funds to," said Fasano. "Donations collected county-wide will be pooled and then split evenly among the five communities."

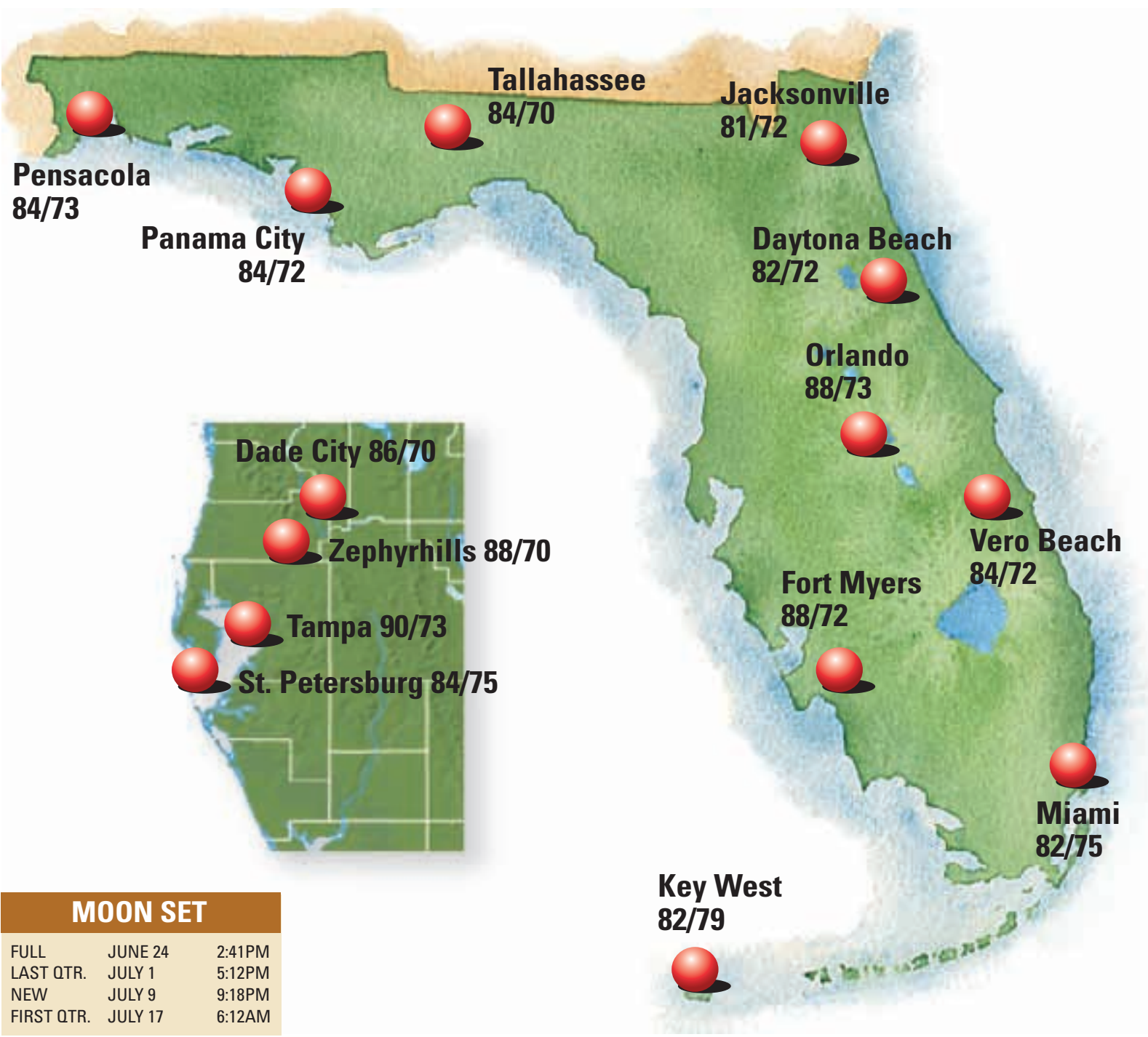

An installation ceremony at Legion Hall brought many legionnaires and auxiliary members from throughout the state. It was noted to be one of the largest events of its kind on record. Seated as post commander and auxiliary president, respectively, were Gomer Jones and Mrs. W. Lincoln Rogers.

Also, H.C. Douglas Jr. was installed as president of the Zephyrhills Rotary Club. Also inducted into office were Roger Sibley, vice president; George Neukom, Secretary; Lee Reed, treasurer; Lee Z. Henry, sergeant-at-arms; along with directors Bernard E. Burns, J.J. Gall, C.A. Henderson and Walter Hill. Gall had served as the club's previous president.

As always there were listings for community announcements, weddings, anniversaries, births and deaths.

One of the more prominent local residents in the latter listing was Alice Manahan, a Zephyrhills resident for 18 years who passed

away at the age of 83. She was a former musician and member of the Zephyrhills Woman's Club.

As for consumer goods and services, Hardy's Department Store offered bargains for its one-year anniversary. Among the items on sale were dresses for juniors and misses as low as \$5.88 and men's dress slacks for \$4.95.

Tires at Western Auto were on sale for \$12.88 (tube-type) or \$17.88 (tubeless), a gallon of house paint cost \$5.98 at Lanham & Sons Building and Supply, and several banks offered low coast home and auto loans.

Pork chops at the Peni-Saver Food Store were listed at 45 cents per pound and milk was 79 cents a gallon at that store on 5th Avenue. At the A&P you could get two large heads of lettuce for 29 cents, a 2 and ½ pound box of chicken fryer breasts for \$1.29 and a gold pound cake or peach pie for 49 cents.

Healthy habits that can become part of your daily routine

A person’s habits can have a strong impact on his or her overall health. Unhealthy habits like smoking and living a sedentary lifestyle can increase a person’s risk for various conditions and diseases. On the flip side, healthy habits like eating a nutritious diet and getting enough sleep can bolster a person’s immune system and reduce his or her risk for various ailments.

Some healthy habits, like daily exercise, can be time-consuming. Busy adults may not have time to exercise vigorously each day, though the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services urges men and women to find time for at least 150 minutes of moderate-intensity aerobic activity each week. But not all healthy habits take up time. In fact, adults can incorporate various healthy practices into their daily routines without skipping a beat.

- Take the stairs. Taking the stairs instead of the elevator can have a profound effect on overall health. According to Duke University, climbing just two flights of stairs combined per day can contribute to six pounds of weight loss over the course of a single year. In addition, a study from the North American Menopause Society found that stair climbing can help postmenopausal women reduce their risk for osteoporosis and help them lower their blood pressure.
- Drink more water. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention notes that water helps the body maintain a normal temperature, lubricates and cushions joints, protects the spinal cord and other sensitive tissues, and helps to rid the body of

waste through urination, perspiration and bowel movements. Adults who are thirsty can choose water over soda or other sugary beverages. The CDC notes that sugary beverages like soda and sports drinks contain calories but little nutritional value, making water a healthier way for individuals to quench their thirst.

- Go for daily walks. Walking benefits the body in myriad ways. For example, the Harvard School of Public Health notes that women who walk 30 minutes per day can reduce their risk of stroke by 20 percent and potentially by 40 percent if they walk briskly. In addition, researchers at the University of Virginia Health System found that men between the ages of 71 and 93 who walked more than a quarter mile per day had half the incidence of dementia and Alzheimer’s disease as men who walked less. A 15-minute walk around the neighborhood each morning coupled with a 15-minute walk after dinner can help adults dramatically improve their overall health.
- Eat more greens. Eating more greens is another healthy habit that doesn’t require a major overhaul of an individual’s lifestyle. The U.S. Department of Agriculture notes that dark green leafy vegetables, such as spinach, are rich in vitamins A, C, E, and K. The Mayo Clinic notes that vitamin E alone can help people maintain their vision



and promote a healthy reproductive system while also improving the health of the blood, brain and skin. The USDA also notes that green vegetables contain very little carbohydrates, sodium and cholesterol. Adults won’t have to reinvent the dietary wheel to incorporate more greens into their diets, and the results of doing so can have a significant, positive effect on their overall health.

The right habits can help people live healthier lives, and such habits need not require any major life changes.

Enjoy a safe and happy Independence Day



Independence Day is a celebration of the United States of America. The holiday is marked by fanfare and large parties, complete with barbecues, fireworks and parades. As fun as July 4th festivities typically are, injuries, particularly those involving fireworks, are a concern that celebrants should not take lightly. An estimated 11,000 people visited the emergency room for fireworks-related injuries in 2016, according to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission. However, fireworks aren't the only danger this time of year. In order to remain safe, individuals can heed these tips.

- Do not drink and drive. Alcohol consumption may accompany Independence Day festivities. For those planning on using a car to get to and from parties, it is essential to designate a driver who will not imbibe. Otherwise, utilize any number of ridesharing services or available taxis.
- Swim smartly. Always swim

The USDA Food Safety and Inspection Service says to never leave food out of refrigeration for more than two hours. If the temperature is above 90 F, food should not be left out for more than one hour.

All-Star play in District 25 is under way with teams from Zephyrhills and Dade City beginning play last weekend in Land O' Lakes. The recreation complex in that community is hosting all of the games at the district level and will host the Section 5 games as well.

At the Major Baseball level, Zephyrhills bounced back from a 14-2 loss to Dade City in Saturday's opening round to defeat Progress Village 12-2. Dade City then followed up that victory with a narrow 8-7 loss to Land O' Lakes.

Darryl Oney, manager of that Zephyrhills All-Star squad, gave his assessment of his team's play through two games of the double-elimination series.

"The boys actually

showed up and played real good," he said of the decisive win over Progress Village, a program based in eastern Hillsborough County. "Everybody hit."

While the manager noted that all nine players in the starting lineup got at least one hit for Zephyrhills, nobody had a more timely base hit than Logan Flannery. His double to center field drove in two runs and he raced around the bases to score after an outfield error.

Zephyrhills also got solid pitching and consistency on defense in its victory. Starter Jerrod Pinkston, a left hander, pitched one solid inning before being relieved by Trenton Kienitz. The right hander struck out seven batters in three innings of relief work on the mound in a game that ended early due to the 10-run mercy rule.

"We put Trenton in and he cleaned house," Oney said. "He's got a good fast ball, a good curve ball and he's got a knuckle curve that I showed him."

Zephyrhills also got a few excellent defensive plays from Pinkston, who after being replaced on the mound moved to first base and snared a line drive headed toward the right field line potentially for extra bases.

Additionally, second baseman Justin Baker fielded a ground ball up the middle and threw out a runner at first base with shortstop Grason Dorman added a few solid plays in the infield.

In the Junior Baseball game, Zephyrhills lost twice to Land O' Lakes, 20-3 on Satur-

day before Sunday's 16-6 defeat.

"You can't beat that ball team," Zephyrhills coach Heath Horsely said, adding, "We just couldn't score."

In the first game against Land O' Lakes, Zephyrhills fell into a 7-0 hole — primarily due to giving up walks and making errors — after the top of the first inning. On a brighter note, the local all-stars held Land O' Lakes scoreless over the next two innings. Zephyrhills then allowed 13 runs over the next two innings for the heartbreaking loss.

Zephyrhills scored single runs in the bottom of the first and second innings before the game got out of hand. In the second, Hayden Little beat out an infield single, moved to second on a throwing error and made it to third on a wild pitch. He scored on Karson Sutton's single.

Then in the bottom of the third, Zephyrhills quickly put two runners on base and capitalized. Lucas Casarez drew a lead-off walk and reached on an infield single by Hunter Bowman. Casarez raced home on an RBI single by J.J. Starnes, the catcher.

Zephyrhills had a great opportunity to get a few more runs in the third but left two baserunners stranded. Sutton and Cayden Palumbo each singled before Zephyrhills batters made three straight outs.

On an adjacent field, the Dade City Major Softball team lost to Progress Village. That squad included four players from Zephyrhills — Kiara Little, Shelby Stevens, McKenzie Dean and Senae Davis.

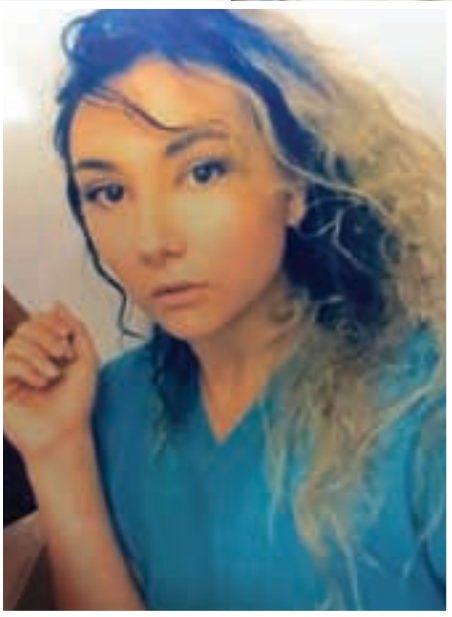

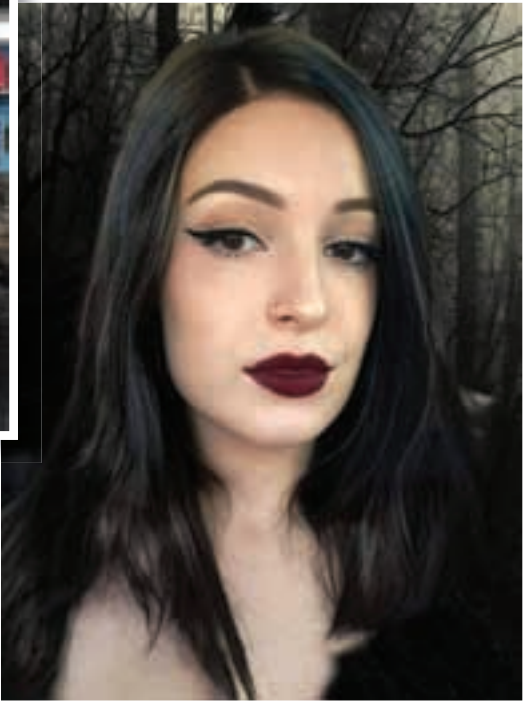

in the film and Sizemore will play one of the main characters. "I knew the tracks (from the album) as I wrote the script and where they would go," Malott said. "They were playing in my head when writing the scenes. I rely heavily on soundtrack to drive the visual imagery."

The production suffered a major delay as it geared up to start in 2020. The COVID-19 Pandemic scuttled Malott's initial plans. "In order not to jeopardize the safety of everyone involved, we paused the production," Malott said. "But then it just got worse and not better. We had to stop and ride it out. It would end up being a 10-month delay."

The production unraveled. Malott lost locations, actors moved to other states but Malott and his remaining team held tight. Fast forward through the worst of the pandemic and the pieces started to come back together. "We ended up with an even better location in Dade City," Malott said. "It's private property in an out-of-the-way place where we can make the film without interruptions. From there, it just progressed."

Cast and crew began to assemble, Malott had already been purchasing equipment he knew he would need for the production and now the filming is set to commence by mid-August with aims at being produced and edited for commercial release by October of 2022, just in time for Halloween. The team Malott has put together is one he is excited about. "You have to find the kind of people you can count on, people in love with the project that share the same determination," Malott said. "We interviewed and auditioned many people and now we have a cast and crew that we think is perfect."

While Malott is stoked about his cast and crew, it's not a complete roster just yet. "Bed of Nails" is still looking for talent. There are two small roles that Malott and Bad Clown Films are openly casting. There are also some secondary roles, background, miscellaneous crew and extras to slot into the production. Another mother was grateful for the local effort. Jacki Comfort was handed meals for her three children — Emmalia, Oscar and Otto — when she pulled up on Tuesday.

"They love it. It gives them something to look forward to and it helps with the grocery bills," she said.

Comfort comes for meals daily basis, while others show up occasionally. Either way, Elks members and volunteers are happy to give back to people who need the help.

"I taught school, so I like knowing the young kids are getting fed," Elks member Geri Teeple said.

In essence, "no child should go hungry," Elks member Shawn Kelly said.

Thomas Promise, which has its own meal giveaways for school children during the academic year, helps out by providing meal packages for weekends. They also get help from Robert Harper, who runs a food pantry in Wesley Chapel and contributes food to the Elks for their program.

The meal giveaways are just part of the Elks efforts to help needy families and children. Ilene Nutting, wife of exalted ruler Paul Nutting, makes crafts to be distributed on Wednesdays. Recently, she made Father's Day cards and for the Fourth of July sun visors will be passed out.

When the summer program concludes midway through August when kids go back to school, book bags with school supplies are distributed.

"I enjoy helping," he said. "You can see that they are happy that they get to have a free lunch."

Bulldogs take on opposing teams in 7-on-7 scrimmages

A tune-up against rivals Wesley Chapel and Cypress Creek prepares Zephyrhills for prestigious King of Kings tournament

The Zephyrhills football team put together several scoring marches in three-way scrimmages last week against host Cypress Creek and Wesley Chapel. That series, however, was just a tune-up for an even bigger offseason test against more formidable competition.

The Bulldogs went up against some pretty strong teams from throughout the state in Saturday's King of Kings tournament in Tampa. They, along with the Coyotes and Wildcats, took on several playoff contenders in the prestigious tourney that each summer attracts college scouts.

For Zephyrhills coach Nick Carroll, it was just good to be able to play in the summer. Last year's 7-on-7 events were cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic restrictions.

"It was nice to get back out there and compete against somebody else," he said. "That's why I wanted to play (both tourneys). I wanted to get in some reps. Our goal is to do one (7-on-7) a week. We'll be at the Cypress Creek tournament on July 15."

Wesley Chapel coach Tony Egan echoed that sentiment, saying the scrimmages at Cypress Creek "got the rust knocked off so we could play in the (King of Kings). That's a big pro, to play other teams you're not used to playing."

Darrell Davis Jr., a 2006 Pasco graduate who later played for North Carolina State, is the offensive coordinator for Cypress Creek. Having played in the King of Kings tourney, he knows first-hand the importance of doing well there.

"Me and Domonic (Brown, another former Pasco standout who opted for a baseball career and played five seasons for the Philadelphia Phillies) got offers at King of Kings," Davis Jr. recalled. "It's huge. It's good exposure to play against different teams, different counties and different classifications."

For quarterback Jaxson Rivera, last week's scrimmages presented an opportunity to test his throwing arm. The rising senior sat out for a month after injuring his right shoulder during the spring game.

"I feel rusty," he said, noting that he just got medical clearance a couple of days before taking on the Coyotes and Wildcats.

Rivera looked decent in the three-way scrimmages as well as the series in Tampa. He hooked up with his brother Maddox, Jaylen Thomas, Maguire Neal and T. J. Jackson on touchdown passes.

"I was happy that he was able to throw the ball," Carroll said of Rivera.

Egan also got a chance to see other quarterbacks behind starter Ethan Harper, who played in the three-way but not King of Kings. Nehemiah Morgan saw plenty of action in the latter tourney.

While Wesley Chapel went 1-2 in the Tampa tourney, Zephyrhills split four games with wins over Spoto and Clearwater. In the latter game, linebacker Theotis Smith clinched the outcome with a late interception.



While the Bulldogs, Coyotes and Wildcats competed in the King of Kings tourney, Wiregrass Ranch headed up to Ocala for the Florida High School 7-on-7 State Championships. The Bulls went 6-2 in that weekend series.

Wiregrass Ranch coach Mark Kantor did not single anyone out and said he was pleased with "the kids' effort throughout the two days. I hope this gets us better prepared."

The week before the Bulls took part in that 7-on-7 competition they hosted a youth football camp put on annually by Anthony Becht, a former National Football League tight end who spent four seasons with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Becht enlisted several Wiregrass Ranch football players as volunteers for that camp, including his son Rocco, who will be a senior and has been the team's quarterback for the past two seasons.
