YMCA welcomes back summer campers

Attendance increases over last year as children enjoy summer camp at the East Pasco YMCA

Talk about wanting to get back outside, in just the third of a 10-week summer camp for children at the East Pasco Family YMCA there are already signs that this year's numbers could easily top those of last season.

Attendance is up compared to last year's pace and camp leaders believe the state's government lockdown that followed the onset of the coronavirus spreading to Florida has something to do with that. Through the first three weeks, 125 boys and girls showed up at the local facility that includes a gym with a hard court, fitness room and swimming pool, as well as other activity and recreational areas.

"These kids have been cooped up for the last 11 weeks with their parents and they've missed their friends," said Ryan Pratt, the

membership and wellness experience director. "They're not only making new friends, but they're meeting up with their old friends, so that's been fun to see."

Alex Delgado, this summer's camp director, noted that 34 kids showed up the first week, 45 the second and 46 the third. The rising numbers, he reasoned, reflect the primary benefit of the camp, which is "just to get them out of the house and be active. They're coming back. We just want them to make friends and do some team-building."

Along those lines there are games designed to get the youngsters working together toward a common goal. Setting up a magic carpet ride and flipping it over as a group, a four-square bouncing ball game and making animal masks are among the team-building events that the boys and girls have enthusiastically undertaken.

One of the best aspects of the camp for Zephyrhills 10-year-old Gabby Blackwell is that "I get to talk to my friends."

"It's very fun to try new things," said Atiana Corrales, an 11-year-old from Zephyrhills.

Corrales' friend, 11-year-old Avah Peraza-Smith of Zephyrhills who is attending her first-ever summer camp at the local YMCA, said she enjoyed swimming the most among the various activities she took part in last week.

Young Guns 2.0 gears up for travel baseball season

A 10-and-under team of east Pasco ballplayers practices in Zephyrhills before playing in inaugural tournaments

The Young Guns 2.0, which is actually the second version of a travel baseball season that lasted five seasons as players aged out, has the ideal roster to represent east Pasco. Players came from Little Leagues in Dade City as well as Dixie Leagues in Wesley Chapel and Ridge Manor.

Coach Clint Moats said Young Guns 2.0, an offshoot of the former Young Guns team, will compete in the Global Sports Alliance.

"It's a lot of pressure," Moats said of coaching the fledgling team of young baseball players from various local leagues. "I feel like I'm under the microscope."

That feeling stems, in part, from going it without his uncle and former fellow coach, the late William Duncan. At the age of 50, Duncan perished in an auto accident in February. He and Moats made a pact two years ago to form a 10U travel team. That left Moats to honor that commitment and the team was formed in May.

"This is what he wanted to do, so we're doing this in memory of him," said Moats' wife, Abby.

"We're just trying to get ready for what's to come," coach Moats said. "These kids have never

Free signups for the Zephyrhills Athletic League

Local youth football and cheerleading organization prepares to get back to the playing fields

Like most youth sports attempting to get back in action after being shut down by the state government due to the coronavirus epidemic, one local youth football and cheerleading organization is making plans for the upcoming season and to give back to the community.

The Zephyrhills Athletic League is signing up players for a fall campaign that begins with official league games in August. The Bulldawgs, who play their home games at Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field, have expanded in recent years to include several other sports.

A basketball league just capped its season before the government shutdown with championship games at the East Pasco YMCA in February, but the entire track and field season was cancelled. Now, however, it's back to football and cheerleading, the league's strong suit. Two seasons ago, the Bulldawgs captured district titles in all four divisions.

"I'm very happy and excited that we're going to have a football season, because we didn't get a track season," said Courtney Brown, the registrar and secretary who alongside parent coordinator Princess Wainwright manned a table for signups in the league's meeting room at the field.

"The 2020 season is coming up for the Bulldawgs," said league director Damien Pickett, who also coaches the junior varsity team. "We're very excited. With everything going on in the world right now we've still got to keep pushing and moving forward."

Avoid injury during workouts

Any time is a great time to get in shape. People with more time on their hands due to stay-at-home restrictions may want to begin an exercise regimen right away.

When proper form is followed, exercise can be highly effective. However, failing to exercise properly can result in injuries that sidetrack fitness plans.

Exercise is a significant component of a healthy lifestyle. The U.S. Surgeon General, the Institute of Medicine, the American Heart Association, and the American College of Sports Medicine all say that daily physical activity is necessary, but recommendations from these groups vary in regard to how much exercise is best. Harvard Medical School says most people should aim for at least 30 minutes of moderate exercise or 15 minutes of intense exercise a day.

As important as duration of exercise can be, proper form is a must. The following are some ways to avoid injury while exercising.

- Consult with your doctor. Speak with a doctor before beginning an exercise regimen, especially if it has been some time since you last exercised. A physician will tell you if there are certain workouts or activities you should avoid, or give you a green light. Discuss exercise each time you get a physical.
- Consider a personal trainer. Many people do not know where to start their exercise journeys. A personal trainer can help you begin safely and structure a fitness plan that becomes more challenging as your body acclimates to exercise. Personal trainers also can hold you accountable. Many trainers work independently and may offer guidance remotely through

services like Skype, FaceTime or Zoom.

- Begin slowly. Harvard Medical School experts say that sprains, muscle strains, tendinitis, knee injuries, and rotator cuff tears are some of the more common exercise- and sports-related injuries. Slowly wading into the water and building up intensity gradually can help prevent some of these injuries. Choosing non-impact exercises, such as swimming, or using an elliptical machine, can be helpful if you have a preexisting condition like arthritis or osteoporosis or a history of injury.

• Warm up. Don't start workouts cold. Spend several minutes stretching and gradually increasing your heart rate.

• Exercise caution when lifting weights. Get instructed on the proper form for lifting weights, as there is a risk for serious injury when not following form. Spotters are key when lifting heavy weights or if you're jittery after an intense routine. Ask a friend or



family member to spot you any time you're doing strength training. This can prevent injuries and emergencies.

Novices need to learn the ropes when they begin to exercise for the first time or after a long pause in physical activity.

The structure of the camp takes into account the precautionary guidelines that are still mandated by state health officials. Social distancing takes place during events and in the pool, as well as at card tables, arts and crafts stations and lunch breaks.

Counselor Haylea Barbieri oversees numerous activities for the youngsters, ensuring they remain safe while enjoying their time at the summer camp. Helping out with the swimming program, she said her responsibilities include "to make sure they pass the swim test and if they don't that they're in the shallow end (of the pool)."

Like the other counselors, Reagan Keeling echoed a familiar refrain about trying to make the programs as much fun as possible for the campers.

"It's just to be able to give the kids the best memories they can have," said Keeling, a 2019 Zephyrhills High graduate who said she never attended a summer camp when she was younger.

Each week of the camp features a different theme. For example, in June the themes consist of: lights, camera, action; hero week; the outback; sports extravaganza; and party in the USA. The numerous group activities during those scheduled sessions included: decorating flags, stacking cups, yoga, archery, whiffle ball, a marshmallow tower, hula hoop obstacles and balloon rockets, to name a few.

Delgado pointed out that all of the activities are designed with the YMCA's four basic principles in mind — honesty, caring, respect and responsibility. Additionally, every day features a closing ceremony in which counselors and campers recap the day's events.

That said, he noted, participating in the league is free this season. Pickett said it is a way that the league can give back to the community.

"It's just to show we have each other's back," he said.

There were some newcomers as well as returning families who registered last week.

Heather Patterson, a 2008 Zephyrhills High graduate who played softball for the school as well as in the Dixie Softball League, registered her two children last week. Eli Elmore, 5, will play flag football for a second straight season while 9-year-old Nevaeh Elmore will cheer for the mighty mites again.

"We came out here last year and they welcomed us with open arms," Patterson recalled. "They're great with the kids, who had a great season. We made lots of friends. It was like a

family. As long as we keep them active and keep them going, that's what it's all about."

Norma Maixner brought her two sons, Zane, 12, and 14-year-old Frederick, reasoning, "They love football."

Another newcomer to ZAL, but not youth football, was 11-year-old Maxx Rossow. He also has played for the old Chiefs in the Tampa Bay Youth Football League and South Pasco Predators, a Pop Warner affiliate.

"This is his last year playing youth football," said his father, Andy Rossow, who played high school football in upstate New York. "That's his everything."

Aside from the early registration taking place, some coaches and returning players have been going through drills on weeknights.

Jacavien McGovern, who played in the league for four seasons but this upcoming season will play high school football as a Zephyrhills freshman, came out last week to assist his father in working with the younger boys. Playing in the ZAL, he noted, should help him at the next level.

"I have more experience," he said.

Registration for the upcoming season is for boys and girls, ages 5-14. Teams are divided into four categories: flag, mighty mites, pee wees and junior varsity. Cheerleaders actually had their first conditioning night on June 15 at Krusen Field.

seen kids that play travel ball. It's a big deal to go from Little League to travel ball, but we've got some good ones. We've got some talent."

Moats, who grew up playing in the Dixie Baseball League at Ridge Manor, has plenty of help in assistants Kevin and Danny Smith (no relation), Patrick Caudill.

On a recent Monday night, pitchers, catchers, along with infielders were put through the motions of working on pickoff plays at first base and attempted steals of second base.

While some baserunners were picked off of first quite easily, there were others who successfully ran down the baseline to make it safely to second.

The coaches said that was just one of several ways in which the team is working on various aspects of the game.

"I want them mainly to watch the pitcher's footwork," said Kevin Smith, an assistant coach whose son Owen was the first baseman in those drills. "Don't get too much of a lead or you'll get picked off."

Gunner Taylor was the runner in those situations. His mother Glista Gunner, from Ridge

Manor, said Gunner "likes it. We just love to watch him play ball."

Caudill, who has coached with Moats on several youth baseball teams, noted that playing travel ball will be beneficial in the players' development.

"It just brings the skill level up for the kids," he said. "It's going to advance them a whole lot better than the Little League can."

Danny Smith concurred, saying, "Little League's got to the point where it's more fundamentals. You're just learning. But if you want to get better you've got to go to travel ball teams."

"It's challenging," said Caudill's son Cameron, one of two catchers who worked on trying to throw out runners at second base at Monday's practice.

Playing catcher is Caudill's favorite position, although he also plays some at first base and third base.

"I like catcher, because you get to play a lot," he reasoned.

Young Guns 2.0 does not plan to play in their first tourney until August. That means the team likely will continue playing some more games in the fall.

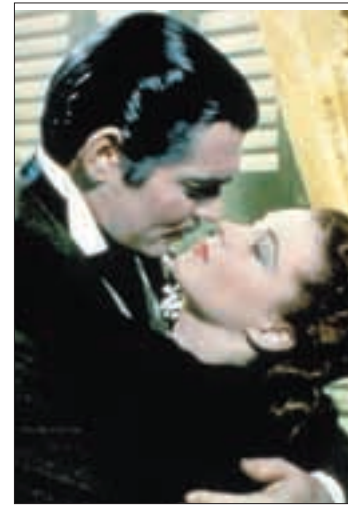


