Sarah Vande Berg Tennis Center hosts promising star to help promote junior tennis program

Alycia Parks is a rising star on the women's professional tennis circuit. Last Saturday, she came to the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis and Wellness Center to meet aspiring juniors and provide a demonstration on the main clay court that serves as the facility's centerpiece.

Not long ago the 21-year-old, who took up the sport at the age of 7 while growing up in Atlanta, was in their shoes. Now, however, she is gradually moving up the

ladder on the international scene, ranked 135th in singles and 201st in doubles by the Women's Tennis Asso-

Recently, the 6-foot-1 Parks played some of the top players in the world, including Ons Jabeur of Tunisia and China's Zheng Qinwen, during a European tour that included stops at Wimbledon, the French Open and Berlin Open to name a few.

While Parks is not overly thrilled with all the travel being on the top pro circuit entails, she did say how

much she enjoys London, home to Wimbledon. "I really like London," she said. "It's very open and the people are nice."

Pascal Collard, Saddlebrook's former tennis director who co-owns SVB in Zephyrhills, spent the past five weeks on that European tour coaching Parks.

Penny for Pasco up for renewal this November

The infrastructure surtax has provided hundreds of thousands of dollars for construction projects in the county

This November, voters in Pasco County will have an opportunity to renew Penny for Pasco, an infrastructure surtax that takes one cent of every dollar of tax revenue collected in the county and designates the funds for economic development, public safety vehicles and equipment, conservation of land and natural resources, transportation infrastructure improvements and enhancements for educational facilities. Penny for Pasco was approved by voters in 2004, then again in 2012. Between January of 2005 and Dec. 31, 2014, Penny for Pasco collected over \$320,000,000.

The results were clear. A resounding 70 percent of voters approved Penny for Pasco in 2012 with renewal until 2024. Proceeds have yet to be totaled but it's estimated that Penny for Pasco will generate more than \$700,000,000 in that time. Pasco County isn't the only county to put an initiative like this in place. There are 60 other counties in Florida that have similar surtaxes, including neighboring Hillsborough, Hernando and Polk.

'More than forty-five million dollars have been dedicated to projects that are creating jobs in Pasco County," Íntergovernmental Affairs Officer Ralph Lair said. "Specific east projects on the east side include: Intersection improvements to Curley Road and Old St. Joe Road as well as State Road 54 and Morris Bridge Road, bicycle/pedestrian trails for the Withlacoochee Trail Extension and Clinton Avenue – phase 2 work – from Pasadena Drive to Fort King Road."

Local children donate to the Elks Feed The Kids **Program**

On May 21, Brooke Jordan, 6 years old and Connor Jordan, 9 years old set up a lemonade stand on North Avenue in front of their grandma and papa's house in Zephyrhills from 10:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. Their purpose for the stand was to raise money for Zephyrhills Elks Lodge Feed the Kids Program.

Their idea was inspired from a video on You Tube, a song called, The Duck Song, about a duck who goes to a lemonade stand. Connor said, "I wanted to do it because Jesus would have wanted me to. It made me feel good about myself."

"I do not want the kids to go hungry," Brooke

A joint family effort was made to sell the lemonade. Papa, Louis Jordan, helped the children make the lemonade stand out of wood, metal pipes, cardboard. Their mother, April Jordan gave the children decoration ideas and they decorated it themselves. Grandma, Stancy Jordan, and the children made the lemonade which they sold for \$1 a cup.

With the help of their father, Adam Jordan, they advertised the lemonade stand at their school and



their church. While sitting at the stand, they waved to people going by and showed them their signs.

People were giving us more than what it costs," said Connor.

The largest donation they received from one person was \$20. In total, they raised \$140 for the program.

On June 6, Connor and Brooke, accompanied by their parents, presented their donation to the Zephyrhills Elks Lodge 2731 during their business meeting. Donna Moyer, program chair, introduced the children while Exalted Ruler, Jay Klamer accepted their donation and presented them both Elk pins.





Eagle Scout and JROTC member comes up with idea for metal box behind FOE Eagles Aerie Post 3752

With numerous U.S. military veterans groups in Zephyrhills and its surrounding communities, not to mention the Zephyrhills Museum of Military History near the city's airport, patriotism reigns supreme.

Those honorable feelings, however, are not limited to older men and women who fought for the liberties and freedoms that prevail in our country today. James Laferriere exemplifies patriotism in a younger generation.

The 2022 Zephyrhills High graduate, who

The 2022 Zephyrhills High graduate, who spent four years moving up through the ranks in that school's JROTC program, is a testament to local students spreading patriotism. He spearheaded the effort for a metal drop-off box for tattered flags or ones in disrepair.

Last week behind the Fraternal Order of Eagles Aerie 3752, where the new flag depository is located, members of that organization, the school and community joined Laferriere and other members of Boy Scout Troop 72 for a brief ceremony. Laferriere came up with the idea for his Eagle Scout project. It helped earn him a communications merit badge.

"This gives the community a spot to place their flags that need to be retired," said Laferriere, who was joined by fellow scouts Orlando Dixon and Aaron Johnson of the Zephyrhillsbased troop.

The metal box, which is behind the lodge and next to the Pasco County Fire Station, is decorated with an American flag and symbols from the six U.S. military branches — Marines, Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard and the Space Force. A Freedom Isn't Free photo also adorns the box as a tribute to fallen soldiers, veterans, POWS and the missing in action.

Doug Griswold, who is in his fourth term as president of the local Eagles Aerie, welcomed Laferriere and his idea for the drop-off box.

"I was honored that (Laferriere and his scout troop) approached us

and that we could get it done at the Eagles," Griswold said. "

Laferriere appeared before city council members earlier this month, requesting funding for the project. Nearly all of the \$825 needed to complete the effort was okayed with council members reaching into their pockets to made additional donations.

"This project was under \$850 and city hall donated \$800," said Laferriere, admittedly grateful for such generosity. "I was only asking for \$600 and all of (the council members) pitched in, which was outstanding."

Laferriere also had solid backing from his

Laterriere also had solid backing from his family — dad Raymond, mom Anjanette and brother Marc, a 2017 Zephyrhills graduate. His brother also was a scout and for his Eagle Scout project he made a human sun dial at Crystal Springs Preserve, a 530-acre sanctuary on the southern outskirts of the city.

"I absolutely loved this idea, because every time we do a (flag) retirement people are dumbfounded that there's a process," said Laferriere's father. "Part of this is to bring those people to the ceremonies. It's sort of an awareness thing."

As a JROTC member with his last rank as a senior being a Command Sgt. Major, Laferriere has been part of flag retirement ceremonies at Oakside Cemetery, including one this past spring.

Rod Rehrig, past commandant of the Marine Corps League Detachment 1124 has been at numerous flag ceremonies, including an annual Flag Day event at the Zephyrhills Elks Lodge 2731. He is encouraged by JROTC members and local students' involvement, commending Laferriere for his project.

Laferriere, a scout for the past seven years in the chapter that meets at Shepard's Park, is likely done with JROTC and scouting. He plans to attend Florida Polytechnic University in Lakeland and major in mechanical engineering.

Funding is divided into three categories. Forty-five percent is designated for public schools, 45 percent goes to the Pasco County Commission and 10 percent can be used for infrastructure in Pasco County cities. The county commission both selects proposals and generates their own initiatives for projects that Penny for Pasco funds can be used for. The current Penny for Pasco is alive at least until 2024 and commissioners have a list of projects they are pursuing but many have already been completed using the funds.

"The Penny has built and renovated

schools, built roads and made major intersection improvements for transportation, new ambulances, fire trucks, sheriff deputy patrol cars, and defibrillators have been purchased," Chairman of the Pasco Citizens Committee Michael Cox said. "Several thousand acres have been purchased and placed into conservation status forever. Pasco County has made enhancements in its parks and recreation. Additionally, thousands of jobs are being created because of the Penny.'

Now it's up to Pasco County residents again. Renewing Penny for Pasco is a decision voters in Pasco county will get to decide on this November. A renewal this time around would keep the "Penny" in place until 2039.

HOLLYWOOD -- "Joker" opened in October 2019, grossed \$1.7 billion, received 11 Oscar nominations, won two, including best actor for Joaquin Phoenix, and then silence. Usually when a film is a runaway hit like, say, "Top Gun: Maverick," sequel talk starts immediately, but there was no sequel talk for "Joker" ... until now!

Director Todd Phillips has written (with Scott Silver) and will direct the sequel, "Joker: Folie a Deux" (a French medical term for a rare mental disorder in which two people share the same delusion). Even though we haven't heard much from Phoenix, he's been busy completing "Disappointment Blvd.," with Parker Posey, Nathan Lane and Patti LuPone, and then immersed himself in creating his "Napoleon," as directed by Ridley Scott for Apple TV+. Among actors who've portrayed Napoleon are Marlon Brando ("Desiree," 1954), Rod Steiger ("Waterloo," 1970), Ian Holm ("The Emperor's New Clothes," 2001) and Christian Clavier ("Napoleon," 2002). Joaquin has some mighty big shoes to

Speaking of "Top Gun: Maverick," there is a big legal dogfight brewing between Paramount Pictures and the Israeli-based widow and son of Ehud Yonay, the man who wrote the original article in California Magazine in 1983 that "Top Gun" was based on. Paramount says the copyright expired after 35 years and it didn't need to be renewed. It plans to "vigorously fight" because the Yonays believe their copyright was still in effect and want big bucks.

Hats off to Matthew McConaughey for standing up in front of the whole world "As a father, gun owner and a Texan from Uvalde." McConaughey, who now lives in Austin, called for all Americans to "step up for change in gun responsibility, including enacting background checks, red flag laws and upping the age requirement to 21."
