Governor inks \$101.5 billion state budget at City Hall

Ron DeSantis makes second appearance in Zephyrhills over past three months

For the second time in three months the governor of Florida came to Zephyrhills for a significant act. On Wednesday afternoon in council chambers at City Hall, Ron DeSantis signed the Florida Leads state budget he approved after this spring's legislative sessions in Tallahassee.

Another story on the front page 28 years ago were written by former assistant editor Mark H. Davis. Law enforcement authorities intensified a search for clues in the murder of 12-year-old Jennifer Odom, a Weightman Middle School seventh-grader who disappeared

at 70 and just below.

Florida's budget totals \$101.5 billion, which includes \$169 million in tax relief. The governor vetoed \$1.5 billion in spending, including \$1.35 million from federal funds received under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

"We're very excited to sign the budget for this year into law," De-Santis said. "There have been a lot of people over the last year, the last year and a half, that said thank God I live in Florida."

In March DeSantis made a surprise visit to Zephyrhills. His message that morning in the parking lot of the old SunTrust Building on Gall Boulevard was vowing to expand vaccine dosages to more seniors and other various groups throughout the state.

That marked the first by a Florida governor since Rick Scott came

here in 2012 to tout job growth in Pasco County.

On hand Wednesday were local dignitaries, city and community leaders. and politicians representing east Pasco. Among that group were State Representative Randy Maggard, a longtime Dade City resident serving District 38; Danny Burgess, a state senator who grew up

in Zephyrhills and serves District 20; Wilton Simpson, president of the Florida Senate from Trilby; and county commissioner Ron Oakley from Dade City.

DeSantis noted that he came to Zephyrhills at Simpson's behest.

Municipal Golf Course on the ropes?

A potential land purchase by the Florida National Guard has the Zephyrhills Municipal Golf Course on thin ice

The Zephyrhills Municipal Golf Course has been a fixture in the area for decades. Established in 1957, it has evolved into a nostalgic and low-cost, beginner-oriented golf course. A big bite was taken out of it when the airport expanded. It basically severed the course in two, separating the clubhouse and six holes from the other 12 holes. Yet, it endured. The shorter courses were and are still, conducive to both beginners and for seniors. The golf course also offers a number of low-cost options for residents. Now the spectre of further encroachment and possibly closure hangs over it.

The 2021 legislative session passed a \$25 million allocation for the Florida National Guard to acquire property in the Zephyrhills area. The National Guard currently has an armory in Dade City but they have long sought to acquire acreage for expansion. While the roughly 24-acre parcel on the southwest side of the airport (where the clubhouse and six holes are) is not the only place the National Guard could acquire, it is certainly at or at least toward the top of the list.

"I think they (National Guard) are looking at other parcels but the golf course property is the leading candidate," Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. said. "We've shown them several pieces of property."

Two things could preclude the acquisition of the golf course acreage. One - the governor's line item veto pen.

Two - there are other properties that might suit the National Guard's needs. It's clear that the golf course property sits atop the list of potential properties but will the public pushback be enough to compel the city and the National Guard to look elsewhere? We can only speculate at the moment.

At the May 24 city council meeting, several local residents spoke in favor of keeping the municipal golf course intact. They spoke

after getting off a school bus in February and whose nude body was later found in Hernando County.

In the other two cover articles, local business and community leaders, including former *Zephyrhills News* editor Steve Spina, met to discuss revitalizing the downtown area. Backing the group was Main Street Zephyrhills, which formed in 1991.


Additionally, Bob Dodd, president of the East Pasco Medical Center (now Advent-Health Zephyrhills), was the keynote speaker to a Memorial Day crowd at the Zephyr Post 118 building.

Inside news included city council's attempt to revive the defunct airport authority, Largo-based Med-Fleet expanding to Zephyrhills, a new post office substation seeking a location and a new home for the county's domestic violence shelter.

As usual, there was plenty of local news. Among them were items related to business, churches and education. Also, blurbs and photos featured anniversaries, weddings and reunions, along with births and deaths.

Back then, the editorial page featured a column of one nation under God by Davis, as

"The region here should feel very proud," the governor said. "We asked Senator Simpson where (the signing) would have the greatest success and he thought there would be no better place than Zephyrhills."

The state budget funds disaster preparedness, supports men and women of law enforcement and first responders, prioritizes students and teachers, and continues to protect the state's environment.

'We made a decision as other states kept locking citizens down we'd lift people up in Florida," the governor said. "We worked hard to get people back to work in our state.'

DeSantis, who earlier in the day spoke at a restaurant in New Smyrna Beach, noted that the approved budget did not result in increased taxes. In fact, it came while maintaining the lowest per capita tax burden in the nation.

"When we came into this legislative session I knew we were going to be strong," DeSantis said, noting that the state should

have about \$10 billion in reserves in a state that often deals with hurricanes and natural disasters

The governor said in April the state took in \$800 million more than some estimates, adding, "That puts us in an incredibly strong position."

Comparing New York's state budget as being twice the size of Florida's, DeSantis said, "We're very prudent in how we spend money."

On education, DeSantis noted that while during the coronavirus pandemic the teacher's union "sued us to close the schools, at the end

of the day the teachers wanted to get back."

Funding various school programs and raising the minimum K-12 teacher salary to \$47,500 are among the strides the governor mentioned in education.

On the environment he said \$625 million is earmarked for Everglades restoration, beach nourishment, rising sea levels and water re-

"That is important when you have 1,300 miles of coastline" DeSantis said.



well as a guest editorial and letters to the editor. Of course, there were additional pages for police reports, park and club news to go along with classifieds and TV listings. Soap operas had their own detailed listings.

Highlights in sports featured six records being broken by the Stewart Middle track team. Among those young athletes was Nick Carroll, a former standout football player at Zephyrhills High who now coaches that sport at his alma mater.

Also in sports were stories on the annual Orange-Black scrimmage to cap spring football practices, athletic booster awards for the high school's top athletes in spring sports, along with roundups for the Dixie Softball League and Zephyrhills Little League.

For those a bit older who still liked to pursue athletic endeavors, there were bowling and golf roundups, as well as a piece on Zephyrhills hosting a Men's Senior Baseball League All-Star Game.

A sampling of prices at local restaurants were lasagna for \$3.50 at lunch time at Piccola-Italia, lunch and breakfast combos at the Clock for as low as \$1.99, and a \$6.95 cracker buffet on Sunday and Thursday evenings at Buddy Freddy's in Plant City.

The prices for some other good and services naturally were substantially lower than today. A list of items found throughout the local weekly newspaper included a \$9.88 oil change at McGee Tire Stores, one of which was in Zephyrhills; a free golf membership and free washer and dryer to move into Sundance, an adult community; and a coupon worth \$6.95 for an adult haircut at Fantastic Sam's.

A sampling of groceries were as follows: a 12-pack of Coke at Rite Aid for \$2.99; buy one get one free on a 9 oz. box of Michelina's Macaroni & Cheese for 88 cents at Kash n' Karry; and turkey breast for \$2.29 a pound at Citrus Country Groves.





Garlic makes a delicious addition to various meals. Though some people may avoid garlic because of its potential to contribute to bad

breath, doing so means people may miss out on some surprising health benefits produced by this powerful, if pungent, bulb.

1. Garlic bolsters the immune system. A 2015 review published in the Journal of Immunology Research found that garlic appears to enhance the functioning of the immune system by stimulating certain cell types. According to the Cleveland Clinic, researchers believe that red blood cells turn the sulfur in garlic into hydrogen sulfide gas that expands the blood vessels. That makes it easier to regulate blood pressure. 4. Garlic may help reduce lead levels in the body. A 2012 study published in the journal Basic & Clinical Pharmacology & Toxicology studied the potentially therapeutic effects of garlic on 117 workers in the car battery industry. The clinical signs and symptoms of lead poisoning were significantly higher among workers who were not treated with garlic compared to those who were. Authors of the study concluded that garlic can be recommended for the treatment of mild-to-moderate lead poisoning

4 health benefits of garlic Where does lost weight go?

Obesity is a significant threat to public health. The World Health Organization says global obesity rates have nearly tripled since 1975. There are now more than one billion overweight adults across the globe, and at least 300 million people are classified as clinically obese.

Many people want to lose weight and unhealthy fat for personal reasons or at the suggestions of their doctors. Weight loss often involves a combination of increasing exercise and decreasing

calorie consumption. As excess weight starts being shed, it becomes evident that a biological process is taking place. Many people refer to it as burning calories. But fat loss is a complicated process that's spawned various misconceptions.

Breathing to lose weight?

Many people may not know that a lot of the fat lost during weight loss efforts occurs through simple breathing. According to Live Science and a 2014 study from researchers at the University of New South Wales, the body stores excess protein or carbohydrates in a person's diet in the form of fat, specifically triglycerides, which consist elementally of hydrogen, carbon and oxy-



The researchers found that, during oxidation, triglycerides are used up in a process that consumes many molecules of oxygen while producing carbon dioxide and water as waste products. The study found that, during weight loss, 84 percent of the triglyceride fat that is lost turns into carbon dioxide and leaves the body through the lungs. The remaining water may be excreted as sweat, breath or tears, or come out in urine - water excretion is the lesser-known component of the biological process

Researchers who authored the University of New South Wales study determined that, when 22 pounds of fat are oxidized, 18.5 pounds of it leaves the body as exhaled carbon. The amount of carbon that is lost can be increased through exercise, according to Medical News Today. By substituting one hour of moderate exercise (like jogging) for one hour of rest, a person can increase his or her metabolic rate of triglyceride usage sevenfold.

Carbon excretion also occurs during sleep, while sitting and doing daily activities. Howev-er, the amount excreted during these activities is minimal and can be offset by eating too much food. Simply breathing more and faster during regular activities is not recommended, either, as doing so increases the risk for hyperventilation.

Pasco Tax Collector's Offices collecting suitcases for the Luggage of Love Program

Pasco County Tax Collector Mike Fasano and staff collect donations of "gently-used" luggage, suitcases, and other travel-related bags throughout the year. The items are used to equip displaced children and families with new and/ or "gently-used" suitcases. The kids and families in need are identified by the Luggage of Love program, which is coordinated in Pasco County by the University of Florida's Pasco Extension Office.

The children, who often must travel with caseworkers into foster care, or are otherwise removed from their homes due to emergency situations, historically have only had plastic gar-bage bags in which to carry their clothing and personal belongings. The luggage adds a level of dignity to a child who is most likely experiencing one of the most traumatic events in their young life (i.e. being removed from their home). In other cases single mothers, often escaping domestic violence, are the recipients of the luggage for themselves and their children.

The staff of the Pasco County Tax Collector's Office continue to respond to the call for help. Staff and members of the public periodically drop off suitcases and other bags which are subsequently delivered to the Luggage of Love program. Right now, the supply of suitable cases is low, and the demand continues to grow.

"Thank you so very much for the donations we have received in the past," said Elizabeth Urquiola, program coordinator for the UF Pasco Extension Office & the Luggage of Love pro-gram. "We can't thank our community enough for the amazing generosity. We need to keep our closets full because children and mothers may be in need at any time. Please help spread the love to our displaced children in Pasco County through our Luggage of Love program. Your donations will always be put to good use.'

"It is heartbreaking to think that a child or a mother in dis-tress may only have plastic garbage bags which they must use to carry their belongings," said Fasano. The golf course can never be deprived of its nostalgia. However, it is also an aging facility in an area that is and will continue to be booming with growth. Attracting an economic driver, like a National Guard base, might be just what the city wants to do in order to raise the regional profile of the airport.

While the golf course serves 150 people per day in the busy season (October to April), it has just nine employees and just one of those is full time.

Pro Shop Manager Craig Sexton brought up a salient point at the May 26 meeting, stating that he doesn't see why, "one has to die for the other to live." While both scenarios - the golf course staying open and the National Guard acquiring the land - occurring is a long shot, it is within the realm of possibility.

It means two big changes for the golf course. One - the golf course would have to condense onto the southern portion of the property. This would mean that it would not be an 18-hole course, but a shorter, 9-hole course. Two - the clubhouse and golf cart service building would have to be relocated to the southern portion of the property. This could be an order too tall to consider.

"That option has to be looked at," Poe said. "But with the lease rates, does it make sense for the golf course operators to do that?'

Poe is in the unenviable position of being the face of this decision, even if it is not entirely his. Poe also has his memories of the golf course. He took golf lessons there as a youth. In 1991, when Poe's father returned from Operation Desert Storm, the municipal golf course is where they played together. Poe just recently took his youngest son to play a round. It's not as though there won't be places to play golf. Silvera-

do, Scotland Yard, Southport Springs, Lake Bernadette, the Saint Leo Abbey, Lake Jovita and the Tampa Bay Golf & Country Club are all less than 15 miles away. Rather, it's the low-cost options and memories attached to the municipal golf course that make for such a difficult decision. Regardless, a decision will have to be made, and soon. The golf course's lease comes up in April and with their busy season coming up in October, preparations need to be made.

"Knowing what's going to happen will dictate what they (golf course) do the next few months," Poe said. "We have to make a decision in fairness to them in the next month or so. The National Guard wants to move quickly. They hope to break ground on their project in the next 12 to 18 months, just like the golf course wants to know if they are going to have a next season. What we have to do is gather the information and make the best decision we can with the information we have at the time."



Gone but not forgotten are veterans of the U.S. Armed Forces and while attendance was a bit sparse for a second straight year the traditional remembrance for those who served and died for their country continued at Oakside Cemetery in Zephyrhills.

Social distancing and a rainy day made for an abbreviated Memorial Day Ceremony last May during the height of the coronavirus pandemic. While there are now fewer restrictions in place many local dignitaries were absent from Monday morning's event. While it did not last long, there were nearly 100 people who came out to pay their respects. That marked a significant increase from last year.

Members of VFW Post 8154 lined up in formation for a 21-gun salute. They were led by honor guard captain Diana Vazquez.

"Despite of Covid protocols we're still out here," said Vazquez, a U.S. Army veteran who served from 2001-17. "It was a great turnout."

Giving back, keeping memories alive and taking pride in serving or supporting the military are among the reasons people showed up at Oakside Cemetery, which was deeded to the city in 1911 and serves as a final resting place for U.S. veterans of six wars.

Charles W. Willoughby, who played taps following the traditional 21-gun salute, is a member of the VFW Auxiliary. He was happy to play a role in Monday's somber ceremony.

"It's something I can do for the pride of the United States," he said.

Joseph Theriot, chaplain of the local VFW 8154, served as the master of ceremonies and gave the benediction before reciting a bit of history about Memorial Day. The holiday, which in 1971 was approved by the U.S. Congress to be observed on the final Monday in May as part of a three-day weekend, stemmed from an idea by day of remembrance and decorating the graves of all U.S. veterans. It came in a general order with May 30, 1868 established as a national holiday. While several southern towns claim to be the first to recognize Memorial Day, Logan is considered as the founder of Memorial Day.

Going back even further, Memorial Day came after Decoration Day, which was when Americans took time to decorate the graves of soldiers who gave their lives in the Civil War.

For Theriot, who served 21 years in the U.S. Army, being able to impart some history and leading this year's local ceremony proved to be quite a memorable occasion.

"Being from the military myself, it's an honor to honor our fallen comrades," he said. They will never pass, because they will always be alive in our hearts and memories. No man has truly died until they're forgotten. Bless the thousands of veterans in our hospitals and the homeless in our land."

Members of the Marine Corps League Sgt. Maj Michael S. Curtin Detachment 1124 also were on hand on Monday. For Ron Curci, a U.S. Marine who also served in the Air National Guard, there was no question about coming out.

"The Marine Corps League is the largest fraternity in the world," he said. "We always stick together."

"Don't forget," said Beverly Holmes, the local Marine Corps League chapter's paymaster. "One way or another, my grandchildren are going to know."

Knowing the meaning of Memorial Day was not lost on Meagan Sammons, scoutmaster for Boy Scout Troop 117. She had five local scouts — Heath Sammons, Javon Harbison, Jacob Connor, Eric Deyarnin and Noah Hamilton — help place small American flags into the ground and clean headstones over the weekend.

"It shows that even today's generation can learn and respect those who gave their lives,' she said.

Hurricane preparedness

Hurricane season officially began on June 1 and it's critical to prepare for a potential hurricane before it threatens our area. The Pasco Sheriff's Office encourages citizens to plan ahead for hurricane season. Preparing today can save lives and protect property during a storm.

A crucial first step is to make sure you have a hurricane supply kit. It should include water, non-perishable food, batteries, toiletries, first-aid supplies, medications, cash and fuel. Don't forget pet supplies as well. We recommend stocking enough food and

water to last three days per person. The Pasco Sheriff's Office suggests obtaining sandbags in advance to prepare your home for hurricanes. Waiting until the storm is here can mean that supplies might be low in stock. If you don't have storm shutters, consider purchasing plywood to fabricate shutters for your windows. Ensure outdoor items are properly secured or stowed away when a storm is in the forecast. Keeping trees trims and disposing of fallen limbs and other yard debris is a good idea during hurricane season as well. Debris and outdoor furniture can become projectiles during a storm. Properly cleaning

your gutters is another integral step in hurricane prep. If an evacuation order is issued for your area, it's advisable to follow it. If you plan to evacuate, keep in mind that community shelters may be limited on space and should only be used as a last resort. Before evacuating make sure to have copies of important papers, including your driver's license and insurance policies. Let friends and family know where you are going and remember to

lock your windows and doors before leaving. If you choose to shelter in place, plan ahead. Designate a safe room, such as a windowless closet or bathroom on the lower floor of your home. Fill containers with water, to give yourself an alternative when water source becomes contaminated during the storm. Additionally, if flooding occurs in your home, turn the power off at the main breaker to prevent further damage and harm. In the event of a power loss, it's critical to know what medical equipment will become unusable and make a plan for its absence.

Although most dangers from a hurricane are apparent, such as wind damage or storm surge, there are additional risks that are less apparent. Heart attacks from overexertion and vehicle accidents are common after storms. Drive carefully and avoid flooded roads. Take ample breaks to rest when cleaning up storm damage.

Staying informed during a storm will help you and your family stay safe. The National Hurricane Center forecasts are an accurate source of information. Bear in mind that the areas effected will extend beyond the center of the storm. PSO is here for our community, and we encourage citizens to prepare well in advance for hurricane season.





Maybe it's best not to put people on pedestals ... no one is perfect, especially me. I hope you are still a fan after you read this, if not ... peace and happiness to you.'

Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for its budget. The comprehensive annual financial report was judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program, which includes demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate its financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the report. The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recog-

nition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management.

This marked the 37th consecutive year the Pasco Clerk & Comptroller's Office has won the Achievement for Excellence.

The Award for Outstanding Achievement in Popular Annual Financial Reporting is a prestigious national honor recognizing conformance with the highest standards for preparation of state and local government popular reports.

To receive an Award for Outstanding Achievement in Popular Annual Financial Reporting, a government unit must publish a Popular Annual Financial Report whose contents conform to program standards of creativity, presentation, under-standability, and reader appeal.

An Award for Outstanding Achievement in Popular Annual Financial Reporting is valid for a period of one year only. The Pasco County Clerk & Comptroller has received a Popular Financial Reporting Award the last five years (fiscal years ended 2015-2019).

> The Distinguished Budget Presentation Award represents a significant achievement by the entity. It reflects the commitment of the governing body and staff to meeting the highest principles of governmental budgeting. To receive the budget award, the entity had to satisfy nationally recognized guidelines for effective budget presentation. These guidelines are designed to assess how well an entity's budget serves as: a policy document; a financial plan; an operations guide; and a communications de-

> Budget documents must be rated "proficient" in all four categories, and in the 14 mandatory criteria within those categories, to receive the award.

> When a Distinguished Budget Presentation Award is grant-ed to an entity, a Certificate of Recognition for Budget Presentation is presented to the individual(s) or department designat-

ed as being primarily responsible for having achieved the award. This has been presented to Christine M. Mettler, Budget and Purchasing Director.

There are more than 1,600 participants in the Budget Awards Program. The most recent Budget Award recipients, along with their corresponding budget documents, are posted quarterly on GFOA's website. Award recipients have pioneered efforts to improve the quality of budgeting and provide an excellent example for other governments throughout North America.
