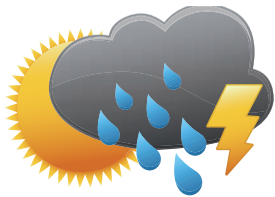

### Postseason exhibitions for Pasco County senior baseball and softball players relocates to Saint Leo

The Fellowship of Christian Athletes' baseball and softball games for Pasco County seniors, formerly held at Bishop McLaughlin, took place at Saint Leo College last week.

"It's great to have an event like this, not only for the local guys to come to our place but the FCA is a great organization," said Saint Leo baseball coach Rick O'Dette, whose son Ricky is a junior pitcher and utility player for Wesley Chapel.

Among the east schools were Zephyrhills, Pasco, Wesley Chapel, Wiregrass Ranch and Cypress Creek. As for the games, the east rallied from a four-run deficit to defeat the west in baseball, 9-7 in 10 innings, while the west got a narrow 6-5 win in softball.

Tied at 7 through nine innings of the baseball game, east scored twice in the 10th. Cypress Creek's Ethan Petry hit a run-scoring double then raced home on a single by Land O' Lakes' Daniel Busot.

Petry worked out the afternoon of the all-star game for the San Diego Padres and could have opted out, but Cypress Creek coach Joe Neale said, "He's got big things coming, but he decided on one last ride with his buddies."

Wiregrass Ranch coach Marshall McDougall pointed out that many of the all-stars on both sides have been teammates on various Little League and travel ball teams.

## Crews to begin construction work on Chancey Road

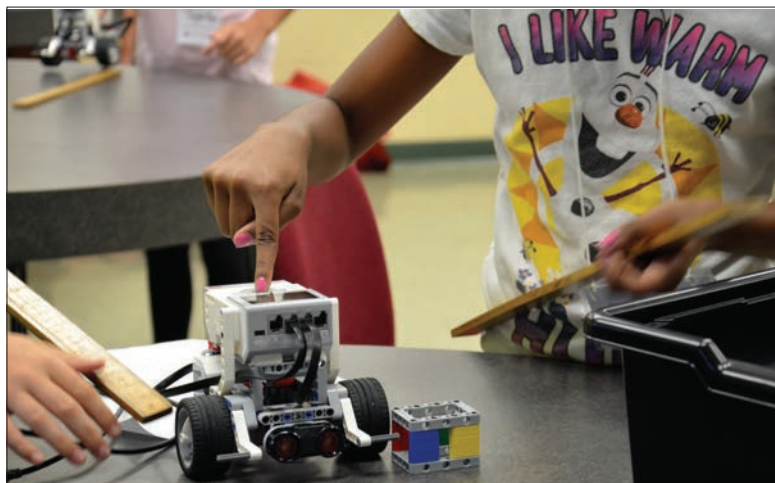

## Saint Leo University offering co-ed robotics summer camps

### Students to learn more about robots, coding, STEM skills

Saint Leo University's popular robotics summer camps will return this year with two weeklong sessions, July 18-22 and July 25-29.

Hosted by Saint Leo's new School of Computing, Artificial Intelligence, Robotics, and Data Science (CARDS), this camp will take place 8 a.m.-4 p.m. at University Campus, 33701 S.R. 52 in St. Leo.

The Saint Leo University Robotics coed camp is designed for middle school students (ages 11-15) who are interested in learning about robotics and programming. The campers, working in pairs, will use LEGO Education SPIKE Prime set, one of the newest robotics kits created by LEGO. This is an exciting opportunity for students to engage in learning about how robots work and how to code, said Dr. Monika

Kiss, interim chair of the Mathematics Department in the School of CARDS.

"Students do not need to have a background in building robots or coding," Kiss said, "they just need to be interested and ready to learn. Robotics is an intersection of all STEM [science, technology, engineering, and math] fields and is a wonderful opportunity to spike interest in young minds."

Those attending the camp will be provided healthy snacks as well as lunch at the Saint Leo University Dining Hall. The cost to attend is \$250 per child.

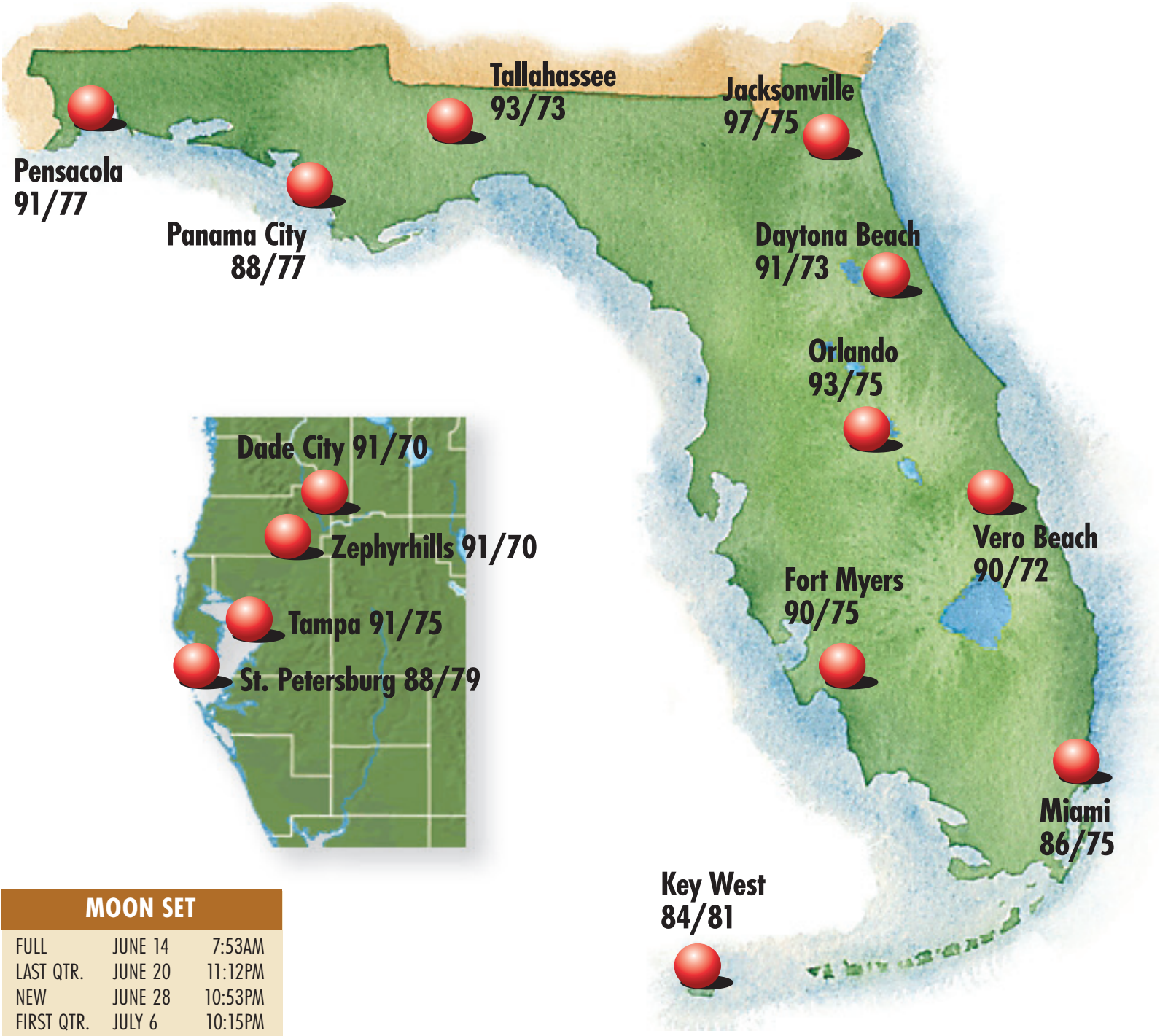

# Zephyrhills' Rusty Guynn is All-SAC Baseball Coach of the Year

Zephyrhills baseball coach Rusty Guynn heads the lists for All-Sunshine Athletic Conference awards in baseball and softball. Guynn, the conference's coach of the year, leads the contingent of honors for high school players from Zephyrhills, Pasco, Cypress Creek, Wesley Chapel and Wiregrass Ranch.

Guynn, a 1996 Zephyrhills graduate and former ballplayer, just completed his ninth season as coach of his alma mater. He guided the resurgent Bulldogs to their first winning season since 2015 when they went 18-10 and advanced to the region quarterfinals.

"I do appreciate it," Guynn said of his first-ever coach of the year award. "Any time you're voted on by your peers it's a big deal. It's really the kids that did it. I also have a great group that coaches with me."

This season, Zephyrhills finished with a 12-6 overall record with a handful of games lost to inclement weather and one team committing to a previous tournament. Despite a surprising 7-6 loss to arch-rival Pasco in the district tourney, the Bulldogs met Melbourne Eau Gallie in a region quarterfinal but lost that game 8-0.

The future is bright for Zephyrhills, which graduated just four seniors in Jaxson Rivera, Bryan Santiago, Martin Calhoun and Rielly Perez. All but Perez made all-conference, as did Bulldogs Mark Santiago, a junior and Bryan's brother, and Austin Dobbins.

The latter two were second-teamers and will be counted on, as will junior Micah Berrien, to keep the Bulldogs in playoff contention for next season.

"It's a good group," Guynn said. "They work hard. Mark and Austin will be back next year. So will Michah (a shortstop and second baseman). He should have made (all-conference) second team."

Cypress Creek's Ethan Petry is the conference's top baseball player. Joining Petry is teammate Seamus Gallagher.

Petry, a pitcher and third baseman, is following in the footsteps of his older brother Peyton, who was the conference's player of the year in 2021 and now plays for Saint Leo. Ethan signed a scholarship with

South Carolina in Columbia.

"I used to love playing with him because he always kept me in check," Ethan said of being Cypress Creek teammates with his brother for three seasons.

"Peyton and Ethan have been each other's biggest supporters since they started playing baseball," Neale said. "Peyton has made every effort to be at games this season to support Ethan and the program."

Neale said Ethan stepped up in a leadership role this season: "Ethan came to us as a true student of the game that was eager to ask questions and get involved with the older guys. This year he passed that along to younger teammates."

Other All-SAC baseball players included: Zachary Showalter, Zachary Bice and Jacob Carrillo from conference champion Wesley Chapel; Wiregrass Ranch's Maddox McDougal, Mason McDougal and Christopher Labron; along with Pasco's Dalton Duncan.

In softball Wiregrass Ranch's Kylee Johnson is the SAC Player of the Year. A junior shortstop and co-captain, she had a .506 batting average and led the Bulls in five categories this season with 46 runs, 44 hits, 12 doubles, 10 triples and eight home runs. Her 34 RBIs ranked second on the team.

Johnson was joined on the all-conference list by Wiregrass Ranch teammates Brianna Baer, Abigail Vyas, Elise Eason and Stephanie Daly.

Also making all-conference were Zephyrhills' Madison Schroeder; Wesley Chapel's Kadence Means, Ava Blakely, Madelyn Golka and Courtney Marks; Cypress Creek's Charlie Montgomery, Reagan Alapa and Miranda Schwartz; as well as Pasco's Madison Petty.

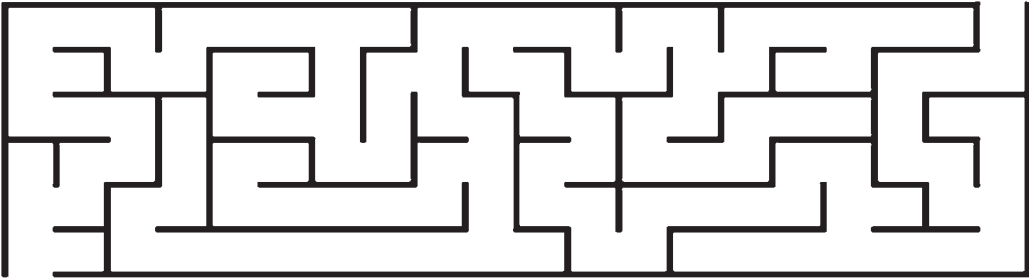

### The History Channel

- On June 9, 1893, the interior of Ford's Theatre collapses when a basement pier gives way, killing 23 people. The building -- where President Lincoln was assassinated -- housed hundreds of government clerks.

- On June 12, 1982, a large crowd descends upon New York City's Central Park, demanding nuclear disarmament. Estimates placed the number of attendees at over a million.
- On June 13, 1381, a large mob of English peasants marches into London and begins burning and looting the city. The revolt began with the bubonic plague in the late 1340s, which killed nearly a third of the population of England and led to higher wages due to scarcity of labor. Parliament, however, passed laws to hold down wages.
- On June 14, 1951, the U.S. Census Bureau dedicates UNIVAC, the first commercially produced general-purpose electronic digital computer in the U.S. UNIVAC used thousands of vacuum tubes for computation.
- On June 15, 1904, more than 1,000 people taking a pleasure trip on New York City's East River are drowned or burned to death when fire sweeps through the riverboat-style steamer General Slocum.

# Did You Know?

Grilling is a summertime tradition, but health-conscious grillmasters may want to marinate their meats before cooking them over an open flame. Heterocyclic aromatic amines (HAAs) are compounds that can form when meats are cooked over an open flame.

HAAs are suspected carcinogens, but a 2008 study published in the Journal of Food Science found that, with a few exceptions, spice-containing marinades inhibited the formation of heterocyclic amines, thus providing reduced exposure to some of the carcinogens formed during grilling.

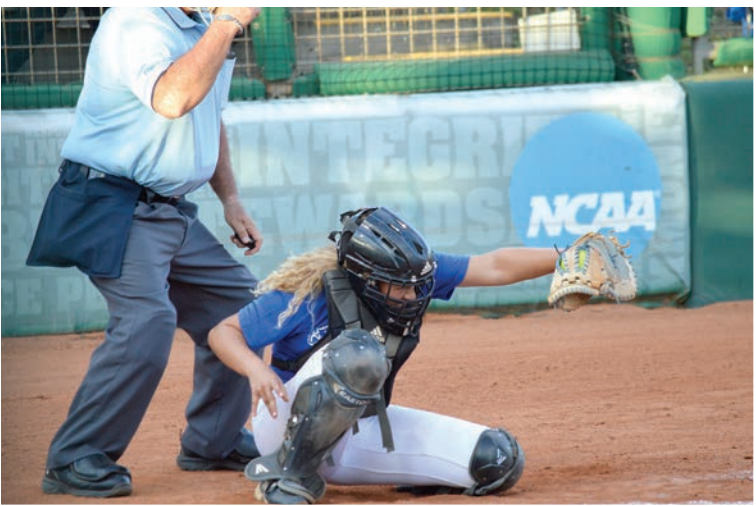

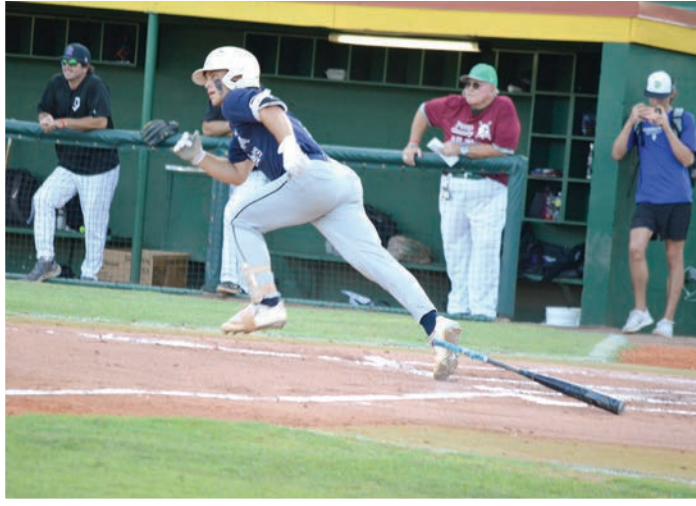

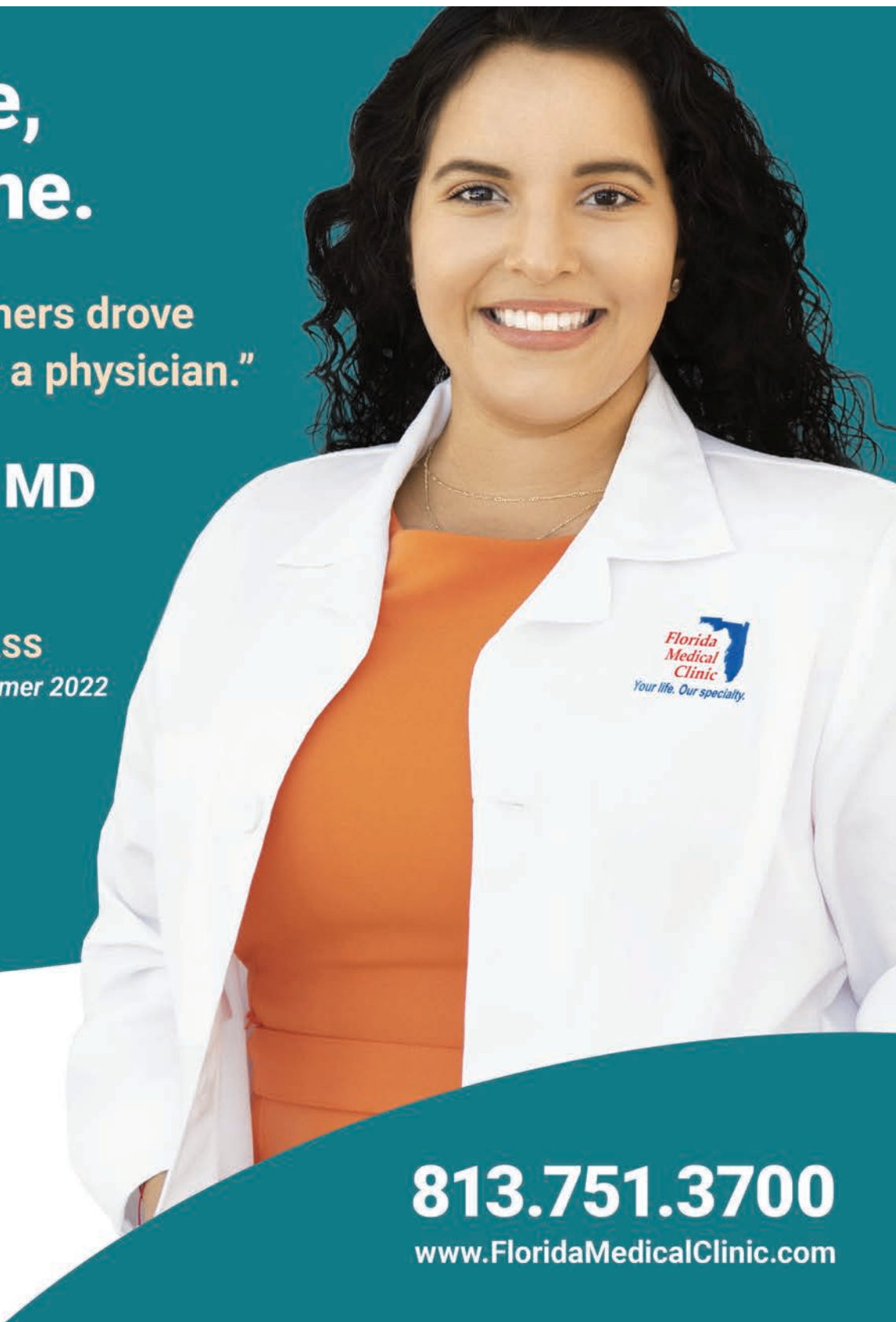

### Reenactors are part of the annual ceremony held at Zephyrhills Museum of Military History

At this time of year patriotism always seems to come shining through in this hometown community of east Pasco County. On Saturday, it was found on the hallowed grounds of the Zephyrhills Museum of Military History on the outskirts of the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport.

That is where the D-Day commemoration took place, which came just six days after a Memorial Day Ceremony at Oakside Cemetery on the other side of the city. The D-Day event serves as an annual remembrance of a pivotal battle on the Beach of Normandy during World War II.

"We've got to always remember D-Day and how many thousands of lives were lost that day," said Cliff Moffett, the museum's director. "I talked to a German and he said the only reason they didn't kill more allies is because they ran out of ammunition."

With a tropical storm moving from Mexico toward the southern part of Florida and Key West on Saturday, the traditional ceremony could have been in jeopardy. Moffett noted that the path was predicted to stay primarily south of the Tampa Bay region, so he did not consider cancelling the event.

"We have a little rain today, but it was worse weather conditions on D-Day," he said.

On June 6, 1944, with Major General Dwight D. Eisenhower in command the United States and 11 other countries sent troops into battle at Normandy to combat evil dictator Adolf Hitler. The largest seaborne invasion in history, which included amphibious and airborne

assaults, marked the start of the allied offensive to take back Europe from Nazi occupation.

Never forget were sentiments shared by many that day, like 24-year-old Karter Lehr, who said he likes being a reenactor "to teach history and make sure no one forgets at what cost we have our freedom."

Teaching history is important to fellow reenactor Brian Lemonovich as well. That is why, in part, he has donned World War II outfits for the allies as well as the enemy.

"My grandfather was a World War II veteran and he got me into it," he said. "I like to talk with the public. The kids like to see the type of gear they used and how different it was."

One kid actually brought his own gear. Thomas DiLella, 9, was dressed in military fatigues. He was there with his dog Sarge, a black lab mix, and his mother, Dawn DiLella.

"I have a whole stack of military gear at my house," said Thomas, who wore a military police helmet as well as a U.S. Army uniform from the Vietnam era. "I just like doing it to remember all the veterans and all the ones who died."

"It's an obsession that's lasted," Dawn said of her son donning military gear for the past two years.

A group of Air Force veterans played a key role in D-Day. The 10th Fighter Squadron. They were stationed at what is now the museum in a building that once was one of 30 barracks of its kind in the United States.

"This squadron participated in D-Day. They were called the P-shooters," Moffett said. "It's a big piece of history in Zephyrhills; a big piece of history in the United States."

Some of the reenactors who showed up last weekend plan to come back to the area for the Second Annual Battle For Veterans. Billed as the state's largest Veterans Day experience it will take place just north of the museum grounds Nov. 11-13 and include a World War II reenactment with tanks, military helicopter rides and military vehicle displays.
