Fire department officials teach and entertain youngsters as part of summer reading program

Men in uniform continued to be a big draw for children in the Zephyrhills Public Library's summer reading program. Earlier this summer, a visit from the city's police department ranked among the most popular events and last week an appearance by the Zephyrhills Fire Department continued that trend.

"The library appreciates the support of the city's police and fire departments to our summer program," said Lori Brightwell, the city's library director. "Both departments went all out for us."

"Kids love to see the guys in uniform and learn about what

they do," she continued. "It's important that the kids see them in their uniforms and let them know they're there to help."

Brightwell initiated the summer reading program for boys and girls between kindergarten and the fifth grade. It consists of nine weekly sessions, held in council chambers at city hall each Wednesday morning, with four remaining. Next up is Silly Sam the Music Man, a staple at libraries throughout Pasco County.

As for the most recent session there was plenty of laughter as boys and girls sat on the floor of council chambers to watch a fun-filled cartoon about fire safety featuring Pumbaa and Timon from The Lion King movie. The youngsters also covered their ears when loud, high-pitched alarms were demonstrated.

The fire department, however, saved the best for last by allowing the children to climb aboard and sit in two fire trucks. That's when the widest smiles were displayed — on the faces of children as well as adults and fire department personnel.

San Antonio advances three all-star teams to states

Juniors are eliminated, but Majors and Minors remain in the hunt for Dixie Baseball League titles

Three San Antonio All-Star teams won District 6 titles and advanced to state tournaments in the Dixie Baseball League. One down with two squads still in the postseason mix.

The Juniors (ages 7-8) bowed out of their state series in three games at Sebring last week, but the Minors (9-10) and Majors (11-12) are headed to Bristol to pursue state title quests. The double-elimination tournaments for both teams are being played in the Florida panhandle city situated between Tallahassee and Panama City.

"We are very proud to have three of our divisions earn the right to represent District 6 and, more importantly, San Antonio at the state championships," said Jeremy DesHotels, San Antonio's league president. "This is the second year in a row that three of our divisions earned this right."

Last season, the San Antonio Minors won a state crown before finishing as a runner-up in the DSL World Series. The Majors won a district crown and made it to the state final. This year, both teams could advance to DSL World Series in their respective divisions by winning state championships.

The San Antonio Majors went 3-0 in the district tourney at Ridge Manor. San Antonio defeated Brooksville 15-11 and 13-1, the latter being the championship game. In between was a 10-7 win over host Ridge Manor.

Practices are under way for another ZAL season

Youth football players and cheerleaders preparing for 2019 championship runs

While it is not exactly championships or bust for the Zephyrhills Athletic League, the local youth football and cheerleading teams have lofty expectations as practices are under way for the 2019 Mid-Florida Football and Cheerleading Conference season.

Football teams in four divisions — flag (6-and-under), mighty mites (8U), pee wee (10U) and junior varsity (12U) — began practicing in late June. Cheerleaders have been out to the sessions at Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field as well.

The ultimate goal for any and all of the Bulldawg squads, however, is to bring home an MFFCC Super Bowl trophy. The last time the ZAL achieved that goal came in 2014 by the mighty mites.

"We've been trying to get there ever since," said Damien Pickett, the league's director and longtime coach.

Last season, all four division teams came close. Each squad won a district title with all of them advancing to the third round of the playoffs. Four postseason victories are needed make it to a Super Bowl and five to win it all.

"It's all about the kids buying into the system," said Pickett, who has put more than a half-dozen family members through the program. "Our kids know we expect them to give 110 percent. They expect to win. They come out with the mindset that they're going to win. Not only that, but they put the work in at practice."

The Bulldawgs get their first opportunities to take on opposing teams when they host a jamboree on July 27.

Tips to get some sleep on your next flight

Overseas travel has risen considerably over the last two decades. According to data from the World Tourism Organization, Yearbook of Tourism Statistics and Compendium of Tourism Statistics, more than 633 million tourists traveled internationally in 1996. - Choose a window seat. Many travelers find that window seats are more conducive to sleeping than center or aisle seats. When sitting in a window seat, you only have one person sitting next to you, which means only one shared arm rest. In addition, window seat occupants can rest their heads against the interior wall of the cabin, which can facilitate sleeping. Window seat occupants also can sleep without fear of interruption by fellow passengers getting up to use the restroom or stretch their legs.

- Avoid exit row seats. Exit row seats with all that extra leg room might seem like the ideal place to doze off. However, many exit row seats

do not recline, forcing occupants to sit upright for the duration of their flights. Especially tall travelers may want to sacrifice reclining in favor of extra leg room.

- Pack light. Two carry-on bags may make it difficult to sleep, as one likely will have to be stored beneath your seat and between your feet. That can make your seat feel especially cramped, compromising your ability to get comfortable and fall asleep.

- Dress the part. Throw fashion to the wind

and choose comfort over style if you hope to sleep on your flight. Wear loose-fitting clothing, such as sweatpants and a T-shirt with a hoodie that can be easily removed if need be. Such clothing is more comfortable to sleep in than jeans and form-fitting attire.

It's possible to get a good night's rest on a flight, giving tourists the chance to hit the ground running once they arrive at their destinations.

"Our bats were super alive and our pitching shut them down," coach Tim Maple said.

Leading the way on the mound were pitchers Ashton Liddington, Owen Wilson, Talon Maple and Lenny Mercado.

Maple's son, who bats leadoff, led San Antonio with a 1.000 batting average and Logan Fernandez has some clutch catches in center field. Yanni Mercado belted a three-run home run in the state title game.

Three players — Liddington, Talon Maple and Trent Coleman — return from last year's state runner-up team, giving San Antonio some experience at that level.

"Been there, done that," coach Maple said. "In districts they were pretty poised because they had been to the state finals."

Rounding out the Majors roster are: Alfredo Carrillo, Joseph Knight, Andrew Spencer, Cole Renner and Luke Renner; along with manager Marvin Francis and coach Noel Mercado.

In the Minors tourney at Spring Hill, San Antonio split four games, but won twice in Division II — 20-0 against Wildwood and 17-2 over Spring Hill C — to qualify for the state competition. Two losses to Spring Hill A and B, respectively, had no bearing

on the Division II level.

"When we're competing against other Division II teams our defense is strong and our bats are pretty good," said DesHotels, who also is the manager of that San Antonio squad. "We expect to do well against other Division II teams. We have eight pitchers, five catchers and we do have good depth through the batting (order)."

The top pitchers are Logan Verosic and Ethan DesHotels, the coach's son. At the plate, Rhett Newsome leads the hitters with a .667 average and Reece Allison averages .571. Entering the state series batting at .500 are Kaleb Cherry, Ethan DesHotels, Masen Harvey and Ronan Piet.

The remaining players on the Minors include: Maximus Storch, Colton Sasser, Tristan Beatty, Oakley Riley and Austin Puentes; along with coaches Eric Verosic and Tim Cherry.

As for the Juniors, who have finished their state series, that all-star team consisted of: Blaine Kohan, Cayson Jackson, Gabriel Burgos, Cody Carroll, Eric Frye, Christian Adams, Deegan Piet, Noah Hill, Bryson Finlay, Easton Newsome, Wyatt Comer and Hank Gough; along with manager Derrick Comer and coaches Justin Newsome, Christopher Burgos and Wesley Frye.

The first home games are the following Saturday on Aug. 3. "Our league's tough," said Pickett, noting that ZAL

also serves as a feeder program for the local middle and high schools. "There's no secret that our league is one of the toughest in Florida." Coaches and players alike welcome the challenge

of playing high-caliber opponents, Pickett noted.

A new challenge faced by longtime coach David Giles will be moving up a level for the upcoming season. Giles, who has coached the flag football team for the past seven seasons, takes over the pee wee team.

"It was time for a change," he said. "I feel like I gave flag my all. I put guys in position to follow suit. I think my (former) assistant, Marvin Johnson, is going to be a great successor."

Giles will not exactly be new to the players on the pee wee squad since he coached many of those players when they played at the flag level.

"Most of them have been around to accept the transition well," Giles said. "I've coached most of these kids since they were 5-years-old so they're familiar for me."

Like at the other levels, for Giles and his assistant coaches, conditioning and staying focused on teaching the fundamentals are the top priorities in the early stages of pre-season practices.

"Right now, early in the season, we just want to establish the basics," he said. "It's about getting the kids to compete."

Pickett noted that practicing in the heat of the summer, with plenty of water breaks, would go a long way in the players' conditioning.

A few dozen cheerleaders, representing several levels and practicing routines together, also are learning new cheers and fine-tuning their skills. Cheerleaders in all age groups are needed to round out teams and a few cheerleading coaches are needed as well.

"With cheering, the more girls you've got on the squad the more you can do," said Valeree Vann, the league's assistant director.

Vann noted that 37 cheerleaders had come out as of last week and that an eventual turnout of more than 50 would be ideal.

Among the children to climb on the front of a fire truck to have their pictures taken were Adrianna Crespo's three — Carlos, 6, 4-year-old Ana and Adrianna, 2.

"We are new around here," said Mrs. Crespo, a new resident of Zephyrhills. "This is an opportunity for them to learn; coming to the library and seeing new stuff. That's why I brought them to this." Getting to see firefighter Rickey Romero in full gear, with co-worker D.J. Mattsen explaining each item as it went on, was an eye-opener to the boys and girls.

"It gets hot, but you have to do your job and do what it

takes to protect the citizens," Romero said.

Lt. Billy Jeffries also let the children know that firefighters are at the public's beck and call.

"We're always at the fire station," he said, noting that personnel often pull 24-hour shifts. "There's always somebody there ready to respond."

Jeffries also let them know that despite the heavy equipment firefighters wear that there is nothing to fear: "If you ever have a fire in your house and we knock on your door this guy (Romero in his full equipment) is what you'll see so you don't have to be afraid. We're the good guys. You

don't have to be afraid of us."

The presentation, along with the dozen or so annual community events with the public, was a welcome respite for a fire department embroiled in a controversy of late. At issue is whether the city's fire department will remain as such or be combined with the county's fire program.

City council had debated the matter in recent years and at the most recent meeting approved a motion to begin negotiations with the county to absorb the city's department. Either way, Jeffries said he and his fellow firefighters are committed to continue in their roles and obligations to city residents.

"This is what we're here to do. We're here to serve the community," he said. "We love these opportunities, because it gives us a chance to get out in the community and teach about fire safety."

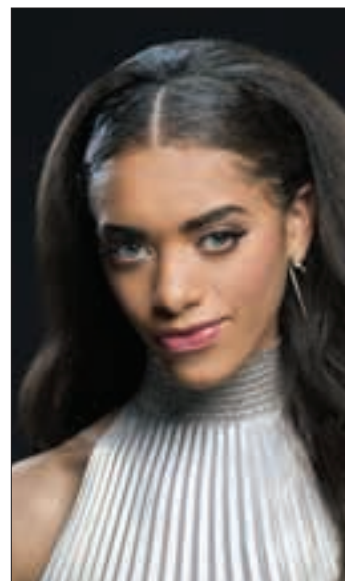

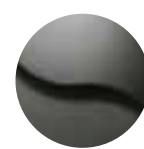

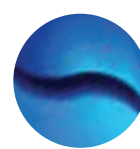
