Faith Wilson displays Main Street's new web site, city council tackles rezonings

While she actually has been on the job since the beginning of June, Faith Wilson utilized the platform of a Community Redevelopment Agency meeting to formally introduce herself to city council members, the mayor and some city staff.

The new director of Main Street Zephyrhills, who

replaces Paxton McCullough after an abbreviated stint, was graciously welcomed by that group. That gathering at city hall came before Monday night's regularly scheduled city council meeting.

Wilson, with a strong background in retail and most recently having worked for the Zephyrhills Police Department, has revamped Main Street's web site. She displayed it on screens in the council chambers Monday and the upgrades were well-received.

"I think it looks great," councilman Lance Smith said. "I know it takes a lot of hours to do that."

Gail Hamilton, the CRA's director, was among several others who appreciated Wilson's efforts to highlight the downtown area and upcoming events.

"She's having to pull teeth from everybody to get

Road projects continue to move forward

Two projects are aimed at making Zephyrhills and Pasco County safer places to drive, walk or bike

The first project is one that's finally nearing completion and that's the one known as the Pretty Pond/301 Project. This project is primarily an intersection improvement that entails a bit more than just three intersections. It's a joint effort from the City of Zephyrhills, the Florida Department of Transportation, the contractor and design engineer and it's faced some challenges.

"All told there have been about 45 days of delays on the project," Project Manager and Zephyrhills Public Works Director Shane LeBlanc said. "We've had weather delays but other things have factored in. We've

A Look Back ...

JULY 1, 2004

New series harkens back to days gone by. Let's look at the above date

This week's Look Back, the eighth in our series, brings us a bit closer in time than in previous editions. We welcome readers to 2004 when a NASA spacecraft landed on Mars, Mark Zuckerberg created Facebook, former President Ronald Reagan passed away and the Tampa Bay Lightning won its first Stanley Cup.

Closer to home, in the little niche of the world called east Pasco, *The Zephyrhills News* brought plenty of local news to the community and outlying areas including Dade City, Wesley Chapel and San Antonio.

The centerpiece photo on the front page featured local firefighters, led by Zephyrhills Captain Kerry Barnett, demonstrating how to put out a car fire. Deal Auto Salvage provided the automobile and use of the lot for the training exercise.

Concerns about increased traffic led city council members to make changes for trucks driving through city limits. A Vietnam Veterans Memorial was unveiled at the Depot Museum. A stain glass window commemorated the life of Johnny Lewis, a Zephyrhills serviceman killed in action in the Vietnam War.

Additionally, preparations got under way for a Zephyrhills Harvest Festival slated for that October at Zephyr Park and sponsored by the Zephyrhills Ministerial Association. Plus, atop an index column was the birth announcement of Dalton Allen King, son of Nancy King, the newspaper's graphic artist.

The city beat on page two differentiated between the city's police beat and Pasco Sheriff's crime reports. A lengthy community calendar also was on that page. Typical for that time of year, the next page was highlighted by an advance on Sparklebration, the traditional

fireworks show on the Fourth of July at the Pasco County Fairgrounds.

There were columns by editor Dave Hasselman and associate editor Gary Hatrick with the former focusing on a good-natured office pool on the birth time and weight of King's son and the latter mentioning response time about a house fire that killed 12-year-old Christopher Sanford.

As usual, local announcements, anniversaries, births and deaths, and weddings were on the pages. There was a church directory as well as the normal staple of tidbits for club and park news.

The Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce advertised for its own news with ribbon-cuttings ambassador and citizens of the month. Also, local students were congratulated for graduating from various institutions.

In sports, the community was coming off a golf benefit at Lake Bernadette that benefitted Daniel Cerf, a Zephyrhills football player who was partially paralyzed after an auto accident north of

Otis Allen Road. He had been in a coma and was recovering from brain trauma.

Local race car driver David Reutimann, who made it to NASCAR from the local race car family, expressed his dissatisfaction about a wreck that came ruing the Milwaukee Mile, which was part of the NASCAR Craftsman Truck Series.

At Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field, the East Pasco Dixie Softball League hosted tournaments at the district level. The local chapter of that league is now defunct. Also at Krusen Field, the new skateboard park was filled with plenty of young skaters on the weekends.

On a Fourth of July advertising page, many local businesses sent well wishes in squares bordered by banners and balloons.

Ads included homes by Suarez Housing in Lake Bernadette selling in the \$150s-\$250s range. Closeout models in the luxury adult community of Tropical Acre Estates were made available for up to a \$10,000 savings.

Back then, classified ads were a bit more extensive and, as always, there was a place for legals. Lastly, the TV guide and movie listings offered entertainment options.

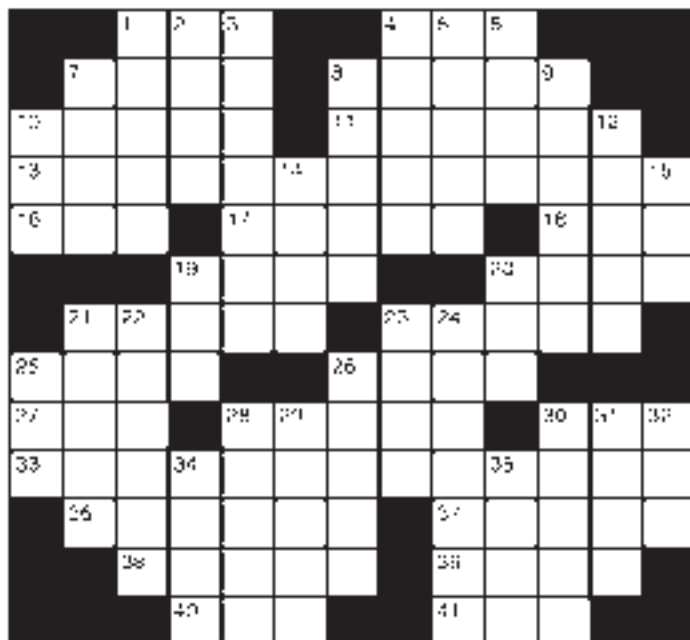

had labor shortages, fuel shortages, the price of concrete and asphalt has gone up.”

LeBlanc mentioned that just getting the mast arms that the traffic signals are installed on had a, “Twenty-eight-week lead time.” The good news is the mast arms are up and the lights are installed. One of the biggest pieces of the puzzle, yet to be completed, is the “traffic separator” that will block through traffic from crossing U.S. Highway 301 between the two shopping centers. New traffic signals at Pretty Pond and at Medical Arts Court will provide access to the shopping centers.

“It’s been a major problem if you wanted to cross 301 from Pretty Pond and you used to not be able to turn south, you’d have to turn north on 301 and then U-turn or cut through the shopping center to come back south,” LeBlanc said. “Now, it’s going to be improved access to the shopping centers and it’s going to keep the traffic moving and improve safety.”

Even with the delays, the project is slated to be completed sometime in mid-August. The traffic separator and the final asphalt paving are two more of the bigger pieces that have to go in. There are no plans for complete closure of 301. The final paving will be conducted at night and there will only be certain lane closures as opposed to closing the whole road and setting detours. Even so, an enterprising motorist might try to avoid that section of 301 when we get into August and that final portion of the project is commencing. The \$2.1-million project is covered by a state appropriation.

The intersection improvements on CR54 are nearing commencement. That project is a joint city-county effort with Zephyrhills on the hook for half the cost but the county is responsible for the execution of the project. It entails a number of intersection and shoulder improvements from basically the Wawa at Gall Boulevard and CR54, going east all the way to 23rd Street. The project technically starts just west of Dairy Road where previous widening was completed. Additionally, the intersection at Wire Road/12th Street and CR54 will have mast arms replace the cables that hold the traffic signals. Mast arms are becoming more common than cables due to their stability and the ease of working on them.

“We like them (mast arms) for their maintenance purposes,” Project Manager and Pasco County Technical Specialist III Patricia Arndt said. “We’ve been using them in the county east of U.S. 41.”

Aside from the mast arm switchover, Wire Road/12th Street will get designated right and left turn lanes. Further down CR54, 23rd Street will get a traffic signal light on mast arms. The south side of 23rd Street will get a designated left turn lane.

There are a number of safety measures and accommodations for pedestrians, too. A 10-foot multi-use path on the south side of CR54 will run from Dairy Road, all the way to 23rd Street. On the north side, a five-foot sidewalk will connect to existing paths at Dairy Road and terminate at 23rd Street.

“It’s a safety project,” Arndt said. “Additional pedestrian signals at the intersection, which we don’t have right now, will improve public safety.”

The project hasn’t launched just yet. Johnson Engineering was awarded the design contract. Advertisements for construction bids went out in February and now the BOCC is close to making a decision to award the contract. Arndt said that she expects the announcement to be made at the Aug. 10 BOCC meeting.

“Once we start, the plan is for one year of construction,” Arndt said.

Wesley Chapel wins District 13 title and advances to states in the Cal Ripken League

It took three nights, thanks to rainouts, for Dade City to eliminate Zephyrhills in the Major Baseball All-Star Tournament District 13. Dade City made it to the championship of that double-elimination series before losing 11-1 to host Land O' Lakes.

"It was a mess trying to play that," Dade City coach Clark Evans said.

The title game actually was moved from Land O' Lakes to Dade City and played on a Friday night after yet another rain delay. Coaches and league officials prepared the field at John S. Burks Memorial Park.

"There were a lot of tournaments starting Saturday, so we had to get the game in," Evans said.

For Zephyrhills, the Dade City game was a rematch. Dade City won the opening game, 14-2 against Zephyrhills, which in between the Dade City games beat Progress Village 12-2.

"We're the only ones who went 1-2," said Zephyrhills coach Darryl Oney, alluding to his team's record compared to two other Zephyrhills all-star squads that did not win a game.

Dade City finished the tourney with a 2-2 record. Aside from beating Zephyrhills twice the team lost twice to Land O' Lakes, which included a close 8-7 defeat earlier.

"We did pretty well against Zephyrhills," Evans said, adding that against Land O' Lakes "I just don't think we were at their level."

Leading the offense for Dade City in the four games were Eli Evans, Emilio Jauregui, Carson Wheatley and Jayden Maneiro. Dade City was deep in pitching with six players taking the mound at various times.

The Dade City Major Softball team, which included Zephyrhills players Kiara Little, Shelby Steavens, McKenzie Dean and Senae Davis, bowed out of its series in two games. They lost 20-2 and 6-4, both games coming against Land O' Lakes.

"They came together and stayed positive," Dade City coach Christopher Harvey said of that second game, adding that his players focused on family and team.

In the Cal Ripken League, Wesley Chapel's 10U all-star baseball team won a District 13 title. They came out of the loser's bracket after a loss to Fishhawk, then defeated East Bay twice — 4-0 and 3-2 — for the championship. Wesley Chapel went 6-1 and outscored the opposition by a whopping 56-11 margin in their series.

"I was so proud of them," coach Trevor Rhodes said. "The whole team is solid, from top to bottom. We prided ourselves in having a well-rounded team where everyone contributes."

Wesley Chapel relied on pitching depth to win its title. Trey Moye, Luke Cepeda, Jack Green, Mark Redden, Levi Cohen, Lucas Mendez and Aiden Alexander all saw time on the mound. Behind the plate for every game was Dempsey Rhodes, the coach's son.

Leading the team in hits were Green, Mendez, Cohen and Trenton Tomer. After a 19-1 opening win over Brandon, Wesley Chapel lost 11-3 to Fishhawk. Decisive 11-1 and 14-5 victories over North Tampa and host Lutz, respectively, followed before the team avenged the loss to Fishhawk with a 2-1 win. Moye pitched a complete game in that narrow victory.

Having to defeat East Bay twice to claim the title, Wesley Chapel got a home run from Mendez, who pitched and was followed by Redden in a 4-0 win. Redden then pitched in the 3-2 clinching win over East Bay with reliever Alexander coming in to get the final out on a flyout to center fielder Luke Peterson.

Rounding out the roster were: Jayden Wade and Caleb Kapish; assistant coaches Ryan Tomer and Tim Moye.

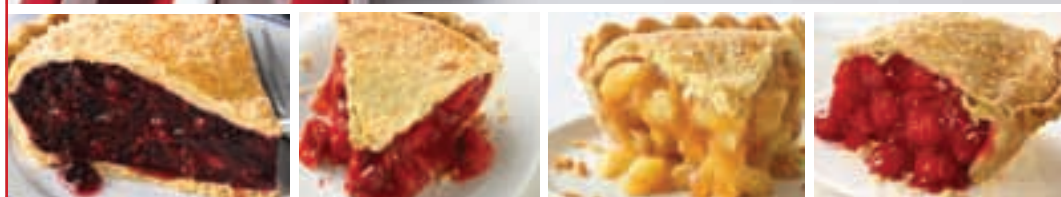

"The opportunity for growth" is why Wilson said she sought the position. "Part of being new is creating change in a positive way."

While many businesses were adversely affected during the coronavirus pandemic of the past year, fewer were hit harder than Main Street. Most events were canceled, but things are looking up. Main Street is scheduled to host Music & Motorcycles, traditionally one of its showcase events, on Sept. 11.

There's more too. Halloween Howl and the Christmas Parade are on track to be revived this year and in the spring plans are in the works for an event recognizing veterans. It could be something other than a veterans parade like in previous years.

"Santa's coming to town," Wilson said enthusiastically, adding that downtown markets could be coming

soon. "One thing close to my heart is markets. That really draws a lot of people."

In welcoming Wilson, city manager Billy Poe said, "I think we're going to see Main Street grow."

As for council business, members debated the possible relocation of a power pole as part of road change north of Pretty Pond. Informed that the task could take up to two years and cost into the millions, the council considered altering plans for the road instead.

"Let's just get the road in," Poe said. "It can be worked around the pole."

Council later approved a request for conditional use to exceed height restrictions for multi-family homes near Zephyr Commons. That outcome came on the first reading of a public hearing.

Autumn Palm Villas, which was annexed into the city several years ago, has been approved for 84 townhome units. A rezoning request, which came during a presentation by Susan Swift representing Collins

Engineering, to increase that number to 94 single-story units was given the okay.

"It's really the only undeveloped tract in that area," Swift said.

In addressing council members, city planner Todd Vande Berg added that city staff favored "the proposed changes that have come before you."

A flag in disrepair at Veterans' Memorial Park has been replaced by a new one purchased by the city, Poe said. He added that two flags were actually purchased so there would be a backup available.

Lastly, council president Alan Knight reminded every-one to "remember July 4" and that Summerfest at Zephyr Park would take place that day with fireworks scheduled to go off around 9 p.m.

Since there will be no Sparklebration at the Pasco County Fairgrounds for a second straight year, Summerfest is the only major Fourth of July alternative this year.
